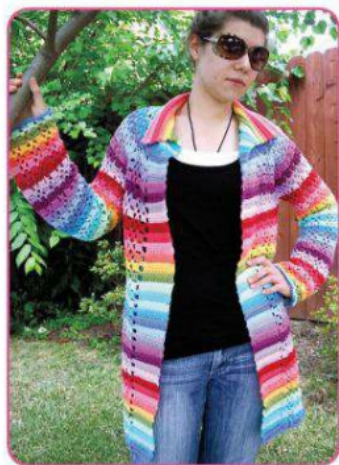
Letter We Love

I am a 13-year-old girl who thoroughly enjoys crocheting. Several of my friends received my crocheted blankets and scarves for Christmas and their interest was



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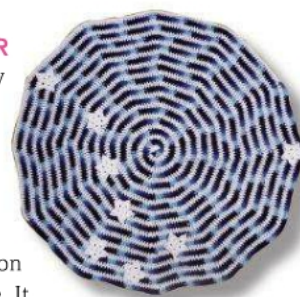

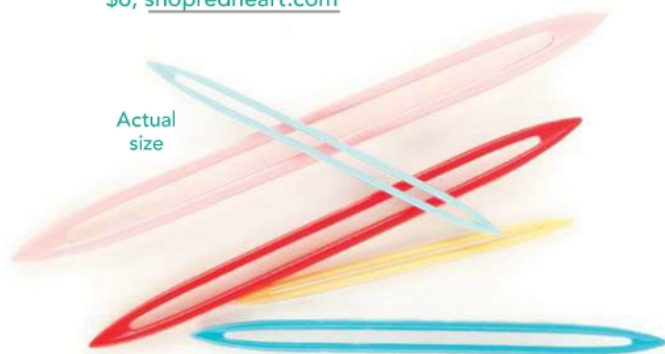

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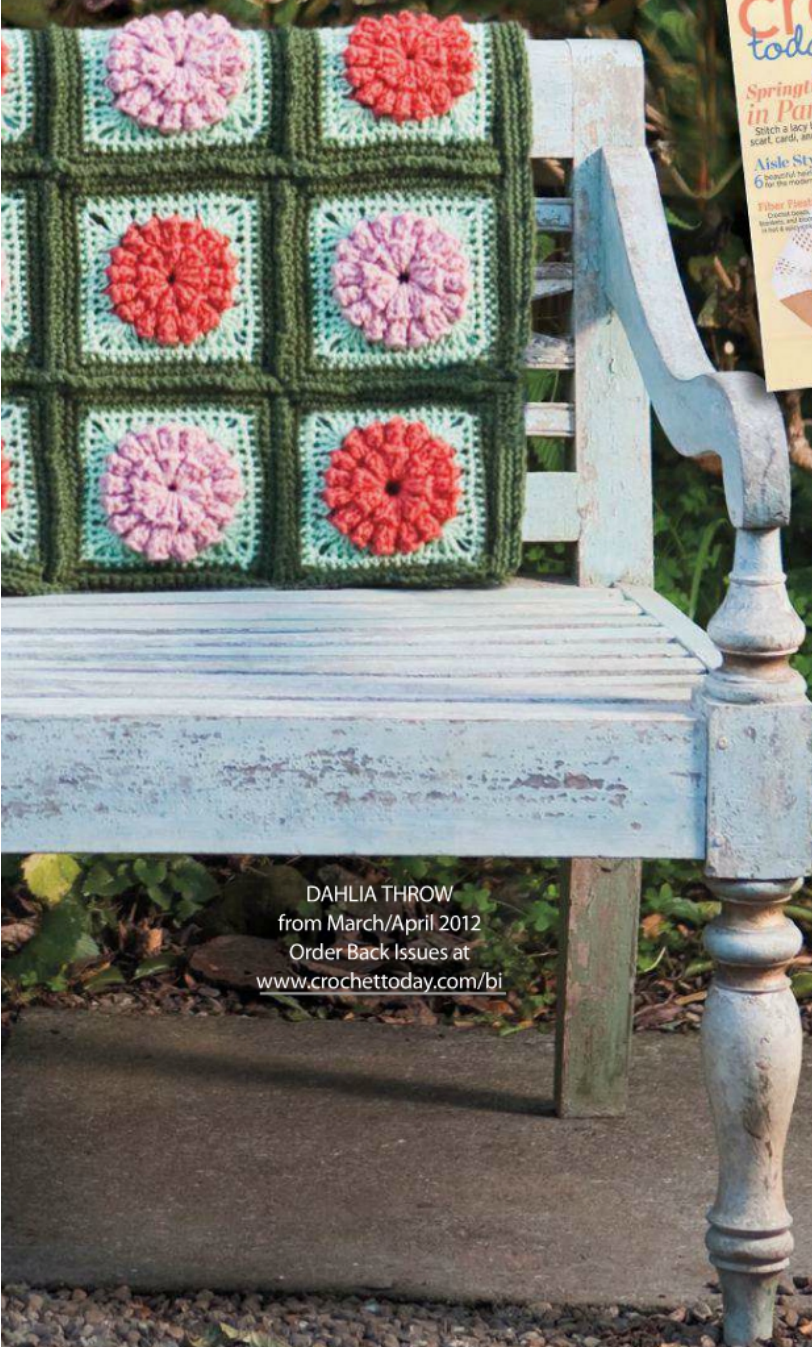
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Little Rascal Set

Prep your little one for snowball fun with this cozy classic set.

What You'll Need

YARN

RED HEART Soft, 5 oz/141g balls, each approx 256 yd/234m (acrylic)

- 2 balls #4604 Navy (A)
- 1 ball #4601 Off White (B)
- 1 ball #4608 Wine (C)

For yarn substitutions, see [page 93](#).

CROCHET HOOK

- Size I/9 (5.5mm) crochet hook *or any size to obtain correct gauge*

NOTIONS

- Yarn needle

Skill Level: INTERMEDIATE

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

Scarf 5"/12.5cm wide x 55"/139.5cm long

Hat 23"/58.5cm circumference

GAUGE

15 sts and 8 rows = 4"/10cm in pattern stitch
Remember to check gauge for best results!

HOW TO MAKE A GAUGE SWATCH

Ch 17.

Row 1 Dc in 4th ch from hook (counts as first dc), dc and in each ch across—15 sts.

Row 2 (RS) Ch 3 (counts as first dc throughout), turn; [FPdc around next st, dc in next 2 sts] 4 times, FPdc around next st, dc in next st.

Row 3 (WS) Ch 3, turn; [BPdc around next st, dc into next 2 sts] 4 times, BPdc around next

st, dc in next st.

Rows 4–7 [Repeat Rows 2 and 3] twice.

Row 8 Repeat Row 2.

Resulting gauge swatch should measure approx 4"/10cm square. If necessary, adjust hook size to obtain correct gauge.

SPECIAL ABBREVIATIONS

FPdc (Front Post double crochet) Yarn over, insert hook from front to back to front again, around post of indicated st, yarn over and draw up a loop, [yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook] twice.

BPdc (Back Post double crochet) Yarn over, insert hook from back to front to back again, around post of indicated st, yarn over and draw up a loop, [yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook] twice.

SPECIAL TECHNIQUES

Adjustable ring method See Resources, [pg 92](#).

NOTES

1 Hat is worked in joined continuous rounds. Do not turn at end of round unless otherwise indicated.

2 Visor is worked in turned rows with two strands of C.

3 To change colors, work last stitch of old color to last yarn over, yarn over with new color, and draw through all loops on hook.

HAT

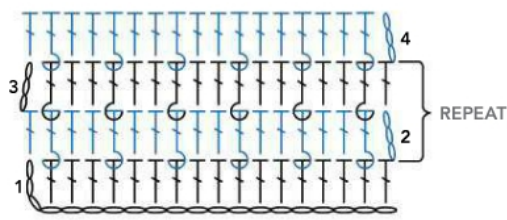
With A, make an adjustable ring.

Round 1 Ch 3 (counts as first st throughout), work 9 dc in ring; join with

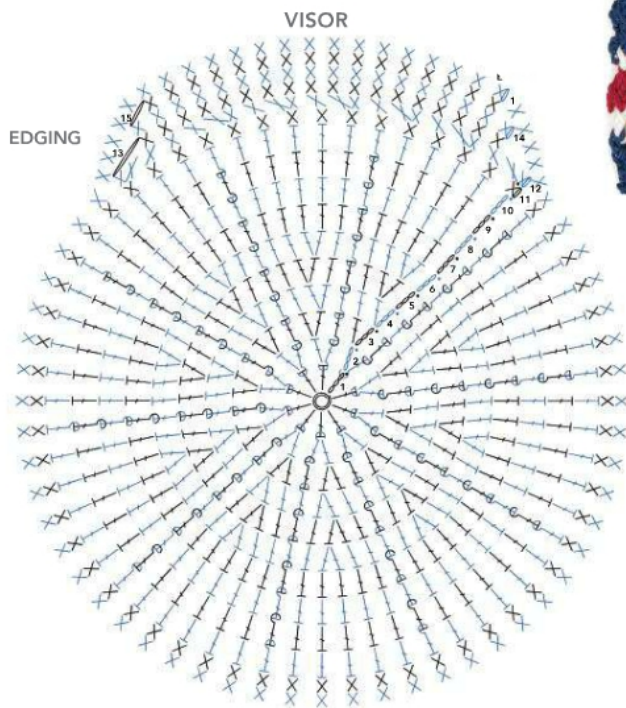

SCARF PATTERN



HAT

Use two strands in the visor to help keep its shape.

sl st in first st—10 dc.

Round 2 Ch 3, [FPdc around next dc, dc in same dc] 9 times, FPdc around ch-3 of previous round; join with sl st in first st—20 sts.

Round 3 Ch 3, dc in same dc, FPdc around next FPdc, [2 dc in next dc, FPdc around next FPdc] 9 times; join with sl st in first st—30 sts.

Round 4 Ch 3, dc in same dc, dc in next dc, FPdc around next FPdc, [2dc in next dc, dc in next dc, FPdc around next FPdc] 9 times; join with sl st in first st—40 sts.

Round 5 Ch 3, 2 dc in next dc, dc in next dc, FPdc around next FPdc, [dc in next dc, 2 dc in next dc, dc in next dc, FPdc around next FPdc] 9 times; join with sl st in first st—50 sts.

Round 6 Ch 3, 2 dc in next dc, dc in next 2

dc, FPdc around next FPdc, [dc in next dc, 2 dc in next dc, dc in next 2 dc, FPdc around next FPdc] 9 times; join with sl st in first st—60 sts.

Round 7 Ch 3, dc in next 4 dc, FPdc around next FPdc, [dc in next 5 dc, FPdc around next FPdc] 9 times; join with sl st in first st.

Round 8 Repeat Round 7. Fasten off A.

Round 9 Join B with sl st in first st; repeat Round 7. Fasten off B.

Round 10 Join C with sl st in first st; repeat Round 7. Do not fasten off.

Round 11 Sc in each sc around; join with sl st in first st, drawing up a 2nd strand of C.

Visor

Note Visor is worked in turned rows holding two strands of C together.

Row 12 Ch 1, [2 sc in next sc, sc in next sc] 6 times, sc in next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc; leave

remaining sc unworked—22 sc.

Row 13 Ch 1, turn; sk next 2 sc, sc in next 18 sc; leave last 2 sc unworked—18 sc.

Row 14 Ch 1, turn; sc in each sc across.

Row 15 Ch 1, turn; sk next sc, sc in next 16 sc; leave last sc unworked; do not fasten off—16 sc.

Edging

Round 1 Ch 1, turn; Sc in each sc around edge of hat and visor. Fasten off.

SCARF

With A, ch 20.

Row 1 Dc into 4th ch from hook (counts as first dc), dc in each ch across—18 dc.

Row 2 (RS) Ch 3 (counts as first dc throughout), turn; [FPdc around next st, dc in next 2 sts] 5 times, FPdc around next st, dc in next st.

Row 3 (WS) Ch 3, turn; [BPdc around next st, dc into next 2 sts] 5 times, BPdc around next st, dc in next st, changing to B. Fasten off A.

Row 4 Repeat Row 2, changing to C in last st. Fasten off B.

Row 5 Repeat Row 3; do not change color at end of row.

Row 6 Repeat Row 2, changing to B in last st. Fasten off C.

Row 7 Repeat Row 3, changing to A in last st. Fasten off B.

Rows 8–103 Repeat Rows 2 and 3, 48 times, changing to B only in last st of last repeat of Row 3. Fasten off A.

Row 104 Repeat Row 2, changing to C in last st. Fasten off B.

Row 105 Repeat Row 3; do not change color at end of row.

Row 106 Repeat Row 2, changing to B in last st. Fasten off C.

Row 107 Repeat Row 3, changing to A in last st. Fasten off B.

Row 108 Repeat Row 2.

Row 109 Repeat Row 3; do not change color at end of row.

Row 110 Sc in each st across. Fasten off A.

FINISHING

Weave in ends.

What You'll Need

YARN

RED HEART Super Saver, 7oz/198g skeins, each approx 364yd/333m (acrylic)

- 1 skein #313 Aran (A)
- 1 skein #390 Hot Red (B)
- 1 skein #387 Soft Navy (C)
- 1 skein #312 Black (D)

Note Only small amounts of each color are needed.

For yarn substitutions, see [page 93](#).

CROCHET HOOK

- Size G/6 (4mm) crochet hook or any size to obtain correct gauge

NOTIONS

- 3 tiny black buttons and 4 tiny gold buttons
- 3 clear snap fasteners
- Ivory embroidery floss
- Stitch marker
- Yarn needle

Skill Level: **EASY**

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

Sweater length Approx 5"/12.5cm long

Hat diameter Approx 4"/10cm



Shorts length Approx 2"/5cm long

Note All pieces are designed to fit Coco the Cat, originally published in the May/June 2012 issue of *Crochet Today*!

GAUGE

16 sts and 14 rows = 4"/10cm over single crochet.

Gauge is not critical for this project.

NOTE

To change color, work last stitch of old color to last yarn over. Yarn over with new color and draw through all loops on hook to complete stitch. Proceed with new color. Fasten off old color.

SWEATER

Beginning at neck, with C, ch 29.

Row 1 (WS) Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each remaining ch across; change to

A—28 sc.

Row 2 With A, ch 1, turn, [2 sc in first sc, sc in next 2 sc] 9 times, 2 sc in last sc; change to C—38 sc.

Row 3 With C, [2 sc in first sc, sc in next 3 sc] 9 times, 2 sc in next sc, sc in last sc—48 sc.

Row 4 With C, ch 1, turn, [2 sc in first sc, sc in next 4 sc] 9 times, 2 sc in next sc, sc in last 2 sc; change to A—58 sc.

Row 5 With A, ch 1, turn, [2 sc in first sc, sc in next 5 sc] 9 times, sc in last 4 sc; change to C—67 sc.

Rows 6 and 7 With C, ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across; change to A at end of Row 7.

Row 8 With A, ch 1, turn, sc in first 11 sc, sk next 13 sc (for armhole), sc in next 19 sc, sk next 13 sc (for armhole), sc in last 11 sc; change to C—41 sc.

Row 9 With C, ch 1, turn, sc in first 10 sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in next 19 sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in last 10 sc—43 sc.

Row 10 With C, ch 1, turn, sc in first 11 sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in next 19 sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in last 11 sc; change to A—45 sc.

Row 11 With A, ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across; change to C.

Row 12 With C, ch 1, turn, sc in first 12 sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in next 19 sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in last 12 sc—47 sc.

Row 13 With C, ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across; change to A.

Row 14 With A, ch 1, turn, sc in first 12 sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in next 21 sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in last 12 sc; change to C—49 sc.

Rows 15 and 16 With C, sc in each sc across; change to A at end of Row 16.

Row 17 With A, sc in each sc across. Fasten off.

Sew three tiny black buttons evenly spaced across back left edge. Sew one half of each clear snap fastener beneath one tiny black button on inner side of back left edge. Sew other half of each clear snap fastener to back right edge, opposite the first halves of the fasteners.

BANDANA

Beginning at back tip, with B, ch 3.

Row 1 Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in next ch—2 sc.

Row 2 Ch 1, turn, 2 sc in each sc across—4 sc.

Row 3 Ch 3, turn, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in next ch, 2 sc in first sc, sc in next 2 sc, 2 sc in last sc—8 sc.

Rows 4–9 Ch 3, turn, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in next ch, 2 sc in first sc, sc in each sc across to last sc, 2 sc in last sc—32 sc.

Ties

Rows 10 and 11 Ch 6, turn, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in next 4 ch, sc in each sc across—42 sc.

Fasten off.

SHORTS

Beginning at top, with D, ch 39.

Row 1 Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across—38 sc.

Rows 2–9 Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across. Fasten off and weave in ends.

Fold piece in half, bringing side edges together. Sew side edge seams, leaving a small opening near lower edge for tail. Flatten piece so seam is centered at the back. Sew center of lower



edges (Row 9) together to form two openings, one on either side of seam, for legs. Sew four tiny gold buttons to the front of Shorts.

HAT

With A, ch 2.

Round 1 (RS) Work 4 sc in 2nd ch from hook; do not join, work in continuous rounds—4 sc. Place marker for beginning of round. Move marker up as each round is completed.

Rounds 2 and 3 Work 2 sc in each sc around—16 sc at the end of Round 3.

Round 4 [2 sc in next sc, sc in next sc] 8 times—24 sc.

Round 5 [2 sc in next sc, sc in next sc] 12 times—36 sc.

Round 6 [Sc2tog, sc in next 4 sc] 6 times—30 sc.

Rounds 7–10 Sc in each sc around.

Round 11 Work 2 sc in each sc around—60 sc.

Rounds 12 and 13 Sc in each sc around. Fasten off.

Hatband

With B, ch 55.

Row 1 Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each remaining ch across—54 sc. Fasten off.

Using photo as a guide, with ivory embroidery floss, embroider "VENEZIA" across center of Hatband. Sew Hatband around Hat, crossing ends at back of Hat.

FINISHING


Weave in ends.

