filet for today

We transform a thoroughly antique "corset cover" into a fetching modern tank.

By Elena Malo

Bone up on your filet crochet with our updated version of this beautiful shell. Originally designed as a corset cover, this pattern is truly a relic from the Victorian heyday of filet. Instead of reaching for the fine thread and steel hook that our grandmothers would have used, we bumped things up to a more contemporary size 3 crochet thread for a longer, thicker tank that is oh-so-now. Pair it with a turtleneck for daytime or dress it up for a night on the town. No corset necessary!



what you'll need

YARN

AUNT LYDIA'S *Caress*
Microfiber, 2oz/56.5g balls, each
approx 124yd/113.5m (acrylic
microfiber)

- 3 (4, 4, 5, 5, 5) balls #2262
Natural

CROCHET HOOK

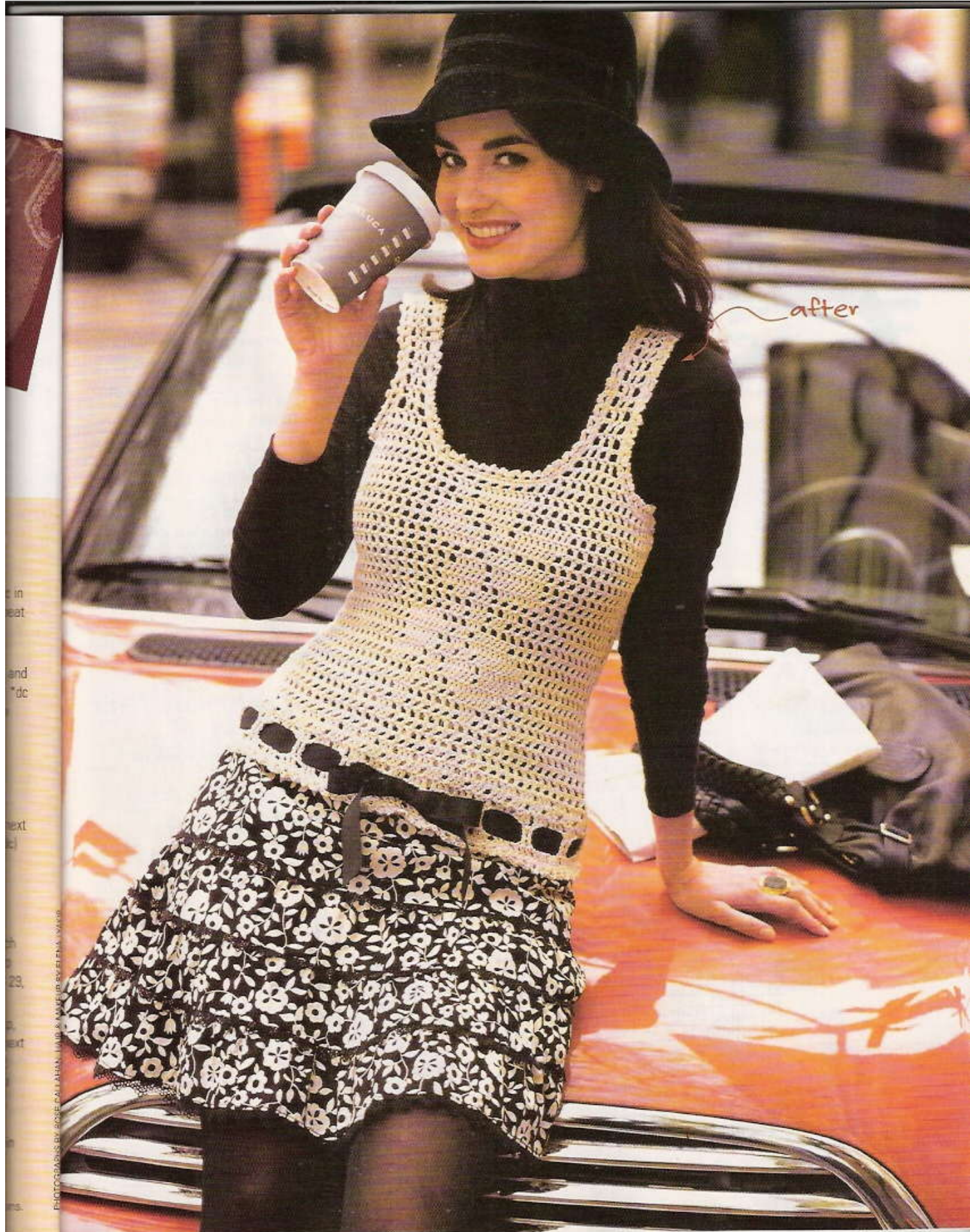

Rows 8 and 9 Decrease in pattern - 41 (47, 51, 57, 61, 67) (dc, ch 1) mesh.

Rows 10 and 11 Work in Petite Filet pattern.

Rows 12 and 13 Decrease in pattern - 39 (45, 49, 55, 59, 65) (dc, ch 1) mesh.

Work in Petite Filet pattern until piece measures 10"/25.5cm from beginning.

Next Row Increase in pattern - 41 (47, 51, 57, 61, 67) (dc, ch 1) mesh.

Next 2 Rows Work in Petite Filet pattern.

Next Row Increase in pattern - 43 (49, 53, 59, 63, 69) (dc, ch 1) mesh.

Work in Petite Filet pattern until piece measures 13 (13, 13½, 13½, 14, 14)"/33 (33, 34.5, 34.5, 35.5, 35.5)cm from the beginning. Do not fasten off.

shape first armhole and shoulder strap

Row 1 (right side) Ch 1, turn, sl st in first ch-1 sp, sl st in next dc, [sl st in next ch-1 sp, sl st in next dc] 6 (7, 9, 10, 11, 12) times, ch 3 (counts as dc), sk next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc, [ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc] 7 (9, 9, 11, 11, 13) times, sk next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc - 7 (9, 9, 11, 11, 13) ch-1 sp and dc at each end.

Row 2 Ch 3, turn, sk first 2 dc and next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc; *ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc; repeat from * across, ending dc in turning ch - 5 (7, 7, 9, 9, 11) ch-1 sp and dc at each end.

Repeat last row 1 (2, 2, 2, 2, 2) times - 3 (3, 3, 5, 5, 7) ch-1 sp and dc at each end.

Next Row Ch 4 (counts as dc, ch 1), sk first 2 dc and next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc; *ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc; repeat from * across, ending ch 1, dc in top of turning ch - 3 (3, 3, 5, 5, 7) ch-1 sp.

Next Row Ch 4 (counts as dc, ch 1), *sk next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc, ch 1; repeat from * across, ending dc in 3rd ch of turning ch.

Repeat last row until shoulder strap measures 6 (6, 6½, 6½, 7, 7)"/15 (15, 16.5, 16.5, 18, 18)cm. Fasten off.

shape second armhole and shoulder strap

With right side facing, sk 11 (11, 11, 11, 13, 13) center meshes, join yarn with sl st in next dc.

Row 1 (right side) Ch 3 (counts as dc), sk next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc, [ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc] 7 (9, 9, 11, 11, 13) times, sk next ch-1 sp, dc in next dc; leave remaining sts unworked - 7 (9, 9, 11, 11, 13) ch-1 sp and dc at each end.

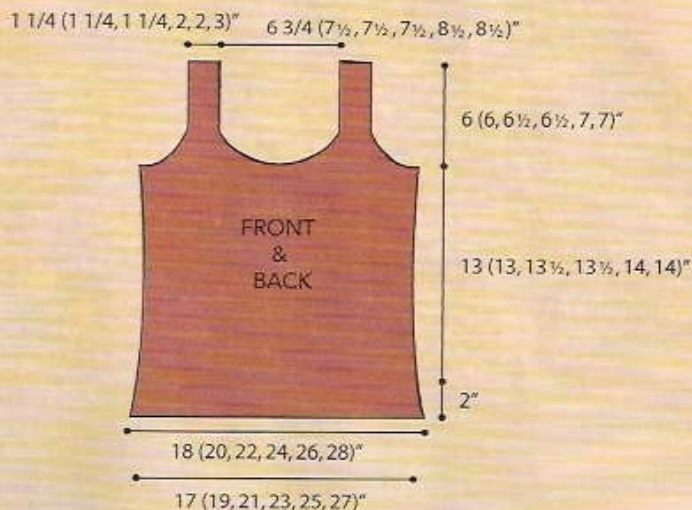
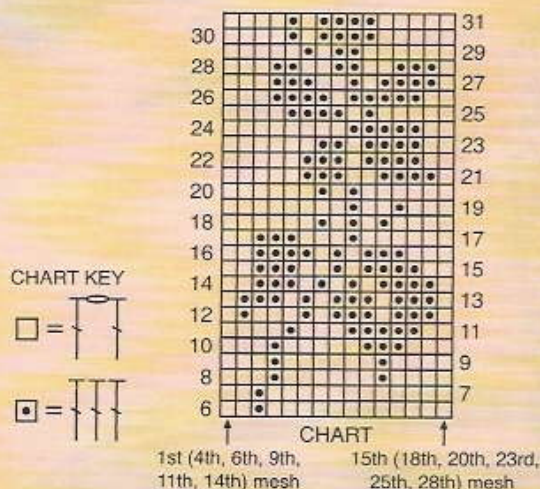
Beginning at Row 2, complete as for first shoulder strap. Fasten off.

FRONT

Work as for Back through Row 5.

Rows 6-31 Work as for Back incorporating Filet Flower Chart as follows:

On WS rows, begin working chart in 1st (4th, 6th, 9th, 11th, 14th) mesh.



On RS rows, begin working chart in 15th (18th, 20th, 23rd, 25th, 28th) mesh.

Read right side rows from right to left.

Read wrong side rows from left to right.

For each open block on chart: Work dc in first dc, ch 1, sk next dc or ch-1 sp, dc in next dc.

For each solid block on chart: Work dc in first dc, dc in dc or ch-1 sp, dc in next dc.

After completing chart, work in Petite Filet pattern until piece measures 13 (13, 13½, 13¾, 14, 14)"/33 (33, 34.5, 34.5, 35.5, 35.5)cm from the beginning. Do not fasten off.

Shape armholes and shoulder straps as for Back.

finishing

Seam shoulder straps and sides.

neckline and armhole edging

With right side facing, join yarn with sl st in armhole seam.

Round 1 Ch 1, sc evenly spaced around armhole, ensuring that there are an even number of

sc; join with sl st in beginning ch-1.

Round 2 *Ch 4, sk 1 sc, sc in next sc; repeat from * around; join with sl st in base of beginning ch-4. Fasten off. Repeat around other armhole and around neckline.

lower edging

With right side facing, join yarn with sl st in lower edge side seam.

Round 1 (ribbon round) Working in free loops of foundation ch, ch 4 (counts as tr); sk first ch, tr in next ch, ch 3, *sk next 3 ch, tr in next 2 ch, ch 3; repeat from * around, ending with sk last 2 (1, 2, 1, 2, 1) ch; join with sl st in top of beginning ch - 35 (40, 43, 48, 51, 56) 2-tr groups.

Round 2 Ch 3 (counts as dc), dc in next tr, dc in next ch, ch 1, *sk next st or ch, dc in next 3 sts or chs, ch 1; repeat from * around, ending with sk last 0 (1, 0, 1, 0, 1) st or ch; join with sl st in top of beginning ch - 44 (50, 54, 60, 64, 70) 3-dc groups.

Round 3 Ch 1, sc in each dc and ch-1 sp

around; join with sl st in first sc - 176 (200, 216, 240, 256, 280) sc.

Round 4 *Ch 4, sk 1 sc, sc in next sc; repeat around; join with sl st in base of beginning ch-4. Fasten off - 88 (100, 108, 120, 128, 140) ch-4 sp.

Weave in all ends.

Using photograph as a guide, weave length of grosgrain ribbon through treble stitches of ribbon round beginning from center front. Tie bow in front.

Weave in all ends. ■

Experiment with the shoulder strap length for a perfect fit.

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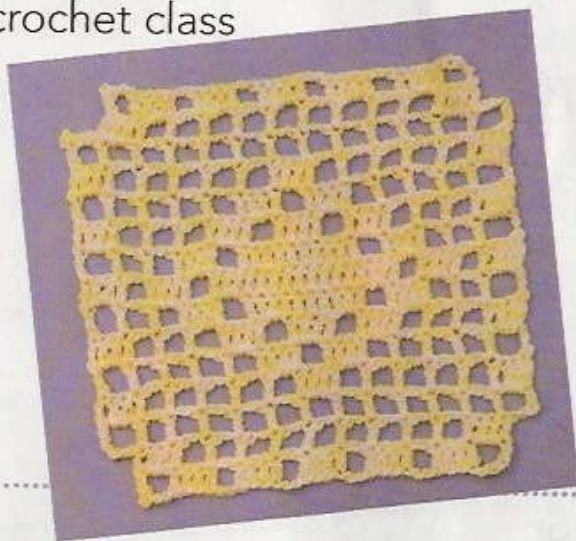
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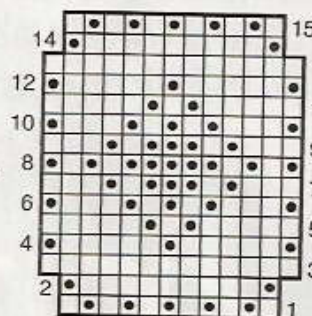
This beautiful and elegant technique is not as difficult as you might think. Once you understand the basics, you'll be making masterpieces in no time.

GETTING STARTED

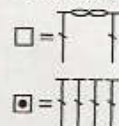
A filet crochet graph or chart illustrates the placement of solid blocks and open spaces to form a motif. Take a look at the chart at right and its corresponding crocheted sample above and keep these basic points in mind:

- The open spaces of the pattern are represented by empty squares on the chart.
- The solid blocks of the pattern are represented with a dot within a square.
- Read odd rows from right to left; read even rows from left to right.
- In *Crochet Today*, a corresponding stitch key explains the stitch combination for each space or block.
- Designs vary; check your pattern for the exact composition of each block.



The key (below) indicates the stitches that make up each square in the chart (left).

CHART KEY



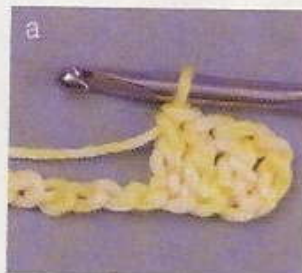
THE BEGINNING CHAIN

Like most crochet, filet begins with a foundation chain. To figure out how many chains you'll need (if your pattern doesn't tell you), count the number of squares in the first row of the chart.

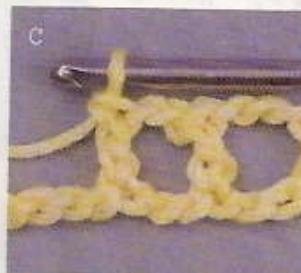
In our sample, each square on the chart is made up of three stitches: the open mesh is created with two chain stitches and one double crochet, while solid blocks are created with three double crochets. To determine the required number of chains to begin your project, multiply the number of squares on the chart by 3, then use the following guidelines:

TIP

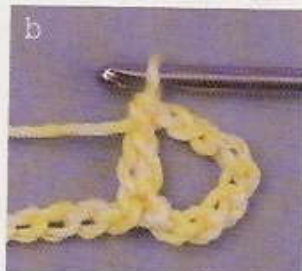
Work into the back bump of the foundation chain for a neat edge.



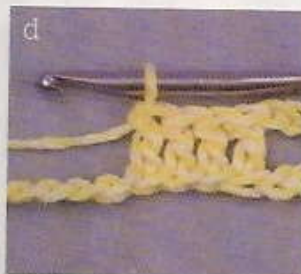
If the chart begins with a solid block: add 3 chains for the turning chain, which counts as one double crochet at the beginning edge of the row. Then work a double crochet into each of the 4th, 5th and 6th chains from the hook to form the first solid block.



If the next square on the chart is an open mesh: chain 2, skip 2 chains, then work a double crochet into the next chain.



If the chart begins with an open mesh: add 5 chains (3 chains for the turning chain, which counts as the first double crochet at the beginning edge of the row, plus 2 chains for the chains of the open mesh). Work one double crochet into the 8th chain from the hook to form the first open mesh.



If the next square on the chart is a solid block: work a double crochet into each of the next 3 chains.

filet crochet

Love the look of filet crochet but think it's too difficult to try? Think again! Though filet may seem intricate, it's actually quite simple—in fact, most filet patterns use only two stitches: the chain stitch and the single crochet. What's easier than that?

Using these two basic stitches, filet consists of a series of open spaces (or mesh), and solid blocks. These spaces and blocks create a gridlike pattern, which can be styled (with the help of a chart) to create motifs ranging from simple diamonds or flowers to an infinite number of intricate designs.

Most any pattern that can be drawn using squares on a graph can be worked in filet crochet. Once you get the hang of things, you'll even be able to easily design your own filet motifs with graph paper. Why not whip up some personalized pillows, curtains or a quick bookmark with your initial or any other simple image?

Follow along with our tutorial and you'll soon be crocheting lots of beautiful creations using this terrific technique. Check out our featured filet patterns in this issue for inspiration.

THE BASIC FILET STITCHES

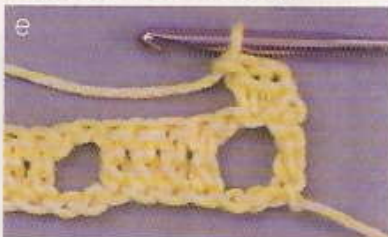
Here's how to create the characteristic grid effect of filet crochet. Follow your chart to determine where to work the open spaces and solid blocks.

Turning Chains

When beginning a new row in filet, you must first work a turning chain.

If the first stitch is a solid block

Chain 3, which counts as the first double crochet of the row. Skip the first stitch of the previous row, then double crochet into each of the next 3 stitches of the previous row.



If the first stitch is an open mesh

Chain 5 (3 chains for the first double crochet of the row plus 2 chains for the first open mesh). Skip the first 3 stitches of the previous row, then double crochet into the next stitch.



Open Mesh Blocks

Working an open mesh over a previous open mesh block

Chain 2. Skipping the ch-2 space of the previous row, double crochet in the next double crochet.



Working an open mesh stitch over a solid block

Chain 2. Skipping the next 2 double crochet stitches of the previous row, double crochet in the next double crochet.



Solid Blocks

Working a solid block over a mesh stitch

Work 2 double crochet stitches into the ch-2 space of the open mesh on previous row. Double crochet into the next double crochet.



Working a solid block over a solid block

Work 1 double crochet into each of the next 3 double crochet stitches.



Ending a Row

To end a row with an open mesh: chain 2, skip the next 2 chains or double crochets, then work a double crochet into 3rd chain of the turning chain.

To end a row with a solid block: work the last double crochet of the block into the 3rd chain of the turning chain.

crochet class

INCREASING AND DECREASING

Increasing and decreasing at the beginning and end of the rows allows you to shape the work and create interesting edgings.

Increasing mesh spaces

Increasing an open mesh at the beginning of a row

Chain 7 (2 chains for the base of the mesh, 3 chains for the turn, 2 chains for the top chains of the mesh), then double crochet into the last double crochet of the previous row.



Increasing an open mesh at the end of a row

Working a triple treble crochet stitch into the same stitch as the last double crochet of the row adds an additional mesh space. After working the last double crochet of the row, chain 2. Yarn over 4 times, insert the hook into the same stitch as the last double crochet of the row, then yarn over and pull up a loop. (Yarn over and pull through 2 loops) 5 times to complete the stitch.



Increasing solid blocks

Increasing a solid block at the beginning of a row

Chain 5, then double crochet into the 4th chain from the hook. Double crochet in the next chain, then double crochet in the next double crochet stitch.



Increasing a solid block at the end of a row

To do this, work 3 treble crochet stitches, working each stitch into the base of the previous stitch. Yarn over twice and insert the hook into the same stitch the last double crochet of the row was worked. Yarn over and pull up a loop. (Yarn over pulling through 2 loops) 3 times. This completes the first stitch of the block.

Next, *yarn over twice, insert the hook into the base of the triple crochet stitch you just made, yarn over and pull up a loop. (Yarn over pulling through 2 loops on the hook) 3 times.* Repeat from * to * once more. This completes the entire block.



Decreasing

Decreasing at the beginning of a row

To decrease at the beginning of a row, work slip stitches to the beginning of the next square on the chart. To decrease one square, chain 1, slip stitch in the first stitch and in each of the next 3 stitches. If the next square on your chart is a solid block, chain 3 to create the turning chain. If the next square on your chart is an open mesh, chain 5 to create the turning chain and the 2 chains of the first mesh.



Decreasing at the end of a row

Decreasing at the end of the row is very easy, you just stop after the last square on your chart has been completed, then turn your work.



Blocking Your Filet

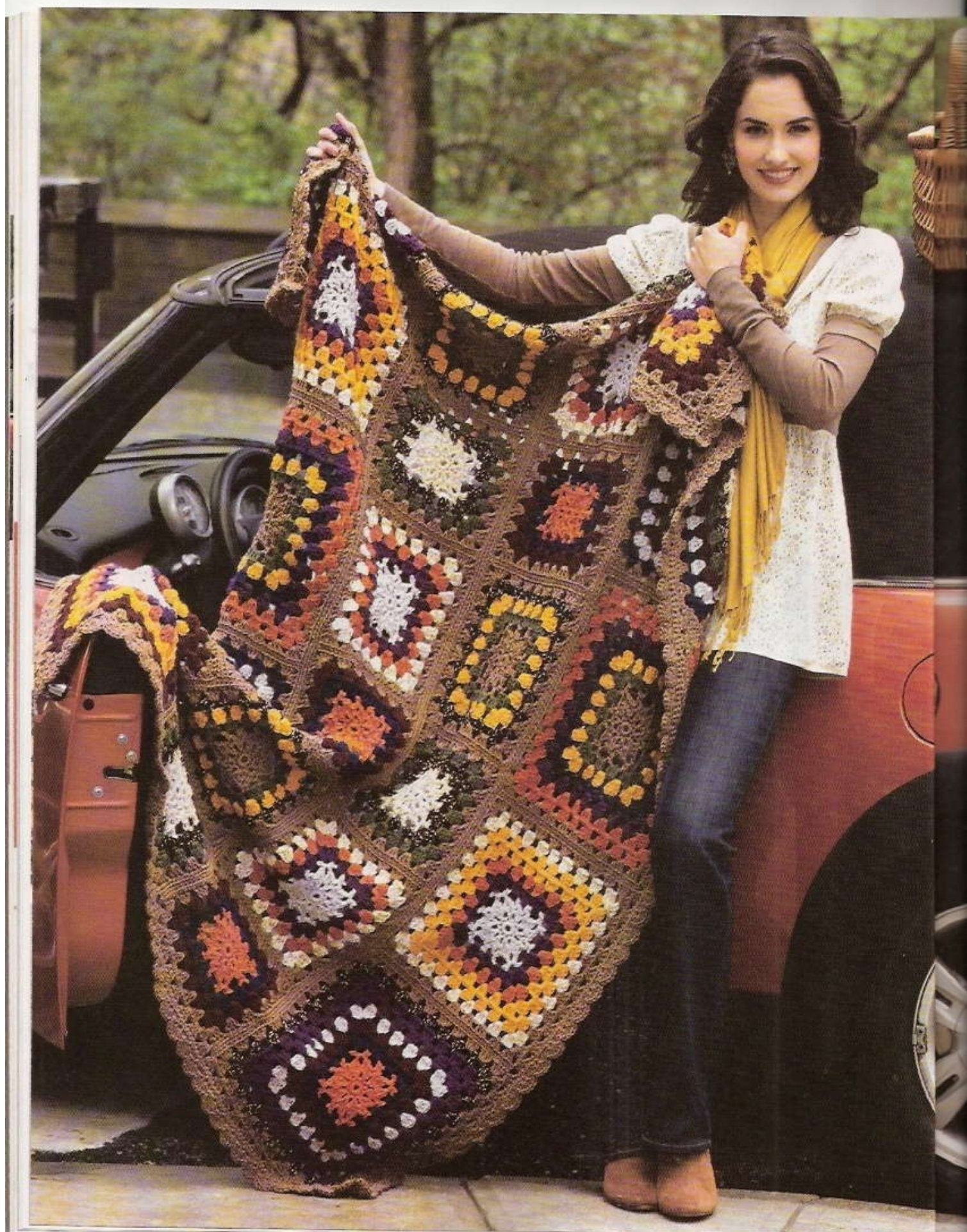
A blocking board printed with a grid is especially helpful for evenly blocking filet crochet, but if you don't have this tool, a piece of foamcore or even a mattress will do. To block your project, pin the piece out on the surface you're using, being sure the meshes open fully into squares and the piece is even along its edges. Spritz the piece with water and allow it to dry. Always read your yarn label for care instructions before blocking your project.


Your Turn to Try

Use our sample chart on page 14 to practice what you've just learned.

