GENDER EXPRESSION IN THE LOWLAND WASTES

Most Farmerlings play with gender like the wind plays with leaves. In a human world tipping between resilience and collapse, jewelry has little value compared to the yearly promise of a potato. New looks, styles, and even facial features are explored using the bounty of strange devices found just under the Earth's surface.

Even the most humble Farmerlings don ornate plastisteel tokens on earlobes, necks, wrists, belly buttons, noses, and fingers to

showcase combinations of masculinity, femininity, and androgyny. Gestures of self-expression are highly personal and vary widely from region to region, place to place.

Across the Lowlands, the lips and ears are often associated with femininity.

The fingers, toes, and nose tend to attract tokens of masculinity. The eyes and the cheeks suggest gender-neutral fashion.

1d10	Name	Rarity	Description
1-2	Crawling Comb	U	A wind-up device used to autonomously arrange a head of hair. Each hairstyle is pre-programmed into the device at its ancient time of creation.
3-4	Drop Earring Chimes	C	Earrings that create melodic pitches, perfect for calling attention to one's ears.
5-6	Fragrance Choker	C	A heated center worn around the neck infuses the air with a selection of aromatic scents - often flowery sweet or sensuously musky.
7-8	Shifting Eyes	C	A mask that blocks the sun's rays from the eyes and whose moving parts symbolize the ever-changing expressions of gender over time.
9-10	Skinshaper's Kit	R	A toolkit used by traveling medical magicians to magically change the shape of the patient's body. Modest changes are relatively simple, but more complicated procedures require the use of Ancient surgery stations found in larger Farmerling villages