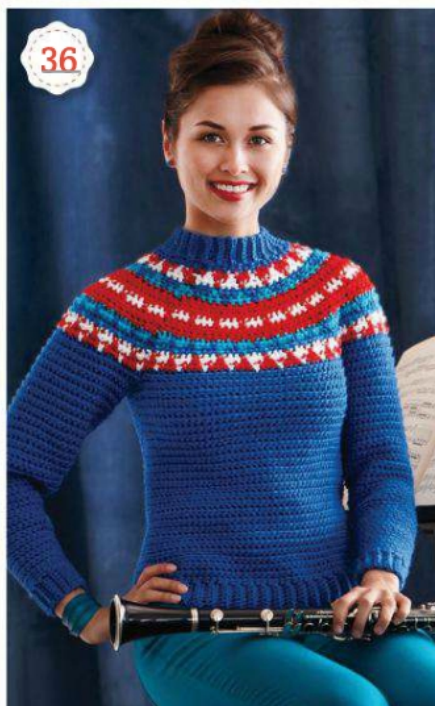
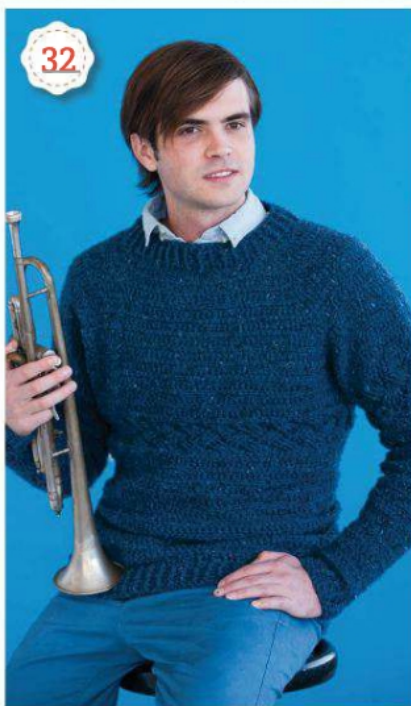
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Singing the Blues

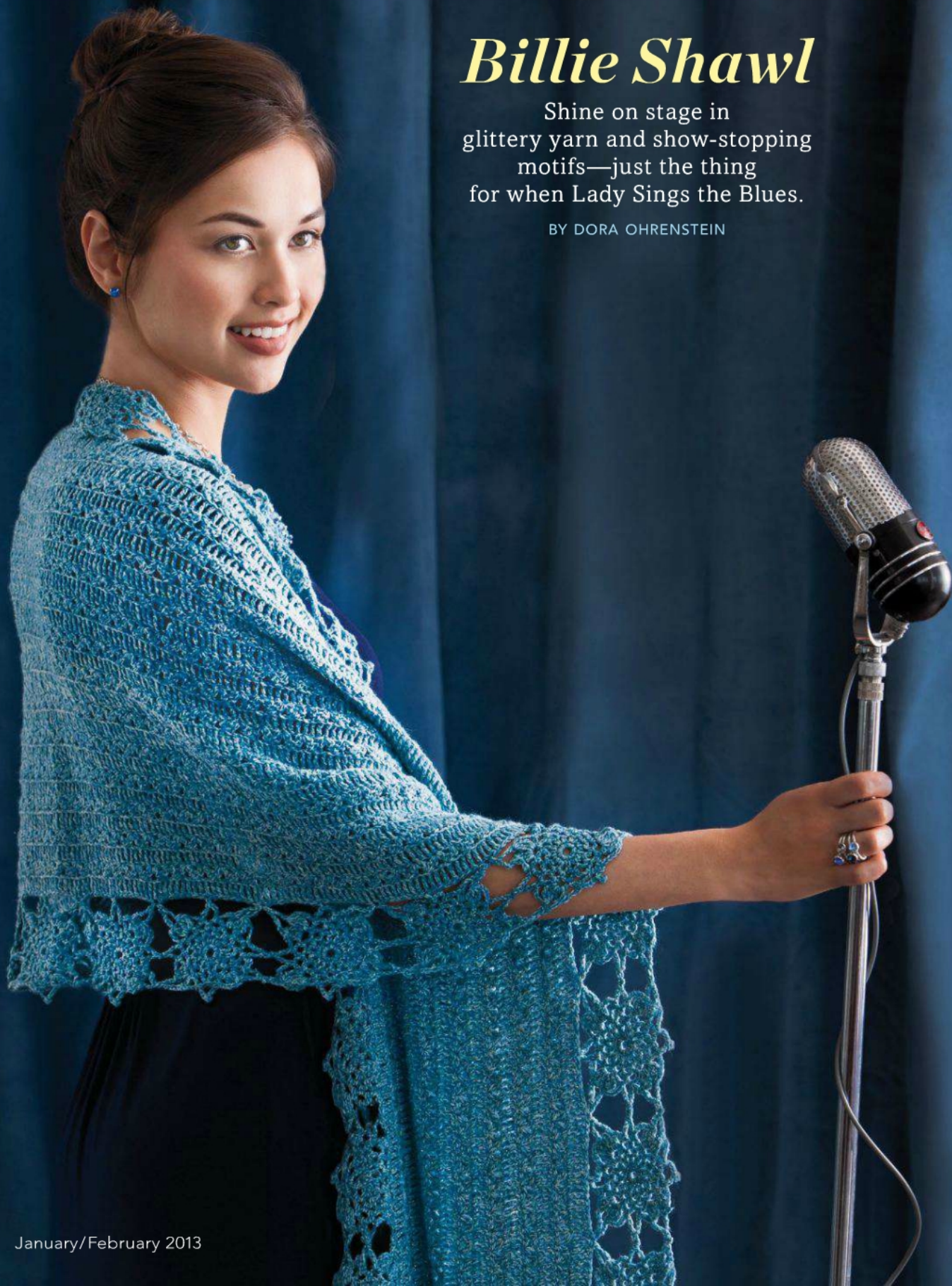
Feeling a little melancholy? Grab your harmonica, we mean *hook*, and get in the rhythm of stitching in the season's best blues. These six fashion patterns, all made in shades of blue yarns, will keep your spirits high through winter. Plus, we've mixed in some metal—metallic yarns to add a bit of glamour. ❖❖❖



Billie Shawl

What You'll Need

YARN

RED HEART Stardust, 1.76oz/50g balls, each approx 191yd/175m (wool/nylon/metallic)

- 7 balls #1805 Blue

For yarn substitutions, see [page 93](#).

CROCHET HOOK

- Size D/3 (3.25mm) crochet hook *or any size to obtain correct gauge*

NOTIONS

- Stitch markers (41)
- Yarn needle

Skill Level: INTERMEDIATE



Stardust in Blue



FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

Width Approx 21"/53.5cm

Length Approx 65"/165cm

GAUGE

22 sts and 8 rows = 4"/10cm over main section pattern;

One motif measures about 3.25 x 3.25"/8.5 x 8.5cm square.

Remember to check gauge for best results!

HOW TO MAKE A GAUGE SWATCH

Ch 25.

Row 1 (RS) Tr BL in 5th ch from hook (beginning ch counts as first tr), tr BL in each remaining ch across—22 tr.

Rows 2–7 Repeat Rows 2 and 3 of Main Section 3 times.

Row 8 Work Row 2 of Main Section once more.

Resulting gauge swatch should measure approx 4 x 4"/10 x 10cm. If necessary, adjust hook size to obtain correct gauge.

SPECIAL STITCHES

petal-pair (Worked over 4 stitches) Yarn over, insert hook in indicated tr, yarn over and draw up a loop, yarn over and

draw through 2 loops on hook (2 loops remain on hook), yarn over, insert hook in same stitch, yarn over and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook (first leg complete—3 loops remain on hook); skip next 2 tr; yarn over, insert hook in next tr, yarn over and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook (4 loops remain on hook), yarn over, insert hook in same stitch, yarn over and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook (2nd leg complete—5 loops remain on hook), yarn over and draw through all 5 loops on hook (petal-pair complete).

petal-point Yarn over 3 times, insert hook in next ch-4 space, yarn over and draw up a loop, [yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook] 3 times (2 loops remain on hook), yarn over twice, insert hook in same ch-4 space, yarn over and draw up a loop, [yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook] twice (3 loops remain on hook), yarn over, insert hook in same ch-4 space, yarn over and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook, yarn over and draw through all 4 loops on hook.

NOTES

1 Main Section of shawl is worked lengthwise in alternating rows of tr and petal-pairs.

2 Motifs are then worked and joined to each other and to a long edge of the shawl, forming a single row of motifs across both long edges.

3 Motifs are joined to each other and to the Main Section using a join-as-you-go technique.

SHAWL

Main Section

Ch 364.

Row 1 (RS) Tr BL in 5th ch from hook (beginning ch counts as first tr), tr BL in each remaining ch across—361 tr.

Row 2 (Petal row) Ch 3 (counts as first dc here and throughout), turn, beginning in first tr and working work petal-pair, *ch 2, beginning in same st as 2nd leg of

previous petal-pair, work petal-pair; repeat from * across, dc in same st as 2nd leg of last petal-pair—120 petal-pairs, 119 ch-2 sps, and 2 dc.

Row 3 (tr row) Ch 4 (counts as first tr here and throughout), turn, tr BL in first dc, *tr BL in next petal-pair, tr BL in each of next 2 ch; repeat from * across to last petal-pair, tr BL in last petal-pair, tr BL in last dc (turning ch-3)—361 tr.

Rows 4–29 Repeat Rows 2 and 3 thirteen times, making sure that the petal-pairs line up with those in previous rows.

Fasten off.

Motif Strip

Place a marker in the first tr of the last row, *sk the next 8 tr, place marker in next tr; repeat from * across—41 markers placed.

First Motif

Ch 6; join with sl st in first ch to form a ring.

Round 1 Ch 1, work 12 sc in ring; join with sl st in first sc—12 sc.

Round 2 Ch 1, sc in same st as join, *ch 3, sc in next sc; repeat from * around; join with ch 1, hdc in first sc (joining ch-1 and hdc count as ch-3 sp)—12 sc and 12 ch-3 sps.

Round 3 Ch 1, sc in first ch-3 sp (the ch-3 sp formed by join, work around the post of the hdc), *ch 3, sc in next ch-3 sp; repeat from * around; join with ch 1, hdc in first sc.

Round 4 Ch 1, sc in first ch-3 sp, *ch 4, sc in next ch-3 sp; repeat from * around; join with ch 1, dc in first sc (joining ch-1 and dc count as ch-4 sp)—12 sc and 12 ch-4 sps.

Note In the next round, you will complete the motif and join it to the marked long edge of the Main Section.

Round 5 (Joining round) Ch 1, sc in first ch-4 sp (the ch-4 sp formed by join, work around the post of the dc), [ch 6, sl st in 4th ch from hook (picot made), ch 3, sc in next ch-4 sp, ch 5, (petal-point, ch 6, sl st in 4th ch from hook, ch 3, petal-point) in next ch-4 sp, ch 5, sc in next ch-4 sp] twice, ch 6, sl st in 4th ch from hook (picot made), ch 3, sc in next ch-4 sp, ch 5, (petal-point, ch 4, sc in first marked

st on long edge of Main Section, ch 4, petal-point) in next ch-4 sp, ch 5, sc in next ch-4 sp, ch 4, sc in next marked st on long edge of main section, ch 4, sc in next ch-4 sp, ch 5, (petal-point, ch 4, sc in next marked st on long edge of Main Section, ch 4, petal-point) in next ch-4 sp, ch 5; join with sl st in first sc. Fasten off.

Next 19 Motifs

Work same as First Motif through Round 4—12 sc and 12 ch-4 sps.

Note In the next round, you will complete the motif and join it to the previous motif as well as to the marked long edge of the Main Section.

Round 5 (Joining round) Ch 1, sc in first ch-4 sp, ch 6, sl st in 4th ch from hook (picot made), ch 3, sc in next ch-4 sp, ch 5, (petal-point, ch 6, sl st in 4th ch from hook, ch 3, petal-point) in next ch-4 sp, ch 5, sc in next ch-4 sp; ch 6, sl st in 4th ch from hook, ch 3, sc in next ch-4 sp, ch 5, (petal-point, ch 4, sc in picot at corner of previous motif, ch 4, petal-point) in next ch-4 sp, ch 5, sc in next ch-4 sp, ch 3, sc in next picot of previous motif, ch 3, sc in next ch-4 sp, ch 5, (petal-point, ch 4, sc in same marked st as previous motif, ch 4, petal-point) in next ch-4 sp, ch 5, sc in next ch-4 sp, ch 4, sc in next marked st on long edge of Main Section, ch 4, sc in next ch-4 sp, ch 5, (petal-point, ch 4, sc in next marked st on long edge of Main Section, ch 4, petal-point) in next ch-4 sp, ch 5; join with sl st in first sc. Fasten off.

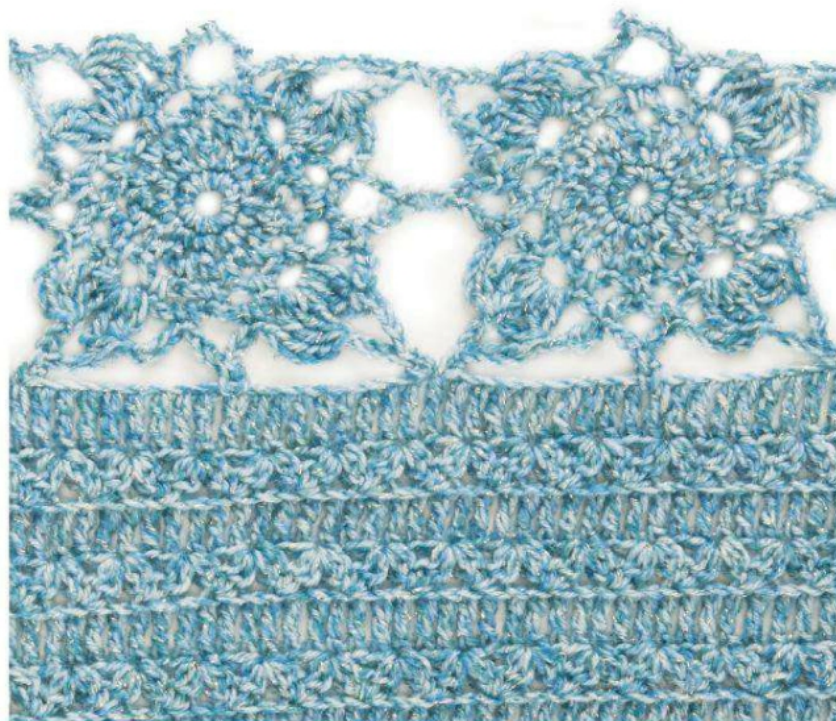
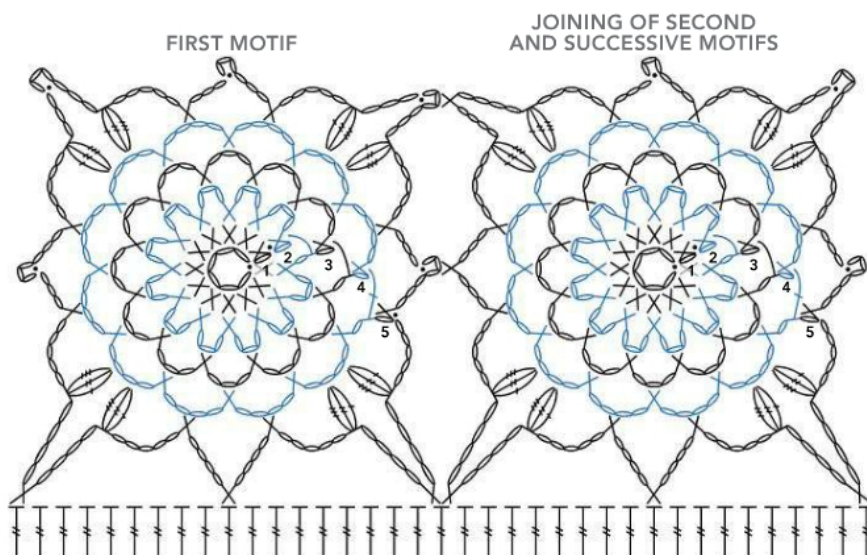
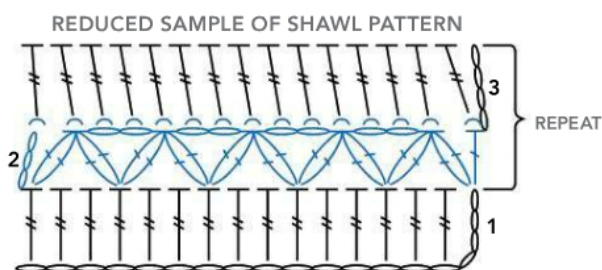
Remove markers. Place a marker in the ch at the base of the first tr of the first row of Main Section, *sk the next 8 tr, place marker in ch at base of next tr; repeat from * across—41 markers placed.

Work Motif Strip across bottom edge of Row 1 in same manner as First Motif strip.

FINISHING

Weave in ends. Wet motifs lightly, pin down to flatten, allow shawl to dry. 🌀

Tip To change the shawl's width, work more or fewer rows, ending with a treble row.

SPECIAL STITCHES

hdc2tog (half double crochet 2 stitches together) Yarn over, insert hook in next st, yarn over and draw up loop, insert hook in next st, yarn over and draw up loop, yarn over, draw through 4 loops on hook. (This produces a less bulky decrease than the typical hdc2tog.)

shell Work 9 dc in indicated stitch.

half shell Work 5 dc in indicated stitch.

dc4tog (double crochet 4 stitches together) [Yarn over, insert hook in next stitch, yarn over and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook] 4 times, yarn over and draw through all 5 loops on hook.

dc5tog (double crochet 5 stitches together) [Yarn over, insert hook in next stitch, yarn over and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook] 5 times, yarn over and draw through all 6 loops on hook.

dc9tog (double crochet 9 stitches together) [Yarn over, insert hook in next stitch, yarn over and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook] 9 times, yarn over and draw through all 10 loops on hook.

NOTES

Hat is worked in joined rounds. Do not turn between rounds unless instructed to do so.

The WS of stitches are used as the RS of Hat. To use RS of stitches, do not turn at beginning of Round 15.

To tighten fit of Hat, repeat Round 15 as desired.

To extend length of Hat, work additional rounds between Rounds 8 and 12.

HAT

With smaller hook, ch 3 (counts as hdc and ch for ring).

Round 1 (WS) Work 9 hdc in first ch, join with sl st in top of ch-3; pull tail to tighten center—10 hdc.

Round 2 Ch 2 (counts as first hdc here and throughout), hdc in same hdc, 2 hdc in each hdc around, join with sl st in first hdc—20 hdc.

Round 3 Ch 2, hdc in same hdc, hdc in next hdc, [2 hdc in next hdc, hdc in next hdc] 9 times, join with sl st in first hdc—30 hdc.

Round 4 Ch 2, hdc in same hdc, hdc in next 2 hdc, [2 hdc in next hdc, hdc in next 2 hdc] 9 times, join with sl st in first hdc—40 hdc.

Round 5 Ch 2, hdc in same hdc, hdc in next 3 hdc, [2 hdc in next hdc, hdc in next 3 hdc] 9 times, join with sl st in first hdc—50 hdc.

Round 6 Ch 2, hdc in same hdc, hdc in next 4 hdc, [2 hdc in next hdc, hdc in next 4 hdc] 9 times, join with sl st in first hdc—60 hdc.

Round 7 Ch 2, hdc in same hdc, hdc in next 5 hdc, [2 hdc in next hdc, hdc in

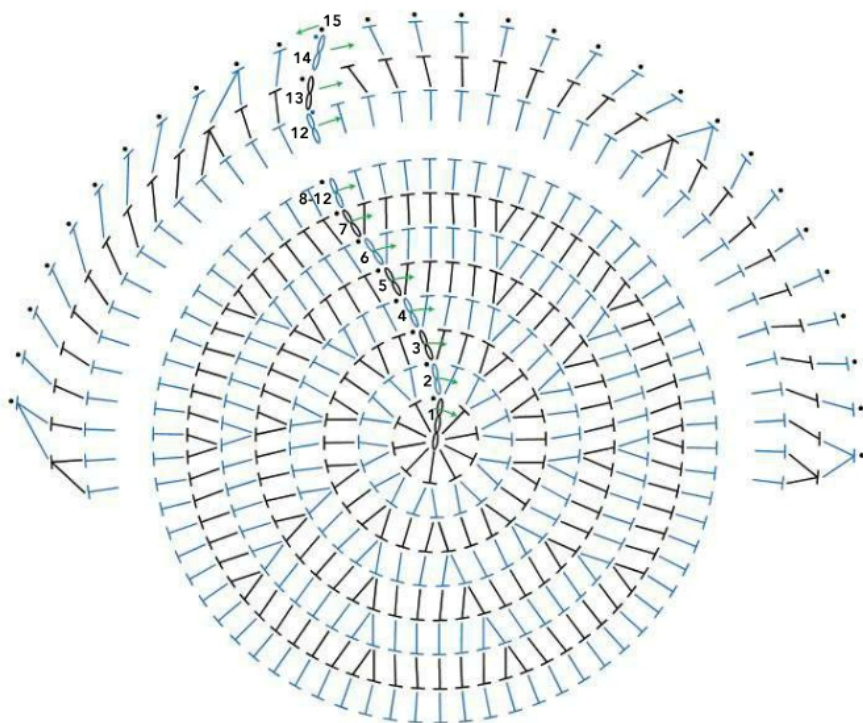


next 5 hdc] 9 times, join with sl st in first hdc—70 hdc.

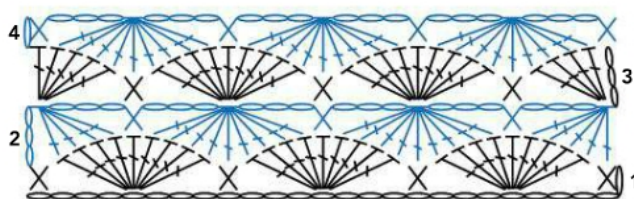

Round 14 Ch 2, sk next st, [hdc in next 8 sts, hdc2tog] 6 times, hdc in next st, join

with sl st in first hdc—56 sts.

Round 15 (RS) Turn; sl st in each st around.

Fasten off.

GATHERED BAND

With larger hook, ch 58.

Row 1 Sc in back bar of 2nd ch from hook, [sk 3 ch, shell in back bar of next ch, sk 3 ch, sc in back bar of next ch] 7 times—7 shells.

Row 2 Ch 3 (counts as first dc here and throughout), turn; dc4tog, [ch 3 loosely, sc in next dc, ch 3 loosely, dc9tog] 6 times, ch 3 loosely, sc in next dc, ch 3, dc-5tog—6 dc9tog, 1 dc4tog and 1 dc5tog.

Row 3 Ch 3, turn; 4 dc in first st (counts

as half shell), [sk next ch-3 sp, sc in next sc, sk next ch-3 sp, shell in next st] 6 times, sc in next sc, 5 dc in last st—6 shells and 2 half shells.

Row 4 Ch 1, turn; sc in first dc, [ch 3, dc9tog, ch 3, sc in next dc] 7 times, do not fasten off—7 dc9tog.

Fold Band in half aligning row ends. Work sl st evenly along seam to close. Fasten off, leaving a 36"/91.5cm tail. Wrap yarn tail in 2"/5cm loops over center of Band eight times, lining strands neatly. Wrap separate short strand of yarn around loops on inside of Band to secure in place.

FINISHING

Weave in ends.

Length 24.5 (25.5, 27, 28, 29, 30)"/62 (65, 68.5, 71, 73.5, 76)cm

GAUGE

13 sts = 4"/10cm and 11 rows = 6"/15cm over pattern.

Remember to check gauge for best results!

HOW TO MAKE A GAUGE SWATCH

Ch 28.

Row 1 (RS) Dc in 4th ch from hook (beginning ch counts as first dc), dc in next 5 ch, ch 2, sk next 2 ch, dc in next 8 ch, ch 2, sk next 2 ch, dc in last 7 ch—22 dc and 2 ch-2 sps.