- To begin, note that this chart is 11 squares across. $11 \times 3 = 33$ chains. Since the first square is an open mesh add 5 chains for a total of 38 chains. Chain 38.
- Next, begin working Row 1 of the graph. Remember to start reading at the bottom right corner, from right to left. To make the first open mesh, double crochet into the 8th chain from the hook. To make the first solid block, double crochet into the next 3 chains. Continue working according to the chart in this manner to see the design come to life.

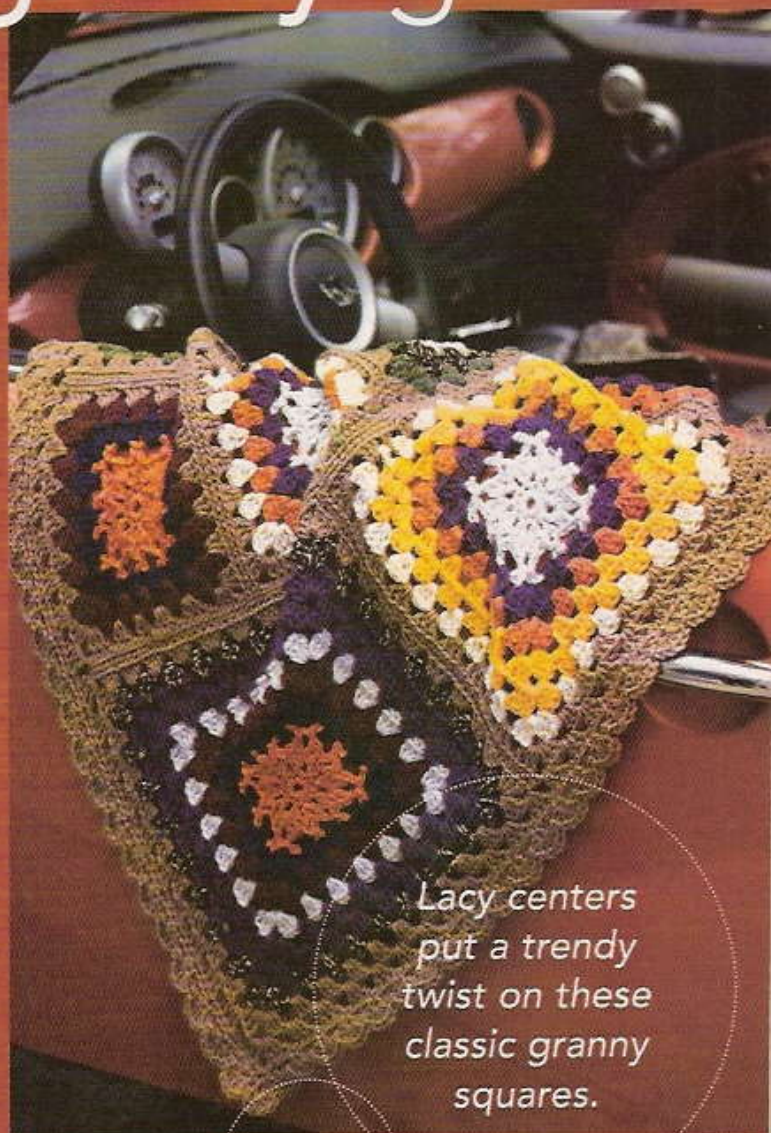

Round 3 Ch 1, (sc, ch 3, sc) in first ch-4 sp; *(2 dc, ch 3, 2 dc) in next ch-4 sp, (sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch-4 sp, (2 dc, ch 3, 2 dc) in next ch-4 sp; repeat from * to *; (sc, ch 3, sc) in last ch-4 sp; sl st in first sc – 10 ch-3 sp.

Round 4 Ch 1, sc in first ch-3 sp; *ch 4, (sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch-3 sp, ch 4, sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 4, (sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch-3 sp, ch 4, sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 2*, sc in next ch-3 sp; repeat from * to *; sl st to first sc – 2 ch-2 sp, 4 ch-3 sp, and 8 ch-4 sp. Fasten off.

With right side facing, attach next color in sequence with sl st to either ch-2 sp.

Round 5 Ch 3 (counts as first dc), 2 dc in same sp as joining; *ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-4 sp, ch 1, (3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc) in next ch-3 sp; (ch 1, 3 dc) in each of next 2 ch-4 sps, ch 1, (3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc) in next ch-3 sp, ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-4 sp, ch 1*, 3 dc in next ch-2 sp; repeat from * to *, join with sl st to first dc – 54 dc, 14 ch-1 sp and 4 ch-2 sp. Fasten off.

With wrong side facing, attach next color in sequence with sl st to the first ch-1 to the left of any corner.

Round 6 Ch 3, 2 dc in same sp as joining; *ch 1, (3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc) in next ch-2 sp, (ch 1, 3 dc) in each ch-1 space across to next corner; repeat from * around to first dc, ch 1, sl st in first dc; turn.

Round 7 With right side facing, attach next color in sequence to first ch-1 sp, repeat Round 6.

Round 8 With wrong side facing, attach next color in sequence to first ch-1 sp, repeat Round 6.

Rounds 9 and 10 Repeat Rounds 7 and 8.

All Motifs

Last Round With right side facing, join H with sl st to the first ch-1 to the left of any corner, ch 3, 2 dc in same sp as joining; *(ch 1, 3 dc) in each ch-1 sp to next corner ch-2 sp, ch 1, (3 dc, ch 3, 3 dc) in next ch-2 sp; repeat from * around to first dc, ch 1, sl st in first dc. Fasten off.

assembly

Weave in ends. Arrange motifs as shown in construction chart. With H, whipstitch through back lps of sts joining motifs to create 4 panels as shown in chart.

finishing

With right side facing of an inner panel, attach H with a sl st in any corner ch-3 sp.

Edging row Ch 1, 2 sc in same ch-3 sp as joining; *sc in each dc and ch-1 sp across to next ch-3 sp, 2 sc in ch-3 sp**, sc in seam, 2 sc in next ch-3 sp; repeat from * across, ending at ** in last ch-3 sp – 219 sc. Fasten off.

Repeat finishing row across inner edge of each panel. With H, whipstitch through back lps to join 4 panels following construction chart for placement.

Border

With right side facing, attach H with sl st to the first ch-1 to the left of any corner.

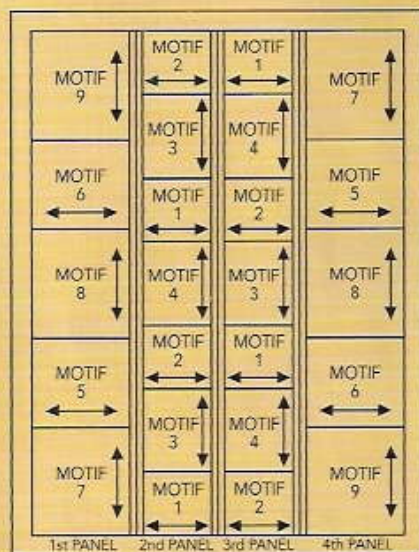
Round 1 Ch 3, 2 dc in same sp as joining; *(ch 1, 3 dc) in each ch-1 sp and each joined ch-3 sp across to next corner ch-3 sp, ch 1, (3 dc, ch 3, 3 dc) in next ch-3 sp; repeat from * around to last st, ch 1, sl st in first dc.

Round 2 Ch 1, *sc in each dc and ch-1 sp across to next corner, (sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch-3 sp; repeat from * around, ending with sc in each of last 4 sts, sl st in first sc.

Round 3 Ch 1, turn; sc in next sc, *(ch 3, sk 3 sc, sc in next sc) across** to next corner ch-3 sp, (sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch-3 sp, sc in next sc; repeat from * around, ending at **, ch 3, sl st in first sc.

Round 4 Ch 1, turn; sc in next ch-3 sp, *5 dc in next sc, sc in next ch-3 sp**, repeat from * to ** to last 2 sc before corner ch-3 sp; 5 dc in next sc, sc in next sc, 5 dc in ch-3 sp, sc in next sc; repeat from * around, ending at **, 5 dc in next sc, sl st in first sc. Fasten off.

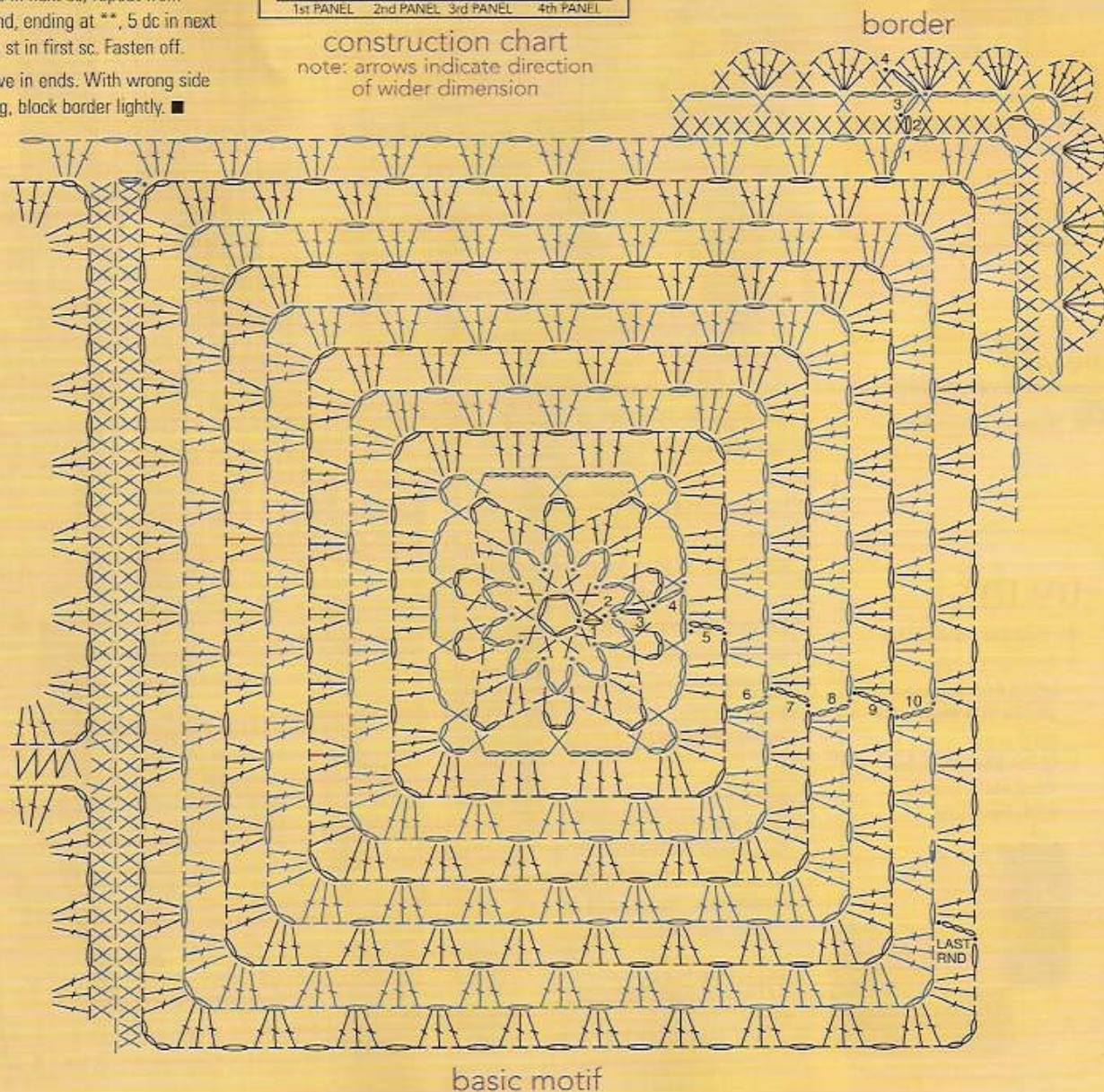

note Stitch pattern is very elastic and will stretch larger than measurements given (2–4"/5–10cm per size). Choose your size accordingly. The A-line shape gives all sizes a generous hip measurement. Instructions for creating a custom-fit are given within the pattern.

gauge

12 hdc and 10 hdc rows = 4"/10cm; 12 dc and 7½ dc rows = 4"/10cm using size J/10 (6mm) crochet hook.

note Row gauge is particularly important in this pattern as the panels are worked side-to-side.

Remember to check gauge for best results!

how to make a gauge swatch

Ch 14.

Row 1 Hdc in 3rd ch from hook and each ch across – 12 hdc.

Rows 2–10 Ch 2, working in back lps only, hdc in each hdc across. Fasten off.

Resulting gauge swatch should measure approx 4" x 4"/10cm x 10 cm. *Adjust hook size if necessary to obtain correct gauge.*

notes

Dress is worked in panels. The center Front and Back panels are worked first and then joined with Fsc at the shoulders. The Side Panels are then worked along the edges of the Front, joining Fsc stitches and Back.

FRONT PANEL right half

With B, work 82 (82, 88) Fsc. Place a marker in the last Fsc made for neck edge.

step 2: Insert hook in base-ch of last Fsc made (be sure to insert hook under 2 lps of the base-ch; the lp at the front or face of the base-ch and the lp on the bottom side of the base-ch), yo and draw up a lp, yo and draw through one lp on hook (base-ch made), yo and draw through 2 lps on hook (Fsc made).

Repeat step 2 for desired number of Fsc.

sc2tog (sc 2 sts together) [Insert hook in next st, yo and draw up a lp] twice, yo and draw through all 3 lps on hook.

Row 1 (right side) Ch 3 (counts as first dc here and throughout), turn, dc in each st across. Place a marker in last dc made for hem edge.

Rows 2 and 3 Ch 3, turn, dc in each st across.

note Row 3 ends at hem edge.

side shaping

Row 4 (wrong side) Ch 3, turn, dc in next st across to last 12 (12, 14) sts, hdc in next 4 (4, 5) sts, sc in next 4 (4, 5) sts, sl st in last 4 sts – 82 (82, 88) sts. Fasten off.

Row 5 Turn, sk first 16 (16, 18) sts of Row 4, join B with sc in next st, sc in next 3 sts, hdc in next 4 sts, dc in each st across – 66 (66, 70) sts.

Row 6 Ch 3, turn, dc in next 45 sts, hdc in next 4 sts, sc in next 4 sts, sl st in next 4 sts; leave rem sts unworked – 58 sts. Fasten off.

Row 7 Turn, sk first 16 sts of Row 6, join B with sc next st, sc in next 3 sts, hdc in next 4 sts, dc in each

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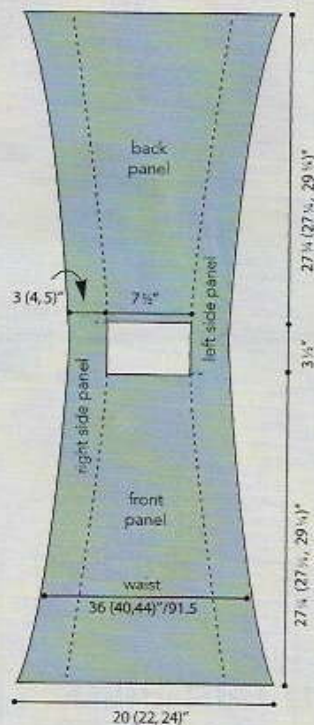

Row 13 Ch 2, turn, working in back lps only, hdc in each st across, work 10 Fsc (for beginning of shoulder) – 92 (92, 98) sts. Fasten off.

left half

With wrong side facing, join B at hem edge with sl st in base-ch of first Fsc of right half.

Row 1 (right side) Ch 3, dc in base-ch of each Fsc across – 82 (82, 88) sts.

Rows 2 and 3 Ch 3, turn, dc in each st across.

note Row 3 ends at neck edge.

side shaping

Row 4 (wrong side) Ch 1, turn, sl st in first 4 sts, sc in next 4 (4, 5) sts, hdc in next 4 (4, 5) sts, dc in each st across – 82 (82, 88) sts.

Row 5 Ch 3, turn, dc in next 57 (57, 61) sts, hdc in next 4 sts, sc in next 4 sts; leave rem sts unworked – 66 (66, 70) sts. Fasten off.

Row 6 Turn, sk first 8 (8, 12) sts of Row 5, join B with sl st in next st, sl st in next 3 sts, sc in next 4 sts, hdc in next 4 sts, dc in each st across – 58 sts.

Row 7 Ch 3, turn, dc in next 33 sts, hdc in next 4 sts, sc in next 4 sts; leave rem sts unworked – 42 sts. Fasten off.

Row 8 Turn, sk first 8 sts of Row 7, join B with sl st in next st, sl st in next 3 sts, sc in next 4 sts, hdc in next 4 sts, dc in each st across – 34 sts. Fasten off.

Do not turn, join A at top of neck edge.

Row 9 (wrong side) Ch 2, working in back lps only, hdc in each sl st and st to the hem edge – 82 (82, 88) sts.

Rows 10–12 Ch 2, turn, working in back lps only, hdc in each st across.

Row 13 Ch 2, turn, working in back lps only, hdc in each st across.

Fasten off.

BACK PANEL

Work as for Front Panel using A throughout.

SIDE PANELS

left side panel

With right side facing, join A at hem edge of Front Panel.

Row 1 Ch 2, working in back lps only, hdc in each st across Front Panel; with right side facing, hdc in 10 Fsc (shoulder) of Back Panel, hdc in each st across Back Panel – 174 (174, 186) sts.

Row 2 Ch 2, turn, working in back lps only, hdc

in each st across.

Repeat last row until Side Panel measures 3 (4, 5)"/7.5 (10, 12.5)cm. Fasten off.

right side panel

With right side facing, join A at hem edge of Back Panel.

Row 1 Ch 2, working in back lps only, hdc in each st across Back Panel; with right side facing, hdc in 10 Fsc (shoulder) of Front Panel, hdc in each st across Front Panel – 174 (174, 186) sts.

Row 2 Ch 2, turn, working in back lps only, hdc in each st across.

Repeat last row until Side Panel measures 3 (4, 5)"/7.5 (10, 12.5)cm. Fasten off.

customize

Before seaming, try the garment on and pull the side edges together at the underarm. The fabric is very stretchy and is intentionally smaller than your actual measurement. If more fabric is desired, add more rows to the side panels or create an underarm panel beginning 8 (8, 9)"/20.5 (20.5, 23)cm below the top of the shoulder on each side.

finishing

Sew side seams leaving an 8 (8, 9)"/20.5 (20.5, 23)cm armhole.

slip stitch embroidery

To create decorative stitching along color changes, join B at hem with sl st where color changes. Sl st around the post of the first row of A colored sts. Repeat for other color change.

flirty hem

With right side facing, join A at lower side seam, sc evenly spaced around entire hem to cause hem to flare slightly.

neck edging

With right side facing, join A with sl st to the right of the B section of Front Panel.

Round 1 Ch 1, sc in same st, sc evenly spaced, working sc2tog at each corner of the square neck, to opposite side of B section, change to B, sc evenly spaced across B section of Front Panel; join with sl st in first sc. Fasten off.

Join A with sl st at center Back neck.

Rounds 2–4 Ch 1, sc in each st around, working sc2tog at each corner of square neck; join with sl st in first sc.

Fasten off.

Weave in all ends. ■

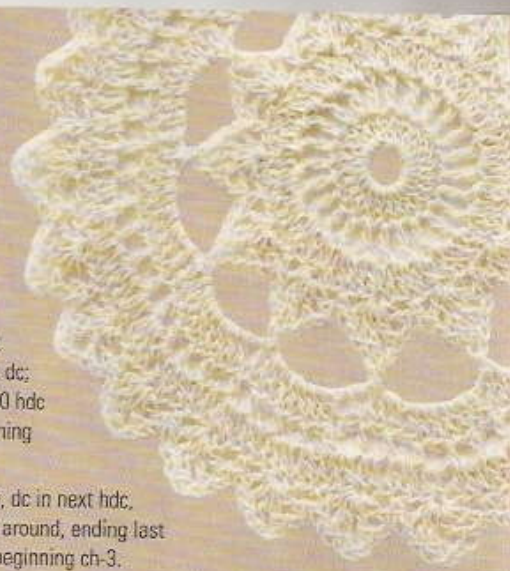
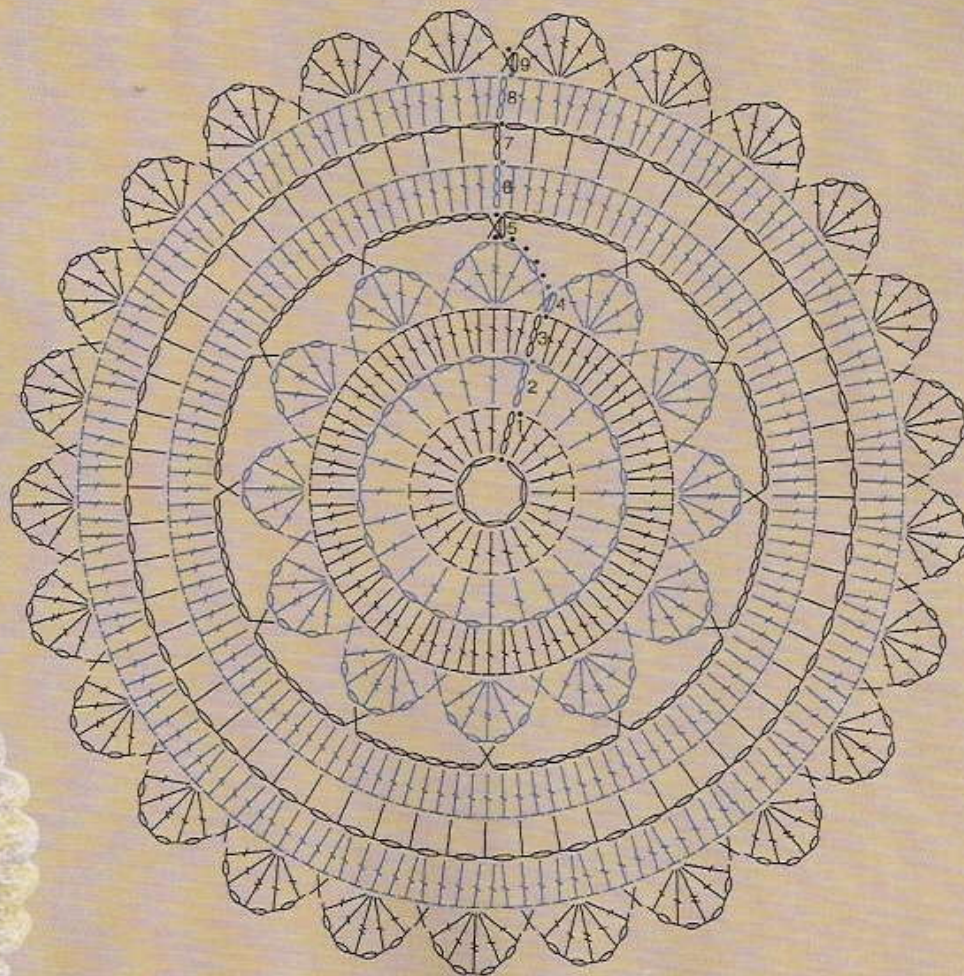

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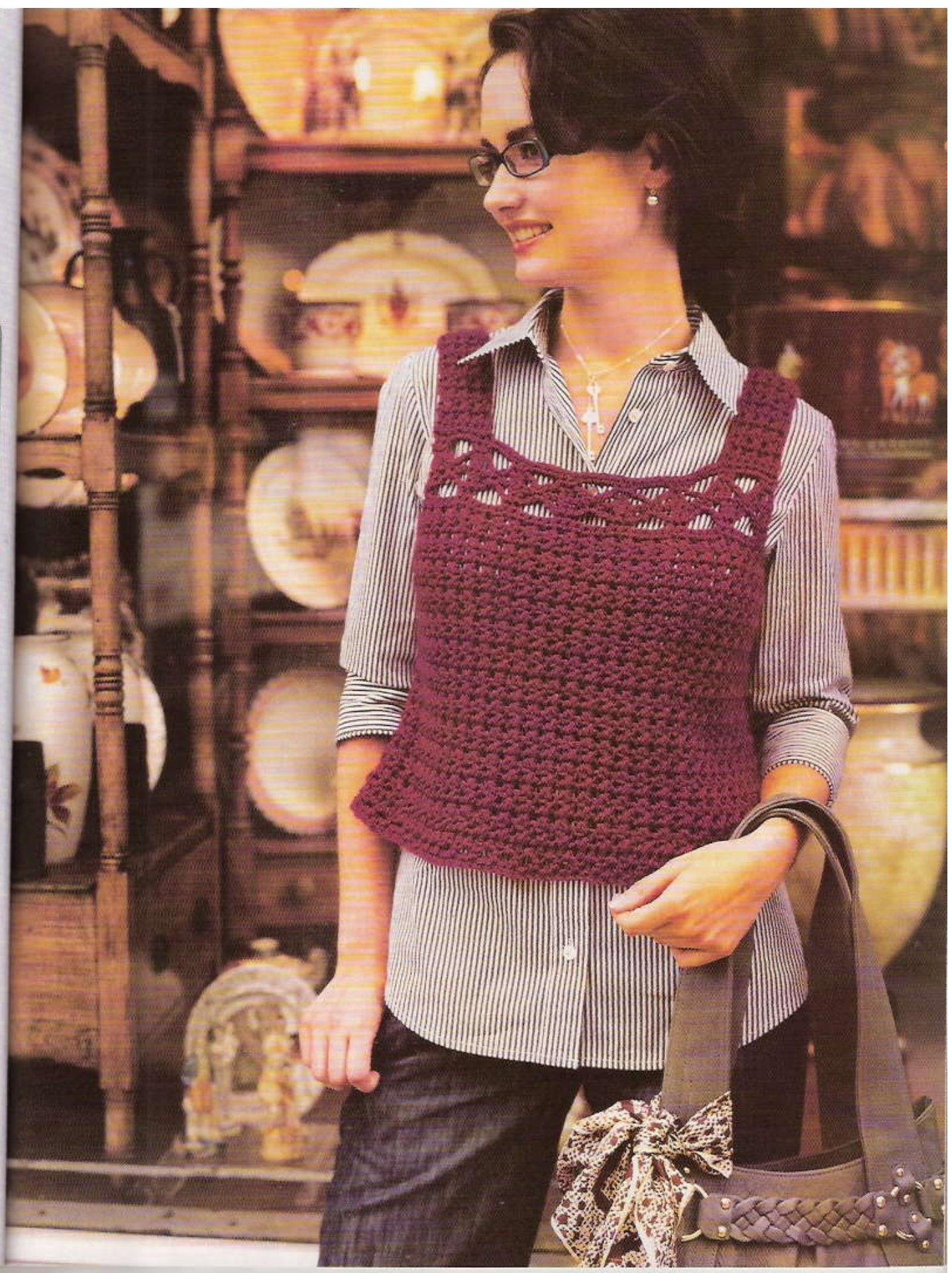

Row 2 Ch 3 (counts as first dc here and throughout), turn, sk first sc, dc in next sc, *ch 2, sc in next ch-6 sp, ch 2, dc in next 2 sc; repeat from * across — 16 (18, 18, 20, 20, 22) dc and 14 (16, 16, 18, 18, 20) ch-2 sp.

Row 3 Ch 3, turn, sk first dc, dc in next dc, *ch 3, sl st in next sc, ch 3, dc in next 2 dc; repeat from * across, working last dc in top of turning ch — 16 (18, 18, 20, 20, 22) dc and 14 (16, 16, 18, 18, 20) ch-3 sp.

Row 4 Ch 1, turn, sc in first 2 dc, *ch 4, sk next sl st, sc in next 2 dc; repeat from * across, working last sc in top of turning ch — 16 (18, 18, 20, 20, 22) sc and 7 (8, 8, 9, 9, 10) ch-4 sp.

Row 5 Ch 1, turn, sc in first 2 sc, *4 sc in next ch-4 sp, sc in next 2 sc; repeat from * across — 44 (50, 50, 56, 56, 62) sc. Do not fasten off.

first shoulder strap

Row 1 (wrong side) Ch 1, turn, sc in first 8 (10, 10, 12, 12, 14) sc; leave rem sts unworked.

Row 2 Ch 2 (counts as first hdc here and throughout), turn, sk first sc, [hdc2tog, ch1] 3 (4, 4, 5, 5, 6) times, hdc in last sc.

Row 3 Ch 2, turn, sk first st, [hdc2tog, ch1] 3 (4, 4, 5, 5, 6) times, hdc in top of turning ch.

Repeat last row until strap, when slightly stretched, measures 4" (4" 5, 5, 5" 5" 5" 5" 11.5, 12.5, 12.5, 14, 14)cm from top of lace edge. Fasten off.

second shoulder strap

With wrong side facing, join yarn with sc in 29th (31st, 31st, 33rd, 33rd, 35th) sc following first shoulder strap (working on last 8 (10, 10, 12, 12, 14) sc of lace edge).

Row 1 Sc in next 7 (9, 9, 11, 11, 13) sc — 8 (10, 10, 12, 12, 14) sc.

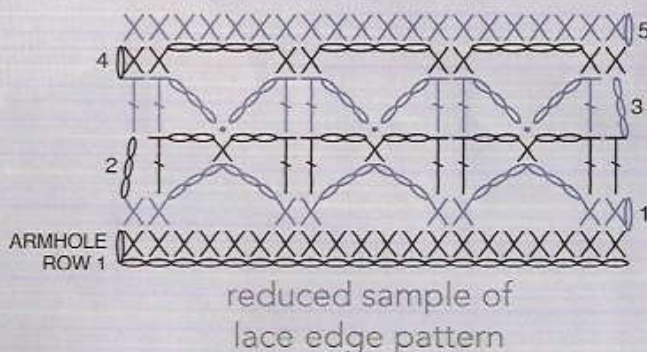
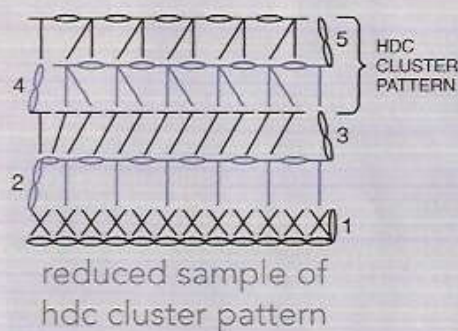
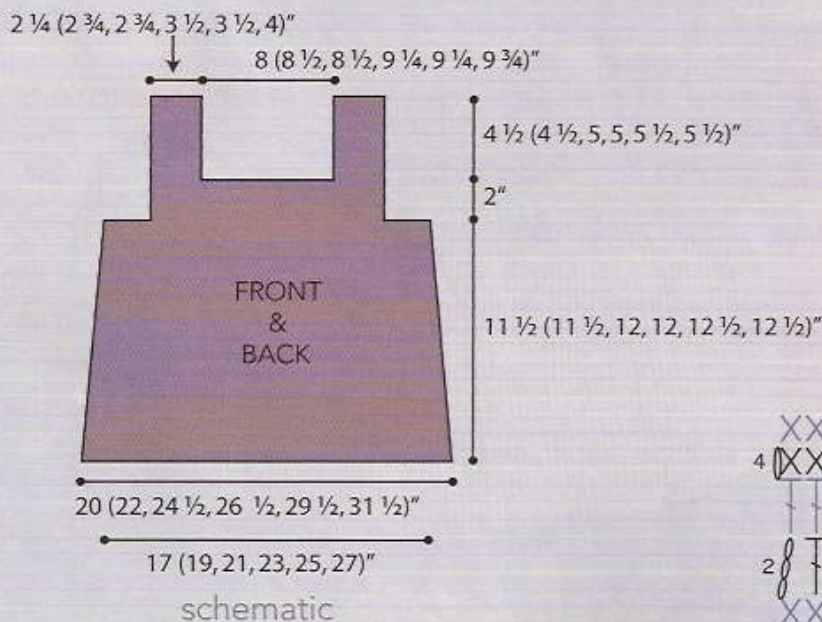

Row 2 Sc in first 3 sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in next sc and in each sc across to last 4 sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in last 3 sc – 32 sc. Ch 1, turn.

Rows 3-19 Repeat Row 2 seventeen times more – 2 more sc in each row than in previous row. At end of Row 19 – 66 sc.

Row 20 Sc in first sc and in each sc across. Ch 1, turn.

Rows 21-48 Repeat Row 20 twenty-eight times more.

Row 49 Sc in first 3 sc, sc2tog, sc in next sc and in each sc across to last 5 sc, sc2tog, sc in last 3 sc – 64 sc. Ch 1, turn.

Rows 50-52 Repeat Row 20 three times more.

Rows 53-84 Repeat Rows 49-52 eight times more – 2 less sc in each 4 rows than in previous 4 rows. At end of Rows 81-84 – 48 sc. At end of Row 84, do not ch 1. Fasten off.

TOP PANEL

With A, ch 13.

Row 1 (right side) Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each rem ch across – 12 sc. Ch 1, turn.

Rows 2-48 Sc in first sc and in each sc across. Ch 1, turn. At end of Row 48, do not ch 1. Fasten off.

GUSSET

With A, ch 25.

Row 1 (right side) Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each rem ch across – 24 sc. Ch 1, turn.

Rows 2-187 Sc in first sc and in each sc across. Ch 1, turn. At end of Row 187, do not ch 1. Fasten off.

FRONT POCKET

With A, ch 31.

Rows 1-20 Work same as Rows 1-20 on Front and Back Panels.

Rows 21-36 Repeat Row 20 sixteen times more. At end of Row 36, do not ch 1. Fasten off.

crochet carry-all

tip

For a colorful kids' book bag, stitch the various sections of this tote in all different colors.

BOTTOM FLAP

With A, ch 31

Rows 1-20 Work same as Rows 1-20 on Front and Back Panels.

Rows 21-24 Repeat Row 20 four times more. At end of Row 24, do not ch 1. Fasten off.

edging

Row 1 With right side facing and working 2 sts from edges, join B with sc in ending edge of Row 19 on Bottom Flap, sc in edge of each row down to Row 2, work 2 sc in edge of Row 2, sc in next 28 sc on Row 2, work 2 sc in edge of Row 2, sc in edge of each row up to and including Row 19 – 66 sc. Ch 1, turn.

Row 2 Sc in first sc and in each sc across. Fasten off.

TOP FLAP

Starting at bottom with A, ch 13.

Row 1 (right side) Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each rem ch across – 12 sc. Ch 1, turn.

Row 2 Sc in first 3 sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in next sc and in each sc across to last 4 sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in last 3 sc – 14 sc. Ch 1, turn.

Rows 3-19 Repeat Row 2 seventeen times more – 2 more sc on each row than on previous row. At end of Row 19 – 48 sc.

Row 20 Sc in first sc and in each sc across. Ch 1, turn.

Rows 21-30 Repeat Row 20 ten times more. At end of Row 30, do not ch 1. Fasten off.

edging

Row 1 With right side facing and working 2 sts from edges, join B with sc in beginning edge of Row 28 on top flap, sc in edge of each row down to Row 2, work 2 sc in edge of Row 2, sc in next 10 sc on Row 2, work 2 sc in edge of Row 2, sc in edge of each row up to and including Row 28 – 66 sc. Ch 1, turn.

Row 2 Sc in first sc and in each sc across. Fasten off.

BOTTOM FRONT STRAP

Starting at bottom with A, ch 11.

Row 1 (right side) Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each rem ch across – 10 sc. Ch 1, turn.

Rows 2-54 Sc in first sc and in each sc across. Ch 1, turn. At end of Row 54, do not ch 1. Fasten off.

TOP FRONT STRAP

Starting at bottom with A, ch 11.

Row 1 (right side) Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in

each rem ch across – 10 sc. Ch 1, turn.

Rows 2-66 Sc in first sc and in each sc across. Ch 1, turn. At end of Row 66, do not ch 1. Fasten off.

SHOULDER STRAPS (make 2)

Starting at bottom with A, ch 11.

Row 1 (right side) Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each rem ch across – 10 sc. Ch 1, turn.

Rows 2-138 Sc in first sc and in each sc across. Ch 1, turn. At end of Row 138, do not ch 1. Fasten off.

assembly

Use photo as guide. Pin wrong side of Sides and bottom edge of Front Pocket to right side of Sides and bottom edge of Front. Pin wrong side of Rows 21-24 on Bottom Flap to right side of Rows 37-40 of Front. Pin wrong side of one long edge of Top Panel to wrong side of top edge of Top Flap and wrong side of other long edge of Top Panel to wrong side of top edge of Back. Pin wrong side of Gusset to wrong side of side and bottom edges of Front and Back with Gusset about $\frac{1}{8}$ "/1.25cm lower than top edges of Front and Back.

Using 2 strands of B held tog for all seams and working 2 sts away from edges, sew back seam through both thicknesses of Back/Gusset and Back/Top Panel. Sew front seam through both/all thicknesses of Front/Gusset, Bottom Flap/Front/Gusset, Front Pocket/Front/Gusset and top edge of Bottom Flap/Front. Sew seam through both thicknesses of top edge of Top Flap/Top Panel. Fold corners at beginning of each strap to back to form a point. Sew down. Center and pin top edge of Bottom Front Strap to top edge of Bottom Flap. Sew seam through both thicknesses around entire perimeter of Strap where it meets Bottom Flap. Repeat with Top Front Strap and Top Flap. Center and pin top edge of Shoulder Straps to top edge of Back, spacing straps approx $1\frac{1}{2}$ "/2.5cm apart. Sew seam through both thicknesses of Straps/Back sewing approx $1\frac{1}{2}$ "/2.5cm x $1\frac{1}{4}$ "/3cm rectangle near top of each strap to secure straps.

Center one buckle over Rows 8-11 of Front Pocket and one buckle over Rows 48-51 of Front. Center 2 buckles over Rows 8-11 on Back spacing approx $2\frac{1}{2}$ "/5cm apart. With A, sew over center bar of buckles, covering bar completely.

finishing

Weave in all ends. ■

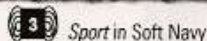
CROCHET HOOK

- Size H/8 (5mm) crochet hook or any size to obtain correct gauge

NOTIONS

- 7"/18cm Coats & Clark navy polyester zipper
- Sewing needle
- Coats & Clark all-purpose navy sewing thread
- Small flat hook and eye closure
- 4"/10cm of grosgrain ribbon, ½"/1.5cm wide
- Yarn needle

SKILL LEVEL: easy

sizes

XS (S, M, L, 1X)

finished waist: 26½ (30, 33, 36, 39)"/67.5 (76, 84, 91.5, 99)cm

finished hip: 34 (37, 40, 43, 46)"/86.5 (94, 101.5, 109, 116.5)cm

finished length: 18 (18, 19, 19, 20)"/45.5 (45.5, 48.5, 48.5, 51)cm

note The skirt is designed to fit snugly with the waist riding low.

gauge

14 esc and 12 rows = 4"/10cm using size H/8 (5mm) crochet hook.

Remember to check gauge for best results!

how to make a gauge swatch

Ch 15.

Row 1 Esc in 2nd ch from hook and each ch across – 14 esc.

Rows 2–12 Ch 1, turn, esc in each ch across. Fasten off.

Resulting gauge swatch should measure approx 4" x 4"/10cm x 10cm. *Adjust hook size if necessary to obtain correct gauge.*

notes

1 Skirt is worked in rows from the waist down to the end of the zipper opening. Then the piece is joined and worked in rounds down to the skirt slit. The final section is worked in rows.

2 The following color and pattern sequence is used throughout: 7 rows of esc worked with A, 1 row of esc with B, 1 row of sc with C, 2 rows of esc with D, 1 row of sc in B.

3 To change color, work the last stitch of the old color to the last yarn over, yarn over with the new color and draw through all loops on hook to complete the stitch.

Abbreviations used in this pattern

special abbreviations

esc (extended single crochet) Insert hook in next st, yo and draw up a lp, yo, draw through 1 lp on hook, yo, draw through last 2 lps on hook.

Fsc (Foundation single crochet)

step 1 Ch 2, insert hook in 2nd ch from hook, yo and draw up a lp, yo and draw through one lp on hook (base-ch made); yo and draw through 2 lps on hook (Fsc made)

step 2 Insert hook in base-ch of last Fsc made (be sure to insert hook under 2 loops of the base-ch; the lp at the front or face of the base-ch and the lp on the bottom side of the base-ch), yo and draw up a lp, yo and draw through one lp on hook (base-ch made), yo and draw through 2 lps on hook (Fsc made).

Repeat step 2 for desired number of Fsc.


Surface sl st (surface slip stitch) Insert hook from right side to wrong side through desired stitch or space, yo, draw lp to right side and through lp on hook (surface slip stitch made). To end a line of surface slip stitches: remove hook from final lp and take hook to wrong side of fabric. Insert hook from wrong side to right side, place lp on hook, draw lp through to wrong side of fabric. Fasten off leaving a long tail. Draw tail through final lp and pull tight.

4 When working in rounds, carry colors not in use on the inside of the work.

5 When working in rows, fasten off the old color after a color change.

SKIRT

With A, work 93 (105, 115, 127, 137) Fsc.

tip

It is not always necessary to fasten off the old color after a color change. If the old color will be used again in the next few rows, you may be able to carry it neatly up the side of the work.

Row 1 (right side) Ch 2 (counts as first esc here and throughout), turn, esc in each st across.

Row 2 Ch 2, turn, esc in next 16 (20, 22, 22, 24) sts, *2 esc in next st, esc in next 18 (20, 22, 25, 27) sts; repeat from * across – 97 (109, 119, 131, 141) esc.

Rows 3 and 4 Ch 2, turn, esc in each st across.

Row 5 Ch 2, turn esc in next 16 (20, 22, 22, 24) sts, *2 esc in next st, esc in next 19 (21, 23, 26, 28) sts; repeat from * across – 101 (113, 123, 135, 145) esc.

Row 6 Ch 2, turn, esc in each st across; change to B in the last st.

Row 7 Ch 2, esc in each st across; change to C in the last st.

Row 8 Ch 1, sc in next 17 (21, 23, 23, 25) sts, *2 sc in next st, sc in next 20 (22, 24, 27, 29) sts; repeat from * across; change to D in the last st. – 105 (117, 127, 139, 149) sc.

Rows 9 and 10 Ch 2, esc in each st across; change to B in the last st of the last row.

Row 11 Ch 1, sc in next 17 (21, 23, 23, 25) sts, *2 sc in next st, sc in next 21 (23, 25, 28, 30) sts; repeat from * across; change to A in the last st – 109 (121, 131, 143, 153) sc. Fasten off.

Rows 12–14 Ch 2, esc in each st across.

Row 15 Ch 2, turn, esc in next 16 (20, 22, 22, 24) sts, *2 esc in next st, esc in next 22 (24, 26, 29, 31) sts; repeat from * across – 113 (125, 135, 147, 157) esc.

Rows 16–18 Ch 2, turn, esc in each st across; change to B in the last st of the last row.

Round 19 Ch 2, turn, esc in next 16 (20, 22, 22, 24) sts, *2 esc in next st, esc in next 23 (25, 27, 30, 32) sts; repeat from * 2 more times, 2 esc in next st, esc in next 20 (22, 24, 27, 29) sts, sk last 3 sts; join with sl st in top of beginning ch; change to C in the last st (the sl st) – 114 (126, 136, 148, 158) esc.

Round 20 Ch 1, sc in each st around; join with sl st in first sc; change to D in the last st.

Rounds 21 and 22 Ch 2, esc in each sc around; join with sl st in top of beginning ch; change to B in the last st of the last row.

Round 23 Ch 1, *2 sc in next st, sc in next 27 (30, 33, 36, 38) sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 28 (31, 33, 36, 39) sts; repeat from * around; join with sl st in first sc; change to A in the last st – 118 (130, 140, 152, 162) sc. Fasten off.

Rounds 24–30 Ch 2, esc in each st around; join with

sl st in top of beginning ch; change to B in the last st of the last row.

Round 31 Ch 2, esc in each st around; join with sl st in top of beginning ch; change to C in the last st.

Round 32 Ch 1, sc in each st around; join with sl st in top of beginning ch; change to D in the last st.

Rounds 33 and 34 Ch 2, esc in each st around; join with sl st in top of beginning ch; change to B in the last st of the last row.

Round 35 Ch 1, sc in each st around; join with sl st in first sc; change to A in the last st.

Rounds 36–42 Ch 2, esc in each st around; join with sl st in top of beginning ch. Fasten off.

Turn piece, sk first 59 (65, 70, 76, 81) sts, join B in front lp only of next st.

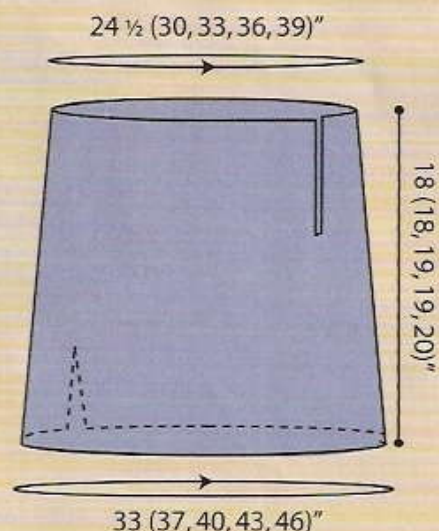
Row 43 Working in front lps only, esc in next 2 sts; working in both lps, esc in each st around (including sk sts); working in back lps only esc in first 3 sts of this round (overlap for slit made); change to C in last st – 121 (133, 143, 155, 165) esc.

Row 44 Ch 1, turn, sc in each st around; change to D in last st. Fasten off.

Rows 45 and 46 Ch 2, turn, esc in each sc across; change to B in last st. Fasten off.

Row 47 Ch 1, turn, sc in each st across; change to A in last st. Fasten off.

Row 48–54 (54, 57, 57, 60) Ch 2, turn, esc in each st across.



Row 55 (55, 58, 58, 61) Ch 1, turn, sc in each st across. Fasten off and weave in all yarn ends.

BELT LOOP (make 10)

With A, ch 14.

Row 1 Sl st in 2nd ch from hook and each ch across. Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.

finishing

Wet block skirt to schematic measurements. (Steam blocking is not recommended for this yarn.)

vertical striping

draw lines Beginning one st over from zipper opening, with sewing marker or chalk, draw a straight line from hem to waist on right side of skirt. *Draw another line one st over from the last line. Draw next line two sts over from the last line. Draw next line eight sts over from the last line; repeat from * around the Skirt 7 (8, 9, 9, 10) times.

work surface sl st

Join B with slip stitch on first drawn line at hem edge of Skirt; work surface slip stitch from hem to waist along line. Fasten off. Join C with slip stitch on next line at hem; work surface slip stitch from hem to waist along line. Fasten off. Join B with slip stitch on next line at hem; work surface slip stitch from hem to waist along line. Fasten off. Continue in this color sequence (B, C, B) around Skirt. Weave in all ends.

zipper

With right side facing, join A with slip stitch at top of zipper opening. Working in ends of rows, work sc evenly spaced down side of zipper opening, sl st in last stitch. Fasten off and weave in ends.

Wet block skirt again to schematic measurements. (Do not use steam.)

Pin zipper to front opening. Sew zipper into opening, taking care to not stretch or pucker the fabric.

hook and eye closure

Cut grosgrain ribbon in half. Tuck in ends, pin and sew to top inside faces of zipper opening. Sew hook and eye closure to grosgrain ribbon.

belt loops

Pin two Belts Loops, side by side, at the center back of the skirt. Pin sets of two Belt Loops equally spaced on either side of center back set, and equally spaced on either side of zipper opening. Using long tails, sew Belt Loops to Skirt.

Weave in all ends ■

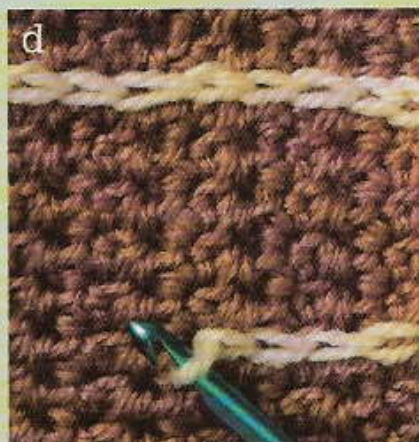
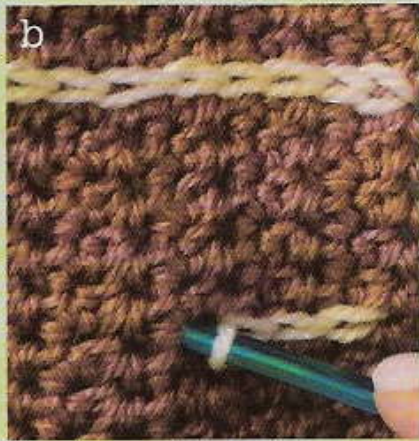
WORKING THE SURFACE SLIP STITCH

a Work with the hook on the right side of the fabric and the yarn on the wrong side.

b Insert the hook from the right side to the wrong side. Yarn over from the wrong side.

c Pull up a loop on the right side.

d Pull the first loop on the hook through the second loop. Repeat steps A through D as many times as necessary.