Rows 2–11 Ch 3 (counts as dc here and throughout), turn, [dc in each dc to next ch-2 sp, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp] twice, dc in each dc across.

Resulting gauge swatch should measure approx 8 x 6"/20.5 x 15cm. If necessary,

adjust hook size to obtain correct gauge.

NOTES

1 Cardigan is worked in one piece from lower edge up to underarms. Piece is then divided and Fronts and Back worked separately.

2 Sleeves are worked directly onto Fronts and Back.

CARDIGAN BODY

Ch 152 (164, 176, 188, 200, 212).

Row 1 (RS) Dc in 4th ch from hook (beginning ch counts as first dc), dc in next 9 (10, 11, 12, 13, 14) ch, [ch 2, sk next 2 ch, dc in next 11 (12, 13, 14, 15, 16) ch] 4 times, ch 2, sk next 2 ch, dc in next 20 (22, 24, 26, 28, 30) ch, [ch 2, sk next 2 ch, dc in next 11 (12, 13, 14, 15, 16) ch] 5 times—130 (142, 154, 166, 178, 190) dc and 10 ch-2 sps.

Rows 2–4 Ch 3 (counts as dc here and throughout), turn, [dc in each dc to next ch-2 sp, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp] 10 times, dc in each dc across.

Shape Waist

Place a stitch marker in the center stitch of the 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th, 7th, 8th, 9th, and 10th dc-sections, leaving the first, last, and middle dc-sections unmarked. As each row is worked, take care to move the markers to the center stitch of each section. When there is no stitch in the exact center, mark a stitch close to the center.

Row 5 (Decrease row) Ch 3, turn, dc in each dc to first ch-2 sp, [ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp, dc in each dc to next marked st, dc2tog, dc in each dc to next ch-2 sp] 4 times, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp, dc in each dc to next ch-2 sp, [ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp, dc in each dc to next marked st, dc2tog,, dc in each dc to next ch-2 sp] 4 times, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp, dc in each dc across—122 (134, 146, 158, 170, 182) dc and 10 ch-2 sps.

Rows 6 and 7 Repeat Row 2 twice.

Rows 8–19 Repeat Rows 5–7 four times—90 (102, 114, 126, 138, 150) dc and 10 ch-2 sps.

Repeat Row 2 until piece measures about 11.5"/29cm from beginning. Remove markers.

FIRST FRONT

Row 1 Ch 3, turn, dc in each dc to next

ch-2 sp, [ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp, dc in each dc to next ch-2 sp] twice, 2 dc in next ch-2 sp; leave remaining sts unworked for back and second front—25 (28, 31, 34, 37, 40) dc and 2 ch-2 sps.

Place marker in the end of this row for armhole edge.

Row 2 Ch 3, turn, dc in first dc (increase made), [dc in each dc to next ch-2 sp, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp] twice, dc in each dc across—26 (29, 32, 35, 38, 41) dc and 2 ch-2 sps.

Row 3 Ch 3, turn, [dc in each dc to next ch-2 sp, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp] twice, dc in each dc to last 2 dc, 2 dc in next dc, dc in last dc—27 (30, 33, 36, 39, 42) dc and 2 ch-2 sps.

Row 4 Repeat Row 2—28 (31, 34, 37, 40, 43) dc and 2 ch-2 sps.

Add Sleeve Chain

Drop loop from hook but do not fasten off. Place the dropped loop on a stitch marker or safety pin to prevent unraveling. With a separate length of yarn, ch 8, join with sl st in first st of Row 4 (at armhole edge) and fasten off. Return dropped loop to hook.

Row 5 Ch 3, turn, [dc in each dc to next ch-2 sp, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp] twice, dc in each dc to sleeve chain, ch 2, sk next 2 ch, dc in last 6 ch—34 (37, 40, 43, 46, 49) dc and 3 ch-2 sps.

Shape Neck

Row 6 Ch 3, turn, [dc in each dc to next ch-2 sp, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp] 3 times, dc in each dc to last 3 sts, dc2tog, dc in last dc—33 (36, 39, 42, 45, 48) dc and 3 ch-2 sps.

Row 7 Ch 3, turn, [dc in each dc to next ch-2 sp, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp] 3 times, dc in each dc across.

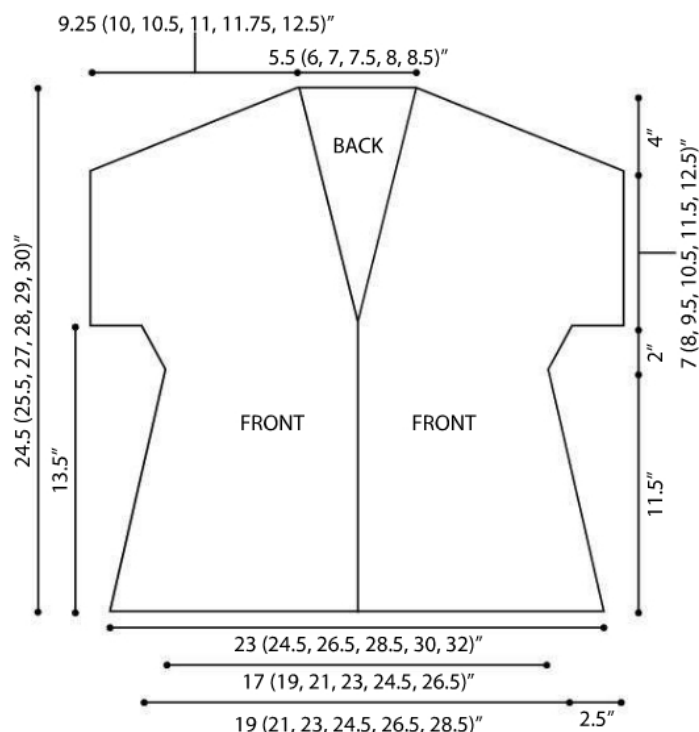
Rows 8–17 (19, 21, 23, 25, 27) Repeat last 2 rows 5 (6, 7, 8, 9, 10) times—28 (30, 32, 34, 36, 38) dc and 3 ch-2 sps.

Shape Shoulder

Row 1 Ch 1, turn, sl st in first dc, sc in next dc, hdc in next dc, [dc in each dc to next ch-2 sp, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp] 3 times, dc in each dc to last 3 dc, dc2tog, dc in last dc—24 (26, 28, 30, 32, 34) dc and 3 ch-2 sps.

Note In following rows do not work in the sl st, sc, or hdc of the previous row. Work only in the dc stitches, as instructed.

Row 2 Ch 3, turn, [dc in each dc to next ch-2 sp, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp] 3 times, hdc



in next dc, sc in next dc, sl st in next dc—21 (23, 25, 27, 29, 31) dc and 3 ch-2 sps. Fasten off.

Row 3 Turn, join with sl st in first ch of first ch-2 sp, sc in next ch, hdc in next dc, [dc in each dc to next ch-2 sp, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp] twice, dc in each dc to last 3 sts, dc2tog, dc in last dc—19 (21, 23, 25, 27, 29) dc and 2 ch-2 sps.

Row 4 Ch 3, turn, [dc in each dc to next ch-2 sp, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp] twice, dc in each dc to last 3 dc, hdc in next dc, sc in next dc, sl st in last dc—16 (18, 20, 22, 24, 26) dc and 2 ch-2 sps. Fasten off.

Row 5 Turn, join yarn with sl st in first dc, sc in next dc, hdc in next dc, [dc in each dc to next ch-2 sp, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp] twice, dc in each dc to last 3 sts, dc2tog, dc in last dc—12 (14, 16, 18, 20, 22) dc and 2 ch-2 sps.

Row 6 Ch 3, turn, [dc in each dc to next ch-2 sp, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp] twice, dc in each dc to last 3 dc, hdc in next dc, sc in next dc, sl st in last dc—9 (11, 13, 15, 17, 19) dc and 2 ch-2 sps. Fasten off.

Note Treat each dc and each ch as a stitch

in the following row. Depending on the size you are making, the sc and hdc may be worked in dc stitches or ch stitches. If only one of the sc or hdc is worked into a ch, work dc in the other ch of the ch-2 sp.

Row 7 Turn, join yarn with sl st in first dc, sc in next st, hdc in next st, dc in each dc and work ch-2 over each ch-2 sp across to last 2 dc, dc2tog—7 (9, 9, 11, 13, 15) dc and 1 (1, 2, 2, 2, 2) ch-2 sps. Fasten off.

BACK

Row 1 Draw up a loop in same ch-2 sp as last dc of first front, ch 3 (counts as first dc), dc in same ch-2 sp, dc in each dc to next ch-2 sp, [ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp, dc in each dc to next ch-2 sp] 4 times, dc in each dc to next ch-2 sp, 2 dc in next ch-2 sp; leave remaining sts unworked for second front—48 (54, 60, 66, 72, 78) dc and 4 ch-2 sps.

Row 2 Ch 3, turn, dc in first dc (increase made), [dc in each dc to next ch-2 sp, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp] 4 times, dc in each dc to last dc, 2 dc in last dc—50 (56, 62, 68, 74, 80) dc and 4 ch-2 sps.

Row 3 Ch 3, turn, 2 dc in next dc, [dc in each dc to next ch-2 sp, ch 2, sk next ch-2

sp] 4 times, dc in each dc to last 2 dc, 2 dc in next dc, dc in last dc—52 (58, 64, 70, 76, 82) dc and 4 ch-2 sps.

Row 4 Repeat Row 2—54 (60, 66, 72, 78, 84) dc and 4 ch-2 sps.

Add Sleeve Chain

Drop loop from hook but do not fasten off. Place the dropped loop on a stitch marker or safety pin to prevent unravelling. With a separate length of yarn, ch 8, join with sl st in first st of Row 4 (at armhole edge) and fasten off. Return dropped loop to hook.

Row 5 Ch 10, turn, dc in 4th ch from hook (beginning ch counts as first dc), dc in next 4 ch, ch 2, sk next 2 ch, [dc in each dc to next ch-2 sp, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp] twice, dc in each dc to sleeve chain, ch 2, sk next 2 ch, dc in last 6 ch—66 (72, 78, 84, 90, 96) dc and 6 ch-2 sps.

Rows 6–17 (19, 21, 23, 25, 27) Ch 3, turn, [dc in each dc to next ch-2 sp, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp] 6 times, dc in each dc across.

Shape Shoulders

Row 1 Ch 1, turn, sl st in first dc, sc in next dc, hdc in next dc, [dc in each dc to next ch-2 sp, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp] 6 times, dc in each dc to last 3 dc, hdc in next dc, sc in next dc, sl st in last dc—60 (66, 72, 78, 84, 90) dc and 6 ch-2 sps. Fasten off.

Note In following rows, do not work in the sl st, sc, or hdc of the previous row. Work only in the dc stitches, as instructed.

Row 2 Turn, join with sl st in first dc, sc in next dc, hdc in next dc, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp, [dc in each dc to next ch-2 sp, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp] 5 times, hdc in next dc, sc in next dc, sl st in next dc—54 (60, 66, 72, 78, 84) dc and 6 ch-2 sps. Fasten off.

Row 3 Turn, join with sl st in first ch of first ch-2 sp, sc in next ch, hdc in next dc, [dc in each dc to next ch-2 sp, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp] 4 times, dc in each dc to one dc before last ch-2 sp, hdc in next dc, sc in next ch, sl st in next ch—52 (58, 64, 70, 76, 82) dc and 4 ch-2 sps. Fasten off.

Row 4 Turn, join with sl st in first dc, sc in next dc, hdc in next dc, [dc in each dc to next ch-2 sp, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp] 4

times, dc in each dc to last 3 dc, hdc in next dc, sc in next dc, sl st in last dc—46 (52, 58, 64, 70, 76) dc and 4 ch-2 sps. Fasten off.

Row 5 Turn, join yarn with sl st in first dc, sc in next dc, hdc in next dc, [dc in each dc to next ch-2 sp, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp] 4 times, dc in each dc to last 3 sts, hdc in next dc, sc in next dc, sl st in next dc—40 (46, 52, 58, 64, 70) dc and 4 ch-2 sps. Fasten off.

Row 6 Turn, join with sl st in first dc, sc in next dc, hdc in next dc, [dc in each dc to next ch-2 sp, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp] twice, dc in each dc to last 3 dc, hdc in next dc, sc in next dc, sl st in last dc—34 (40, 46, 52, 58, 64) dc and 4 ch-2 sps. Fasten off.

Note in the following row, treat each dc and each ch as a stitch. Depending on the size you are making, the sc and hdc may be worked in dc stitches or ch stitches. If only one of the sc or hdc is worked into a ch, work dc in the other ch of the ch-2 sp.

Row 7 Turn, join yarn with sl st in first dc, sc in next st, hdc in next st, dc in each dc and work ch-2 over each ch-2 sp across to last 3 sts before hdc of previous row, hdc in next st, sc in next st, sl st in next st—32 (38, 40, 46, 52, 58) dc and 2 (2, 4, 4, 4) ch-2 sps. Fasten off.

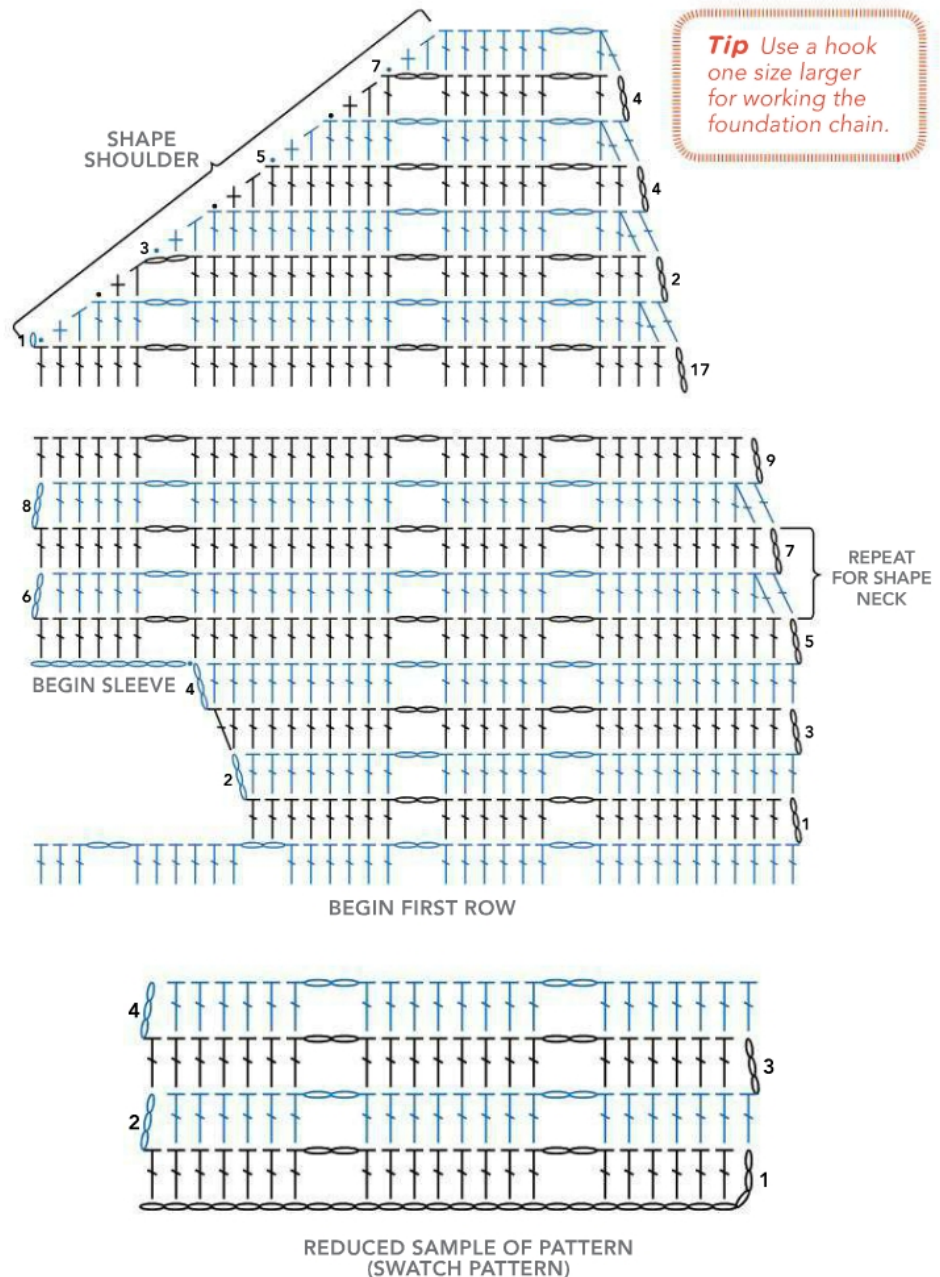
SECOND FRONT

Row 1 Draw up a loop in same ch-2 sp as last dc of back, ch 3 (counts as first dc), dc in same ch-2 sp, [dc in each dc to next ch-2 sp, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp] twice, dc in each dc across—25 (28, 31, 34, 37, 40) dc and 2 ch-2 sps.

Place marker in the beginning of this row for armhole edge.

Row 2 Ch 3, turn, [dc in each dc to next ch-2 sp, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp] twice, dc in each dc to last 2 dc, 2 dc in next dc, dc in last dc—26 (29, 32, 35, 38, 41) dc and 2 ch-2 sps.

Row 3 Ch 3, turn, dc in first dc (increase made), [dc in each dc to next ch-2 sp, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp] twice, dc in each dc



across—27 (30, 33, 36, 39, 42) dc and 2 ch-2 sps.

Row 4 Repeat Row 2—28 (31, 34, 37, 40, 43) dc and 2 ch-2 sps.

Row 5 (Add sleeve) Ch 10, turn, dc in 4th ch from hook (beginning ch counts as first dc), dc in next 4 ch, ch 2, sk next 2 ch, [dc in each dc to next ch-2 sp, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp] twice, dc in each dc across—34 (37, 40, 43, 46, 49) dc and 3 ch-2 sps.

Shape Neck

Row 6 Ch 3, turn, dc2tog, [dc in each dc to next ch-2 sp, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp] 3 times, dc in each dc across—33 (36, 39, 42, 45, 48) dc and 3 ch-2 sps.

Row 7 Ch 3, turn, [dc in each dc to next ch-2 sp, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp] 3 times, dc in each dc across.

Rows 8–17 (19, 21, 23, 25, 27) Repeat last 2 rows 5 (6, 7, 8, 9, 10) times—28 (30, 32, 34, 36, 38) dc and 3 ch-2 sps.

Shape Shoulder

Row 1 Ch 3, turn, dc2tog, [dc in each dc to next ch-2 sp, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp] 3 times, dc in each dc to last 3 dc, hdc in next dc, sc in next dc, sl st in next dc—24 (26, 28, 30, 32, 34) dc and 3 ch-2 sps. Fasten off.

Note In following rows, do not work in the sl st, sc, or hdc of the previous row. Only work in the dc stitches, as instructed.

Row 2 Turn, join with sl st in first dc, sc in next dc, hdc in next dc, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp, [dc in each dc to next ch-2 sp, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp] twice, dc in each dc across—21 (23, 25, 27, 29, 31) dc and 3 ch-2 sps.

Row 3 Ch 3, turn, dc2tog, [dc in each dc to next ch-2 sp, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp] twice, dc in each dc to one dc before last ch-2 sp, hdc in next dc, sc in next ch, sl st in next ch—19 (21, 23, 25, 27, 29) dc and 2 ch-2 sps. Fasten off.

Row 4 Turn, join with sl st in first dc, sc in next dc, hdc in next dc, [dc in each dc to next ch-2 sp, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp] twice,

dc in each dc across—16 (18, 20, 22, 24, 26) dc and 2 ch-2 sps.

Row 5 Ch 3, turn, dc2tog, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp, dc in each dc to next ch-2 sp, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp, dc in each dc to last 3 dc, hdc in next dc, sc in next dc, sl st in last dc—12 (14, 16, 18, 20, 22) dc and 2 ch-2 sps. Fasten off.

Row 6 Turn, join with sl st in first dc, sc in next dc, hdc in next dc, [dc in each dc to next ch-2 sp, ch 2, sk next ch-2 sp] twice, dc in last 2 dc—9 (11, 13, 15, 17, 19) dc and 2 ch-2 sps.

Note In the following row, treat each dc and each ch as a stitch. Depending on the size you are making, the sc and hdc may be worked in dc stitches or ch stitches. If only one of the sc or hdc is worked into a ch, work dc in the other ch of the ch-2 sp.

Row 7 Ch 2 (does not count as a st), dc in each dc and work ch-2 over each ch-2 sp across to last 3 sts before hdc of previous row, hdc in next st, sc in next st, sl st in next st—7 (9, 9, 11, 13, 15) dc and 1 (1, 2, 2, 2, 2) ch-2 sps.

Fasten off.

FINISHING

Sew shoulder seams. Sew underarm Sleeve seams.