Round 7 Chain 3, double crochet in same chain as joining, double crochet in next 5 stitches; *2 double crochet in next stitch, double crochet in next 5

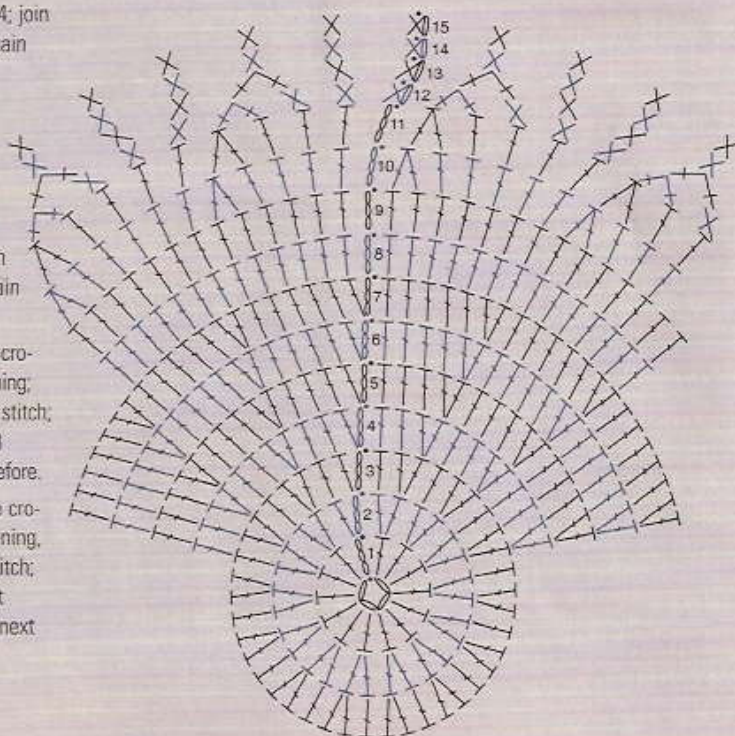

Round 2 Chain 3, double crochet in same chain as joining; *2 double crochet in next stitch; repeat from * around – 28 double crochet. Join as before.

Round 3 Chain 3, double crochet in same chain as joining, double crochet in next stitch; *2 double crochet in next stitch, double crochet in next



stitches; repeat from * around – 98 double crochet. Join.

Rounds 8 and 9 Chain 3, double crochet in next stitch and in each stitch around. Join.

Round 10 Chain 3, double crochet in next 4 stitches, double crochet 2 stitches together; *double crochet in next 5 stitches, double crochet 2 stitches together; repeat from * around – 84 double crochet. Join.

Round 11 Chain 3, double crochet in next 3 stitches, double crochet 2 stitches together; *double crochet in next 4 stitches, double crochet 2 stitches together; repeat from * around – 70 double crochet. Join.

Round 12 Chain 1, single crochet in same chain as joining and in next 2 stitches, single crochet 2 stitches together; *single crochet in next 3 stitches, single crochet 2 stitches together; repeat from * around – 56 single crochet. Join with slip stitch in first single crochet.

Round 13 Chain 1, single crochet in same stitch as joining and in next stitch, single crochet 2 stitches together; *single crochet in next 2 stitches, single crochet 2 stitches together; repeat from * around – 42 single crochet. Join as before.

Rounds 14 and 15 Chain 1, single crochet in same stitch as joining and in each stitch around. Join. At end of Round 15, fasten off.

finishing

Weave in all ends. If desired, sew embellishments to edge of beret as shown in photograph. ■

finished girth: 17 (21, 25, 33)"/43 (53.5, 63.5, 84)cm

gauge

13 sc and 16 rows = 4"/10cm over single crochet in body using size I/9 (5.5mm) crochet hook.

13 sc and 15 rows = 4"/10cm over single crochet worked in back loops (neckband) using I/9 (5.5mm) crochet hook.

Remember to check gauge for best results!

how to make a gauge swatch

With I/9 (5.5mm) hook, ch 14.

Row 1 Sc in 2nd ch from hook and each ch across – 13 sc.

Rows 2–16 Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across. Fasten off.

Resulting gauge swatch should measure approx 4" x 4"/10cm x 10cm. *Adjust hook size if necessary to obtain correct gauge.*

NECKBAND

note Neckband is worked lengthwise.

With A and larger hook, ch 14.

Row 1 Sc in 2nd ch from hook and each ch across – 13 sc.

Row 2 Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.

Row 3 Ch 1, turn, working in back lps only, sc in each sc across.

Row 4 Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.

Rows 5–48 (60, 72, 96) Repeat last 2 rows 22 (28, 34, 46) times. Do not fasten off.

Fold Neckband in half lengthwise (wrong sides tog),

bringing last row up to meet first row. Sc first and last rows tog creating a ring. Do not fasten off.

Fold ring in half widthwise (wrong sides tog, seam on wrong side), bringing ends of rows tog. Making sure that the ribs are straight, secure the seam with pins.

Joining Round Ch 1, working through both thicknesses, sc in the end of each row around; join with sl st in first sc – 48 (60, 72, 96) sc. Do not fasten off.

BODY

Round 1 Ch 1, turn, [sc in next 7 (6, 6, 7) sc, 2 sc in next sc] 6 (8, 10, 12) times, sc in next 0 (4, 2, 0); join with sl st in first sc – 54 (68, 82, 108) sc.

Round 2 Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc around; join with sl st in first sc.

Repeat last round until piece (including neckband) measures 4½ (5½, 7, 9)"/11.5 (14, 18, 23)cm. Do not fasten off.

shape armhole

note The armhole shaping is worked in short rows in two distinct sections: on the underside and on the back.

shape underside armhole

Row 1 Ch 1, turn, sc in first 7 (8, 9, 11) sc; leave rem sc unworked.

Row 2 Ch 1, turn, sc in first 7 (8, 9, 11) sc, work next 6 (8, 8, 11) unworked sc of previous row; leave rem sc unworked – 13 (16, 17, 22) sc.

Row 3 Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, sc in each sc across to last 2 sc, sc2tog – 11 (14, 15, 20) sc.

Row 4 Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.

Row 5 Repeat Row 3 – 9 (12, 13, 18) sc.

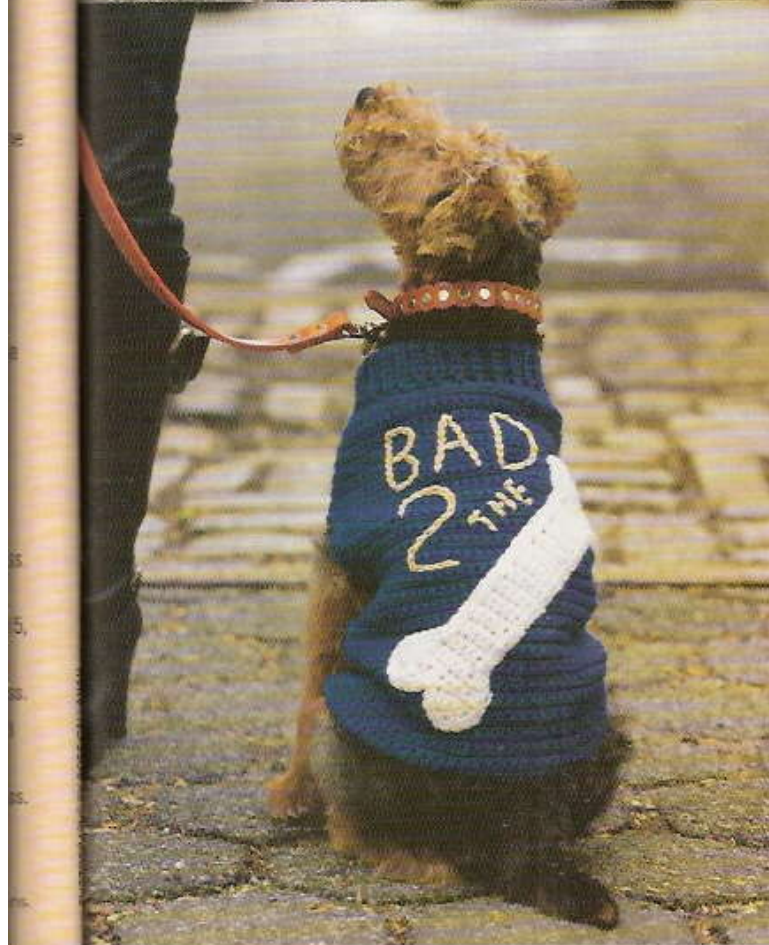
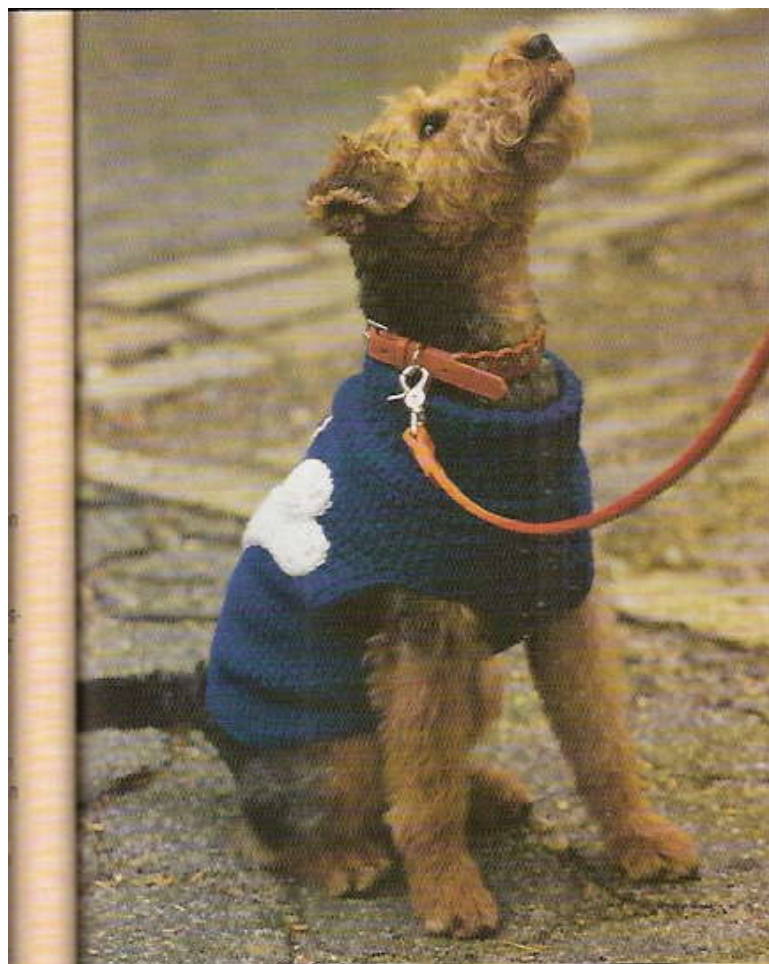
Rows 6–8 (8, 9, 10) Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.

Row 9 (9, 10, 11) Ch 1, turn, 2 sc in first sc, sc in each sc across to last sc, 2 sc in last sc – 11 (14, 15, 20) sc.

Row 10 (10, 11, 12) Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.

Row 11 (11, 12, 13) Repeat Row 9 (9, 10, 11) – 13 (16, 17, 22) sc.

Row 12 (12, 13, 14) Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across. Fasten off.

tip

The rounds of this sweater are joined with a slip stitch; to avoid mistakes, be sure to always skip the joining slip stitch when working the next round.

shape backside armhole

With underside armhole shaping facing you and larger hook, join A with sl st in the 6th (8th, 11th, 15th) sc to the left of the completed underside rows of the body of the sweater.

Row 1 Ch 1, sc in same sc as join, sc in next 30 (37, 44, 57) sc – 31 (38, 45, 58) sc.

Rows 2–12 (12, 13, 14) Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across. Fasten off.

BODY (continued)

Flip sweater so that armholes are facing toward you.

join armhole sections

With larger hook, join A with sl st in the 7th (9th, 9th, 12th) sc of underside section.

Round 1 Ch 1, sc in same sc as join, sc in next 6 (7, 8, 10) sc, ch 5 (7, 10, 14); working in backside section, sc in each sc across; ch 5 (7, 10, 14); working in rem sc of underside section, sc in last

6 (8, 8, 11) sc; join with sl st in first sc.

Round 2 Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc and ch around; join with sl st in first sc – 54 (68, 82, 108) sc.

Round 3 Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc around; join with sl st in first sc.

Repeat last round until piece (from neckband to outer edge) measures 13 (16, 19, 25)"/33 (40.5, 48.5, 63.5)cm (or desired length) ending with a right side row. Fasten off.

BONE APPLIQUÉ Lower end "knobs" (make 2)

With B and smaller hook, ch 2.

Row 1 3 sc in 2nd ch from hook.

Row 2 Ch 1, turn, 2 sc in first sc, sc in next sc, 2 sc in last sc – 5 sc.

Row 3 (wrong side) Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across. Fasten off.

join knobs

With right side of one bone knob facing and smaller hook, join B with sl st in first sc.

Row 4 Ch 1, sc2tog over first 2 sc, sc in last 3 sc, ch 1; with right side of other bone end facing, sc in first 3 sc, sc2tog – 8 sc and 1 ch-1.

Row 5 Ch 1, turn, sc in first 4 sc, sc in next ch, sc in last 4 sc – 9 sc.

Row 6 Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, sc in next 5 sc, sc2tog – 7 sc.

Row 7 Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, sc in next 3 sc, sc2tog – 5 sc. Do not fasten off.

bone body

Rows 1–20 Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across. Do not fasten off at end of Row 20.

begin upper bone end

Row 1 Ch 1, turn, 2 sc in first sc, sc in next 3 sc, 2 sc in last sc – 7 sc.

Row 2 Ch 1, turn, 2 sc in first sc, sc in next 5 sc, 2 sc in last sc – 9 sc.

Row 3 Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.

Row 4 (begin first knob of bone end) Ch 1, turn, 2 sc in first sc, sc in next 3 sc; leave rem sc unworked – 5 sc.

Row 5 Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.

Row 6 Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, sc in next sc, sc2tog – 3 sc.

Row 7 Ch 1, turn, sc3tog – 1 sc. Fasten off.

next knob of bone end

Turn work and skip next unworked sc of Row 3. With smaller hook, join B with sl st in next

unworked sc of Row 3, ch 1, sc in same sc, sc in next 2 sc, 2 sc in last sc – 5 sc.

Last 3 Rows Repeat Rows 5–7 of first half of bone end.

bone trim

With smaller hook, join B with sl st in edge of bone, ch 1, sc in same sp. Work sc evenly spaced around outer edge of bone, working sc2tog at the cleft in the center of each bone end, and working extra sc around the outer curves of the bone ends. Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing bone to backside of sweater.

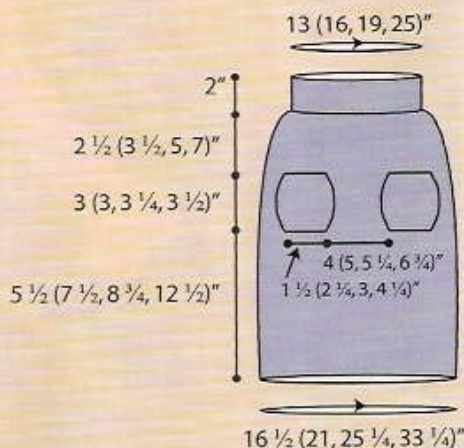
finishing armhole trim

Join A with sl st in edge of armhole. Ch 1, sc in same st, work sc evenly spaced around armhole opening working sc2tog at each corner. Repeat on other armhole.

Using photograph as a guide, sew bone to back of sweater.

With C, and referring to stitch diagram below, embroider letters to sweater using chain stitch.

Weave in all ends. ■

how to make a gauge swatch

Ch 21.

Row 1 Dc in 4th ch from hook (sk chs count as dc), dc in each rem ch – 19 dc. Ch 3 (counts as dc on next row now and throughout), turn.

Row 2 Dc in next st and in each st across, ending with dc in first sk ch. Ch 3, turn.

Rows 3-11 Dc in next st and in each st across, ending with dc in 3rd ch of turning ch-3. Ch 3, turn. Swatch should measure approx 4"/10cm square. *Adjust hook size if necessary to obtain correct gauge.*

LARGE IPOD COZY

(will fit most 20 GB iPods and larger)

note Cozy alternates back and forth between rows and rounds. Starting at bottom, ch 13.

Row 1 (right side) Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each rem ch – 12 sc. Do not turn. Work now progresses in rounds.

Round 2 Ch 3 (counts as dc), 3 dc in same ch as last sc; working in free lps of foundation ch, dc in next 10 chs, 3 dc in next ch; dc in next 11 sc on Row 1 – 28 dc. Join with sl st in 3rd ch of beginning ch-3.

Round 3 Ch 3 (counts as dc), dc in next st and in each st around. Join as before. Fasten off. Work now progresses in rows.

Row 4 With right side facing, join with sl st in next

Rows 6 and 7 Hdc in next 21 sts, working last hdc in 2nd ch of turning ch-2. Ch 2, turn. At end of Row 7, work progresses in rounds.

Round 8 Hdc in next 21 sts, working last hdc in 2nd ch of turning ch-2, ch 6 – 22 hdc and 1 ch-6 sp. Join with sl st in 2nd ch of turning ch-2.

Round 9 Ch 3 (counts as dc), dc in next 21 hdc, dc in next 6 chs – 28 dc. Join with sl st in 3rd ch of beginning ch-3. Work now progresses in rows.

Row 10 Ch 2 (counts as hdc), hdc in next 21 sts – 22 hdc. Ch 3 (counts as dc on next row), turn, leaving last 6 sts unworked.

Row 11 Dc in next 21 sts – 22 dc. Ch 2 (counts as hdc on next row), turn. Work now progresses in rounds.

Round 12 Repeat Round 8.

Round 13 Ch 3 (counts as dc), dc in next 21 hdc



(place marker in 20th hdc worked), dc in next 6 chs – 28 dc. Join with sl st in 3rd ch of beginning ch-3. Fasten off. Work now progresses in rows.

Row 14 With right side facing, join with sl st in marked st on Round 13, ch 3 (counts as dc), dc in next 5 sts, ch 2 (to accommodate headphone jack), sk next 2 sts, dc in next 4 sts – 10 dc and 2 chs. Fasten off, leaving a long end for sewing. Center and sew top of Row 14 to unworked sts at center top of Round 13, sewing edges of Row 14 to unworked sts at left and right ends of Round 13.

FLAP (optional)

Starting at bottom, ch 12.

Row 1 (right side) Dc in 4th ch from hook (sk chs count as dc), dc in each rem ch – 10 dc. Ch 3 (counts as dc on next row now and throughout), turn.

Row 2 Dc in next st and in each st across, ending with dc in first sk ch. Ch 3, turn.

Row 3 Dc in next st and in each st across, ending with dc in 3rd ch of turning ch-3. Ch 3, turn.

Rows 4-9 Repeat Row 3 six times more. At end of Row 9, ch 1 instead of ch 3. Do not turn.

edging

Work 2 sc in edge of Row 9 and in edge of each row along left edge of Flap; working in free lps of foundation ch, 2 sc in first foundation ch, sc in each ch along bottom edge to last ch, 2 sc in last foundation ch; work 2 sc in edge of each row along right edge of Flap – 48 sc. Fasten off, leaving a long end for joining.

joining

Center and whipstitch top of Flap to top of Round 12 above screen window.

finishing

Weave in ends. Center and stitch button to Round 3 below scroll wheel window. Button through dc on Row 1 of Flap. Cozy is stretchy; insert iPod through screen window.

SMALL IPOD COZY (will fit iPod Nano)

note Cozy alternates back and forth between rows and rounds.

Starting at bottom, ch 9.

Row 1 (right side) Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each rem ch – 8 sc. Do not turn. Work now progresses in rounds.

Round 2 Ch 3 (counts as dc), 3 dc in same ch as last sc; working in free lps of foundation ch, dc in next 6 chs, (dc, ch 1, dc) in next ch (ch-1

sp will accommodate headphone jack); dc in next 7 sc on Row 1 – 19 dc and 1 ch. Join with sl st in 3rd ch of beginning ch-3.

Round 3 Ch 3 (counts as dc), dc in next st and in each st around – 20 dc. Join as before. Fasten off. Work now progresses in rows.

Row 4 With right side facing, join with sl st in last dc on Round 3, ch 3 (counts as dc), dc in next 14 sts – 15 dc. Ch 3 (counts as dc on next row), turn, leaving last 5 sts unworked.

Row 5 Dc in next 14 sts, working last dc in 3rd ch of beginning ch-3 – 15 dc. Ch 3 (counts as dc on next round), turn. Work now progresses in rounds.

Round 6 Dc in next 14 sts, working last dc in 3rd ch of turning ch-3, ch 5 – 15 dc and 1 ch-5 sp. Join with sl st in 3rd ch of turning ch-3.

Round 7 Ch 3 (counts as dc), dc in next 14 dc, dc in next 5 chs – 20 dc. Join with sl st in 3rd ch of beginning ch-3. Work now progresses in rows.

Row 8 Ch 3 (counts as dc), dc in next 14 sts – 15 dc. Ch 3 (counts as dc on next row), turn, leaving last 5 sts unworked. Work now progresses in rounds.

Row 9 Repeat Row 5.

Round 10 Dc in next 14 sts, working last dc in 3rd ch of turning ch-3 (place marker in next to last dc worked), ch 5 – 15 dc and 1 ch-5 sp. Join with sl st in 3rd ch of turning ch-3. Fasten off. Work now progresses in rows.

Row 11 With right side facing, join with sl st in marked st on Round 10, ch 3 (counts as dc), dc in next 7 sts – 8 dc. Fasten off, leaving a long end for sewing. Center and sew top of Row 11 to unworked sts at center top of Round 10, sewing edges of Row 11 to unworked sts at left and right ends of Round 10.

Flap (optional)

Starting at bottom, ch 9.

Row 1 (wrong side) Dc in 4th ch from hook (sk chs count as dc), dc in next 5 chs – 7 dc. Ch 3 (counts as dc on next row now and throughout), turn.

Row 2 Dc in next st and in each st across, ending with dc in first sk ch. Ch 3, turn.

Row 3 Dc in next st and in each st across, ending with dc in 3rd ch of turning ch-3. Ch 3, turn.

Rows 4-8 Repeat Row 3 five times more. At end of Row 8, ch 2 instead of ch 3. Do not turn.

edging

Work 2 sl sts in edge of Row 8 and in edge of each row along left edge of Flap; working in free lps of foundation ch, work 2 sl sts in first

foundation ch, sl st in each ch along bottom edge to last ch, work 2 sl sts in last foundation ch; work 2 sl sts in edge of each row along right edge of Flap – 41 sl sts. Fasten off, leaving a long end for joining.

joining

Center and whipstitch top of Flap to top of Round 10 above screen window.

finishing

Weave in ends. Center and stitch button to Round 3 below scroll wheel window. Button through dc on Row 1 of Flap. Cozy is stretchy; insert iPod through screen window.

LARGE HEADPHONE COZY (make 2)

Ch 4.

Round 1 Work 13 dc in 4th ch from hook (sk chs count as dc) – 14 dc. Join with sl st in 4th ch of beginning ch-4.

Round 2 Ch 3 (counts as dc), dc in same ch as joining, 2 dc in each of next 13 sts – 28 dc. Join with sl st in 3rd ch of beginning ch-3.

Round 3 Ch 3 (counts as dc), dc in same ch as joining, dc in next st; *2 dc in next st, dc in next st; repeat from * around – 42 dc. Join as before.

Round 4 Ch 3 (counts as dc), dc in next st; *dc2tog, dc in next 2 sts; repeat from * around – 32 dc. Join.

Round 5 Ch 1, sc in same ch as joining, sc in next 3 sts, sc2tog; *sc in next 3 sts, sc2tog; repeat from * around to last st; sc in last st – 26 sc. Join with sl st in first sc. Fasten off.

finishing

Weave in all ends.

SMALL HEADPHONE COZY (make 2)

Ch 4.

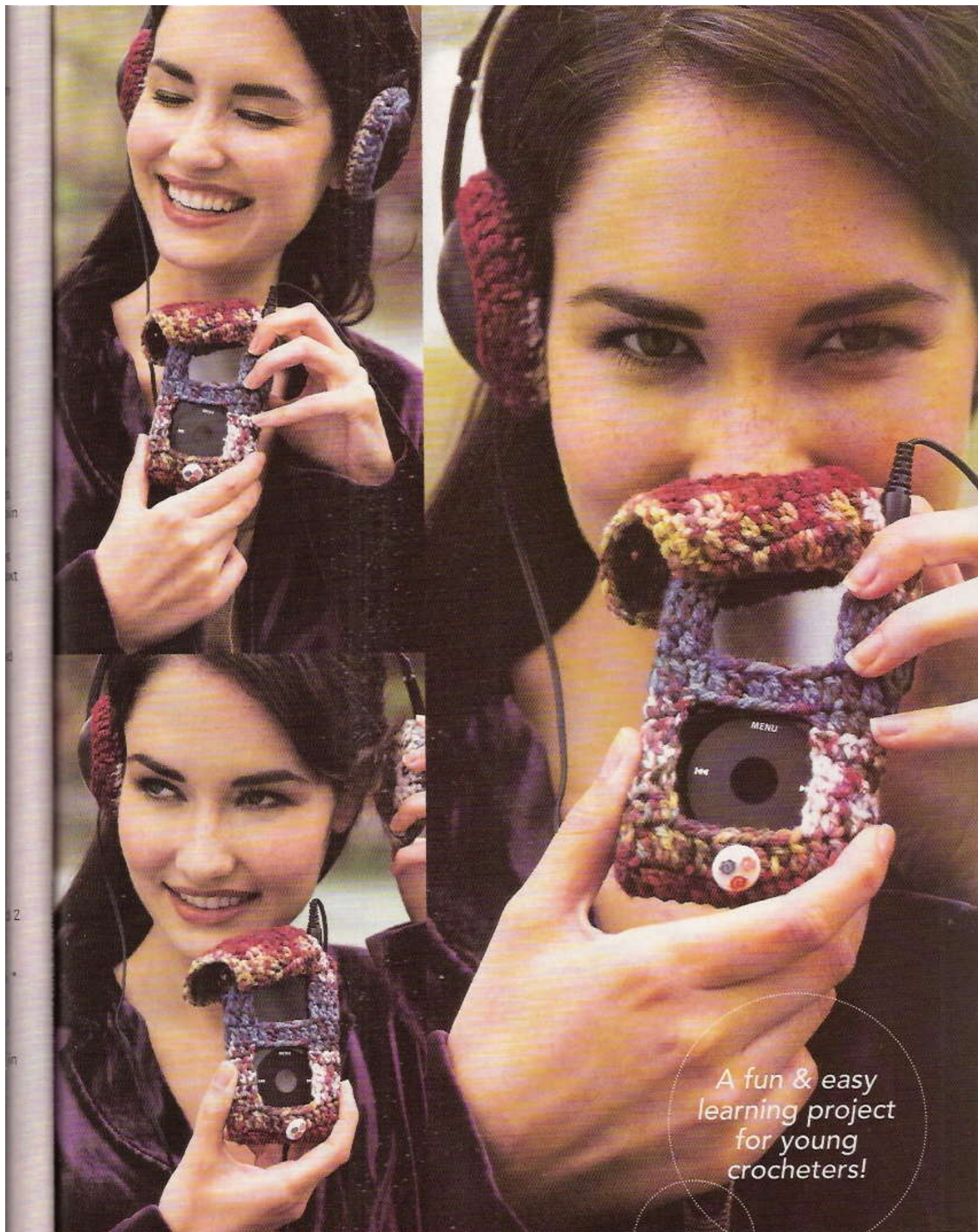

Round 17 Ch 1, sc in same st as join, *[sc in next ch-1 sp, sc in next dc] * to next ch-2 sp (before corner dc), 2 sc in ch-2 sp, (sc, ch 2, sc) in corner dc, 2 sc in next ch-2 sp, sc in next dc; repeat from * 3 more times, sc in next ch-1 sp, [sc in next dc, sc in next ch-1 sp] around; join with sl st in first sc – 49 sc on each side and ch-2 sp at each corner.

Round 18 Sl st in next 3 sc, ch 1, sc in same sc, ch 5, *[sk 3 sc, sc in next sc, ch 5] to 4 sc before corner ch-2 sp, sk 4 sc before corner, (sc, ch 4, sc) in corner ch-2 sp, ch 5, sk 4 sc, sc in next sc; repeat from * 3 more times, [ch 5, sk 3 sc, sc in next sc] to last 3 sc, ch 2; join with dc in first sc (forming last ch-5 sp) – 12 ch-5 sp on each side and ch-4 sp at each corner.

Round 19 Ch 1, 4 sc in first ch-5 sp (formed by join), *7 sc in each ch-5 sp to corner ch-4 sp, (2 sc, ch 2, 2 sc) in corner ch-4 sp; repeat from * 3 more times, 7 sc in each ch-5 sp to last ch-5 sp (formed by join), 3 sc in last ch-5 sp; join with sl st in first sc – 88 sc on each side and ch-2 at each corner.

Round 20 Ch 1, sc in first sc, ch 3, *[sc in 4th sc of next 7-sc group, ch 3] to corner ch-2 sp, (sc, ch 2, sc) in corner ch-2 sp, ch 3; repeat from * 3 more times, [sc in 4th sc of next 7-sc group, ch 3] around; join with sl st in first sc – 13 ch-3 sp on each side and ch-2 at each corner.

Round 21 Ch 1, sc in first sc, *[3 sc in next ch-3 sp, sc in next sc] to corner ch-2 sp, (sc, ch 2, sc) in corner ch-2 sp, sc in next sc; repeat from * 3 more times, 3 sc in next ch-3 sp, [sc in next sc, 3 sc in next ch-3 sp] around; join with sl st in first sc – 55 sc on each side and ch-2 at each corner.

Round 22 (filet round) Ch 4, sk next sc, *[dc in next sc, ch 1, sk next sc] to corner ch-2 sp, (dc, ch 2, dc, ch 2, dc) in corner ch-2 sp, ch 1, sk next sc; repeat

from * 3 more times, [dc in next sc, ch 1, sk next sc] around; join with sl st in 3rd ch of beginning ch – 28 ch-1 mesh on each side and 2 ch-2 sp at each corner.

Round 23 Ch 3, dc in next ch-sp, dc in next dc, *[dc in next ch-sp, dc in next dc] to next ch-2 sp (before corner dc), 2 dc in ch-2 sp, (dc, ch 2, dc) in corner dc, 2 dc in next ch-2 sp, dc in next dc; repeat from * 3 more times, dc in next ch-sp, [dc in next dc, dc in next ch-sp] around; join with sl st in top of beginning ch – 63 dc on each side and ch-2 sp at each corner.

Round 24 Ch 3, *dc in each dc across to corner ch-2 sp, (dc, ch 2, dc) in corner; repeat from * 3 more times, dc in each dc around; join with sl st in top of beginning ch – 65 dc on each side and ch-2 sp at each corner.

Round 25 Sl st in next dc, ch 4 (counts as dc, ch 1), sk next dc, *[dc in next dc, ch 1, sk next dc] to corner ch-2 sp, (dc, ch 2, dc, ch 2, dc) in corner ch-2 sp, ch 1, sk next dc; repeat from * 3 more times, [dc in next dc, ch 1, sk next dc] around; join with sl st in 3rd ch of beginning ch – 33 mesh on each side and 2 ch-2 sp at each corner. Fasten off.

right lower section

With right side facing, join yarn with sl st in any corner.

Row 1 Ch 4 (counts as dc, ch 1 here and throughout), sk next ch-sp, dc in next dc, *ch 1, sk next ch-sp, dc in next dc; repeat from * 31 more times; leave rem sts unworked – 33 mesh.

Row 2 Ch 1, turn, sl st in first dc, sl st in next ch-1 sp, sl st in next dc (1 mesh decrease – lower edge of top), ch 4, sk next ch-sp, dc in next dc, *ch 1, sk next ch-sp, dc in next dc; repeat from * across – 32 mesh.

Row 3 Ch 3 (counts as dc here and throughout), turn, *dc in next ch-sp, dc in next dc; repeat from * across to last ch-1 sp; leave rem sts unworked – 63 dc.

Row 4 Ch 1, turn, sl st in first 3 dc, ch 4, sk next dc, dc in next dc, *ch 1, sk next dc, dc in next dc; repeat from * across – 30 mesh.

Row 5 Ch 3, turn, *dc in next ch-sp, dc in next dc; repeat from * across to last mesh; leave last mesh unworked – 59 dc.

Continue in established pattern, decreasing 1 mesh on every row at lower edge and working in 6-row pattern repeat of (3 mesh rows, 1 dc row, 1 mesh row, 1 dc row), until only 1 mesh remains. Fasten off.

left lower section

With right side facing, join yarn in 2nd dc after next corner dc of center square.

Row 1 Ch 4 (counts as dc, ch 1 here and throughout), sk next ch-sp, dc in next dc, *ch 1, sk next ch-

sp, dc in next dc; repeat from * across side working last dc in corner dc – 33 mesh.

Row 2 Ch 4, turn, sk next ch-sp, dc in next dc, *ch 1, sk next ch-sp, dc in next dc; repeat from * across to last ch-1 sp (1 mesh decrease – lower edge of top); leave rem sts unworked – 32 mesh.

Row 3 Ch 1, turn, sl st in first dc, sl st in next ch-1 sp, sl st in next dc, ch 3 (counts as dc here and throughout), *dc in next ch-sp, dc in next dc; repeat from * across – 63 dc.

Row 4 Ch 4, turn, sk next dc, dc in next dc, *ch 1, sk next dc, dc in next dc; repeat from * across to last 2 dc; leave rem sts unworked – 30 mesh.

Row 5 Ch 1, turn, sl st in first dc, sl st in next ch-1 sp, sl st in next dc, ch 3, *dc in next ch-sp, dc in next dc; repeat from * across – 59 dc.

Continue in established pattern, decreasing 1 mesh on every row at lower edge and working in 6-row pattern repeat of (3 mesh rows, 1 dc row, 1 mesh row, 1 dc row), until only 1 mesh remains. Fasten off.

left side

With right side facing, join yarn in left lower edge.

Row 1 Ch 1, sc in same st, work 126 sc evenly spaced along edge ending at neck edge – 127 sc.

Row 2 Ch 3 (counts as first dc here and throughout), turn, dc in each sc across to last sc, 2 dc in last sc (increase made – lower edge of top) – 128 dc.

Rows 3 and 4 Ch 3, turn, dc in each dc across.

Row 5 Ch 1, turn, sc in first dc, ch 5, sk 2 dc, sc in next dc, *ch 5, sk 3 dc, sc in next dc; repeat from * across – 32 ch-5 sp.

Row 6 Ch 1, turn, sc in first sc, ch 2, sc in 3rd ch of next ch-5, *ch 3, sc in 3rd ch of next ch-5; repeat from * across, ch 2, sc in last sc – 31 ch-3 sp across side and 2 ch-2 sp at each end.

Row 7 Ch 1, turn, sc in first sc, 2 sc in next ch-2 sp, sc in next sc, *3 sc in next ch-3 sp, sc in next sc; repeat from * across to last ch-2 sp, 2 sc in ch-2 sp, sc in last sc – 131 sc.

Row 8 Ch 3, turn, dc in next sc and each sc across to last sc, 2 dc in last sc – 132 dc.

Row 9 Ch 3, turn, dc in each dc across. Fasten off.

shape armhole

With wrong side facing, sk first 40 (40, 44, 44, 48, 48) dc of Row 9, join yarn in next dc.

Row 10 Ch 3, dc in rem 91 (91, 87, 87, 83, 83) dc – 92 (92, 88, 88, 84, 84) dc.

Row 11 Ch 3, turn, dc in each dc across.

Repeat last row 0 (2, 5, 7, 10, 12) more times. Fasten off.

right side

With right side facing, join yarn in right neck edge.

Row 1 Ch 1, sc in same st, work 126 sc evenly spaced along edge ending at lower edge – 127 sc.

Row 2 Ch 3 (counts as first dc here and throughout), turn, dc in first sc (increase made – lower edge of top) dc in each sc across – 128 dc.

Rows 3 and 4 Ch 3, turn, dc in each dc across.

Row 5 Ch 1, turn, sc in first dc, *ch 5, sk 3 dc,

sc in next dc; repeat from * across to last 3 dc, ch 5, sk 2 dc, sc in last dc – 32 ch-5 sp.

Row 6 Ch 1, turn, sc in first sc, ch 2, sc in 3rd ch of next ch-5, *ch 3, sc in 3rd ch of next ch-5; repeat from * across, ch 2, sc in last sc – 31 ch-3 sp across side and 2 ch-2 sp at each end.

Row 7 Ch 1, turn, sc in first sc, 2 sc in next ch-2 sp, sc in next sc, *3 sc in next ch-3 sp, sc in next sc; repeat from * across to last ch-2 sp, 2 sc in ch-2 sp, sc in last sc – 131 sc.

Row 8 Ch 3, turn, dc in first sc (increase made), dc in next sc and each sc across – 132 dc.

Row 9 Ch 3, turn, dc in each dc across.

shape armhole

Row 10 Ch 3, turn, dc in next 91 (91, 87, 87, 83, 83) dc; leave rem sts unworked – 92 (92, 88, 88, 84, 84) dc.

Row 11 Ch 3, turn, dc in each dc across.

Repeat last row 0 (2, 5, 7, 10, 12) more times. Fasten off.

finishing

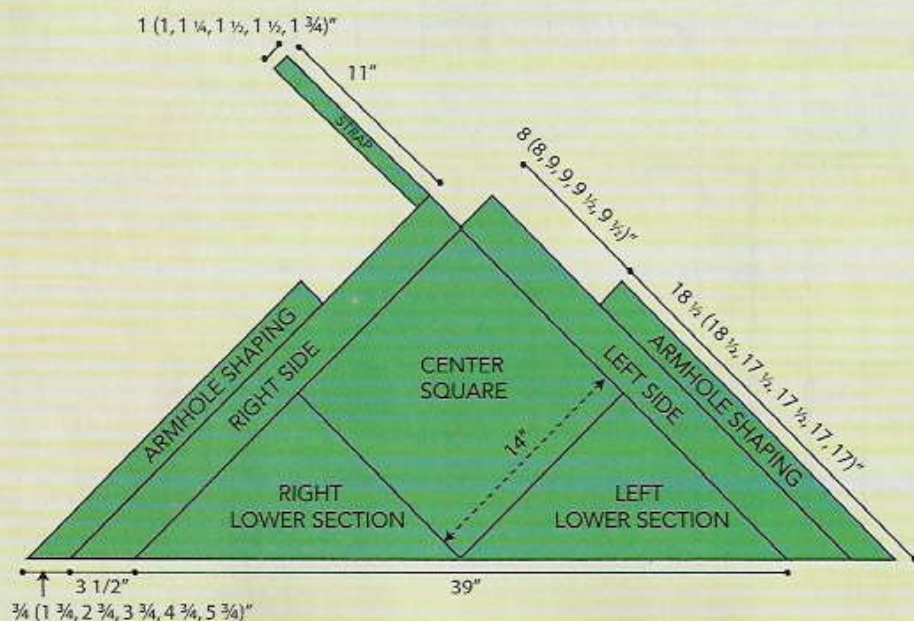
Block Front and Back to measurements.

lower edge (work on both pieces, Front and Back, separately)

To even lower edge, join yarn in corner of lower edge, ch 1, sc in same st.

Row 1 *Ch 3, sc in next point; repeat from * across.

Row 2 Ch 1, turn, *sl st in next ch-3 sp, [ch 4, sl st in same ch-3 sp] twice, sl st in next ch-3 sp; repeat from * across. Fasten off.



lacy swing top



Working on wrong sides, sl st side edges of Front and Back together.

neck trim and strap (work on both pieces, Front and Back, separately)

With right side facing, join yarn in top of V-neck opening.

Row 1 Ch 1, sc in same st, work sc evenly spaced along V-neck opening; pivot work to work along top of armhole, work sc in first 5 (5, 6, 7, 7, 8) sts along top of armhole for beginning of strap.

Row 2 Ch 1, turn, sc in first 5 (5, 6, 7, 7, 8) sc; leave rem sts unworked.

Row 3 Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.

Repeat last row until strap measures 11"/28cm. Fasten off.

Sew ends of straps to the top of the opposite armhole.

stabilize armholes

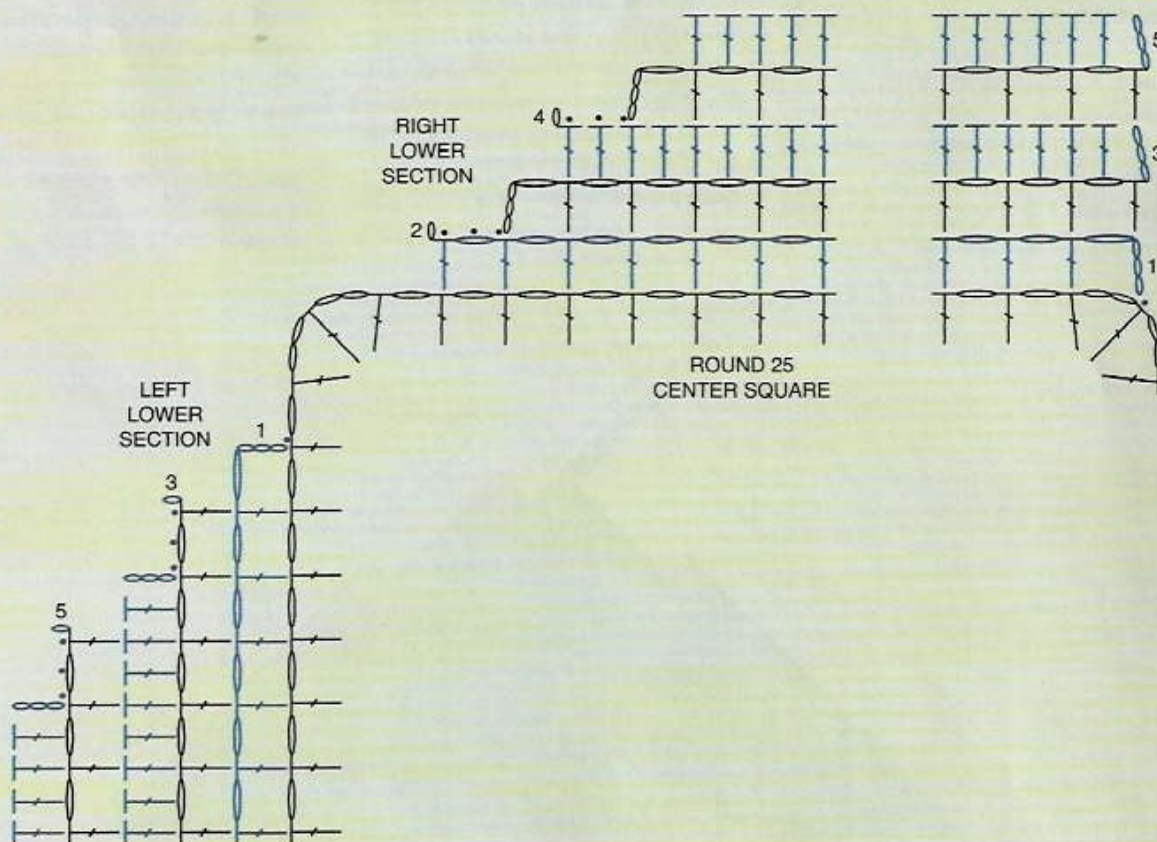

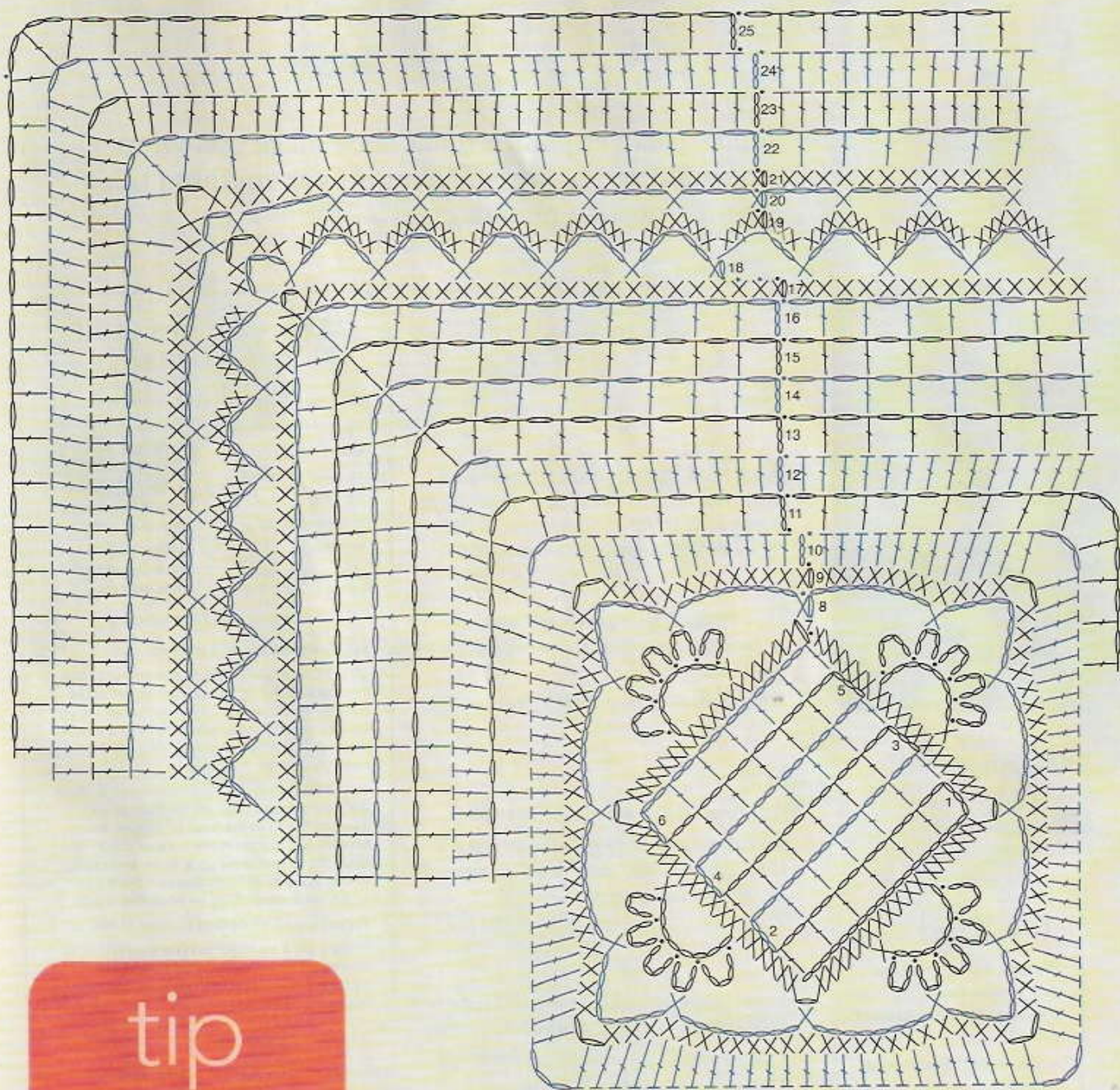

stabilize neck

With right side facing, join yarn at center of Back V-neck. Work sl st evenly around V-neck opening and strap edges; join with sl st in first st. Fasten off.

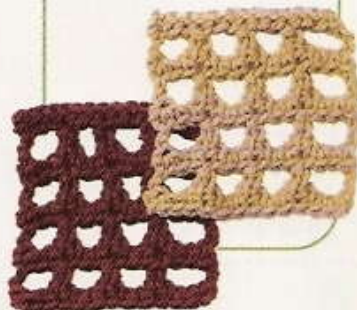

gauge

7 sc = 4"/10cm; 2 mesh and 4 rows (2 mesh) = 3½"/9cm over pattern as established using size N/15 (10mm) crochet hook.

Remember to check gauge for best results!

how to make a gauge swatch

Sc 10.

Work Pattern Rows 1 and 2 twice. Fasten off.

Resulting gauge swatch should measure approx 5¼" x 4½"/13.5cm x 11.5cm. Adjust hook size if necessary to obtain correct gauge.

MESH STITCH PATTERN

step 2 Insert hook in base-ch of last Fsc made (be sure to insert hook under 2 lps of the base-ch; the lp at the front or face of the base-ch and the lp on the bottom side of the base-ch), yo and draw up a lp, yo and draw through one lp on hook (base-ch made), yo and draw through 2 lps on hook (Fsc made). Repeat step 2 for desired number of Fsc.

Row 5 Ch 7, working from left to right, sl st in first sc, *sc in last 2 ch just made, mark the last of these ch, ch 4, sk next sc, sl st in next sc; repeat from * across to last sc, sc in last 2 ch just made, mark the last of these ch, ch 2, turn, dc in last sc — 36 mesh.

both sizes

Row 6 Work Pattern Row 2 — 97 (109, 124) sc.

Mark row edge of last sc of Row 6 for button loop placement.

Work even as follows: Repeat Pattern Rows 1 and 2, 2 (3, 4) times, or for desired length of Capelet before lace, end by working Pattern Row 2 — 97 (109, 124) sc. Do not fasten off.

LACE

sizes S/M (L/1X) only

Row 1 Ch 3, turn, sk first sc, dc in next sc, *ch 4, sk next 2 sc, sc in next 5 sc, ch 4, sk next 2 sc, dc in next 3 sc; repeat from * 7 (8) more times, omitting last dc — 8 (9) lace repeats.