Armhole Trim

Round 1 (RS) With RS facing, draw up a loop of yarn in armhole edge at seam, work sc evenly spaced around; join with sl st in first sc.

Round 2 Ch 2 (counts as first hdc), turn, hdc in each sc around; join with sl st in top of beginning ch. Fasten off. Repeat around second armhole.

Outer Trim

Round 1 (RS) With RS facing, join yarn with sc in lower front corner, sc evenly spaced all the way around outer edge, working ch-2 at each corner; join with sl st in first sc.

Round 2 Ch 2 (counts as first hdc), turn, hdc in each sc around; join with sl st in top of beginning ch. Fasten off. Weave in ends. 

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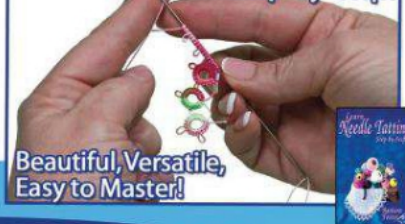

- Sewing pins

Motif

Width 3"/7.6cm at widest point

Length 7"/18cm

HOW TO PREPARE A GAUGE SWATCH

Ch 16.

Row 1 Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across—15 sc.

Row 2 Ch 1, turn; sc in each st across.

Rows 3–16 Repeat Row 2.

Resulting swatch should measure approx 4"/10cm square. If necessary, adjust hook size to obtain correct gauge.

NOTES

Each rope end is covered with yarn before stitches are worked. Work sc stitches in

same color yarn that was used to cover rope ends.

Stitch counts for Motif rows are approximate. Work as many stitches as needed to keep stitches loosely spaced along length of rope while ensuring white rope is completely covered after working Row 4.

Note Download a full-size version of the C Clef Diagram at www.crochettoday.com.

MOTIF

(Make 6—3 each with A and B)

Prepare Rope

With yarn threaded on yarn needle, tie double knot approx .5"/12mm from one end of rope. Wrap yarn 6–10 times around rope, working toward end. Anchor wrapping by threading the needle through rope. Wrap yarn again 5–7 times, working toward starting knot. Knot yarn and weave end through wrapping. Trim off yarn tail. Repeat on opposite end of rope.

Cord

Make an adjustable ring.

Round 1 (RS) Work 5 sc in ring, do not join; pull tail to tighten ring—5 sc.

Round 2 Work 2 sc in each sc around; do not fasten off—10 sc.

Note Work now progresses in rows along length of rope.

Row 3 Beginning at end of rope with strand extended across work surface, sc over rope as follows: *insert hook under strand of rope, yarn over and draw up a loop to front of rope, yarn over by bringing yarn over top of rope and draw through both loops on hook; repeat from * working 70 sc evenly spaced along length of rope, taking care not to twist rope or sts—70 sc.

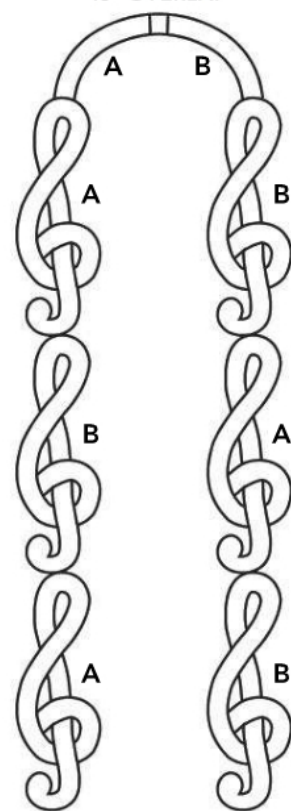
Row 4 Ch 1, turn to work along opposite side of rope, work 70 sc as in Row 1, inserting hook between sc made in Row 1—70 sc. Fasten off.

Weaving Motif

Enlarge Diagram 1 by 200 percent and pin Diagram 1 to Styrofoam or cork block. Line up Rounds 1–2 with circle on Diagram 1 and pin to Styrofoam block.

Tip Make just one motif with a long chain loop to hang as a decoration over your rear-view mirror or window.

Trace shape of Motif with Cord following diagram, pinning each crossing to secure the weave.

Carefully remove Motif from Styrofoam block.

Turn Motif over, so that WS is facing and securing crossings with yarn needle and matching yarn.

Using a cotton pressing cloth and a steam iron set on medium-high setting, steam press Motif for five seconds. Dry flat overnight.

JOINING PIECE

(Make 2—1 each with A and B)

Ch 16.

Row 1 Working in back bar of chs, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across—15 sc.

Rows 2–3 Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across. Fasten off, leaving a long tail for assembly.

FINISHING

Assemble Scarf

Using Diagram 2 as a guide, sew completed Motifs together in the color pattern shown.

Sew Joining Pieces together along short edge, overlapping approx .5"/12mm.

Matching colors, sew opposite ends of Joining Pieces to top of each Motif strip.

Weave in ends. 

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Otis Sweater

Stitch a pullover he'll actually wear, with a subtle cable to make it interesting.

GAUGE

12 sts and 10 rounds = 4"/10cm over Hdc/Dc Pattern.

Remember to check gauge for best results!

HOW TO MAKE A GAUGE SWATCH

Row 1 Fhdc 12—12 sts.

Row 2 Ch 2 (counts as first dc here and throughout), turn, dc in each st across.

Row 3 Ch 1 (does not count as a st here and throughout), turn, hdc in each st across.

Row 4 Repeat Row 2.

Rows 5–10 Repeat last two rows three times. Resulting gauge swatch should measure approx 4 x 4"/10 x 10cm. If necessary, adjust hook size to obtain correct gauge.

SPECIAL ABBREVIATIONS

Beg-Fhdc corner (Beginning foundation half double crochet corner) Ch 2, work 2 hdc in 2nd ch from hook, yarn over, insert

hook in same ch, yarn over and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through 1 loop on hook (base-ch made), yarn over and draw through all 3 loops on hook—2 sts increased.

BPdc (Back Post double crochet) Yarn over, insert hook from back to front to back again around post of indicated stitch, yarn over and draw up a loop, [yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook] twice.

FPdc (Front Post double crochet) Yarn over, insert hook from front to back to front again around post of indicated stitch, yarn over and draw up a loop, [yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook] twice.

Fhdc (Foundation half double crochet)

step 1 Ch 2 (does not count as a st), yarn over, insert hook in second ch from hook, yarn over and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through 1 loop on hook (base-ch made), yarn over and draw through all 3 loops on hook (Fhdc made)

step 2 Yarn over, insert hook in base-ch of last Fhdc made (be sure to insert hook under two loops of the base-ch; the loop at the front or face of the base-ch and the loop on the bottom side of the base-ch), yarn over and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through 1 loop on hook (base-ch made), yarn over and draw through all 3 loops on hook (Fhdc made). Repeat step 2 for desired number of Fhdc.

Fhdc corner (Foundation half double crochet corner) Work 2 hdc in base-ch of previous Fhdc, yarn over, insert hook in same base-ch, yarn over and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through 1 loop on hook (base-ch made), yarn over and draw through all 3 loops on hook—2 sts increased.

FPedc (Front Post extended double crochet) Yarn over, insert hook from front to back to front again around post of indicated stitch, yarn over and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through 1 loop on hook, [yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook] twice.

FPetr (Front Post extended treble crochet) Yarn over twice, insert hook from front to back to front again around post of indicated stitch, yarn over and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through 1 loop on hook, [yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook] 3 times.

3/3 LC (3 over 3 Left Cross) Sk next 3 sts, FPetr around each of next 3 sts, working in front of 3 sts just made, FPetr around each of the 3 skipped sts.

3/3 RC (3 over 3 Right Cross) Sk next 3 sts, FPetr around each of next 3 sts, working behind 3 sts just made, FPetr around each of the 3 skipped sts.

SPECIAL STITCH

Hdc/Dc Pattern

Round 1 (RS) Ch 2 (counts as dc), turn, dc in each st around; join with sl st in top of turning ch.

Round 2 (WS) Ch 1 (does not count as a st), turn, hdc in each st around; join with sl st in first hdc.

Repeat Rounds 1 and 2 for Hdc/Dc Pattern.

NOTES

- 1 Sweater is worked from the top down.
- 2 The Yoke is worked in joined rounds beginning at the neck edge. Increases are worked at four corners to shape the Yoke.
- 3 The Body is worked in joined rounds beginning at lower edge of Yoke. Sleeve stitches are skipped when beginning the Body. The Sleeves are worked in rounds over these skipped stitches after the Body is complete.

SWEATER YOKE

Round 1 (WS) Beg-Fhdc corner, Fhdc 10 (for sleeve), Fhdc corner, Fhdc 21 (23, 25, 27, 29) (for front), Fhdc corner, Fhdc 10 (for sleeve), Fhdc corner, Fhdc 21 (23, 25, 27, 29) (for back); join with sl st in first st of beginning corner—74 (78, 82, 86, 90) sts.

Place a marker in the center stitch of each corner.

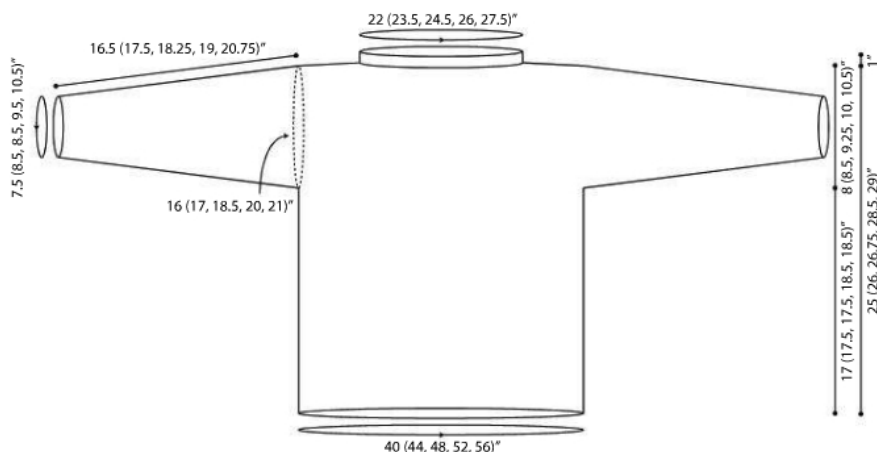
Notes The center corner stitches are the 2nd, 15th, 39th (41st, 43rd, 45th, 47th), and 52nd (54th, 56th, 58th, 60th) stitches.

Move markers to center stitch of each 3-stitch corner as each of the following rounds is worked.

Round 2 (RS) Ch 2 (counts as first dc here and throughout), turn, [dc in each st to next marked corner st, 3 dc in corner st] 4 times, dc in each remaining st around; join with sl st in top of turning ch—82 (86, 90, 94, 98) dc.

Round 3 Ch 1 (does not count as st here and throughout), turn, [hdc in each st to next marked corner st, 3 hdc in corner st] 4 times, hdc in each remaining st around; join with sl st in first hdc—90 (94, 98, 102, 106) hdc.

Rounds 4–19 (21, 23, 25, 27) Repeat last 2 rounds 8 (9, 10, 11, 12) times—218 (238,



258, 278, 298) sts.

Note Not including the marked stitches, there should be 48 (52, 56, 60, 64) sts between marked sts for each Sleeve, and 59 (65, 71, 77, 83) sts between markers for front and back. Fasten off.

BODY

Set-Up Round (RS) With RS facing, fold Yoke in half bringing marked sts on both sides of each set of Sleeve sts together. Place a slip knot on hook, yarn over, insert hook through both marked sts on each side of one set of Sleeve sts, yarn over and draw up a loop, [yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook] twice (join with dc made); sk all Sleeve sts, dc in each st across to next marked st; yarn over, insert hook through both marked sts on each

side of next set of Sleeve sts and work a dc, sk all Sleeve sts, dc in each st around; join with sl st in first dc—120 (132, 144, 156, 168) sts remain for Body. Leave only one marker in each corner pair at the base (underarm) of each Sleeve.

Cable Band

Note Work first stitch of each round in same stitch as joining.

Round 1 (RS) Ch 1, do not turn, *3/3 LC; repeat from * around; join with sl st in first st.

Round 2 Ch 1, turn, BPdc around each st around; join with sl st in first st.

Round 3 Ch 1, turn, FPdc around each of next 3 sts, *3/3 RC; repeat from * to last 3 sts, FPdc around each of next 3 sts; join with sl st in first st.

Round 4 Repeat Round 2.

Round 5 Ch 1, turn, *3/3 LC; repeat from * around; join with sl st in first st.

Round 6 Repeat Round 2.

Round 7 (WS) Ch 1, do not turn, hdc in each st around; join with sl st in first hdc.

Rounds 8–37 (39, 39, 41, 41) Beginning with Round 1 of pattern, work Hdc/Dc Pattern for 30 (32, 32, 34, 34) rounds.

Ribbing

Note Do not turn at the beginning of Ribbing rounds.

Round 1 (RS) Ch 2, dc in each st around; join with sl st in top of beginning ch.

Rounds 2–7 Ch 1, beginning in same st as join, *FPdc around next st, BPdc around next st; repeat from * around; join

with sl st in first st.

Round 8 Ch 1, turn, sc in each st around; join with sl st in first sc.

Fasten off.

SLEEVES

Set-Up Round (RS) With RS facing, draw up a loop in marked st at base of one Sleeve, ch 2, dc in each Sleeve st around; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—49 (53, 57, 61, 65) sts.

Note Work first stitch of each round in same stitch as joining.

Round 1 (RS) Ch 1, do not turn, FPdc around each of first 1 (3, 2, 1, 3) sts, *3/3 LC; repeat from * around to last 0 (2, 1, 0, 2) sts, FPdc around each of last 0 (2, 1, 0, 2) sts; join with sl st in first st.

Round 2 Ch 1, turn, BPdc around each st around; join with sl st in first st.

Round 3 Ch 1, turn, FPdc around each of first 4 (6, 5, 4, 6) sts, *3/3 RC; repeat from * around to last 3 (5, 4, 3, 5) sts, FPdc around each of last 3 (5, 4, 3, 5) sts; join with sl st in first st.

Round 4 Repeat Round 2.

Round 5 Ch 1, turn, FPdc around each of first 1 (3, 2, 1, 3) sts, *3/3 LC; repeat from * around to last 0 (2, 1, 0, 2) sts, FPdc around each of last 0 (2, 1, 0, 2) sts; join with sl st in first st.

Round 6 Repeat Round 2.

Beginning with Round 2 of pattern, work in Hdc/Dc Pattern for 0 (4, 0, 4, 2) rounds.

Shape Sleeve

Round 1 (WS) Ch 1, do not turn, hdc in first st, hdc2tog, hdc in each st to last 2 sts, hdc2tog; join with sl st in first hdc—47 (51, 55, 59, 63) hdc.

Round 2 Ch 2, turn, dc in each st around; join with sl st in top of turning ch.

Round 3 Ch 1, turn, hdc in first st, hdc2tog, hdc in each st to last 2 sts, hdc2tog; join with sl st in first hdc—45 (49, 53, 57, 61) hdc.

Round 4 Repeat Round 2.

Rounds 5–26 (26, 30, 32, 32) Repeat last 2 rounds 11 (11, 13, 14, 14) times—23 (27, 27, 29, 33) dc.

Next Round Ch 1, turn, hdc in first st, hdc2tog, hdc in each remaining st around; join with sl st in first hdc—22 (26, 26, 28, 32) hdc.

Beginning with Round 1 of pattern, work in Hdc/Dc Pattern for 5 (3, 5, 1, 7) rounds.

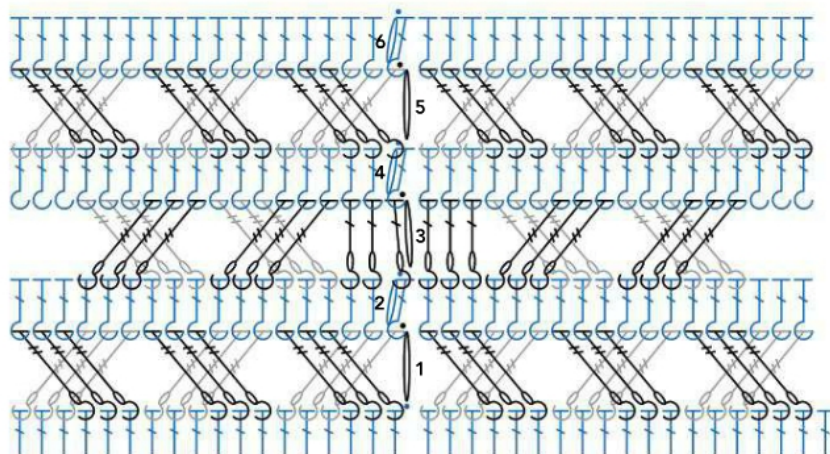

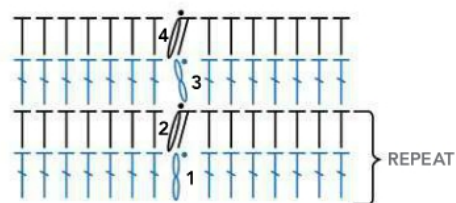

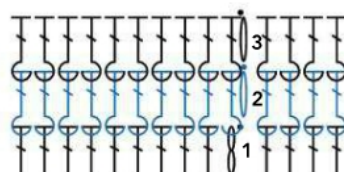

Cuff

Note Do not turn at the beginning of Cuff rounds.

Round 1 (RS) Ch 2, dc in each st around; join with sl st in top of beginning ch.

Rounds 2–5 Ch 1, beginning in same st as join, *FPdc around next st, BPdc around next st; repeat from * around; join with sl st in first st.

Round 6 Ch 1, turn, sc in each st around; join with sl st in first sc. Fasten off. Work second Sleeve same as first, working over other set of Sleeve stitches.

FINISHING

Neckband

Round 1 With RS facing and working in base-ch side of first round of Yoke. Draw up a loop in base-ch at back neck, ch 2 (counts as dc), dc in each base-ch around; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—66 (70, 74, 78, 82).

Note Only 1 stitch should be worked in the base-ch at each corner.

Rounds 2–5 Ch 1, beginning in same st as join, *FPdc around next st, BPdc around next st; repeat from * around; join with sl st in first st.

Round 6 Ch 1, turn, sc in each st around; join with sl st in first sc. Fasten off.

Weave in ends. Block cable band to finished measurement for chest. 🌀

How to Make the Cables

1 (Row 1) Skip 3 sts, work Front Post extended treble crochet (FPetr) in next 3 sts.



2 (Row 1) Working in front of last 3 sts, FPetr in 3 skipped sts, then work Front Post extended double crochet (FPedc) in next 3 sts.



3 (Rows 2 & 4) Work Back Post double crochet (BPdc) in each st.



4 (Row 3) FPedc in next 3 sts, skip 3 sts, then FPetr in next 3 sts.



5 (Row 3) Working behind last 3 sts, FPetr in 3 skipped sts.

GAUGE

11 sts and 8 rounds = 4"/10cm over linked half double crochet with larger hook.



Remember to check gauge for best results!

HOW TO MAKE A GAUGE SWATCH

With larger hook, ch 22; taking care not to twist ch, join with sl st in first ch to form a ring.

Round 1 Ch 2 (does not count as a st here and throughout), lhdcc in each ch around; join with sl st in top of beginning ch.

Rounds 2–8 Ch 2, lhdcc in each st around; join with sl st in top of beginning ch.

Resulting gauge swatch should measure approx 4"/10cm tall x 8"/20.5cm circumference (or approx 4"/10cm wide if piece is flattened before measuring). If necessary, adjust hook size to obtain correct gauge.

SPECIAL ABBREVIATIONS

lhdcc (linked half double crochet) Insert hook in the center (horizontal) bar of the last stitch made (or into the 2nd ch of the beginning ch-2) and draw up a loop (2 loops on hook), insert hook in next stitch and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through all 3 loops on hook.

lhdcc2tog (linked half double crochet 2 together) Insert hook in the center (horizontal) bar of the last stitch made and draw up a loop (2 loops on hook), [insert hook in next stitch and draw up a loop] twice, yarn over and draw through all 4 loops on hook.

NOTES

1 Sweater is worked in four pieces:

body, two sleeves, and yoke.

2 Body and sleeves are worked in joined rounds beginning at lower ribbing.

3 Yoke is worked in rounds beginning across top edges of Body and Sleeves.

4 Colorwork can be worked following written instructions or chart.

5 To change color, work last stitch of old color to last yarn over. Yarn over with new color and draw through all loops on hook to complete stitch. Carry color not in use across WS until next needed or instructed to fasten off.

SWEATER BODY

Ribbing

With smaller hook and A, ch 8.

Row 1 Sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each remaining ch across—7 sc.

Rows 2–84 (98, 106, 118, 128) Ch 1, turn, sc BL in each sc across.

Join into Ring (WS) Hold Ribbing with sts at bottom of first row and sts of last row matching, ch 1, working through both thicknesses, sc in each st across to join Ribbing into a large ring. Do not fasten off.

Body

Change to larger hook.

Round 1 Working across one edge of Ribbing ring, ch 2 (does not count as a st here and throughout), lhdc in end of each row around; join with sl st in first st—84 (98, 106, 118, 128) sts.

Round 2 Ch 2, lhdc in each st around; join with sl st in first st.

Repeat Round 2 until piece measures about 14 (14, 14.5, 14.5, 15)"/35.5 (35.5, 37, 37, 38)cm from beginning.

Last Round Ch 2, lhdc in first 42 (49, 53, 59, 64) sts, place a marker in last st made for center, lhdc in each remaining st around; join with sl st in first st. Fasten off.

Mark for Underarms

Place a marker in the third st following and in the fourth st before the beginning of last round. Place a marker in the third st following and the fourth st before the center marker. Remove the center marker. There should be five sts between the markers for each underarm.

SLEEVES (MAKE 2)

Ribbing

With smaller hook and A, ch 8.

Row 1 Sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each remaining ch across—7 sc.

Rows 2–22 (24, 26, 26, 28) Ch 1, turn, sc BL in each sc across.

Join into Ring (WS) Hold Ribbing with sts at bottom of first row and sts of last row matching, ch 1, working through both thicknesses, sc in each st across to join Ribbing into a large ring. Do not fasten off.

Shape Sleeve

Change to larger hook.

Round 1 Working across one edge of Ribbing ring, ch 2 (does not count as a st here and throughout), lhdc in end of each row around; join with sl st in first st—22 (24, 26, 26, 28) sts.

Rounds 2–4 Ch 2, lhdc in each st around; join with sl st in first st.

Round 5 (Increase round) Ch 2, lhdc in first st, 2 lhdc in next st, lhdc in each st around to last 2 sts, 2 lhdc in next st, lhdc in last st; join with sl st in first st—24 (26, 28, 28, 30) sts.

Round 6 Ch 2, lhdc in each st around; join with sl st in first st.

Repeat last 2 rounds 8 more times—40 (42, 44, 44, 46) sts.

Repeat Round 6 until piece measures 16.5 (17, 17, 17.5, 17.5)"/42 (43, 43, 44.5, 44.5) cm from beginning.

Fasten off.

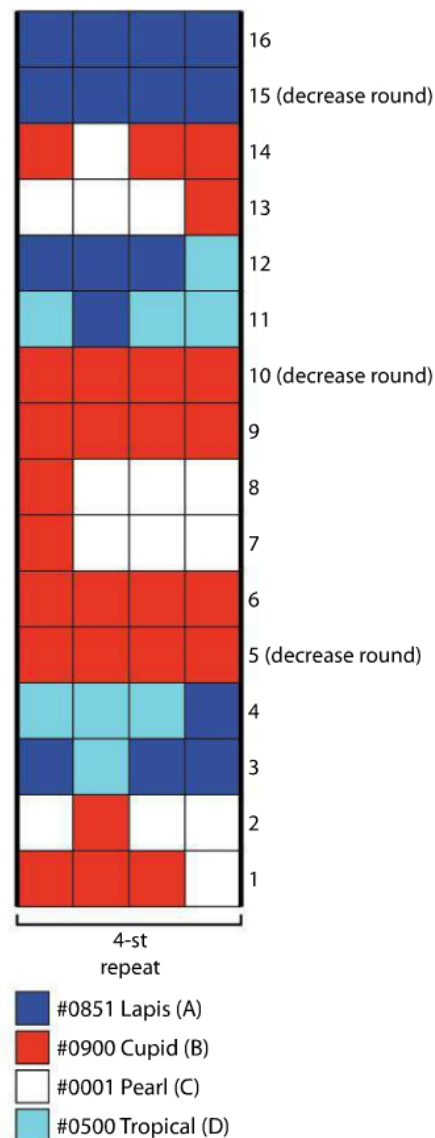
Mark for Underarm

Place a marker in the third st following and in the fourth st before beginning of last round. There should be five sts between the markers for the underarm.

YOKE

Note If you are right-handed, begin at the back of the Left Sleeve. If you are left-handed, begin at the back of the Right Sleeve. The underarm stitches on both Body and Sleeves remain unworked until they are seamed.

Round 1 Hold one Sleeve against Body, with underarm markers and sts matching, insert hook into both marked underarm sts at back of Body and Sleeve and draw up a loop of A, ch 2, lhdc in



same st pair, working in outer Sleeve sts (not underarm sts), lhdc in each st across to next pair of markers; working through both thicknesses work lhdc in the marked sts, working in Body sts, lhdc in each st across to next pair of markers; working through both thicknesses work lhdc in the marked sts, working in outer Sleeve sts, lhdc in each st across to next pair of markers; working through both thicknesses work lhdc in the marked sts, working in Body sts, lhdc in each Body st to end of round; join with sl st in first st—140 (158, 170, 182, 196) hdc. Remove underarm markers.

Size XS only

Increase Round Ch 2, [lhdc in next 27 sts, 2 lhdc in next st] 4 times, lhdc in each remaining st around; join with sl st in first st—144 sts.

Sizes S (M, L) only

Decrease Round Ch 2, [lhdc in next 52 (56, 60) sts, lhdc2tog] twice, lhdc in each remaining st around; join with sl st in first st—156 (168, 180) sts.

All Sizes

Next Round Ch 2, lhdc in each st around; join with sl st in first st—144 (156, 168, 180, 196) sts.

Repeat last round 0 (1, 2, 3, 4) more times.

Begin Color Work

Round 1 Ch 2, *with C, lhdc in next st; with B, lhdc in next 3 sts; repeat from * around; join with sl st in first st. Change to C.

Round 2 Ch 2, with C, lhdc in next 2 sts; *with B, lhdc in next st; with C, lhdc in next 3 sts; repeat from * around to last 2 sts; with B, lhdc in next st; with C, lhdc in last st; join with sl st in first st. Change to A. Fasten off B and C.

Round 3 Ch 2, with A, lhdc in next 2 sts; *with D, lhdc in next st; with A, lhdc in next 3 sts; repeat from * around to last 2 sts; with D, lhdc in next st; with A, lhdc in last st; join with sl st in first st.

Round 4 Ch 2, *with A, lhdc in next st; with D, lhdc in next 3 sts; repeat from * around;



join with sl st in first st. Change to B. Fasten off A and D.

Round 5 (Decrease round) With B, ch 2, *lhdc in next st, lhdc2tog; repeat from * around to last 0 (0, 0, 0, 4) sts, lhdc in last 0 (0, 0, 0, 4) sts; join with sl st in first st—96 (104, 112, 120, 132) sts.

Round 6 With B, ch 2, lhdc in each st around; join with sl st in first st. Change to C.

Round 7 Ch 2, *with C, lhdc in next 3 sts; with B, lhdc in next st; repeat from * around; join with sl st in first st. Change to C.

Round 8 Repeat Round 7. Change to B. Fasten off C.

Round 9 With B, ch 2, lhdc in each st around; join with sl st in first st.

Round 10 (Decrease round) With B, ch 2, *lhdc in next 2 (1, 1, 1, 1) sts, lhdc2tog; repeat from * around to last 0 (8, 4, 0, 0) sts, lhdc in last 0 (8, 4, 0, 0) sts; join with sl st in first st—72 (72, 76, 80, 88). Change to D. Fasten off B.

Round 11 With D, ch 2, lhdc in next 2 sts, *with A, lhdc in next st; with D, lhdc in next 3 sts; repeat from * around to last 2 sts, with A, lhdc in next st; with D, lhdc in last st; join with sl st in first st.

Round 12 Ch 2, *with D, lhdc in next st, with A, lhdc in next 3 sts; repeat from * around; join with sl st in first st. Change to B. Fasten off D and A.

Round 13 Ch 2, *with B, lhdc in next st; with C, lhdc in next 3 sts; repeat from * around; join with sl st in first st. Change to B.

Round 14 With B, ch 2, lhdc in next 2 sts, *with C, lhdc in next st; with B, lhdc in next 3 sts; repeat from * around to last 2 sts, with

C, lhdc in next st; with B, lhdc in last st; join with sl st in first st. Change to A. Fasten off B and C. Continue with A only.

Round 15 (decrease round) Ch 2, *lhdc in next st, lhdc2tog; repeat from * around to last 0 (0, 1, 2, 1) sts, lhdc in last 0 (0, 1, 2, 1) sts; join with sl st in first st—48 (48, 51, 54, 59) sts.

Round 16 Ch 2, lhdc in each st around; join with sl st in first st. Do not fasten off.

Neck Ribbing

Note Neck Ribbing is worked back and forth in rows perpendicular to the neck edge. The end of every other row of Ribbing is joined to the top of the neck. With smaller hook and A, ch 8.

Row 1 Sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in next 6 ch, sl st in next lhdc of neck edge (Round 16 of yoke), ch 1, sl st in next lhdc of neck edge.

Row 2 Turn, working across previous Ribbing row, sc BL in each sc across.

Row 3 Ch 1, turn, working across previous Ribbing row, sc BL in each sc across, sl st in next lhdc of neck edge, ch 1, sl st in next lhdc of neck edge.

Repeat last 2 rows all the way around neck edge.

Join working yarn through bottom of sts of Row 1 and sts of last row, sc in each sc across to join ends of Neck Ribbing. Fasten off.

FINISHING

Sew underarm seams. Weave in ends. 🧵

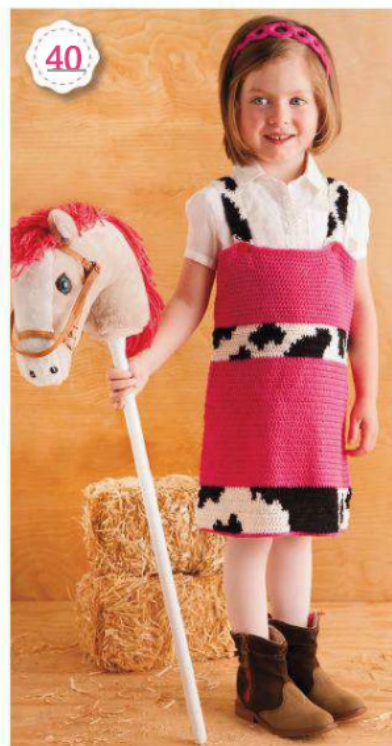
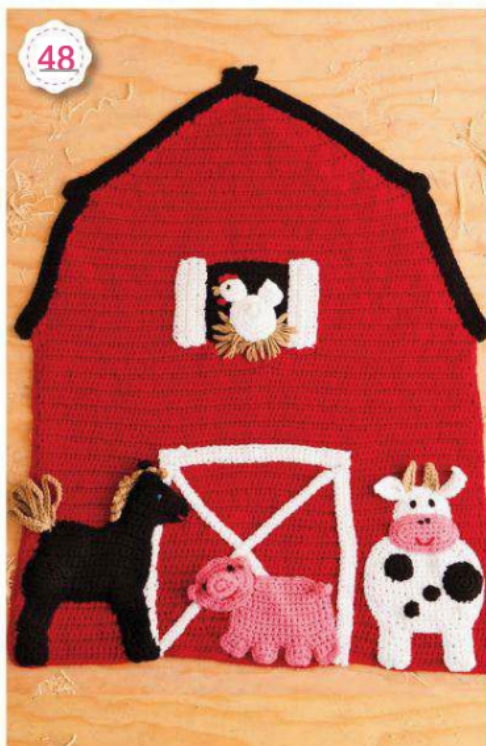

GAUGE

19 sts and 24 rows = 4"/10cm over single crochet.

20 sts and 16 rows = 4"/10cm over half double crochet.

20 sts and 11 rows = 4"/10cm over double crochet.

Remember to check gauge for best results!

NOTES

- 1 Dress is worked in joined rounds

beginning at the top edge.

2 Cow pattern inserts are worked at the Waist and Hem. Straps are worked entirely in Cow pattern.

3 Follow charts to work Cow pattern. Read RS rows from right to left and WS rows from left to right. Take care to work only the section of each chart indicated for the size you are making. Each chart is worked in a different stitch. The Waist Cow pattern is worked in half double crochet (hdc).

The Hem Cow pattern is worked in double crochet (dc). The Strap Cow patterns are worked in (sc).

4 To change color, work last stitch of old color to last yarn over. Yarn over with new color and draw through all loops on hook to complete stitch.

5 Straps are worked beginning at top edge of back of Dress.

6 Turn at the beginning of rounds when working colorwork. Do not turn rounds in single-color sections.

DRESS

With A, ch 110 (120, 130, 140), taking care not to twist ch; join with sl st in first ch to form a ring.

Round 1 (RS) Ch 2 (does not count as a st here and throughout), hdc in same ch as join, and each remaining ch around; join with sl st in first hdc—110 (120, 130, 140) sts.

Round 2 Ch 2, hdc in each st around; join with sl st in first hdc.

Round 3 (Buttonhole row) Ch 2, hdc in first 14 (15, 16, 17) sts, ch 3, sk next 3 sts (buttonhole made), hdc in next 21 (24, 27, 30) sts, ch 3, sk next 3 sts (buttonhole made), hdc in each st to end of round; join with sl st in first hdc—104 (114, 124, 134) sts and 2 ch-3 sps.

Note Buttonholes are on Dress front.

Round 4 Ch 2, hdc in each hdc and ch around; join with sl st in first hdc—110 (120, 130, 140) sts.

Rounds 5–14 (16, 20, 26) Ch 2, hdc in each st around; join with sl st in first hdc. Fasten off.

Begin Waist Color Chart

Round 1 (RS) Draw up a loop of B in same st as join, ch 2, beginning in same st as join, work Row 1 of Waist color chart. Each box of chart represents one hdc st worked in the indicated color; join with sl st in first hdc.

Rounds 2–8 Ch 2, turn, work next row of Waist color chart. Fasten off.

Shape Sides

Place a marker in the first st and in the 55th (60th, 65th, 70th) st to mark sides. Move markers up as each round is worked.

Increase Round Draw up a loop of A in same st as join, ch 3 (counts as first dc here and throughout), dc in same st as join (increase made), dc in each st to side marker, 2 dc in marked st, move marker to first st of 2-dc just made, dc in each st to end of rnd; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—112 (122, 132, 142) sts.

Next Round Ch 3, dc in each st around; join with sl st in top of beginning ch.

Repeat last 2 rounds 9 times—130 (140, 150, 160) sts.

Next Round Repeat Increase Round—132 (142, 152, 162) sts.

Begin Hem Color Chart

Round 1 Draw up a loop of C in same st as join, ch 3 (counts as first dc here and throughout), work Row 1 of Hem color chart. Each box of chart represents one dc st worked in the indicated color; join with sl st in top of beginning ch.

Rounds 2–8 Ch 3, turn, work next row of Hem color chart. Fasten off.

Next Round Draw up a loop of A in same st as join, ch 1, sc in each st around; join with sl st in first sc. Fasten off.

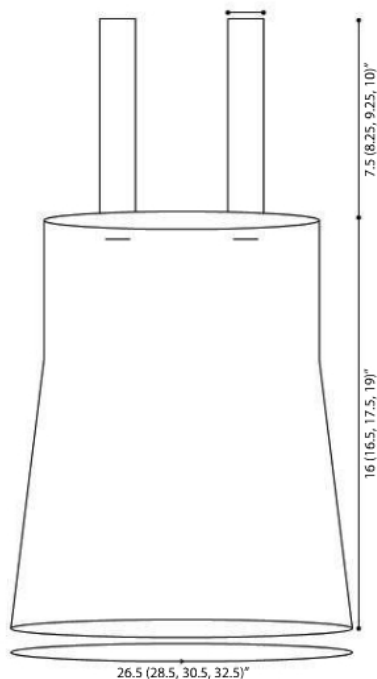

Rows 2–45 (50, 55, 60) Ch 1, turn, work next row of Strap 1 color chart. Fasten off.

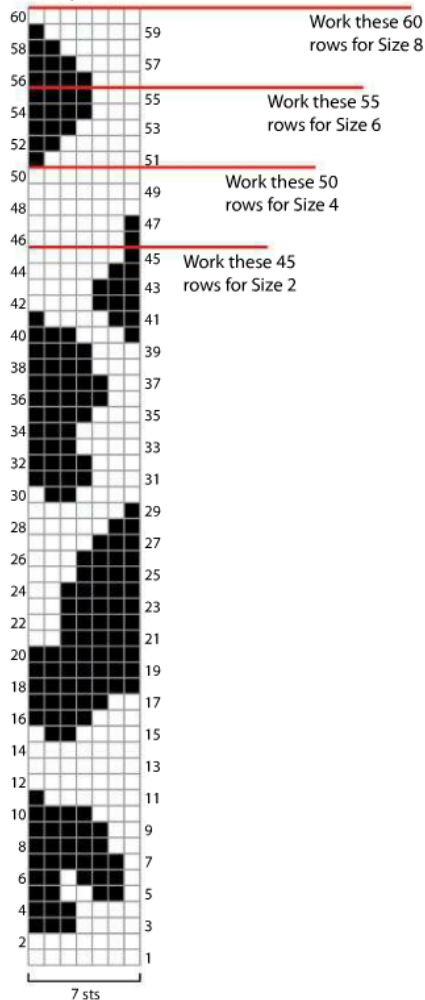

Fasten off, leaving long tail for sewing. Cut two small black felt circles. Using photo as a guide, sew circles onto Nose.

With A, ch 2.

Round 1 Work 5 sc in 2nd ch from hook—5 sts.

Round 2 Work 2 sc in each sc around—10 sts.

Round 3 [Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc] 5 times—15 sts.

Round 4 [Sc in next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 5 times—20 sts.

Round 5 [Sc in next 3 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 5 times—25 sts.

Round 6 [Sc in next 4 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 5 times—30 sts.

Round 7 [Sc in next 5 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 5 times—35 sts.

Round 8 [Sc in next 6 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 5 times—40 sts.

Round 9 [Sc in next 7 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 5 times—45 sts.

Round 10 [Sc in next 8 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 5 times—50 sts.

Round 11 [Sc in next 9 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 5 times—55 sts.

Round 12 [Sc in next 10 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 5 times—60 sts.

Round 13 [Sc in next 11 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 5 times—65 sts.

Rounds 14–28 Sc in each sc around.

Round 29 [Sc in next 11 sc, sc2tog] 5

times—60 sts.

Round 30 [Sc in next 10 sc, sc2tog] 5 times—55 sts.

Round 31 [Sc in next 9 sc, sc2tog] 5 times—50 sts.

Round 32 [Sc in next 8 sc, sc2tog] 5 times—45 sts.

Round 33 [Sc in next 7 sc, sc2tog] 5 times—40 sts.

Round 34 [Sc in next 6 sc, sc2tog] 5 times—35 sts.

Round 35 Sc in each sc around.

Face

Using photo as a guide, attach plastic eyes to Head. Stuff Nose lightly and sew to Head. Embroider smile with black sewing thread. Continue with Head as follows.

Round 36 [Sc in next 5 sc, sc2tog] 5 times—30 sts.

Round 37 [Sc in next 4 sc, sc2tog] 5 times—25 sts.

Stuff Head.

Round 38 [Sc in next 3 sc, sc2tog] 5 times—20 sts.

Round 39 [Sc in next 2 sc, sc2tog] 5 times—15 sts.

Round 40 [Sc in next sc, sc2tog] 5 times—10 sts.

Round 41 [Sc2tog] 5 times—5 sts. Fasten off. Weave in all ends.

Ears (Make 2)

With A, ch 2.

Round 1 Work 5 sc in 2nd ch from hook—5 sts.

Round 2 Sc in each sc around.

Round 3 Work 2 sc in each sc around—10 sts.

Round 4 Repeat Round 2.

Round 5 [Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc] 5 times—15 sts.

Round 6 Repeat Round 2.

Round 7 [Sc in next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 5 times—20 sts.

Round 8–11 Repeat Round 2.

At end of Round 11, join with sl st in first sc.

Fasten off, leaving long tail for sewing.

Using photo as a guide, sew Ear to Head.

Body

With A, ch 2.

Round 1 Work 5 sc in 2nd ch from hook—5 sts.

Round 2 Work 2 sc in each sc around—10 sts.

Round 3 [Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc] 5 times—15 sts.

Round 4 [Sc in next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 5 times—20 sts.

Round 5 [Sc in next 3 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 5 times—25 sts.

Round 6 [Sc in next 4 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 5 times—30 sts.

Round 7 [Sc in next 5 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 5 times—35 sts.

Round 8 [Sc in next 6 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 5 times—40 sts.

Round 9 [Sc in next 7 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 5 times—45 sts.

Rounds 10–36 Sc in each sc around.

Round 37 [Sc in next 7 sc, sc2tog] 5 times—40 sts.

Rounds 38–39 Sc in each sc around.

At end of Round 39, join with sl st in first sc.

Fasten off, leaving long tail for sewing.

Stuff Body. Using photo as a guide, sew Body to Head.

Legs (Make 4)

With B, ch 2.

Round 1 Work 5 sc in 2nd ch from hook—5 sts.

Round 2 Work 2 sc in each sc around—10 sts.

Round 3 [Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc] 5 times, changing to A in last st—15 sts.

Round 4 Sc in BL of each sc around.