Row 2 Ch 3, turn, dc in first dc, dc in next dc, *ch 4, sk next ch-4 sp, sk next sc, sc in next 3 sc, ch 4, sk next sc, sk next ch-4 sp, 2 dc in next dc, (dc, ch 4, dc) in next dc, 2 dc in next dc; repeat from * 6 (7) more times; ch 4, sk next ch-4 sp, sk next sc, sc in next 3 sc, ch 4, sk next sc, sk next ch-4 sp, dc in next dc, 2 dc in top of turning ch.

Row 3 Ch 3, turn, dc in first 3 dc, *ch 4, sk next ch-4 sp, sk next sc, sc in next sc, ch 4, sk next sc, sk next ch-4 sp, dc in next 3 dc, ch 4, sc in next ch-4 sp, ch 4, dc in next 3 dc; repeat from * 6 (7) more times; ch 4, sk next ch-4 sp, sk next sc, sc in next sc, ch 4, sk next sc, sk next ch-4 sp, dc in next 2 dc, 2 dc in top of turning ch.

Row 1 Ch 3, turn, dc in first sc, dc in next 2 sc, *ch 4, sk next 2 sc, sc in next 5 sc, ch 4, sk next 2 sc, dc in next 3 sc; repeat from * 9 more times, dc in last sc — 10 lace repeats.

Row 2 Ch 3, turn, sk first dc, dc in next 3 dc, *ch 4, sk next ch-4 sp, sk next sc, sc in next 3 sc, ch 4, sk next sc, sk next ch-4 sp, 2 dc in next dc, (dc, ch 4, dc) in next dc, 2 dc in next dc; repeat from * 8 more

times; ch 4, sk next ch-4 sp, sk next sc, sc in next 3 sc, ch 4, sk next sc, sk next ch-4 sp, dc in next 3 dc, dc in top of turning ch.

Row 3 Ch 3, turn, sk first dc, dc in next 3 dc, *ch 4, sk next ch-4 sp, sk next sc, sc in next sc, ch 4, sk next sc, sk next ch-4 sp, dc in next 3 dc, ch 4, sc in next ch-4 sp, ch 4, dc in next 3 dc; repeat from * 8 more times; ch 4, sk next ch-4 sp, sk next sc, sc in next sc, ch 4, sk next sc, sk next ch-4 sp, dc in next 3 dc, dc in top of turning ch.

all sizes

Row 4 Ch 3, turn, dc in first dc, ch 4, *dc in next 3 dc, sk next ch-4 sp, sk next sc, sk next ch-4 sp, dc in next 3 dc, ch 4, [sc in next ch-4 sp, ch 4] 2 times; repeat from * 6 (7, 8) times; dc in next 3 dc, sk next ch-4 sp, sk next sc, sk next ch-4 sp, dc in next 3 dc, ch 4, 2 dc in top of turning ch.

Row 5 (wrong side) Ch 3, turn, sk first dc, dc in next dc, ch 4, sk next ch-4 sp, *dc6tog, ch 4, [sc in next ch-4 sp, ch 4] 3 times; repeat from * 6 (7, 8) times, dc6tog, ch 4, sk next ch-4 sp, dc in next dc, dc in top of turning ch — 30 (34, 38) ch-4 sp.

finishing edging (right side) scallop lower edge

Ch 3, turn, dc in first dc, (sl st, ch 3, dc) in each ch-4 sp across, sl st in top of turning ch — 31 (35, 39) scallops. Do not fasten off.

fronts and neck

Pivot to work in ends of rows along front edge, work 2 sc in ends of next 5 dc rows, [sc in end of next sc row, 2 sc in end of next dc row] to marker at base of V-neck shaping, ch 2 (button loop), [sc in end of next sc row, 2 sc in end of next dc row] to neck ch, sc in each ch of neck, [2 sc in end of next dc row, sc in end of next sc row] to lace rows, 2 dc in ends of next 5 dc rows of lace, sl st in base of beg ch-3. Fasten off.

Weave in all ends. Block Capelet to open up lace pattern.

button

With smaller hook and leaving a long tail, wrap yarn twice around finger to form a ring, insert hook into ring, yo and draw up a loop, ch 1, work 6 sc firmly in ring, sl st in first sc. Fasten off leaving a long tail. Thread ending tail on yarn needle, sew tail into wrong side of button. Pull on beginning tail to tighten ring at center of button, knot two tails to secure, use tails to attach button to left front, opposite button loop. ■

HOW TO WORK THE FOUNDATION SINGLE CROCHET

Step 1

a Chain 2 and insert hook in the 2nd chain from the hook, under the back loop of the chain and the bump on the back of the chain. Yarn over and pull up a loop.

b Yarn over and pull through one loop on hook; this makes one base chain.

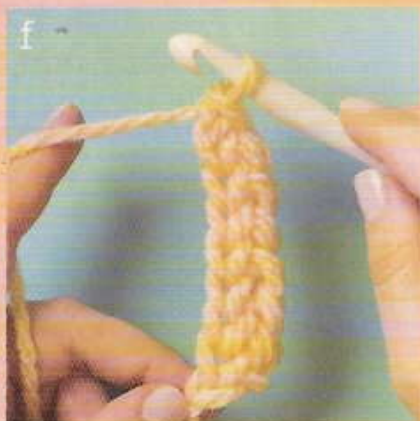
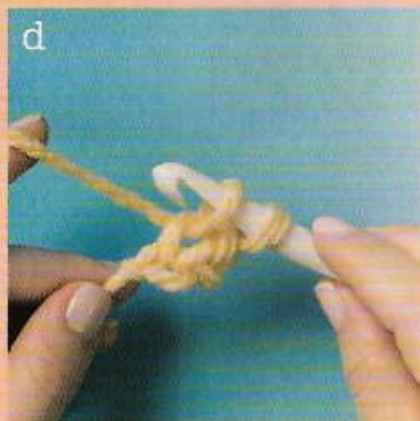
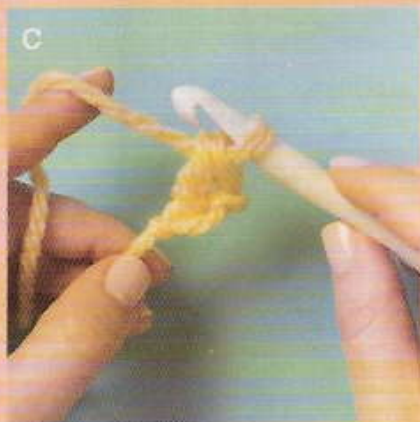
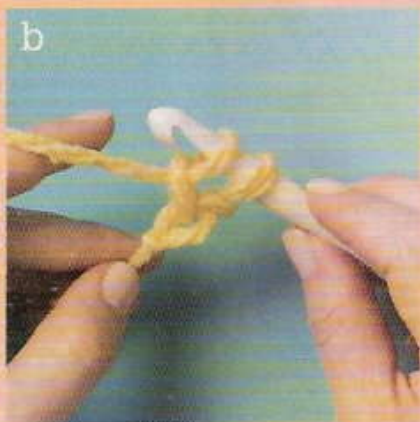
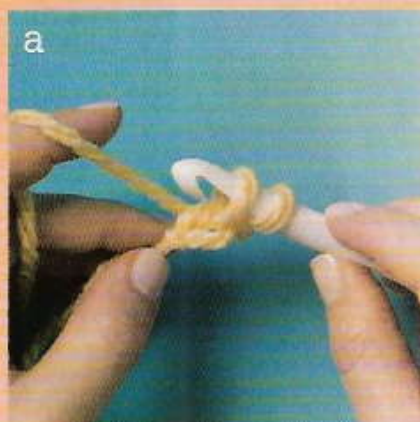
c Yarn over and pull through two remaining loops on hook. (This makes one foundation single crochet.)

f Several fsc's have been completed. The base chains run along the left side in this photo; the sc's run along the right side.

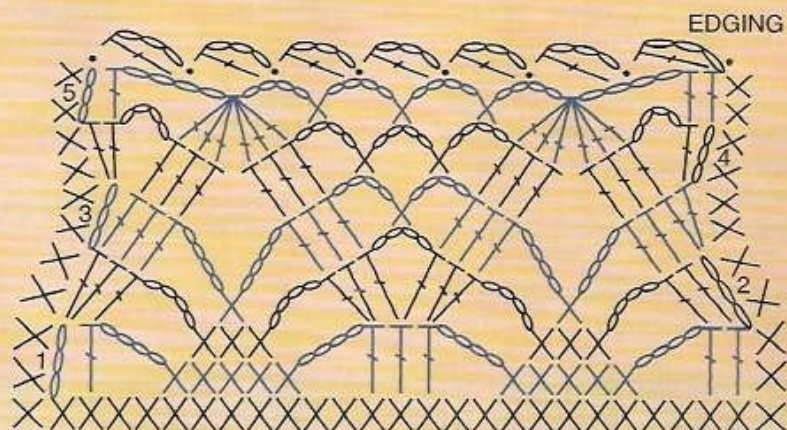

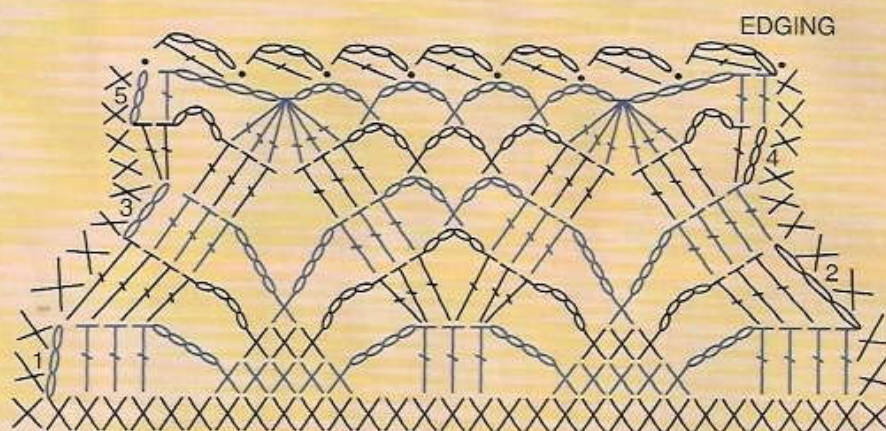

Fasten off.

Seeing stitches in this bulky yarn can be tricky. If you're having trouble, start by making a few motifs in plain, worsted weight yarn, then move on to the bulky yarn once you get the hang of things.



Using A, with right sides facing, whipstitch motifs along all row seams. After rows are joined, whipstitch the columns together.

edging

Round 1 With right side facing, join A with sc in third dc of 5-dc group in upper right corner of blanket, 2 sc in same st as joining, *sc in each st of each motif across (including the middle st of each corner)**; 3 sc in center st of 5-dc corner group; repeat from * 3 times ending final repeat at **; join with sl st in first sc – 418 sc.

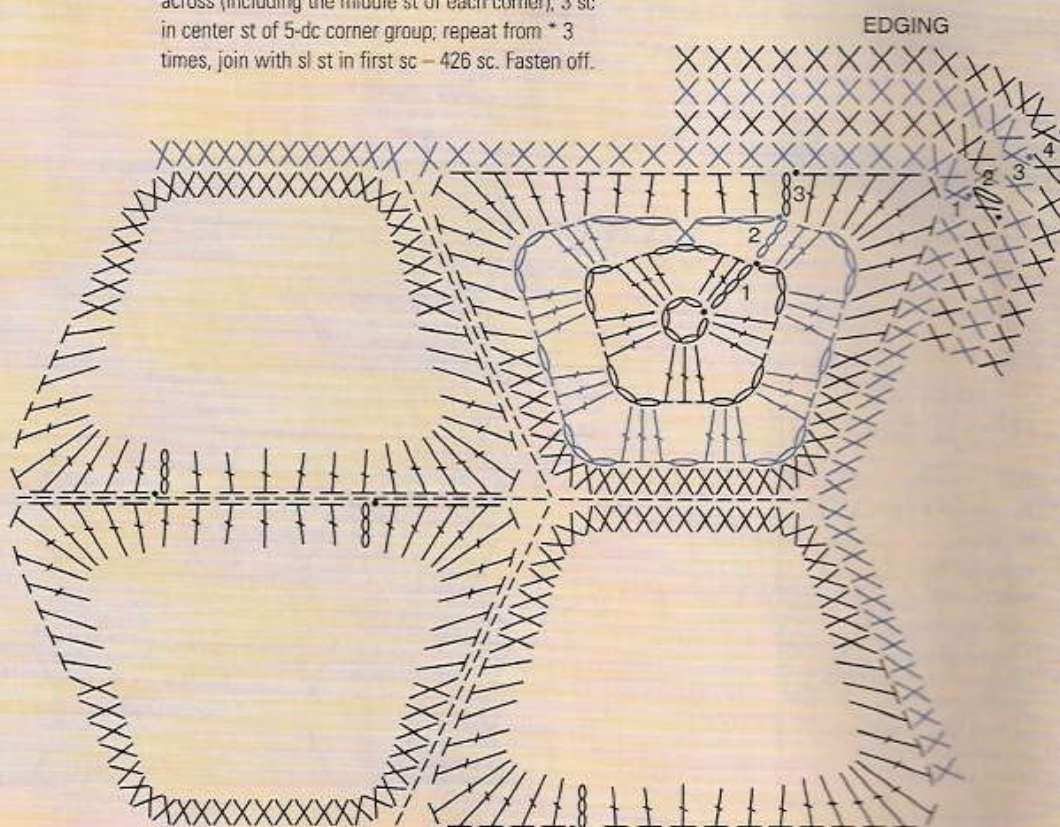
Round 2 Ch 1, turn, *sc in each stitch of each motif across (including the middle st of each corner); 3 sc in center st of 5-dc corner group; repeat from * 3 times, join with sl st in first sc – 426 sc. Fasten off.

Round 3 With right side facing, join B with sc in center dc of 5-dc group in upper right corner of blanket, 2 sc in same st as joining. *Sc in each stitch across to center sc of next corner**, 3 sc in center st of 3-sc corner group; repeat from * 3 times ending at final repeat at **, join with sl st in first sc – 434 sc. Fasten off.

Round 4 Repeat Round 3 with A – 442 sc. Fasten off.

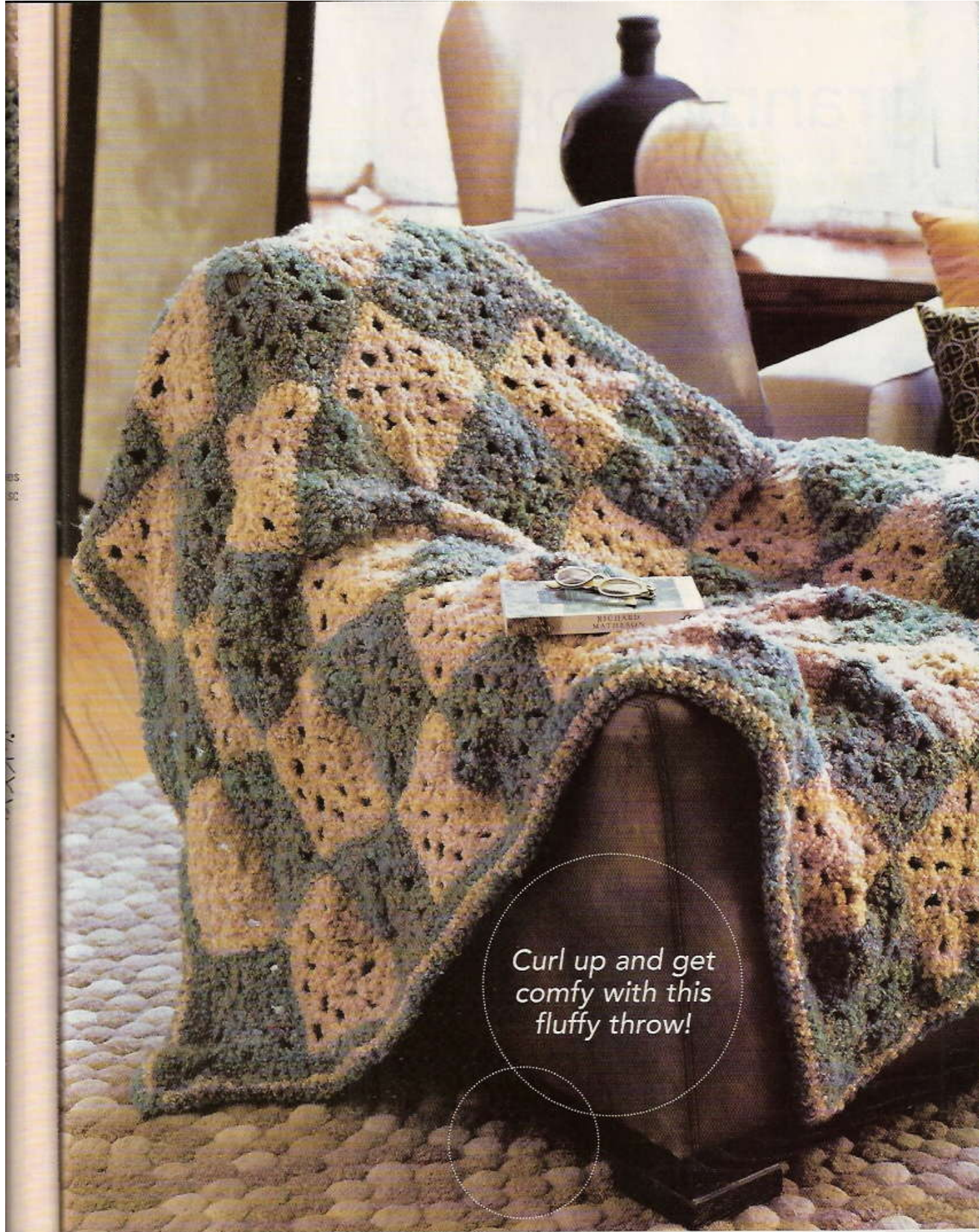

Round 2 Work beginning cl in same ch-1 sp as joining; ch 2, [cl in next ch-1 sp, ch 2] 7 times – 8 cl and 8 ch-2 sps. Join with sl st in 2nd ch of beginning cl, changing to C; turn. Fasten off B.

Round 3 (wrong side) Ch 3 (counts as dc), 3 dc in first ch-2 sp, 4 dc in next ch-2 sp, ch 2, *[4 dc in next ch-2 sp] twice, ch 2; repeat from * 2 times more – 32 dc and 4 ch-2 sps. Join with sl st in 3rd ch of beginning ch-3, changing to D; turn. Fasten off C.

Round 4 (right side) Ch 1, 3 sc in first ch-2 sp, sc in next 8 dc; *3 sc in next ch-2 sp, sc in next 8 dc; repeat from * 2 times more – 44 sc. Join with sl st in first sc. Fasten off.

HALF SQUARE (make 2 for each slipper)

With A, ch 2; join with sl st in first ch to form a ring.

Round 1 (right side) Ch 1, [sc in ring, ch 1] 5 times – 5 sc and 5 ch-1 sps. Join with sl st in first sc. Fasten off.

note

Rest of half square is worked in rows, not rounds.

Row 2 With right side facing, join B with sl st in first ch-1 sp, ch 2 (counts as hdc), hdc in same ch-1 sp, [ch 2, cl in next ch-1 sp] 3 times; work beginning cl in next ch-1 sp (first 2 chs count as ch-2 sp),

Row 3 (wrong side) Ch 5 (counts as dc and ch-2 sp); *[4 dc in next ch-2 sp] twice, ch 2; repeat from * once more; dc in 2nd ch of beginning ch-2, changing to D – 18 dc and 3 ch-2 sps; turn. Fasten off C.

Row 4 (right side) Ch 1, 2 sc in first ch-2 sp, sc in next 8 dc, 3 sc in next ch-2 sp, sc in next 8 dc, 2 sc

If your feet are smaller than these slippers, use a sport weight yarn, a smaller hook and a shorter sole to make smaller slippers.

in last ch-2 sp; work 10 sc evenly spaced across edges of rows and round to form bottom edge of half square. Fasten off D.

assembling Heel Section

With right sides tog, working through back lps only, whipstitch 2 squares tog beginning in center sc of 3 sc in corner of Round 4 and ending in center sc of 3 sc in next corner of Round 4. Whipstitch another square in same manner to other end of one joined square to form a row of 3 joined squares.

assembling Toe Section

See assembly diagram. With right sides tog, pin one half square to rem unjoined square, matching first sc on Row 4 of half square to center sc of 3 sc in any corner of Round 4 of square. Whipstitch through back lps only of first 12 sts on half square and matching sts on square, ending in center sc of 3 sc in next corner of Row 4 of half square and Round 4 of square. Do not fasten off. With right sides tog, pin other half square to same square, matching same center sc of 3 sc in corner of Round 4 of same square to center sc of 3 sc in corner on Row 4 of half square (12th st). Working again through same center sc of 3 sc in same corner of same square, whipstitch through back lps of next 12 sts of square and half square, ending in center sc of 3 sc in next corner of Round 4 of square and in st before 10 sc on bottom edge of half square. Fasten off.

assembling Heel and Toe Sections

See assembly diagram. With right sides tog, pin rem unjoined bottom corners of Toe Section (first sc on Row 4 of one half square and 23rd sc on Row 4 of other half square) to bottom unworked corners (center sc of 3 sc in corner) of squares at ends of Heel Section. Whipstitch through back lps only of these pinned corner sts and next 4 sts along outer edge of squares on Heel Section and unworked first or 2nd edge of half squares on Toe Section, leaving rem sts along edges unworked. Fasten off.

note

Bottom edge of half squares is not joined to adjacent squares. Top and bottom edges of 3 joined squares on Heel Section and 2 edges of square on Toe Section are not joined to any squares.

EYELETS

With right side of Toe Section facing, join D with sl

st in 5th st on half square just joined between Heel Section and Toe section (new unworked st after whipstitch in 4 sts); ch 1, sc in same st; *ch 2, sk next st, sc in next st*; repeat from * to ** 2 times more; sc2tog in next st and in first st of adjacent half square, sc in next st, repeat from * to ** 3 times more. Fasten off.

LACES (make 2)

Ch 130 tightly, fasten off. Weave in ends and dab with fabric sealant, if desired.

SOLE

Cut 8 1/4/244cm length of D. Beginning at back seam of suede sole and working from wrong side, work blanket stitch in each hole around entire sole – 91 blanket sts. Fasten off.

Round 1 With right side facing and working under horizontal bars of blanket sts around, join D with sl st in first stitch at back seam of sole, ch 1, sc in same st as joining and in next 2 sts, sc2tog in next 2 sts, sc in next 7 sts, sc2tog in next 2 sts, sc in next 64 sts, sc2tog in next 2 sts, sc in next 7 sts, sc2tog in next 2 sts, sc in next 2 sts – 87 sc. Join with sl st in first sc. Fasten off, leaving a 5 1/2/152cm tail for sewing.

assembly

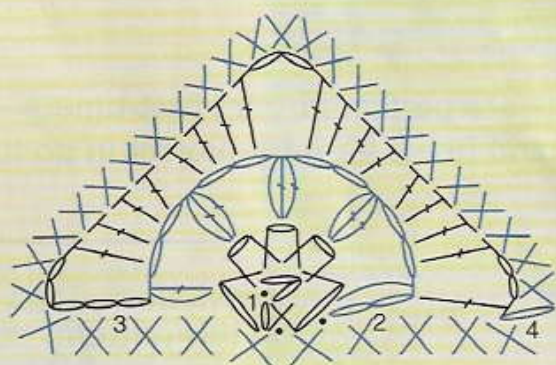
Starting with first st at back seam and counting to the left, mark the 19th, 32nd, 44th, 56th, and 69th st. With right side of assembled squares and outside of sole facing, pin tog matching sts as follows:

First st on sole with st just left of center on bottom of center square of Heel; 19th st on sole with bottom corner st of half square where it is joined to end square of Heel; 32nd st on sole with other bottom corner st of same half square where it is joined to square at Toe; 44th st on sole with center sc of 3 sc in unjoined corner of square at Toe; 56th st on sole with bottom corner st of next half square where it is joined to square at Toe; 69th st on sole with other bottom corner st of same half square where it is joined to other end square of Heel.

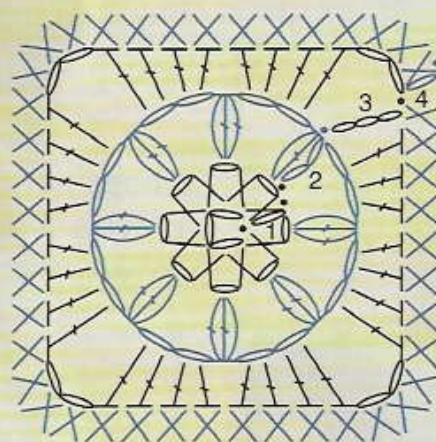
Whipstitch evenly around through both lps of Round 1 on sole and both lps of bottom edge of assembled Toe and Heel Sections, easing to fit, if necessary.