Round 5 Sc in each sc around.

Round 6 Repeat Round 5, changing to B in last st.

Rounds 7–9 With B, repeat Round 5, 3 times, changing to A in last st of Round 9.

Rounds 10–12 With A, repeat Round 5, 3 times, changing to B in last st of Round 12.

Rounds 13–15 With B, repeat Round 5, 3 times, changing to A in last st of Round 15.

Rounds 16–18 With A, repeat Round 5, 3 times.

At end of Round 18, join with sl st in first sc.

Fasten off, leaving long tail for sewing.

Stuff Leg. Using photo as a guide, sew Leg to Body.

Tail

With A, ch 21 loosely.

Row 1 Sl st in 2nd ch from hook, *sk next ch, sl st in next ch*; repeat across.

Fasten off, leaving long tail for sewing.

Sew Tail to Body.

Bow

With C, ch 6 loosely.

Row 1 Sc in second ch from hook and in each sc across—5 sc.

Rows 2–9 Ch 1, turn; sc in each sc across.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.

Wrap yarn tail around middle of piece as desired to form Bow. Tie knot to secure.

Using photo as a guide, sew Bow to top of Tail. Weave in ends.

HEADPHONES

Earpiece (Make 2)

With D, ch 2.

Round 1 Work 5 sc in 2nd ch from hook—5 sts.

Round 2 Work 2 sc in each sc around—10 sts.

Round 3 [Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc] 5 times—15 sts.

Round 4 [Sc in next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 5 times—20 sts.

Round 5 Sc in each sc around.

Round 6 [Sc in next 2 sc, sc2tog] 5 times—15 sts.

Round 7 [Sc in next sc, sc2tog] 5



Crochet a curly pigtail!

times—10 sts.

Stuff lightly.

Round 8 [Sc2tog] 5 times—5 sts. Fasten off. Weave in ends.

Speaker (Make 2)

With C, ch 2.

Round 1 Work 5 sc in 2nd ch from hook—5 sts.

Round 2 Work 2 sc in each sc around—10 sts.

Round 3 [Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc] 5 times—15 sts.

Round 4 Sc in each sc around.

Fasten off, leaving long tail for sewing.

Using photo as a guide, sew Speaker to center of Earpiece.

Headband

With D, ch 36.

Row 1 Hdc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across—35 sts.

Fasten off. Sew one Earpiece to either end of Headband. Using photo as a guide, sew finished Headphones to Head.

FINISHING

Weave in ends. ✨

Hat is worked in continuous spiral. Do not join and do not turn at beginning of each round, unless otherwise stated. Place a marker to indicate the beginning of each round. Move marker up as each round is completed.

A stitch marker is also used in the Crown shaping. Move the marker up in each round to st worked in marked st, unless otherwise stated.



COWBOY HAT

Crown

With A, make an adjustable ring.

Round 1 (RS) Ch 1, work (6 sc, hdc, dc, ch 1, dc, hdc) in ring—10 sts and 1 ch-1 sp.

Round 2 2 sc in each of next 6 sts, sc in next 2 sts, 3 sc in ch-1 sp, (insert st marker in center sc of 3 sc just made), sc in next 2 sts—19 sts.

Round 3 [Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc] 6 times, sc in next 3 sts, 3 sc in marked st, sc in next 3 sts—27 sts.

Round 4 [Sc in next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 6 times, sc in next 4 sts, 3 sc in marked st, sc in next 4 sts—35 sts.

Round 5 [Sc in next 3 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 6 times, sc in next 5 sts, 3 sc in marked st, sc in next 5 sts—43 sts.

Round 6 [Sc in next 4 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 6 times, sc in next 6 sts, 3 sc in marked st, sc in next 6 sts—51 sts.

Round 7 [Sc in next 5 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 6 times, sc in next 7 sts, 3 sc in marked st, sc in next 7 sts—59 sts.

Round 8 [Sc in next 6 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 6 times, sc in next 8 sts, 3 sc in marked st, sc in next 8 sts—67 sts.

Round 9 [Sc in next 7 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 6 times, sc in next 9 sts, 3 sc in marked st, sc in next 9 sts—75 sts.

Size M Only

Round 10 [Sc in next 8 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 6 times, sc in next 10 sts, 3 sc in marked st, sc in next 10 sts—83 sts.

All sizes

Round 10 (11) Sc in each sc around.

Rounds 11 (12) – 30 (34) Repeat last round 20 (23) times.

Shape Brim

Round 31 (35) Sc in next 3 sts, *2 sc in next st, sc in next 7 sts; repeat from * around—84 (93) sts.

Round 32 (36) Sc in next 7 sts, *2 sc in next st, sc in next 8 sts; repeat from * around to last 5 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 4 sts—93 (103) sts.

Round 33 (37) Sc in next 3 sts, *2 sc in next st, sc in next 9 sts; repeat from * around—102 (113) sts.

Round 34 (38) Sc in next 8 sts, *2 sc in

next st, sc in next 10 sts; repeat from * around to last 6 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 5 sts—111 (123) sts.

Round 35 (39) Sc in next 3 sts, *2 sc in next st, sc in next 11 sts; repeat from * around—120 (133) sts.

Round 36 (40) Sc in next 9 sts, *2 sc in next st, sc in next 12 sts; repeat from * around to last 7 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 6 sts—129 (143) sts.

Round 37 (41) *2 sc in next st, sc in next 13 sts; repeat from * around to last 3 sts, sc in next 3 sts—138 (153) sts.

Round 38 (42) Sc in next 10 sts, *2 sc in next st, sc in next 14 sts; repeat from * around to last 8 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 7 sts—147 (163) sts.

Round 39 (43) Sc in each sc around.

Round 40 (44) Holding millinery wire flush with top of last round of sts and leaving at least 1"/2.5cm overlapping before beginning stitches, sc in next 131 (147) sc, encasing wire; overlap two ends of wire and join with plastic millinery joining piece (or wrap densely with thread and glue in place, allowing glue to dry before continuing); trim wire ends if necessary; sc in next 16 sc, join with sl st in first sc. Fasten off.

FINISHING

Shape Hat

With hand inside Hat, pinch first few



Wire keeps the brim in shape. Sew the hat folds in place on the inside.

rounds of Crown together lengthwise. Tack tops of pinched area together invisibly along top of Hat. With pointed end at 12 o'clock and using photo as a guide, press in sides and back of Crown at 3, 6, 9, and 12 o'clock, forming an X-shape on top of Hat. Bend wire at brim if desired. Do not block Hat, spot clean only.

Braided Rope (Optional)

Cut six strands of B, each 3yd/2.7m long, and tie them together at one end, leaving 2"/5cm of yarn ends. Braid strands until Rope measures approx 28 (30)"/71 (76) cm long; tie a knot to secure braid. Loop Rope around Hat and tie ends together. Weave in ends. 🧶

HOW TO MAKE A GAUGE SWATCH

Ch 14.



Row 1 (RS) Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each remaining ch across—13 sc.

Row 2 Ch 3 (counts as first dc here and throughout), turn, dc BL in each st across to last st, dc in last st (working under both loops).

Row 3 Ch 1, turn, sc in first dc, sc FL in each st across to last st, sc in last st (top of turning ch).

Rows 4–9 Repeat last 2 rows 3 more times. Resulting gauge swatch should measure approx 4 x 4"/10 x 10cm. If necessary, adjust hook size to obtain correct gauge.

NOTES

1 Blanket is worked in one piece.

2 Barn door, window, and farm animals are

worked separately and sewn to blanket.

3 When fastening off, leave a long tail for sewing piece to blanket.

BLANKET

Beginning at lower edge with A, ch 92.

Row 1 (RS) Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each remaining ch across—91 sc.

Note In following rows, work the first and last stitches under both loops for sturdy edges. Work remaining stitches in FL or BL as indicated.

Row 2 Ch 3 (counts as first dc here and throughout), turn, dc BL in each st across to last st, dc in last st.

Row 3 Ch 1, turn, sc in first dc, sc FL in

each st across to last st, sc in last st (top of turning ch).

Row 4 Repeat Row 2.

Rows 5–40 Repeat last 2 rows 18 times.

Row 41 Ch 1, turn, sc in first dc, sc2tog FL, sc FL in each st across to last 3 sts, sc2tog FL, sc in last st—89 sts.

Place a marker at the beginning and end of this row.

Row 42 Repeat Row 2.

Rows 43–56 Repeat last 2 rows 7 times—75 sts at the end of Row 56.

Row 57 Ch 1, turn, sc in first st, [sc2tog FL] twice, sc FL in each st across to last 5 sts, [sc2tog FL] twice, sc in last st—71 sts. Place a marker at the beginning and end of this row.

Row 58 Ch 3, turn, [dc2tog BL] twice, dc BL in each st across to last 5 sts, [dc2tog BL] twice, dc in last st—67 sts.

Rows 59–72 Repeat last 2 rows 7 times—11 sts at the end of Row 72.

Edging

Ch 1, turn, sc evenly spaced all the way around blanket, working 3 sc in each lower corner and 2 sc in ends of each marked row; join with sl st in first sc. Fasten off. Do not remove markers.

Roof Top Pieces (Make 2)

With C, ch 40.

Row 1 Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each remaining ch across—39 sc.

Row 2 and 3 Ch 1, turn, sc in each st across. Fasten off.

Roof Lower Pieces (Make 2)

With C, ch 30.

Row 1 Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each remaining ch across—29 sc.

Row 2 and 3 Ch 1, turn, sc in each st across. Fasten off.

Pin Top Roof pieces on top edges of Blanket. Overlap the top ends of the two pieces at the top center of Blanket, and line up the lower ends with the ends of Row 41 (marked). Sew Top Roof pieces in place. Pin Lower Roof pieces on edges of Blanket with top ends near lower ends of Top Roof pieces and lower ends in

line with the ends of Row 57 (marked). Sew Lower Roof pieces in place. Remove markers on Rows 41 and 57.

BARN DOOR

Frame (Make 3)

With D, ch 35.

Row 1 Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each remaining ch across—34 sc.

Row 2 Ch 1, turn, sc in each st across. Fasten off.

Center one Frame piece horizontally across Row 26 and pin in place. Place the other two pieces vertically, each beginning at one end of horizontal piece and ending at lower edge of Blanket, and sew in place.

Criss-Cross Pieces (Make 2)

With D, ch 41.

Row 1 Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each remaining ch across—40 sc. Fasten off.

Arrange pieces in a criss-cross over Barn Door and sew in place.

WINDOW

With C, ch 16.

Row 1 Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each remaining ch across—15 sc.

Rows 2–16 Ch 1, turn, sc in each st across. Fasten off.

Shutter (Make 2)

With D, ch 17.

Row 1 Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each remaining ch across—16 sc.

Rows 2–5 Ch 1, turn, sc in each st across. Fasten off.

Body

With D, ch 2.

Round 1 (RS) Work 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook; do not join, work in continuous rounds—6 sc. Place marker to indicate

beginning of round. Move marker up as each round is completed.

Round 3 [Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc] 6 times—18 sc.

Round 4 [Sc in next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 6 times—24 sc.

Row 5 (Tail) Sc in next 3 sc; leave remaining sts unworked—3 sc.

Row 6 Ch 1, turn, sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in next sc; leave remaining sts unworked—4 sc.

Rows 7 and 8 Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across. Fasten off.

Using photo as a guide, sew Body to Window.

Head

With D, ch 2.

Round 1 (RS) Work 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook; do not join, work in continuous rounds—6 sc.

Round 2 Work 2 sc in each sc around; join with sl st in first st—12 sc. Fasten off.

Using photo as a guide, sew Head to Body and Window. With C, embroider a French knot for eye. With B, embroider two long lazy daisy stitches for beak. With A, embroider three French knots on top of Head for comb and one French knot under beak for wattle.

Wing

With D, ch 4.

Row 1 Sc in 2nd ch from hook, 3 hdc in next ch, sl st in last ch. Fasten off. Sew Wing to Body. Center Window above Barn Door, with lower edge across Row 41, and sew in place. Sew one Shutter to each side of Window. With B, embroider long stitches beneath Chicken for hay.

PIG

Body and Legs

Beginning at top of back with E, ch 11.

Row 1 Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each remaining ch across—10 sc.

Rows 2–4 Ch 1, turn, sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in each sc across to last 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in last sc—16 sc at the end of Row 4.

Rows 5–10 Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.

Row 11 Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, sc in each sc



across to last 2 sc, sc2tog—14 sc.
Do not fasten off.

First Leg

Row 1 Ch 1, turn, sc in next 3 sc; leave remaining sts unworked (for other 3 legs)—3 sc.

Rows 2 and 3 Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.
Fasten off.

Second Leg

Row 1 Join E with sc in next unworked sc following first leg, sc in next 2 sc; leave remaining sts unworked—3 sc.

Rows 2 and 3 Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.
Fasten off.

Third Leg

Row 1 Sk next 2 unworked sc following second leg, join E with sc in next unworked sc, sc in next 2 sc; leave remaining sts unworked—3 sc.

Rows 2 and 3 Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.
Fasten off.

Fourth Leg

Row 1 Join E with sc in next unworked sc following third leg, sc in last 2 sc—3 sc.

Rows 2 and 3 Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.
Do not fasten off.

Edging

Ch 1, turn, work sc evenly spaced all the way around outer edge of Body and Legs working 3 sc in each lower corner of each Leg; join with sl st in first sc. Fasten off.

Tail

With E, ch 6.

Row 1 Work 2 sc in 2nd ch from hook, 2

sc in each remaining ch across—10 sc.
Fasten off.

Head

Beginning at snout with E, ch 2.

Round 1 (RS) Work 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook; do not join, work in continuous rounds—6 sc. Place marker to indicate beginning of round. Move marker up as each round is completed.

Round 2 Work 2 sc in each sc around—12 sc.

Round 3 Sc FL in each sc around.

Round 4 Sc BL in each sc around.

Round 5 Sc in each sc around.

Round 6 Work 2 sc FL in next 8 sc, sc in last 4 sc—20 sc.

Round 7 [Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc] 8 times, sc in last 4 sc—28 sc.

Round 8 Sc in next 4 sc, (sl st, ch 1, tr, ch 1, sl st) in next sc (ear made), sc in next 10 sc, (sl st ch 1, tr, ch 1, sl st) in next sc, sc in last 12 sc. Fasten off.

With C, embroider two French knots for eyes. With A, embroider couched stitch for smile. Using photo as guide, sew Head, Body, and Tail in place.



HORSE

Beginning at lower edge of Body with C, ch 15.

Row 1 Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each remaining ch across—14 sc.

Row 2 Ch 1, turn, sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in each sc across to last 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in last sc—16 sc.

Row 3 Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across to last 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in last sc—17 sc.

Row 4 Ch 1, turn, sc in next sc, 2 sc in next

sc, sc in each remaining sc across—18 sc.

Rows 5–9 Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.

Row 10 Ch 1, turn, sc in next 6 sc, sc2tog, sl st in next sc; leave remaining sts unworked—7 sc.

Row 11 Turn, sk the sl st, sc2tog, sc in next 3 sc, sc2tog—5 sc.

Row 12 Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, sc in next 3 sc, sc in edge of Row 11, sc in each of the 9 unworked sc of Row 9—14 sc.

Row 13 (Neck) Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, sc in next 4 sc, sc2tog; leave remaining sts unworked—6 sc.

Row 14 Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.

Row 15 Ch 1, turn, sc in next 4 sc, sc2tog—5 sc.

Row 16–18 Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.

Row 19 (Head) Ch 4, turn, 2 sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in next 2 ch, sc in next 4 sc, 2 sc in last sc—10 sc.

Rows 20 and 21 Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.

Row 22 Ch 1, turn, sc in next 8 sc, sc2tog—9 sc.

Row 23 Ch 1, turn, sl st in next 4 sc, sc2tog, sc in next sc, sc2tog—3 sc.

Edging

Ch 1, turn, work sc evenly spaced all the way around Head and Body. Fasten off. With blue embroidery floss, embroider French knots for eyes. With A, embroider straight stitch smile.

Hind Leg

Beginning at top of Leg with C, ch 4.

Row 1 Sc in 2nd ch from hook, 2 sc in next ch, sc in last ch—4 sc.

Row 2 Ch 1, turn, sc in next sc, 2 sc in each of next 2 sc, sc in last sc—6 sc.

Row 3 Ch 1, turn, sc in next 2 sc, 2 sc in each of next 2 sc, sc in last 2 sc—8 sc.

Rows 4–6 Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.

Row 7 Ch 1, turn, sc in next sc, sc2tog, sc in next 3 sc, sc2tog—6 sc.

Row 8 Ch 1, turn, sc in next sc, [sc2tog] twice, sc in last sc—4 sc.

Row 9 Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, sc in last 2 sc—3 sc.

Row 10 Ch 1, turn, 2 sc in next sc, sc2tog.

Row 11 Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, 2 sc in last sc.

Rows 12–15 Repeat last 2 rows twice.

Rows 16–19 Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.

Edging

Ch 1, turn, sc in next 2 sc, 3 sc in last sc, sc evenly spaced around remaining edges of Leg working 3 sc in each lower corner; join with sl st in first sc. Fasten off.

Front Leg

Beginning at top of Leg with C, ch 4.

Row 1 Sc in 2nd ch from hook, 2 sc in next ch, sc in last ch—4 sc.

Rows 2 and 3 Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.

Row 4 Ch 1, turn, sc in next st, sc2tog, sc in last sc—3 sc.

Rows 5–8 Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.

Row 9 Ch 1, turn, 2 sc in next sc, sc2tog.

Row 10 Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, 2 sc in last sc.

Rows 11 and 12 Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.

Edging

Ch 1, turn, sc evenly spaced around leg, working 3 sc in each lower corner; join with sl st in first sc. Fasten off.

Tail

With B, ch 24.

Row 1 Sl st in first ch from hook, [ch 23, sl st in same ch as last sl st] 6 times. Fasten off.

Mane

With B, ch 6.

Row 1 Sl st in 6th ch from hook, [ch 6, sl st in 6th ch from hook] 8 times. Fasten off.

Ears (Make 2)

With C, ch 4.

Row 1 Sc in 2nd ch from hook, hdc in next ch, (hdc, ch 2, sl st in 2nd ch from hook, hdc) in last ch; working across opposite side of foundation ch, hdc in next ch, sc in next ch. Fasten off.

Using photo as a guide, arrange pieces on Blanket and sew in place.

COW

Head

Beginning at top of Head with D, ch 4.

Row 1 Sc in 2nd ch from hook, 2 sc in next ch, sc in last ch—4 sc.



Row 2 Ch 1, turn, sc in next sc, 2 sc in each of next 2 sc, sc in last sc—6 sc.

Row 3 Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.

Row 4 Ch 1, turn, sc in next 2 sc, 2 sc in each of next 2 sc, sc in last 2 sc—8 sc.

Rows 5 and 6 Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.

Edging

Ch 1, turn, sc evenly spaced around head; join with sl st in first sc. Fasten off.
With C, embroider lazy daisy stitches for eyes.

Nose

With E, ch 9.

Round 1 Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in next 6 ch, 3 sc in last ch; working across opposite side of foundation ch, sc in next 6 ch, 2 sc in last ch—18 sc. Place marker to indicate beginning of round. Move marker up as each round is completed.

Round 2 Work 2 sc in next sc, sc in next 6 sc, 2 sc in each of next 3 sc, sc in next 6 sc, 2 sc in each of last 2 sc—24 sc.

Round 3 Sc in each sc around, sl st in first sc. Fasten off.

With C, embroider French knots for nostrils.

With A, embroider couch stitch for smile.

Ear (Make 2)

With D, ch 6.

Round 1 Sc in 2nd ch from hook, hdc in next 3 ch, (hdc, ch 2, sl st in 2nd ch from hook, hdc) in next ch; working across opposite side of foundation ch, hdc in next 3 ch, sc in last ch. Fasten off.

Horn (Make 2)

With B, ch 5.

Row 1 Sl st in first ch from hook, sc in next

ch, hdc in next ch, dc in last 2 ch. Fasten off.

Body and Legs

With D, ch 11.

Row 1 Sc in 2nd ch from hook, 2 sc in next ch, sc in each ch to last 2 ch, 2 sc in next ch, sc in last ch—12 sc.

Rows 2–4 Ch 1, turn, sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in each sc to last 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in last sc—18 sc at the end of Row 4.

Rows 5–13 Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.

Rows 14–16 Ch 1, turn, sc in next sc, sc2tog, sc in each sc to last 3 sc, sc2tog, sc in last sc—12 sc at the end of Row 16. Do not fasten off.

First Leg

Row 1 Ch 1, turn, sc in next 3 sc; leave remaining sts unworked—3 sc.

Rows 2–7 Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across. Fasten off.

Second Leg

Row 1 Sk 6 unworked sts following first leg, join D with sc in next st, sc in next 2 sc—3 sc.

Rows 2–7 Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc across.

Edging

Ch 1, turn, sc evenly spaced all the way around Body and Legs, working 3 sc in each lower corner of each Leg; join with sl st in first sc. Fasten off.

Large Spot (Make 2)

With C, ch 2.

Round 1 Work 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook—6 sc.

Round 2 Work 2 sc in each sc around; join with sl st in first sc—12 sc. Fasten off.

Small Spot (Make 2)

With C, ch 2.

Round 1 Work 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook; join with sl st in first sc—6 sc. Fasten off.
Arrange spots on Body as desired and sew in place. Using photo as a guide, arrange pieces on Blanket and sew in place.

FINISHING

Weave in ends. 🧵

3 The instep (top of foot) is worked back and forth in rows across the narrow end of the Bootie. The ends of the instep rows are joined to the top of the Bootie as you go.

Sole (Make 2)

Ch 12.

Round 1 Work 2 sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in next 9 ch, 3 sc in last ch; rotate piece to work across opposite side of foundation ch, sc in next 9 ch, sc in next ch (same ch into which first 2-sc were worked); do not join, work in continuous rounds—24 sc.

Place marker for beginning of round. Move marker up as each round is completed.

Round 2 Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in next 9 sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in next sc,

2 sc in next sc, sc in next 9 sc, 2 sc in last sc—28 sc.

Round 3 Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in next 10 sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in next 10 sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in last sc—32 sc.

Sides

Round 4 Lpst in each sc around.

Round 5 Sc in each sc around.

Rounds 6 and 7 Repeat Rounds 4 and 5.

Round 8 Lpst in each sc around.

Fasten off.

Instep

Hold Bootie with the narrow end facing you (toe end). Locate the center 6 sc across the toe end.

Row 1 Join A with sc in first sc of the center 6 sc at toe end, sc in next 4 sc, sc2tog; leave remaining sts unworked—6 sc.

Note A sc2tog is worked at the end of each row of the Instep, by inserting the hook in the last Instep stitch and into the next sc of Round 8 (at the top of the Bootie). This joins the Instep

to the Bootie as you work and helps shape the top of the toe.

Row 2 Ch 1, turn, sc in first 5 sc, insert hook in last sc of Row 1 and draw up a loop, insert hook in next sc at top of Bootie and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through all 3 loops on hook (sc2tog made); leave remaining sts unworked—6 sc.

Rows 3–6 Ch 1, turn, sc in first 5 sc, insert hook in last sc of previous row and draw up a loop, insert hook in next unworked sc at top of Bootie and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through all 3 loops on hook (sc2tog made); leave remaining sts unworked—6 sc.

Cuff

Round 7 Ch 1, turn, sc in first 5 sc, insert hook in last sc of previous row and draw up a loop, insert hook in next unworked sc at top of Bootie and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through all 3 loops on hook (sc2tog made), lpst in each remaining sc around; do not join, work in continuous rounds—25 sts.

Rounds 8–14 Sc in each sc around. Fasten off.

LAMB FACE

(Make 2)

Ch 2.

Round 1 Work 3 sc in 2nd ch from hook; do not join, work in continuous rounds—3 sc. Place marker for beginning of round. Move marker up as each round is completed.

Rounds 2 and 3 Work 2 sc in each sc around—12 sc at the end of Round 3.

Round 4 [2 sc in next sc, sc in next 5 sc] twice—14 sc.

Round 5 [2 sc in next sc, sc in next sc] 7 times—21 sc.

Fasten off.

Place a small amount of stuffing in each Lamb Face and sew each over the top of one Instep.

EARS

(Make 4 – 2 for each bootie)

Outer Ear

Ch 6.

Round 1 Sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in next 3 ch, 2 sc in last ch; rotate piece to

work across opposite side of foundation ch, sc in next 3 ch, sc in last ch (same ch into which first sc was worked); join with sl st in first sc—10 sc. Fasten off.

Inner Ear

With pink yarn, ch 5.

Row 1 Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each remaining ch across—4 sc. Fasten off.

Sew one Inner Ear to center of each Outer Ear. Using photo as a guide, sew two Ears to top of each Lamb Face.

FINISHING

Cut four small circles of green felt, each slightly larger than one of the black glass eyes. Place two green felt circles on each Lamb Face for back of eyes. Sew black glass eyes to the Lamb Face, centered

on green felt circles. With pink yarn, embroider a straight st “Y” nose on each Lamb Face, centered beneath the eyes. Weave a blue ribbon through stitches near lower edge of each cuff and tie into a bow at front of Bootie. Weave in ends. 🍷

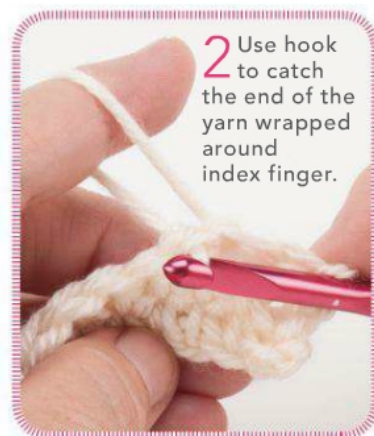


How to Work the Loop Stitch

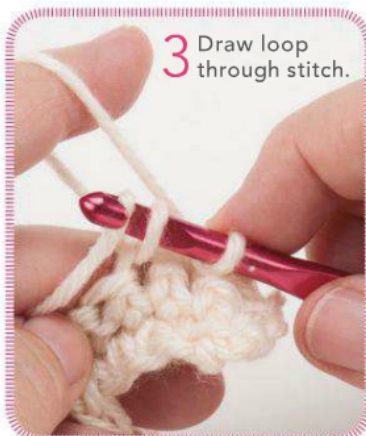
1 Insert hook in next stitch, wrapping yarn around index finger and pulling that finger back away from work about 1"/2.5cm.



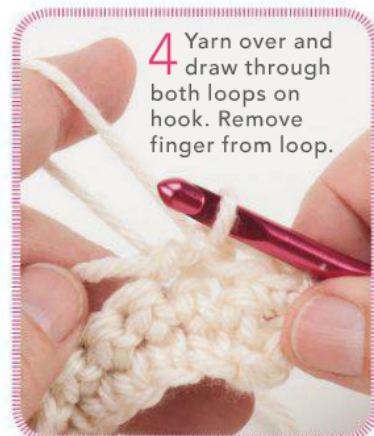
2 Use hook to catch the end of the yarn wrapped around index finger.



3 Draw loop through stitch.



4 Yarn over and draw through both loops on hook. Remove finger from loop.

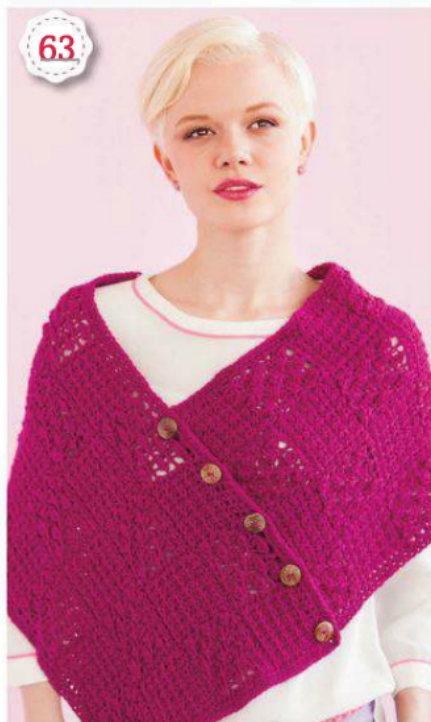

Circumference Approx 20"/51cm

GAUGE

12 sts and 9 rows = 4"/10cm over pattern.

HOW TO MAKE A GAUGE SWATCH

Ch 24.

Row 1 Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each remaining ch across—23 sc.

Row 2 (RS) Ch 2 (does not count as a st here and throughout), turn, hdc in each sc across.

Row 3 Ch 2, turn, hdc in next 3 sts, BPdc around next st, hdc in next 3 sts, Cl in next st, hdc in next 3 sts, BPdc around each of next 5 sts, hdc in next 3 sts, BPdc around next st, hdc in last 3 sts—15 hdc, 7 BPdc, and 1 Cl.

Row 4 Ch 2, turn, hdc in first 3 hdc,



FPdc around next BPdc, hdc in next 3 sts, sk next 2 BPdc, FPtr around next BPdc (center BPdc); working behind st just made, FPdc around each of the 2

skipped sts; FPdc around next 2 BPdc; working in front of sts just made, FPtr around center BPdc again, hdc in next 7 sts, FPdc around next BPdc, hdc in last

3 hdc—16 hdc, 6 FPdc, and 2 FPtr.

Row 5 Ch 2, turn, hdc in next 3 hdc, BPdc around next FPdc, hdc in next 3 hdc, Cl in next hdc, hdc in next 3 hdc, BPtr around next FPtr, BPdc around next FPdc, BPdc-2tog, BPdc around next FPdc, BPtr around next FPtr, hdc in next 3 hdc, BPdc around next FPdc, hdc in next 3 hdc—15 hdc, 4 BPdc, 2 BPtr, 1 Cl, and 1 BPdc2tog.

Row 6 Ch 2, turn, hdc in first 3 hdc, FPdc around next BPdc, hdc in next 3 hdc, FPtr around next BPtr, sk next st, FPtr around next BPdc2tog; working behind st just made, FPdc around skipped st; FPdc around next BPdc; working in front of st just made, FPtr around same BPdc2tog; FPtr around next BPtr, hdc in next 7 sts, FPdc around next BPdc, hdc in last 3 hdc—16 hdc, 4 FPdc, and 4 FPtr.

Row 7 Ch 2, turn, hdc in next 3 hdc, BPdc around next FPdc, hdc in next 3 hdc, Cl in next hdc, hdc in next 3 hdc, BPdc around each of next 2 FPtr, BPdc2tog, BPdc around each of next 2 FPtr, hdc in next 3 hdc, BPdc around next FPdc, hdc in next 3 hdc—15 hdc, 6 BPdc, 1 Cl, and 1 BPdc2tog.

Row 8 Ch 2, turn, hdc in first 3 hdc, FPdc around next BPdc, hdc in next 15 sts, FPdc around next BPdc, hdc in last 3 hdc—21 hdc, and 2 FPdc.

Rows 9 and 10 Repeat Rows 3 and 4. Resulting gauge swatch should measure approx 8 x 4"/20.5 x 10cm. If necessary, adjust hook size to obtain correct gauge.

SPECIAL ABBREVIATIONS

BPdc (Back Post double crochet) Yarn over, insert hook from back to front to back again around post of indicated stitch, yarn over and draw up a loop, [yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook] twice.

BPdc2tog (Back Post double crochet 2 stitches together) [Yarn over, insert hook from back to front to back again around post of next stitch, yarn over and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook] twice; yarn over and draw through all 3 loops on hook.

BPtr (Back Post treble crochet) Yarn over twice, insert hook from back to front to back again around post of indicated

stitch, yarn over and draw up a loop, [yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook] 3 times.

FPdc (Front Post double crochet) Yarn over, insert hook from front to back to front again around post of indicated stitch, yarn over and draw up a loop, [yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook] twice.

FPtr (Front Post treble crochet) Yarn over twice, insert hook from front to back to front again around post of indicated stitch, yarn over and draw up a loop, [yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook] 3 times.

Cl (cluster) Yarn over, insert hook in indicated stitch, yarn over and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook; [yarn over, insert hook in same stitch, yarn over and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook] 3 times, yarn over and draw through all 5 loops on hook.

NOTES

1 Cowl is worked in one piece beginning at lower edge.

2 Edging is worked around all edges of the Cowl. Several rows of edging are worked across each side edge. The second to last row of each side edging contains ch-1 sps (eyelets). A tie is woven through these eyelets to close the Cowl.

3 When working a post stitch around a BPdc2tog, hold all strands at top of BPdc2tog together to ensure that you work around the entire stitch.

COWL

Ch 48.

Row 1 Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each remaining ch across—47 sc.

Row 2 (RS) Ch 2 (does not count as a st here and throughout), turn, hdc in each sc across.

Row 3 Ch 2, turn, [hdc in next 3 sts, BPdc around next st, hdc in next 3 sts, Cl in next st, hdc in next 3 sts, BPdc around next st, hdc in next 3 sts, BPdc around each of next 5 sts] twice, hdc in next 3 sts, BPdc around next st, hdc in last 3 sts—30 hdc, 15 BPdc, and 2 Cl.

Row 4 Ch 2, turn, hdc in first 3 hdc, [FPdc around next BPdc, hdc in next 3

sts, sk next 2 BPdc, FPtr around next BPdc (center BPdc); working behind st just made, FPdc around each of the 2 skipped sts; FPdc around next 2 BPdc; working in front of sts just made, FPtr around center BPdc again, hdc in next 3 hdc, FPdc around next BPdc, hdc in next 7 sts] twice, FPdc around next BPdc, hdc in last 3 hdc—32 hdc, 13 FPdc, and 4 FPtr.

Row 5 Ch 2, turn, [hdc in next 3 hdc, BPdc around next FPdc, hdc in next 3 hdc, Cl in next hdc, hdc in next 3 hdc, BPdc around next FPdc, hdc in next 3 hdc, BPtr around next FPtr, BPdc around next FPdc, BPdc2tog, BPdc around next FPdc, BPtr around next FPtr] twice, hdc in next 3 hdc, BPdc around next FPdc, hdc in next 3 hdc—30 hdc, 9 BPdc, 4 BPtr, 2 Cl, and 2 BPdc2tog.

Row 6 Ch 2, turn, hdc in first 3 hdc, [FPdc around next BPdc, hdc in next 3 hdc, FPtr around next BPtr, sk next st, FPtr around next BPdc2tog; working behind st just made, FPdc around skipped st; FPdc around next BPdc; working in front of st just made, FPtr around same BPdc2tog; FPtr around next BPtr, hdc in next 3 hdc, FPdc around next BPdc, hdc in next 7 sts] twice, FPdc around next BPdc, hdc in last 3 hdc—32 hdc, 9 FPdc, and 8 FPtr.

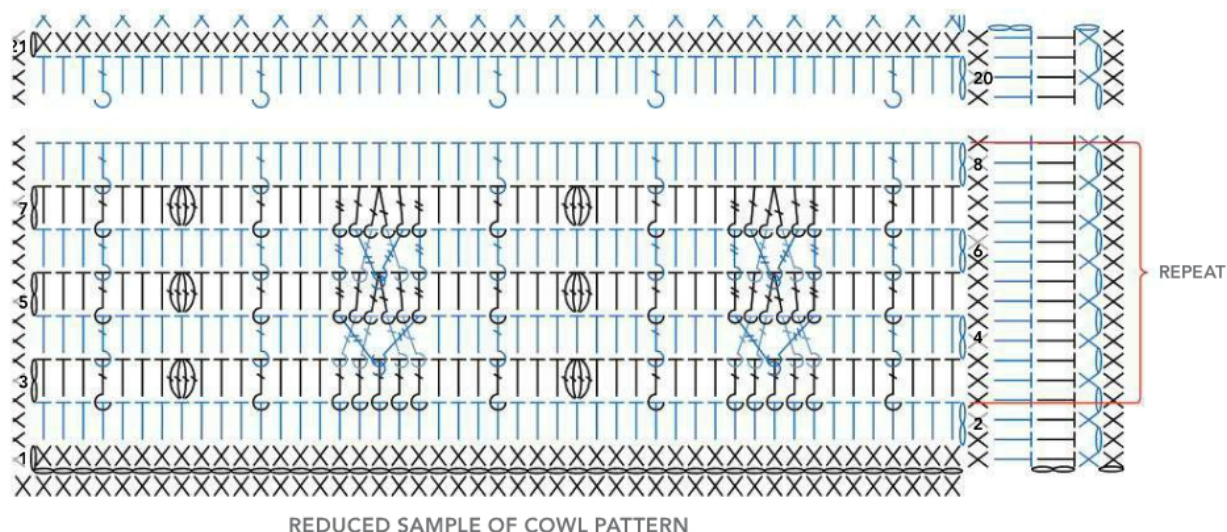
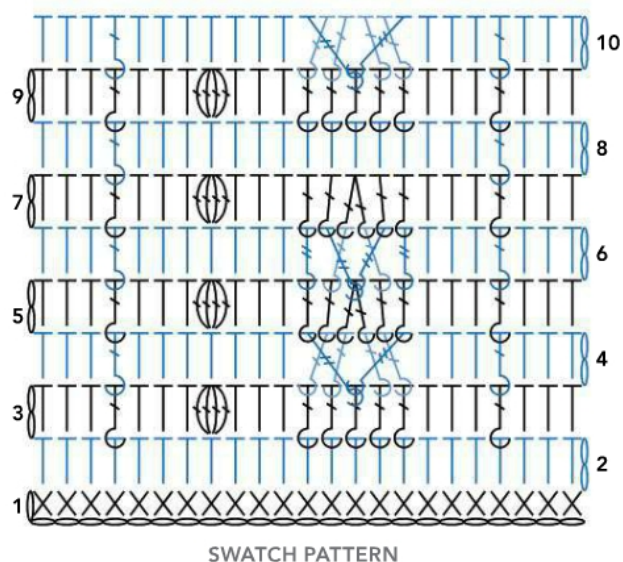
Row 7 Ch 2, turn, [hdc in next 3 hdc, BPdc around next FPdc, hdc in next 3 hdc, Cl in next hdc, hdc in next 3 hdc, BPdc around next FPdc, hdc in next 3 hdc, BPdc around each of next 2 FPtr, BPdc2tog, BPdc around each of next 2 FPtr] twice, hdc in next 3 hdc, BPdc around next FPdc, hdc in next 3 hdc—30 hdc, 13 BPdc, 2 Cl, and 2 BPdc2tog.

Row 8 Ch 2, turn, hdc in first 3 hdc, [FPdc around next BPdc, hdc in next 11 sts, FPdc around next BPdc, hdc in next 7 sts] twice, FPdc around next BPdc, hdc in last 3 hdc—42 hdc, and 5 FPdc.

Rows 9–20 Repeat Rows 3–8 twice.

Row 21 Ch 1, turn, sc in each st across—47 sc.

Row 22 (Top edging) Ch 1, turn, sc in first sc, *ch 3, sk next sc, sc in next sc; repeat from * across—24 sc and 23 ch-3 sps. Do not fasten off.



First Side Edging

Row 1 Rotate piece (do not turn) to work across side edge, work 37 sc evenly spaced across side edge—37 sc.

Rows 2 and 3 Ch 2, turn, working across the 37 side sts only, hdc in each st across.

Row 4 Ch 1, turn, sc in first hdc, *ch 1, sk next hdc, sc in next hdc; repeat from * across—19 sc and 18 ch-1 sps (18 eyelets).

Row 5 Ch 1, turn, sc in each sc and ch-1 sp across. Do not fasten off.

Lower Edging

Row 1 Rotate piece to work across lower edge of piece, sc evenly spaced across lower edge. Do not fasten off.

Second Side Edging

Row 1 Rotate piece to work across second side edge, work 37 sc evenly spaced across side edge—37 sc.

Rows 2–5 Work same as Rows 2–5 of first side edging. Fasten off.

TIE

Ch 131.

Row 1 Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each remaining ch across—130 sc. Fasten off.

FINISHING

Weave in ends.

Weave Tie through eyelets of side edgings in a crisscross pattern, then tie the ends in a knot or bow.

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

Chest 31 (35, 39, 43, 47)"/78.5 (89, 99, 109, 119.5)cm

Length 24 (24.5, 25, 26, 26.5)"/61 (62, 63.5, 66, 67.5)cm, not including neck ribbing

GAUGE

15 sts and 16 rounds = 4"/10cm over single crochet with larger hook.

Remember to check gauge for best results!

NOTES

- 1 Sweater is worked in four pieces: body, two sleeves, and yoke.
- 2 Body and sleeves are worked in joined rounds beginning at lower ribbing.
- 3 Yoke is worked in rounds beginning across top edges of body and sleeves.
- 4 Colorwork can be worked following written instructions or Chart.
- 5 To change color, work last stitch of old color to last yarn over. Yarn over with new

color and draw through all loops on hook to complete stitch. Carry color not in use across WS until next needed or instructed to fasten off.

SWEATER BODY

Ribbing

With smaller hook and A, ch 11.

Row 1 Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each remaining ch across—10 sc.

Rows 2–116 (132, 146, 162, 176) Ch 1, turn, sc BL in each sc across.

Join into Ring (WS) Hold Ribbing with sts at bottom of first row and sts of last row matching, ch 1, working through both thicknesses, sc in each st across to join Ribbing into a large ring. Do not fasten off.

Sweater Body

Change to larger hook.

Round 1 Working across one edge of Ribbing ring, ch 1, sc in end of each row around; join with sl st in first sc—116 (132, 146, 162, 176) sts.

Round 2 Ch 1, sc in each st around; join with sl st in first sc.

Repeat Round 2 until piece measures about 3"/7.5 cm from beginning.

Shape Sides

Round 1 Ch 1, sc in first 75 (85, 95, 106, 115) sts, place marker in last st made, sc in next 24 (28, 29, 31, 34) sts, place marker in last st made, sc in each remaining st around; join with sl st in first sc.

Markers indicate decrease locations on back of Body. Move markers up as each round is worked.