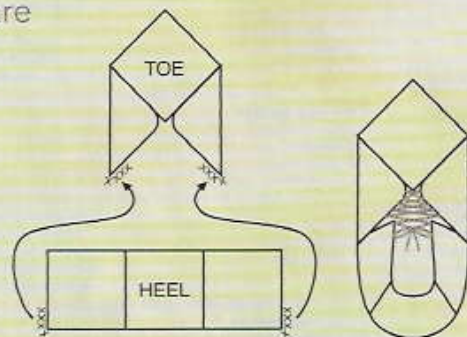

blocking

Remove lp from hook on second square and place a stitch marker or safety pin in lp to keep from unraveling. Pin and block each square to 4 1/4"/11cm square. Allow to dry.

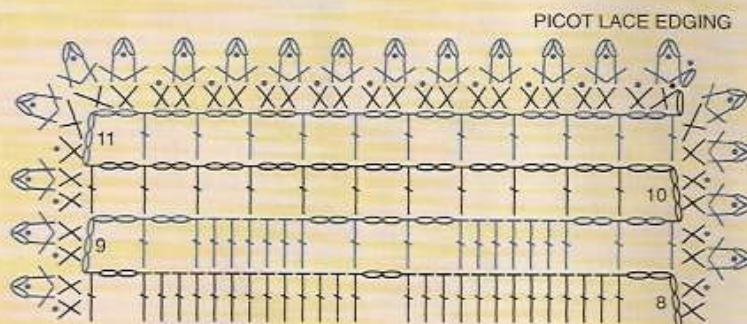

Place squares with wrong sides tog, aligning edges and hearts. Insert hook in removed lp from second square, ch 1, 2 sc in first corner mesh; *2 sc in each

C/dc, 2 rows E/dc, 2 rows A/X-st, 1 row D/dc, 4 rows B/X-st, 3 rows D/dc, C 1 row C/dc, A 3 rows A/X-st*, 4 row E/dc, then work color sequence backwards, starting * with 3 rows A/X-st and ending with 1 row C/dc for a total of 104 rows.

AFGHAN

With C, ch 139.

Row 1 Dc in 4th ch from hook and each ch across, changing to A, turn – 137 dc.

Rows 2–104 Follow Color/Pattern Sequence above. Each Dc row will have 137 dc and each X stitch row will have 45 X-sts and 2 dc.

At the end of Row 104, do not fasten off or turn.

Round 4 *Work 2 sc in next sc, sc in next 2 sc; repeat from * around – 24 sc.

Round 5 *Work 2 sc in next sc, sc in next 3 sc; repeat from * around – 30 sc.

Round 6 *Work 2 sc in next sc, sc in next 4 sc; repeat from * around – 36 sc.

Round 7 *Work 2 sc in next sc, sc in next 5 sc; repeat from * around – 42 sc.

Round 8 *Work 2 sc in next sc, sc in next 6 sc; repeat from * around – 48 sc.

Rounds 9-16 Sc in next sc and in each sc around.

Round 17 *Sc2tog, sc in next 6 sc; repeat from * around – 42 sc.

EYES (make 2)

With C, ch 3.

Round 1 Work 12 dc in 3rd ch from hook – 12 dc. Join with sl st in first dc. Fasten off, leaving 6"/15cm tail.

head and eye assembly

Insert 18mm doll eyes into center of each crochet

tip

This quick and fun pattern makes a great project for a crochet class—especially if you're teaching teens.

eye. Attach assembled eyes to head on rounds 9-15, spacing eyes about 1 1/2 cm apart; secure with washers on inside of head. Stuff head very firmly. Do not skimp on stuffing! Whipstitch edges of crochet eyes onto head using 6"/15 cm tails.

BODY

Starting at top of body with A, ch 18; being careful not to twist ch, join with sl st in first ch to form a ring.

Round 1 Ch 1; *2 sc in first ch, sc in next 2 chs; repeat from * around – 24 sc.

Round 2 *Work 2 sc in next sc, sc in next 3 sc; repeat from * around – 30 sc.

Round 3 *Work 2 sc in next sc, sc in next 4 sc; repeat from * around – 36 sc.

Round 4 *Work 2 sc in next sc, sc in next 5 sc; repeat from * around – 42 sc.

Rounds 5-13 Sc in next sc and in each sc around.

Round 14 *Sc2tog, sc in next 5 sc; repeat from * around – 36 sc.

Round 15 *Sc2tog, sc in next 4 sc; repeat from * around – 30 sc.

Round 16 *Sc2tog, sc in next 3 sc; repeat from * around – 24 sc.

Round 17 *Sc2tog, sc in next 2 sc; repeat from * around – 18 sc.

Round 18 *Sc2tog, sc in next sc; repeat from * around – 12 sc.

Round 19 *Sc2tog; repeat from * around – 6 sc. Fasten off, and close hole tightly with tail.

head and body assembly

Add pellets to weight body, if desired, then add fiberfill, or stuff body very firmly with only fiberfill. Whipstitch bottom of head to top of body.

WINGS (make 2)

Starting at bottom of wing with C, ch 2.

Row 1 (right side) Sc in 2nd ch from hook – 1 sc. Ch 1, turn.

Row 2 Work 2 sc in first sc – 2 sc. Ch 1, turn.

Row 3 Work 2 sc in first sc, sc in next sc – 3 sc. Ch 1, turn.

Row 4 Work 2 sc in first sc, sc in next sc and in each sc across – 4 sc. Ch 1, turn.

Rows 5-12 Repeat Row 4 eight times more – one more sc in each row than in previous row. At end of Row 12 – 12 sc.

Round 1 Ch 1, sc evenly around all 3 edges of wing, increasing at corners as necessary. Join with sl st in first sc. Finish off, leaving a long tail.

Whipstitch top edge of wings to sides of body with right side of wings facing.

BEAK

Starting at bottom of beak with B, ch 2.

Rows 1-5 Work same as Rows 1-5 of wings. At end of Row 5, do not ch 1. Fasten off, leaving a long tail.

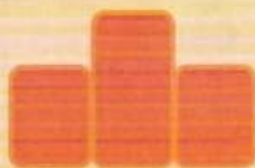

Rounds 14–18 Ch 1, turn, sc in first dc, dc in next sc, *sc in next dc, dc in next sc; repeat from * around; join with sl st in first sc; change to A in sl st.

Rounds 19–42 Repeat Rows 7–18 two more times – 72 (78, 84) sts.

Repeat last round, and continue to change color every 6 rows, until piece measures 17 (19, 21)"/43 (48.5, 53.5)cm. Fasten off.

FRONT

note Continue changing color every 6 rows.

shape armholes

Row 1 Turn, sk 3 sts and join yarn, work in Griddle Stitch across first 30 (33, 36) sts; leave rem sts unworked.

Rows 2–4 Turn, work in Griddle Stitch, dec in patt at beginning and end of row – 24 (27, 30) sts.

Row 5 Turn, work in Griddle Stitch. Do not fasten off.

first shoulder strap

Row 6 Turn, work in Griddle Stitch over first 8 sts; leave rem sts unworked – 8 sts.

Row 7 Turn, work in Griddle Stitch, dec in patt at beginning of row (neck edge) – 7 sts.

Row 8 Turn, work in Griddle Stitch, dec in patt at end of row (neck edge) – 6 sts.

Row 9 Turn, work in Griddle Stitch.

Repeat last row until piece measures 6 (7, 8)"/15 (18, 20.5)cm from beginning of armhole shaping. Fasten off.

second shoulder strap

Sk next 8 (11, 14) unworked sts of Row 5 and join yarn in next st.

Row 6 Turn, work in Griddle Stitch over last 8 sts – 8 sts.

Rows 7 and 8 Turn, work in Griddle Stitch, dec in patt at neck edge – 6 sts.

Row 9 Turn, work in Griddle Stitch.

Repeat last row until piece measures 6 (7, 8)"/15

(18, 20.5)cm from beginning of armhole shaping. Fasten off.

BACK

note Continue changing color every 6 rows.

shape armholes

Row 1 Sk next 6 unworked sts of last row of Body and join yarn, work in Griddle Stitch across first 30 (33, 36) sts; leave rem sts unworked.

Rows 2–4 Turn, work in Griddle Stitch, dec in patt at beginning and end of row – 24 (27, 30) sts.

Rows 5–8 (9, 10) Turn, work in Griddle Stitch.

first shoulder strap

Row 9 (10, 11) Turn, work in Griddle Stitch over first 8 sts; leave rem sts unworked – 8 sts.

Rows 10 (11, 12) and 11 (12, 13) Turn, work in Griddle Stitch, dec in patt at neck edge – 6 sts.

Row 12 (13, 14) Turn, work in Griddle Stitch.

Repeat last row until piece measures 9 (10, 11)"/23 (25.5, 28)cm from beginning of armhole shaping. Fasten off.

second shoulder strap

Sk next 8 (11, 14) unworked sts of Row 8 (9, 10) and join yarn in next st. Complete as for first shoulder strap.

FLOWER (make 2)

With C, ch 4; join with sl st in first ch to form a ring.

Round 1 Ch 1, work 10 sc in ring; join with sl st in first sc – 10 sc.

Round 2 [Ch 4, Fpsl st around post of next sc] 10 times; join with sl st in first sc of Round 1.

Round 3 Working behind sts of Round 2, ch 1, 2 sc in each sc of Round 1; join with sl st in first sc – 20 sc.

Round 4 [Ch 4, tr in next st, 2 tr in next st, tr in next st, ch 4, sl st in same st, sl st in next st] 4 times, ch 4, tr in next st, 2 tr in next st, tr in next st, ch 4, sl st in same st; join with sl st in first sc of Round 3. Fasten off.

flower center

With A, ch 4.

Round 1 Work 4 dc in 4th ch from hook; join with sl st in top of beginning ch. Fasten off.

Draw beginning and ending yarn tail through center of Flower, secure and weave in ends.

finishing

trim

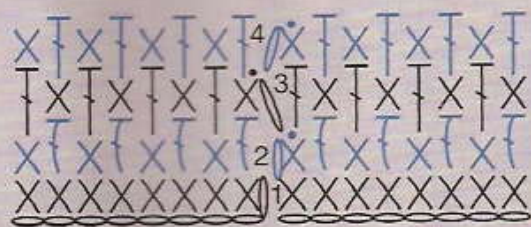
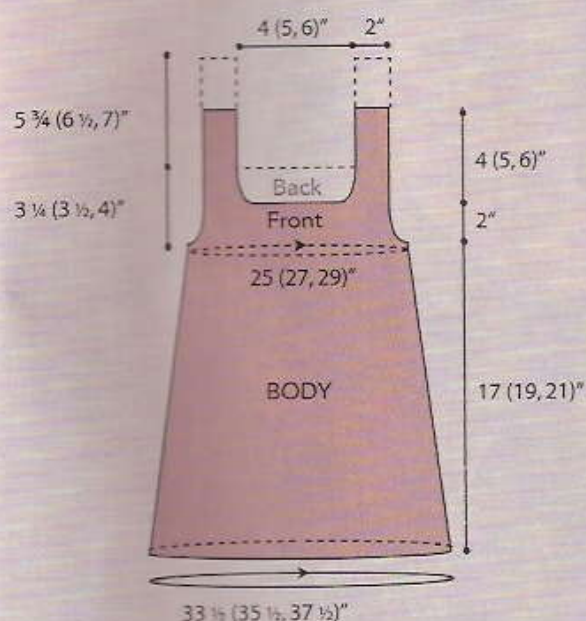
With right side facing, join C with sl st in lower edge of Jumper.

Round 1 Ch 1, work sc evenly spaced around lower edge of Jumper; join with sl st in first sc.

Round 2 Ch 1, rev sc in each sc around; join with sl st in first st. Fasten off.

Fold Back shoulder straps (longer straps) over Front shoulder straps so that the color changes align (or to create desired strap length). Mark the location for snap closures on shoulder straps. Sew one half of a snap closure to the underside of each Back shoulder strap. Sew the other half of the snap closure to the Front shoulder straps. Sew one Flower on front of each Back shoulder strap directly over snap closures.

Weave in all ends. ■

Round 3 Ch 3, dc in same st, dc in next 3 dc, *2 dc in next dc, dc in next 3 dc; repeat from * around; join with sl st in top of beginning ch-3 – 40 dc.

Round 6 Ch 3, dc in each dc around.

Round 7 Ch 3, dc in next 5 dc, dc2tog, *dc in next 6 dc, dc2tog; repeat from * around; join with sl st in top of beginning ch-3 – 49 dc. Fasten off.

EARFLAP (make 2)

Beginning along side edge of Earflap, with A, ch 10.

Row 1 Dc in 4th ch from hook (skipped ch-3 counts as dc) and each ch across – 8 dc.

Row 2 Ch 3 (counts as dc here and throughout), turn, [dc in next dc, dc2tog] twice, dc in last dc – 6 dc.

Row 3 Ch 3, turn, dc2tog, dc in next dc, dc2tog – 4 dc.

Row 4 Ch 3, turn, dc3tog – 2 dc.

Fasten off leaving a long tail for sewing Earflap to Hat.

EAR (make 2)

With A, ch 4; join with sl st in first ch to form a ring.

Row 1 Ch 3 (counts as dc here and throughout), work 5 dc in ring; do not join – 6 dc.

Row 2 Ch 3, turn, 2 dc in next 5 dc – 11 dc.

Row 3 Ch 1, turn, sk first dc, dc in each dc across to last dc, sl st in last dc – 9 dc. Fasten off leaving a long tail for sewing Ear to Hat.

Earflap, draw strands halfway through earflap and bring ends together to form six 15"/38cm strands. Group 2 strands of A, 2 more strands of A, and 2 strands of B. Braid the grouped strands, leaving a 4"/10cm tail for fringe. Tie a knot in the end of the braid to secure. Trim fringe to desired length.

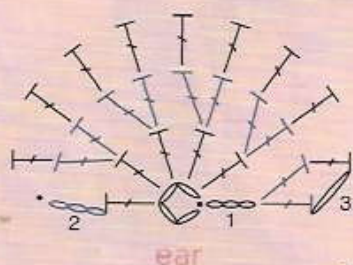

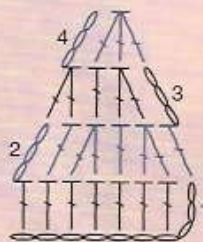

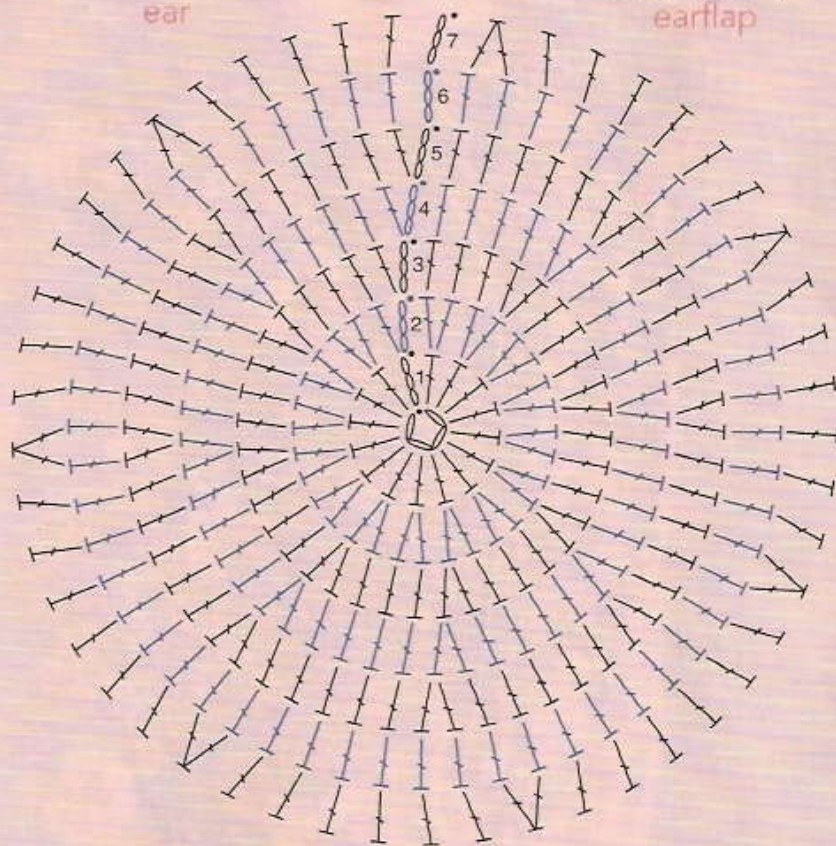

Row 1 With wrong side of Tongue facing, join B with sc in edge of first sc on Tongue Edging; sc in next sc on Row 16 and in each sc across, sc in edge of last sc on Tongue Edging – 8 sc. Ch 1, turn.

Rows 2–4 Sc in first sc and in each sc across. Ch 1, turn.

Starting at top with A, ch 16.

Row 1 (wrong side) Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each rem ch – 15 sc. Ch 1, turn.

Row 2 Sc in first sc and in each sc across. Ch 1, turn.

Row 3 Work 2 sc in first sc, ch 1, sk next sc, sc in next sc and in each sc across to last 2 sc, ch 1, sk next sc, 2 sc in last sc – 15 sc and 2 ch-1 sps. Ch 1, turn.

Row 4 Sc in each sc and ch-1 sp across – 17 sc. Ch 1, turn.

Rows 5 and 6 Repeat Row 2 two times more.

Row 7 Repeat Row 3 – 17 sc and 2 ch-1 sps.

Row 8 Work 2 sc in first sc, sc in each sc and ch-1 sp across to last sc, 2 sc in last sc – 21 sc. Ch 1, turn.

Row 9 Work 2 sc in first sc, sc in next sc and in each sc across to last sc, 2 sc in last sc – 23 sc. Ch 1, turn.

Row 10 Repeat Row 3 – 23 sc and 2 ch-1 sps.

Row 11 Repeat Row 8 – 27 sc.

Row 12 Repeat Row 9 – 29 sc.

Row 13 Sc in first sc, ch 1, sk next sc, sc in next sc and in each sc across to last 2 sc, ch 1, sk next sc, sc in last sc – 27 sc and 2 ch-1 sps. Ch 1, turn.

Row 14 Repeat Row 4 – 29 sc.

Rows 15 and 16 Repeat Row 2 two times more. At end of Row 16, do not turn.

upper edging

Round 1 Sc in edge of rows 16-13, 2 sc in edge of row 12, sc in edge of rows 11-1; working in free lps of foundation ch, 3 sc in next ch, sc in next 13 chs, 3 sc in next ch; sc in edge of Rows 1-11, 2 sc in edge of row 12, sc in edge of Rows 13-16 – 53 sc. Fasten off, leaving a 12"/30.5cm tail for sewing.

upper/toe joining

Round 1 With wrong side of Upper and Toe facing, join B with sc in 15th sc on row 16 of Upper, sc in next sc and in each sc across, sc in edge of Upper Edging; working along Toe, sc in edge of Rows 1-5 on Toe, 2 sc in each st on Row 6, sc in edge of Rows

5-1; working along Upper again, sc in edge of Upper Edging, sc in next sc and in each sc across to joining, sc in same sc as joining – 50 sc. Join with sl st in first sc.

Round 2 Ch 1, turn, sc in first sc and in each sc around. Join as before. Fasten off.

Round 3 With wrong side facing, join C with sc in last sc on Round 2, sc in next sc and in each sc around. Join. Fasten off.

Round 4 With right side facing, join B with sc in last sc on Round 3, sc in next sc and in each sc around. Join. Do not fasten off.

sole joining

Ch 1, with wrong sides of Upper/Toe Joining and Sole Edging tog, working through both thicknesses, sl st in first sc and in each sc around.

note

If necessary, use safety pins to hold Upper/Toe Joining and Sole Edging tog.

ANKLE CIRCLE (make 2)

With B, ch 2.

Round 1 Work 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook – 6 sc. Join with sl st in first sc.

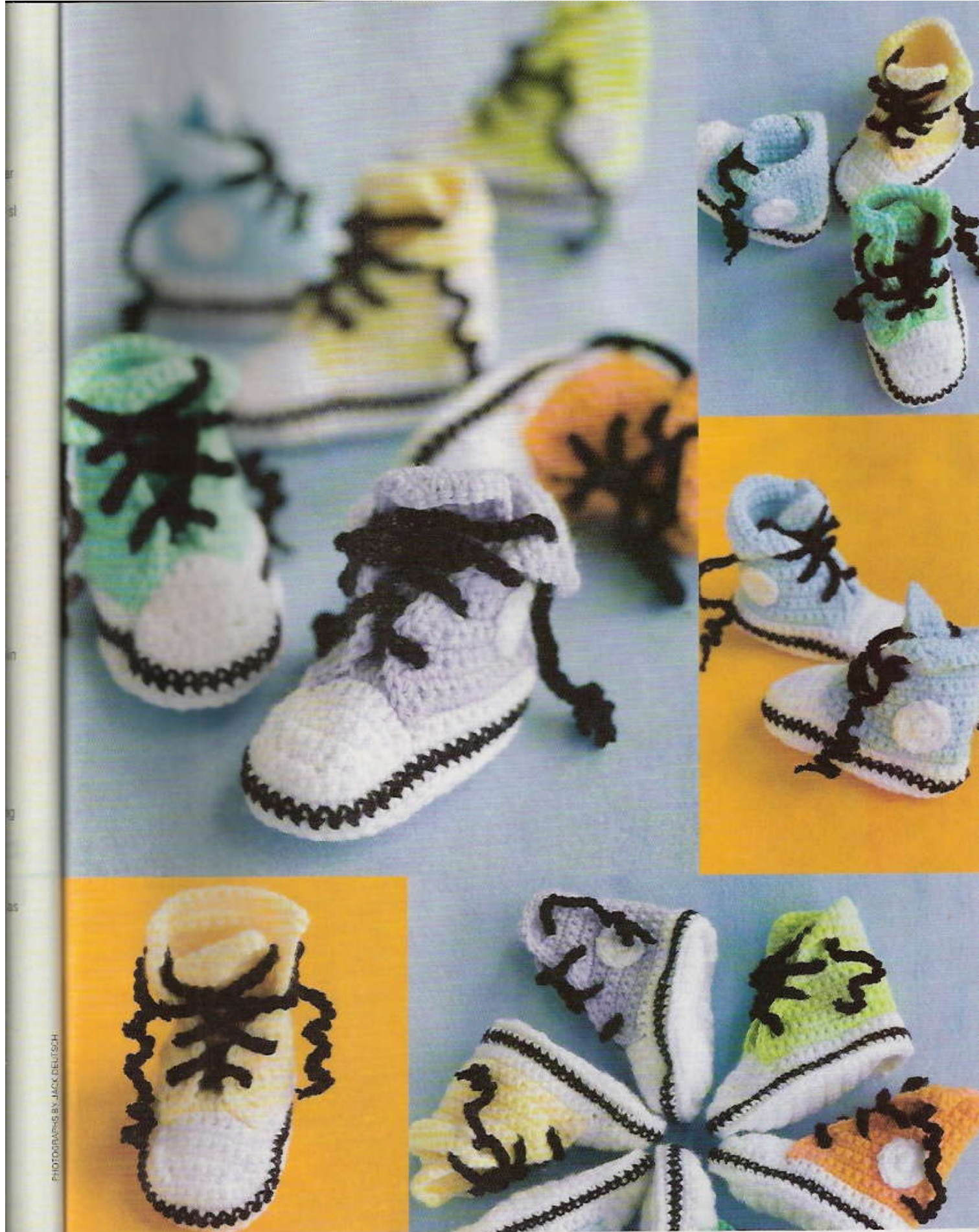
Round 2 Ch 1, 2 sc in same sc as joining, 2 sc in next sc and in each sc around – 12 sc. Join as before. Fasten off, leaving a 12"/30.5cm tail for sewing.

LACE (make 2)

With 2 strands of C held tog, make a 26"/66cm long chain. Trim ends and weave lace through holes in Upper.

finishing

With tail, sew Ankle Circles on outside of booties as pictured. With A, sew 3 or 4 sts at beginning and end of Upper Edging to last row of Tongue to hold Upper and Tongue tog below bottom lace holes. Weave in all ends. ■

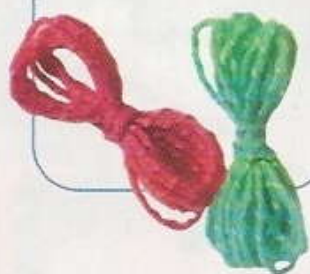

SKILL LEVEL: intermediate

sizes

18 months (2 years, 4 years)

finished chest: 20¼ (22½, 24¼) / 51.5 (57, 62)cm

finished length: 10¼ (11, 12) / 27.5 (28, 30.5)cm

gauge

15 sc and 18 rows = 4" / 10cm using size H/8 (5mm) crochet hook.

Remember to check gauge for best results!

how to make a gauge swatch

With larger hook, ch 16 loosely.

Row 1 Working in back bars only, sc in 2nd ch from hook and each ch across – 15 sc.

Rows 2–18 Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across. Fasten off.

Resulting gauge swatch should measure approx 4" x 4" / 10cm x 10cm. *Adjust hook size if necessary to obtain correct gauge.*

notes

1 Jacket is worked in one piece from the hem upwards to the beginning of the armhole shaping. The piece is then divided into three sections worked separately: Left Front, Back and Right Front.

2 In the first row of all pieces, work into the bump on the back side of the foundation chain to form a neat edge.

BODY

With larger hook and A, ch 77 (85, 93) loosely.

Row 1 (wrong side) Working in bumps of foundation chain only, sc in 2nd ch from hook and each ch across – 76 (84, 92) sc.

Rows 2 and 3 Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.

Row 4 (right side) Ch 1, turn, working in back loops only, sc in each sc across.

note A ridge is created in Row 4 to define the waistband of the jacket. Ensure that the ridge is on

the right side (outside) of the jacket.

Rows 5–28 (30, 32) Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across. Do not fasten off.

In preparation for dividing Body into Left Front, Back and Right Front, place stitch markers in the 18th (20th, 22nd) and 59th (65th, 71st) sts to indicate armhole placement.

LEFT FRONT shape armhole

Row 1 (wrong side) Ch 1, turn, sc in first 17 (19, 21) sc (stopping at last st before marker); leave rem sc unworked – 17 (19, 21) sc.

Row 2 Turn, sl st in first sc, ch 1, sc in each rem sc across – 16 (18, 20) sc.

Row 3 Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.

Rows 4–5 (7, 9) Repeat last 2 rows 1 (2, 3) more times – 15 (16, 17) sc.

Rows 6 (8, 10)–12 (12, 14) Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across. Do not fasten off.

shape neck

Row 13 (13, 15) Turn, sl st in first 4 sc, ch 1, sc in rem 11 (12, 13) sc – 11 (12, 13) sc.

Row 14 (14, 16) (right side) Ch 1, turn, sc in first 10 (11, 12) sc; leave last sc unworked – 10 (11, 12) sc.

Abbreviations used in this pattern

ch chain

rem remain(ing)

sc single crochet



The back loop of a stitch is the strand of the stitch that is farthest away from you.

Row 15 (15, 17) Turn, sl st in first sc, ch 1, sc in each rem sc across – 9 (10, 11) sc.

Row 16 (16, 18) Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.

Row 17 (17, 19) Repeat Row 15 (15, 17) – 8 (9, 10) sc.

Rows 18 (18, 20)–20 (20, 22) Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.

Fasten off.

BACK

With wrong side facing and larger hook, join A with sl st in next sc (marked) of Body.

shape armholes

Row 1 (wrong side) Ch 1, sc in same sc as join, sc in next 41 (45, 49) sc (working last sc in next marked sc) – 42 (46, 50) sc.

Row 2 Turn, sl st in first sc, ch 1, sc across to last sc; leave last sc unworked – 40 (44, 48) sc.

Rows 3 Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.

Rows 4–5 (7, 9) Repeat last 2 rows 1 (2, 3) more times – 38 (40, 42) sc.

Rows 6 (8, 10)–16 (16, 18) Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.

shape left neck

Row 17 (17, 19) (wrong side) Ch 1, turn, sc in first 11 (12, 13) sc; leave rem sc unworked – 11 (12, 13) sc.

Row 18 (18, 20) Turn, sl st in first 2 sc, ch 1, sc in rem 9 (10, 11) sc – 9 (10, 11) sc.

Row 19 (19, 21) Ch 1, turn, sc in first 8 (9, 10) sc; leave last sc unworked – 8 (9, 10) sc.

Row 20 (20, 22) Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across. Fasten off.

shape right neck

With wrong side facing and larger hook, sk next 16 sc of Row 16 (16, 18), join A with sl st in next sc.

Row 17 (17, 19) (wrong side) Ch 1, sc in same sc as join, sc in next 10 (11, 12) sc – 11 (12, 13) sc.

Row 18 (18, 20) Ch 1, turn, sc in first 9 (10, 11) sc; leave rem 2 sc unworked – 9 (10, 11) sc.

Row 19 (19, 21) Turn, sl st in first sc, ch 1, sc in rem 8 (9, 10) sc – 8 (9, 10) sc.

Row 20 (20, 22) Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across. Fasten off.

RIGHT FRONT

With wrong side facing and larger hook, join A with sl st in next sc of Body (sc following last marked sc of Body).

shape armhole

Row 1 (wrong side) Ch 1, sc in same sc as join, sc in rem 16 (18, 20) sc – 17 (19, 21) sc.

Row 2 Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across to last sc; leave last sc unworked – 16 (18, 20) sc.

Rows 3 Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.

Rows 4–5 (7, 9) Repeat last 2 rows 1 (2, 3) more times – 15 (16, 17) sc.

Rows 6 (8, 10)–12 (12, 14) Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across. Do not fasten off.

shape neck

Row 13 (13, 15) Ch 1, turn, sc in first 11 (12, 13) sc; leave rem 4 sc unworked – 11 (12, 13) sc.

Row 14 (14, 16) (right side) Turn, sl st in first sc, ch 1, sc in each rem sc across – 10 (11, 12) sc.

Row 15 (15, 17) Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across to last sc; leave last sc unworked – 9 (10, 11) sc.

Row 16 (16, 18) Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.

Row 17 (17, 19) Repeat Row 15 (15, 17) – 8 (9, 10) sc.

Rows 18 (18, 20)–20 (20, 22) Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.

Fasten off.

Turn piece inside out and sl st shoulder seams together.

FRONT PLACKETS

left front placket

With right side facing and smaller hook, join A with sl st at neck of Left Front edge.

Row 1 Working in ends of rows down Left Front, ch 1, sc in end of each row to hem edge – 40 (42, 46) sc.

Row 2 Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.

Row 3 Ch 1, turn, sc in first sc, ch 2, skip 2 sc (for buttonhole), sc in next 7 (8, 9) sc, ch 2, skip 2 sc, [sc in next 7 (7, 8) sc, ch 2, skip 2 sc] twice, sc in next 7 (8, 9) sc, ch 2, skip 2 sc, sc in last sc.

Row 4 Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc and ch across.

Row 5 Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.

Fasten off.

right front placket

With right side facing and smaller hook, join A with sl st at hem of Right Front edge.

Row 1 Working in ends of rows up Right Front, sc in end of each row to neck edge – 40 (42, 46) sc.

Rows 2–5 Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across. Fasten off.

SLEEVE (make 2)

note Sleeves are worked from the cuff up. With larger hook, ch 27 (29, 33).

Row 1 (wrong side) Working in bumps of foundation ch only, sc in 2nd ch from hook and each ch across – 26 (28, 32) sc.

Rows 2–5 Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.

Row 6 (right side) Ch 1, turn, working in the back loops only, sc in each sc across.

note A ridge is created in Row 6 to define the cuff of the Sleeve. Ensure that the ridge is on the right side (outside) of the Sleeve.

Rows 7–40 (42, 50) Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.

shape sleeve cap

Row 41 (43, 51) Turn, sl st in first 3(4, 4) sc, ch 1, sc in next 20 (20, 24) sc; leave rem 3 (4, 4) sc unworked – 20 (20, 24) sc.

Row 42 (44, 52) Turn, sl st in first sc, ch 1, sc in each sc across to last sc; leave last sc unworked – 18 (18, 22) sc.

Row 43 (45, 53) Repeat Row 42 (44, 52) – 16 (16, 20) sc.

Rows 44 (46, 54)–**46** (48, 58) Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.

Row 47 (49, 59) Repeat Row 42 (44, 52) – 14 (14, 18) sc.

Row 48 (50, 60) Turn, sl st in first 2 sc, ch 1, sc in next 10 (10, 14) sc; leave last 2 sc unworked – 10 (10, 14) sc.

Fasten off.

Working from the wrong side, sl st Sleeve seam together from underarm to cuff. Turn Sleeve right side out, and with wrong side of Jacket facing, sl st Sleeve to armhole of Jacket.

COLLAR

With right side facing and larger hook, join A with sl st in neck edge at 3rd row of right placket.

Row 1 Ch 1, sc in same st as join, sc evenly spaced around neck edge to 3rd row of left placket.

Rows 2–11 Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across. Fasten off.

POCKET FLAP (make 2)

With smaller hook and A, ch 11 (11, 13).

Row 1 Working in back bars, sc in 2nd ch from hook and each ch across – 10 (10, 12) sc.

Rows 2 and 3 Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.

Rows 4–6 (6, 7) Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, sc in each

sc across to last 2 sc, sc2tog – 4 sc.

Row 7 (7, 8) Ch 1, turn, sc2tog twice – 2 sc. Fasten off.

finishing

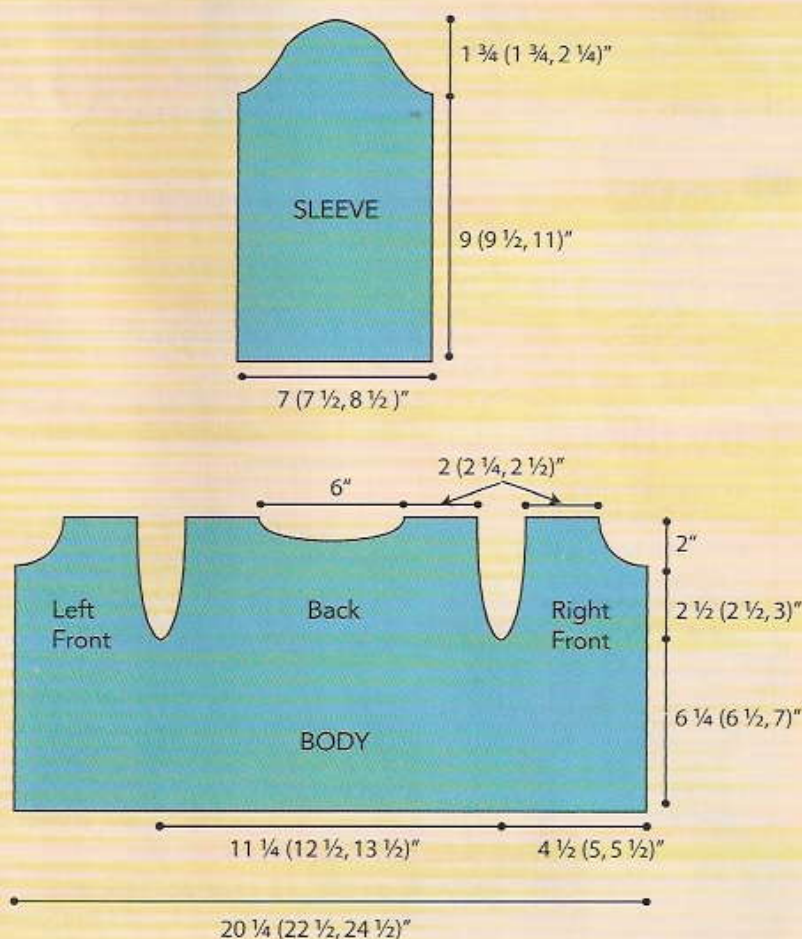
Weave in all ends.

embroidery

note Use photograph as a guide for placement of pocket flaps and embroidery.

With yarn needle and B, appliqué pocket flaps to chest using back stitch. Embroider running stitches down center of Fronts of Jacket to create faux princess seams. Embroider running stitches around collar edge and upper cuff edge.

With yarn needle and A, sew buttons on right placket opposite buttonholes of left placket. ■

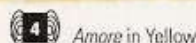

Round 2 Ch 2 (counts as hdc here and throughout), hdc in joining sl st, 2 hdc in next hdc around; join with sl st in top of beginning ch-2 — 14 hdc.

Round 3 Ch 2, 2 hdc in next hdc, *hdc in next hdc, 2 hdc in next hdc; repeat from * around; join with sl st in top of beginning ch-2 — 21 hdc.

Round 4 Ch 2, hdc in next hdc, 2 hdc in next hdc, *hdc in next 2 hdc, 2 hdc in next hdc; repeat from * around;

larger size only

Round 6 Ch 2, hdc in next 3 hdc, 2 hdc in next hdc, *hdc in next 4 hdc, 2 hdc in next hdc; repeat from * around; join with sl st in top of beginning ch-2 — 42 hdc.

Round 7 Ch 2, hdc in next 4 hdc, 2 hdc in next hdc, *hdc in next 5 hdc, 2 hdc in next hdc; repeat from * around; join with sl st in top of beginning ch-2 — 49

hdc. Fasten off.

TOP AND SIDES OF BONNET

With right side of Back of Bonnet facing, join A with a sl st in 5th (7th) st following join of last round.

Row 1 Ch 2 (counts as hdc here and throughout), hdc in next 26 (36) sts; leave rem sts unworked — 27 (37) hdc.

Rows 2-3 (5) Ch 2, turn, hdc in each hdc across. Fasten off.

RUFFLE

With right side of Bonnet facing, join A with sl st in first hdc of previous row.

Row 1 Ch 3 (counts as dc), 2 dc in same hdc, 3 dc in next hdc across — 81 (111) hdc. Fasten off.

FLOWER

With B, ch 6.

Round 1 Dc in 6th ch from hook (skipped ch-5 counts as dc, ch 2), ch 2, [dc in same ch, ch 2] 6 times; join with sl st in 3rd ch of beginning ch-5 — 8 ch-2 sp.

Round 2 Ch 1, (sc, ch 1, 2 dc, ch 1, sc) in each ch-2 sp around; join with sl st in first sc — 8 petals. Fasten off.

inner flower

With A, ch 4; join with sl st in first ch to form a ring.

Round 1 Ch 1, [sc in ring, ch 2] 6 times; join with sl st in first sc – 6 ch-2 sp.

Round 2 Ch 1, [sc, ch 1, 2 hdc, ch 1, sc] in each ch-2 sp around; join with sl st in first sc – 6 petals. Fasten off. With A, sew inner flower to center of Flower.

finishing

With right side of Bonnet facing, join A with sl st in first dc of Ruffle.

Round 1 Sl st in each dc across

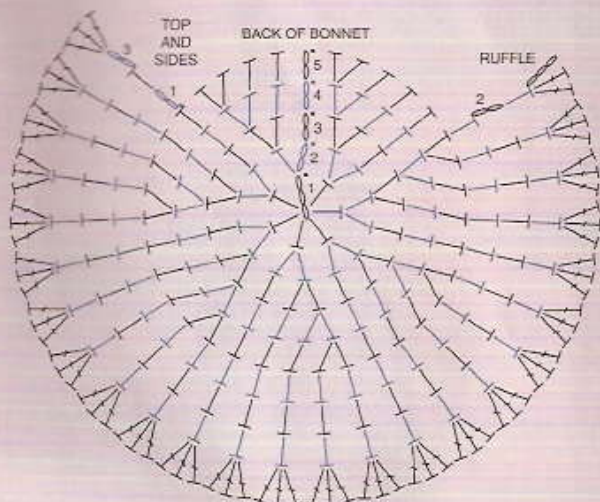
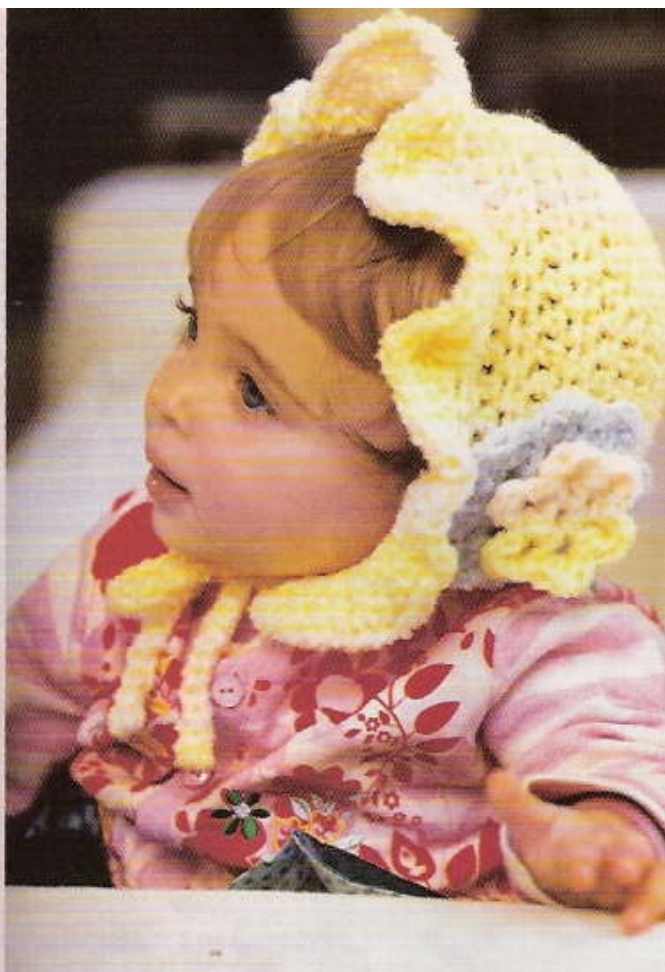

Row 2 Sc in first dc and in each dc across, working last sc in next ch – 29 sc. Ch 3 (counts as dc on next row now and throughout), turn.

Row 3 Sk first st, dc in next st and in each st across – 29 dc. Ch 1, turn.

Row 4 Sc in first 5 dc; [bobble in next dc, sc in next 5 dc] 4 times, working last sc in 3rd ch of turning ch-3 – 25 sc and 4 bobbles. Ch 3, turn.

Row 5 Repeat Row 3.

Rows 6 and 7 Repeat Rows 2 and 3.

Row 9 Repeat Row 3.

Rows 10 and 11 Repeat Rows 2 and 3.

Rows 12-31 Repeat Rows 4-11 two times, then repeat Rows 4-7 once. Do not fasten off.

BORDER

Round 1 (wrong side) Work 3 sc in first dc (corner made), sc in next dc and in each dc across top edge, 3 sc in 3rd ch of turning ch-3 (corner made); work 45 sc evenly spaced along side edge, working approx 1 sc in edge of each sc row and 2 sc in edge of each dc row; 3 sc in 3rd sk ch at beginning of Row 1 (corner made), sc in free lp of each ch across bottom edge; 3 sc in free lp of last ch (corner made), work 45 sc evenly spaced along side edge as before – 156 sc. Join with sl st in first sc. Fasten off.

Round 2 With right side facing, join E with sl st in center sc of 3 sc in any corner, ch 3 (counts as dc),

edging

Round 1 With wrong side facing, join E with sc in center dc of 3 dc in any corner, work 2 sc in same dc as joining, sc in each dc around, working 97 sc along top and bottom edges, 151 sc along side edges and 3 sc in center dc of 3 dc in each corner – 508 sc.

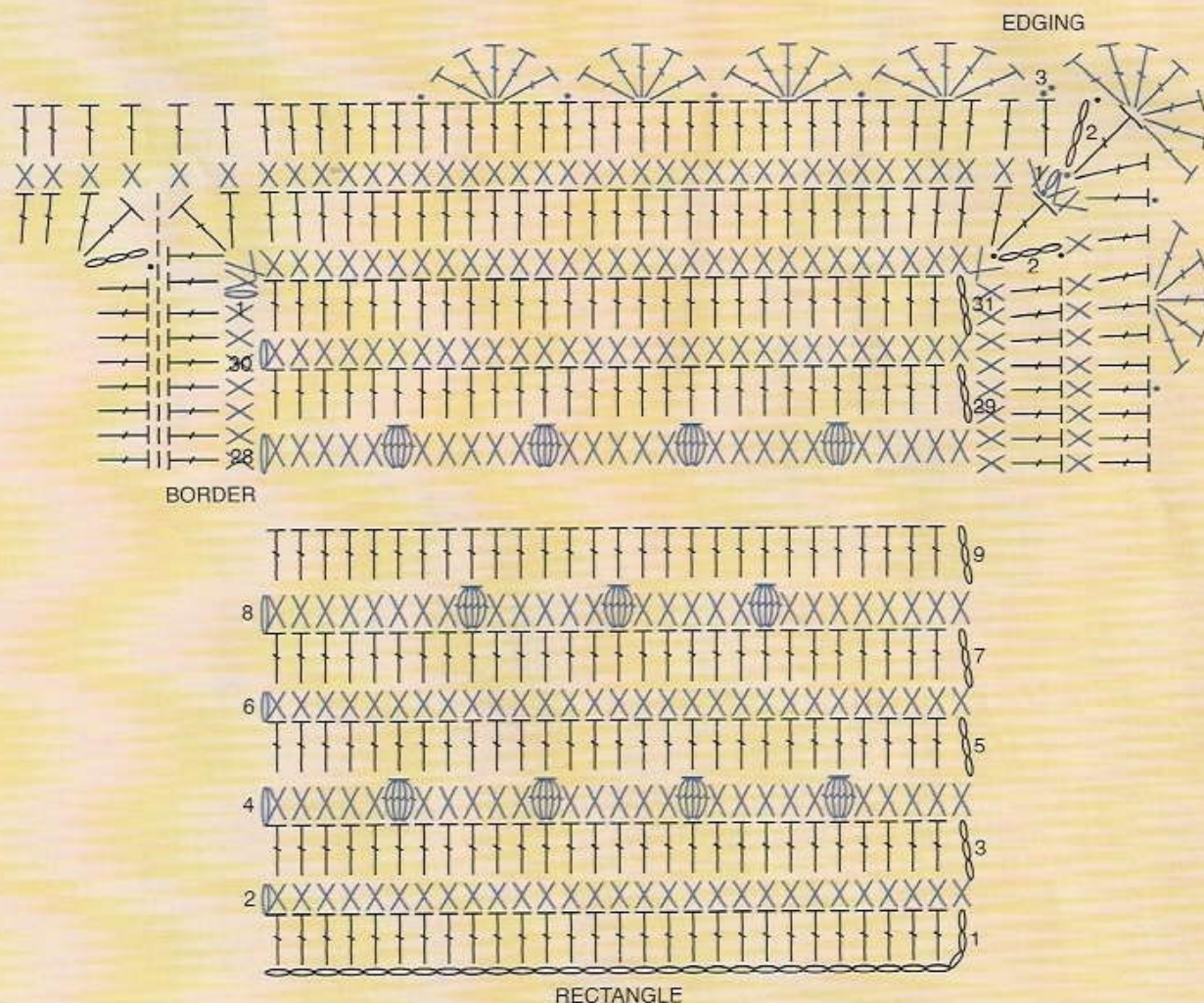
Join with sl st in first sc. Ch 3 (counts as dc on next round), turn.

Round 2 Dc in next sc and in each sc around, working 3 dc in center sc of 3 sc in each corner – 516 dc. Join with sl st in 3rd ch of beginning ch-3. Do not turn.

Round 3 *Sl st in next dc, sk next 2 dc, shell in next dc, sk next 2 dc; repeat from * around, working corner shell instead of shell in center dc of 3 dc in each corner – 82 shells and 4 corner shells. Join with sl st in beginning sl st. Fasten off.

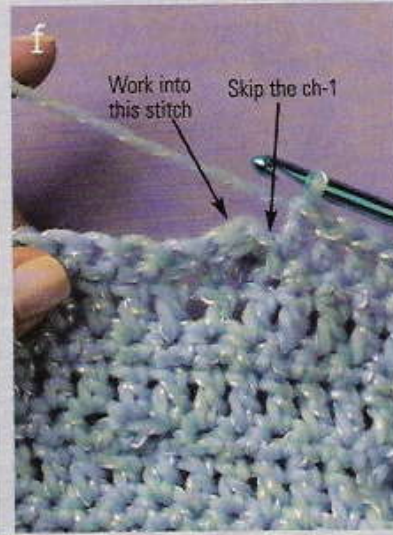

Weave in all ends. ■



MAKING A BOBBLE

- a** Yarn over, insert hook in the next stitch and pull up a loop. Yarn over and pull through two loops.
- b** Repeat step A four more times in the same stitch. Six loops will remain on the hook.
- c** Yarn over and pull through all six loops on the hook at once.
- d** Chain one to "close" the bobble.
- e** Work the next single crochet normally in the next stitch; after working this stitch you will see the bobble "pop."
- f** (wrong side shown) When working back across the bobbles on the wrong side, do not work into the chain-one of the bobble. Work into the stitch at the top of the bobble only.

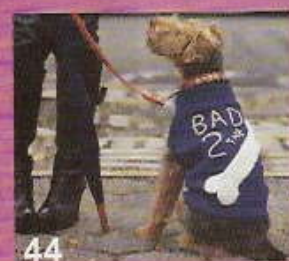
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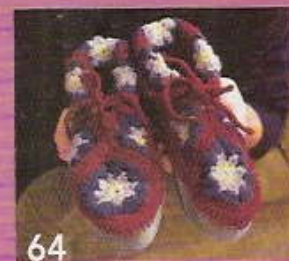