Round 2 (Decrease round) Ch 1, sc in each st to 1 st before first marked st, sc2tog and move marker to sc2tog just made, sc in each st to next marked st, sc2tog and move marker to sc2tog just made, sc in each remaining st around; join with sl st in first sc—114 (130, 144, 160, 174) sts.

Round 3 Ch 1, sc in each st around; join with sl st in first sc.

Rounds 4–23 Repeat last 2 rounds 10 more times—94 (110, 124, 140, 154) sts.

Rounds 24–26 Repeat Round 2 (decrease round) 3 times—88 (104, 118, 134, 148) sts.

Round 27 Ch 1, sc in each st around; join

with sl st in first sc.

Rounds 28–30 (Increase round) Ch 1, sc in each st to marked st, 2 sc in marked st and move marker to 2nd sc of 2-sc just made, sc in each st to next marked st, 2 sc in next st and move marker to first sc of 2-sc just made, sc in each remaining st around; join with sl st in first sc—94 (110, 124, 140, 154) sts.

Round 31 Ch 1, sc in each st around; join with sl st in first sc.

Round 32 Repeat Round 28 (increase round)—96 (112, 126, 142, 156) sts.

Rounds 33–52 Repeat last 2 rounds 10 more times—116 (132, 146, 162, 176) sts.

Round 53 Ch 1, sc in each st around; join with sl st in first sc.

Repeat last round until piece measures about 17"/43cm from beginning. Fasten off. Remove the decrease location markers. Place markers on the 58th (66th, 73rd, 81st, 88th) and 59th (67th, 74th, 82nd, 89th) sts for center.

Mark for Underarms

Place a marker in the fifth st following and in the fifth st before the beginning of last round. Place a marker in the fifth st following and the fifth st before the center marker. Remove the center marker. There should be 8 sts between the markers for each underarm.

SLEEVES (MAKE 2)

Ribbing

With smaller hook and A, ch 11.

Row 1 Sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each remaining ch across—10 sc.

Rows 2–38 (40, 46, 50, 54) Ch 1, turn, sc BL in each sc across.

Join into Ring (WS) Hold Ribbing with sts at bottom of first row and sts of last row matching, ch 1, working through both thicknesses, sc in each st across to join Ribbing into a large ring. Do not fasten off.

Sleeve

Change to larger hook.

Round 1 Working across one edge of Ribbing ring, ch 1 (does not count as a st here and throughout), sc in end of each row around; join with sl st in first st—38 (40,

46, 50, 54) sts.

Round 2 Ch 1, sc in each st around; join with sl st in first sc.

Repeat Round 2 until piece measures about 3 (3, 3, 4, 4)"/7.5 (7.5, 7.5, 10, 10) cm from beginning.

Mark for Underarm

Place a marker in the fifth st following and in the fifth st before beginning of last round. There should be 8 sts between the markers for the underarm.

YOKE

Notes If you are right-handed, begin at the back of the Left Sleeve. If you are left-handed, begin at the back of the Right Sleeve. The underarm stitches on both Body and Sleeves remain unworked until they are seamed.

Round 1 Hold one Sleeve against Body, with underarm markers and sts matching, insert hook into both marked underarm sts at back of Body and Sleeve and draw up a loop of A, ch 1, sc in same st pair, working in outer Sleeve sts (not underarm sts), sc in each st across to next pair of markers; working through both thicknesses work sc in the marked sts, working in Body sts, sc in each st across to next pair of markers; working through both thicknesses work sc in the marked sts, working in outer Sleeve sts, sc in each st across to next pair of markers; working through both thicknesses work sc in the marked sts, working in Body sts, sc in each Body st to end of round; join with sl st in first sc—156 (176, 202, 226, 248) sc. Remove underarm markers.

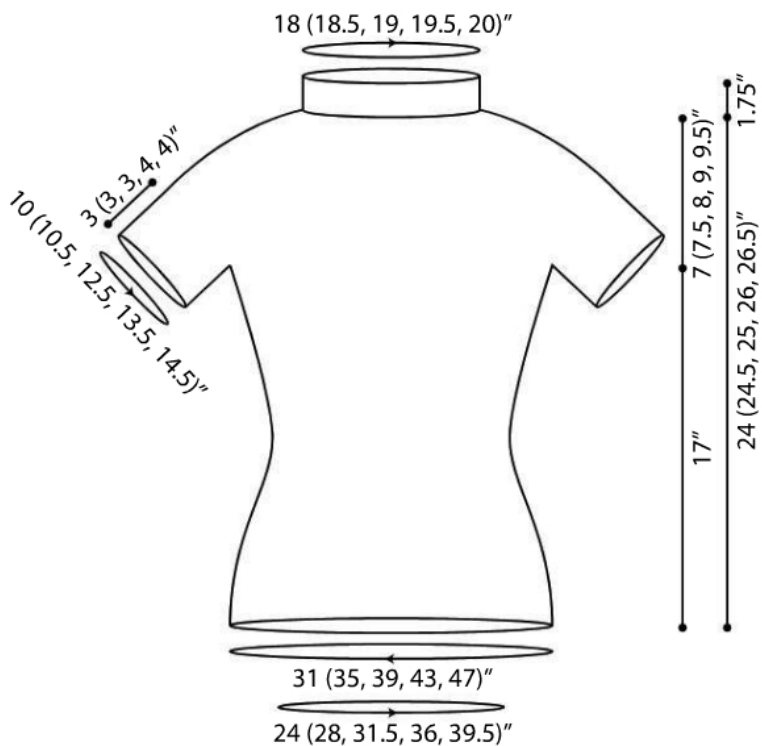
Round 2 Ch 1, [sc in next 0 (35, 67, 75, 50) sts, 2 sc in next st] 0 (4, 2, 2, 4) times, sc in each remaining sc around; join with sl st in first sc—156 (180, 204, 228, 252) sc.

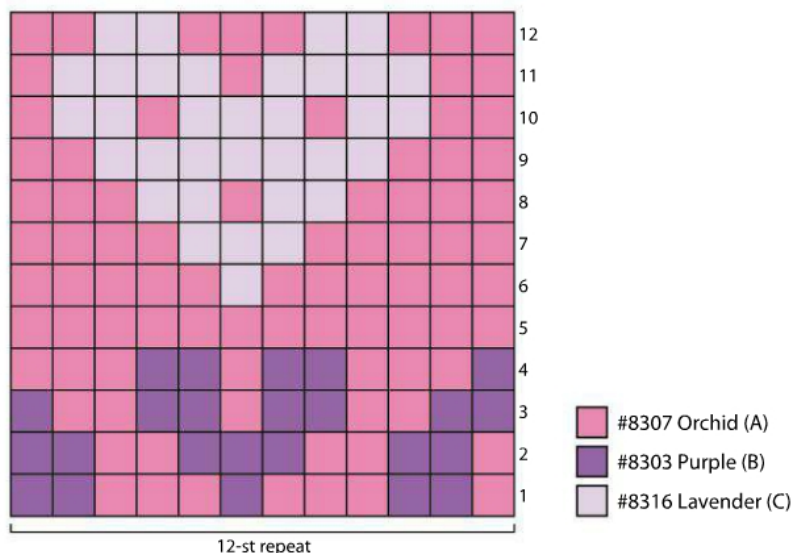

Round 2 Ch 1, *with A, sc in next st; with B, sc in next 2 sts; with A, sc in next 2 sts; with B, sc in next 3 sts; with A, sc in next 2 sts; with B, sc in next 2 sts; repeat from * around; join with sl st in first sc.

Round 3 Ch 1, with B, sc in next 2 sts; *with A, sc in next 2 sts; with B, sc in next 2 sts; with A, sc in next st; with B, sc in next 2 sts; with A, sc in next 2 sts; with B, sc in next 3 sts; repeat from * around to last 10 sts, with A, sc in next 2 sts; with B, sc in next 2 sts; with A, sc in next st; with B, sc in next 2 sts; with A, sc in next 2 sts; with B, sc in last st; join with sl st in first sc.

Round 4 Ch 1, *with B, sc in next st; with A, sc in next 3 sts; with B, sc in next 2 sts; with A, sc in next st; with B, sc in next 2 sts; with A, sc in next 3 sts; repeat from * around; join with sl st in first sc. Fasten off B.

Round 5 With A, ch 1, sc in each st around; join with sl st in first sc.

Round 6 Ch 1, with A, sc in next 6 sts; *with C, sc in next st; with A, sc in next 11 sts; repeat from * around to last 6 sts, with C, sc in next st; with A, sc in last 5 sts; join with sl st in first sc.

Round 7 Ch 1, with A, sc in next 5 sts; *with C, sc in next 3 sts; with A, sc in

next 9 sts; repeat from * around to last 7 sts, with C, sc in next 3 sts; with A, sc in last 4 sts; join with sl st in first sc.

Round 8 Ch 1, with A, sc in next 4 sts; *with C, sc in next 2 sts; with A, sc in next st; with C, sc in next 2 sts; with A, sc in next 7 sts; repeat from * around to last 8 sts, with C, sc in next 2 sts; with A, sc in next st; with C, sc in next 2 sts; with A, sc in last 3 sts; join with sl st in first sc.

Round 9 Ch 1, with A, sc in next 3 sts; *with C, sc in next 7 sts; with A, sc in next 5 sts; repeat from * around to last 9 sts, with C, sc in next 7 sts; with A, sc in last 2 sts; join with sl st in first sc.

Round 10 Ch 1, with A, sc in next 2 sts; *with C, sc in next 2 sts; with A, sc in next st; with C, sc in next 3 sts; with A, sc in next st; with C, sc in next 2 sts; with A, sc in next 3 sts; repeat from * around to last 10 sts, with C, sc in next 2 sts; with A, sc in next st; with C, sc in next 3 sts; with A, sc in next st; with C, sc in next 2 sts; with A, sc in last st; join with sl st in first sc.

Round 11 Ch 1, with A, sc in next 2 sts; *with C, sc in next 4 sts; with A, sc in next st; with C, sc in next 4 sts; with A, sc in next 3 sts; repeat from * around to last 10 sts, with C, sc in next 4 sts; with A, sc in next st; with C, sc in next 4 sts; with A, sc in last st; join with sl st in first sc.

Round 12 Ch 1, with A, sc in next 3 sts; *with C, sc in next 2 sts; with A, sc in next 3 sts; with C, sc in next 2 sts; with A, sc

in next 5 sts; repeat from * around to last 9 sts, with C, sc in next 2 sts; with A, sc in next 3 sts; with C, sc in next 2 sts; with A, sc in last 2 sts; join with sl st in first sc. Fasten off C.

Round 13 (Decrease round) With A, ch 1, sc in next 6 (0, 12, 6, 0) sts, *sc in next st, sc2tog; repeat from * around to last 6 (0, 12, 6, 0) sts, sc in last 6 (0, 12, 6, 0) sts; join with sl st in first sc—108 (120, 144, 156, 168) sts.

Rounds 14–17 Repeat Rounds 1–4 (chart rows).

Fasten off B. Continue with A only.

Rounds 18–19 (20, 21, 22, 23) Ch 1, sc in each st around; join with sl st in first sc. Continue with A only.

Next Round (Decrease round) Ch 1, *sc in next st, sc2tog; repeat from * around; join with sl st in first sc—72 (80, 96, 104, 112) sc.

Next 2 (3, 3, 3, 3) Rounds Ch 1, sc in each st around; join with sl st in first sc.

Next Round (Decrease round) Ch 1, *sc in next 13 (6, 2, 1, 1) sts, sc2tog; repeat from * around to last 12 (0, 0, 14, 4) sts, sc in remaining 12 (0, 0, 14, 4) sts; join with sl st in first sc—68 (70, 72, 74, 76) sc.

Neck Ribbing

Note Neck Ribbing is worked back and forth in rows perpendicular to the neck edge. The end of every other row of Ribbing is joined to the top of the neck. With smaller hook and A, ch 11.

Row 1 Sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in next 9 ch, sl st in each of next 2 sc of neck edge (last round of yoke).

Row 2 Turn, working across previous ribbing row, sc BL in each sc across.

Row 3 Ch 1, turn, working across previous ribbing row, sc BL in each sc across, sl st in each of next 2 sc of neck edge. Repeat last two rows all the way around neck edge.

Join

Working through bottom of sts of Row 1 and sts of last row, sc in each sc across to join ends of Neck Ribbing. Fasten off.

FINISHING

Sew underarm seams. Weave in ends. 🧵

GAUGE

Each block measures approx 3.25 x 3.25"/8 x 8cm.

Remember to check gauge for best results!

SPECIAL TECHNIQUE

Tunisian Crochet (See Crochet Classroom, pg 90) Each row of Tunisian crochet is worked in two steps, a forward (or pick-up) pass and a return (or work-off) pass. The work is never turned. RS is facing at all times. The forward pass is worked from right to left, and the return pass is worked from left to right. A row is complete when only one loop remains on hook. This remaining loop serves as the first stitch of the next row. When inserting hook under a vertical bar always insert it from right to left under the bar.

Forward Pass Various Tunisian stitches, including Tss, Tps, and Tcl are worked during the forward pass.

Tss (Tunisian simple stitch) Insert hook under next vertical bar, yarn over and draw up a loop.

Tps (Tunisian purl stitch) Move yarn to front of

work, insert hook under next vertical bar, yarn over and draw up a loop.

Tcl (Tunisian cluster) Yarn over, insert hook under next vertical bar, yarn over and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook, yarn over, insert hook under same vertical bar, yarn over and draw up a loop, [yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook] twice.

Return Pass Most rows of Tunisian crochet use the same return pass. Unless otherwise instructed, work the return pass as follows:

Standard return pass Yarn over and draw through one loop on hook, *yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook; repeat from * until only one loop remains on hook.

Note To get started, watch our Tunisian Simple Stitch video at crochettoday.com/how-to/tunisian-crochet

NOTES

1 The Stole is worked in Tunisian Entrelac.

Rows of blocks are worked in diagonal strips beginning in the lower left corner.

2 The yarn is fastened off at the end (left hand edge) of each diagonal strip of blocks, and rejoined at the right hand edge to begin the next diagonal strip of blocks.

3 Each block of Tunisian Entrelac is quite small, so a short Tunisian hook or standard in-line crochet hook can be used.

4 In forward pass, always skip the first vertical bar (at left edge of piece), and insert hook under two strands of the last vertical bar (at right edge of piece) to ensure a sturdy edge.

5 Edging is worked around the entire outside edge of the completed Stole.

BLOCK 1

(Knotted Twist Stitch)

With larger hook, ch 12.

Row 1 (Forward pass) Insert hook in 2nd ch from hook and draw up a loop, *insert hook in next ch and draw up a loop; repeat from * across—12 loops on hook.

Row 1 (Return pass) Work standard return pass.

Row 2 (Forward pass) *Insert hook into next 2 vertical bars (at the same time), yarn over and draw up a loop, insert hook under top horizontal bar of previous st (before the 2 vertical bars just worked into), yarn over and draw up a loop; repeat from * across to last vertical bar, insert hook under 2 strands of last vertical bar

(at left edge of piece) and draw up a loop (Tss made)—12 loops on hook.

Row 2 (Return pass) Work standard return pass.

Row 3 (Forward pass) Tss, *Tps, Tss; repeat from * across.

Row 3 (Return pass) Work standard return pass.

Rows 4–9 Repeat last 2 rows 3 more times.

Note The next row works sl sts into the vertical bars of the previous row. There is no return pass.

Row 10 *Insert hook into next 2 vertical bars, yarn over and draw loop through the bars and the loop on hook (sl st made), sl st in next horizontal bar; repeat from * across to last vertical bar, sl st in last vertical bar—11 sl sts made. Fasten off.

SECOND STRIP

(Blocks 2 and 3 in Peronell Lace Stitch)

Block 2

With RS facing and larger hook, join yarn with sl st in lower right corner of Block 1, ch 13.

Row 1 (Forward pass) Insert hook in 3rd ch from hook and draw up a loop (2 skipped ch count as first st), ch 1, Tcl in next ch, *sk next ch, Tps in next ch, sk next ch, Tcl in next ch; repeat from * across to last ch, Tss in last ch, ch 1, insert hook in first row of Block 1 and draw up a loop to join Block 2 to Block 1—9 loops on hook.

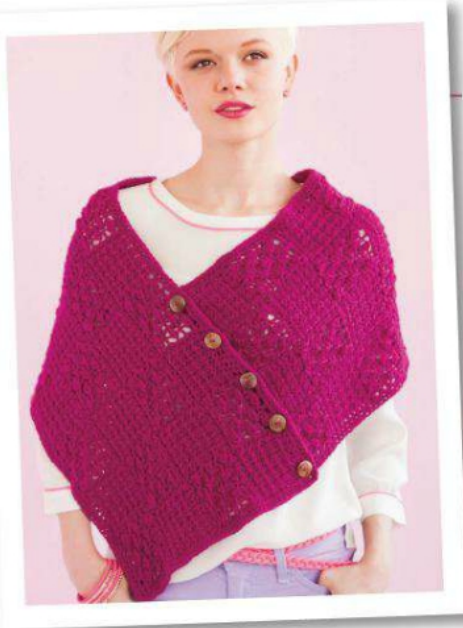
Row 1 (Return pass) Yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook, *yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook, ch 1; repeat from * until 4 loops remain on hook, [yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook] 3 times.

Note In the next 4 rows work into the vertical bars only, skip the chain-spaces.

Row 2 (Forward pass) Ch 1 (counts as first st), Tss, ch 1, Tps (above cluster of previous row), *Tcl (above Tps of previous row), Tps; repeat from * across to last vertical bar, Tss, ch 1, insert hook in next row of Block 1 and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook, insert hook in next row of Block 1 and draw up a loop—9 loops on hook.

Row 2 (Return pass) Work same as Row 1 return pass.

Row 3 (Forward pass) Ch 1, Tss, ch 1, Tcl (above Tps of previous row), *Tps (above cluster of previous row), Tcl; repeat from * across to last vertical bar, Tss, ch 1, insert hook in next



How many ways can you wear it? As a wrap, poncho, long or short cowl!

row of Block 1 and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook, insert hook in next row of Block 1 and draw up a loop—9 loops on hook.

Row 3 (Return pass) Work same as Row 1 return pass.

Rows 4 and 5 Repeat Rows 2 and 3.

Note The next row is worked like a standard crochet row worked into the vertical bars. There is no return pass. This leaves the hook in the correct position for starting the next block.

Row 6 Sl st in next vertical bar, *Sl st in next vertical bar, sl st in next ch-sp; repeat from * across to last 2 vertical bars, sl st in each of last 2 vertical bars—1 loop remains on hook. Do not fasten off.

Block 3

Row 1 (Forward pass) Working across top edge of Block 1, ch 1, Tss in first sl st, ch 1, Tcl in next sl st, *sk next sl st, Tps in next sl st, sk next sl st, Tcl in next sl st; repeat from * across to last sl st, Tss in last sl st, ch 1—8 loops on hook.

Row 1 (Return pass) Yarn over and draw through one loop on hook, *yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook, ch 1; repeat from * until 4 loops remain on hook, [yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook] 3 times.

Row 2 (Forward pass) Ch 1, Tss, ch 1, Tps, *Tcl, Tps; repeat from * across to last vertical bar, Tss, ch 1—8 loops on hook.

Row 2 (Return pass) Work same as Row 1 return pass.

Row 3 (Forward pass) Ch 1, Tss, ch 1, Tcl, *Tps, Tcl; repeat from * across to last vertical bar, Tss, ch 1—8 loops on hook.

Row 3 (Return pass) Work same as Row 1 return pass.

Rows 4 and 5 Repeat Rows 2 and 3.

Row 6 Sl st in next vertical bar, *sl st in next vertical bar, sl st in next ch-sp; repeat from * across to last 2 vertical bars, sl st in each of last 2 vertical bars—1 loop remains on hook. Fasten off.

THIRD STRIP

(Blocks 4–6 in Knotted Twist Stitch)

Note There are loops (stitches) running up the right side edge of each block of the previous strip. Insert the hook into these stitches at the end of each row to join each block in this strip to the edge of a block in the previous strip.

Block 4

With RS facing and larger hook, join yarn with sl st in lower right corner of Block 2, ch 12.

Row 1 (Forward pass) Insert hook in 2nd ch from hook and draw up a loop, *insert hook in next ch and draw up a loop; repeat from * across, insert hook in first st on side of Block 2—13 loops on hook.

Row 1 (Return pass) *Yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook; repeat from * until one loop remains on hook.

Row 2 (Forward pass) *Insert hook into next 2 vertical bars, yarn over and draw up a loop,

insert hook under top horizontal bar of previous st, yarn over and draw up a loop; repeat from * to last vertical bar, Tss, insert hook in next st on side of Block 2 and draw up a loop—13 loops on hook.

Row 2 (Return pass) Work same as Row 1 return pass.

Row 3 (Forward pass) Tss, *Tps, Tss; repeat from * across, insert hook in next st on side of Block 2 and draw up a loop—13 loops on hook.

Row 3 (Return pass) Work same as Row 1 return pass.

Rows 4–9 Repeat last 2 rows 3 more times.

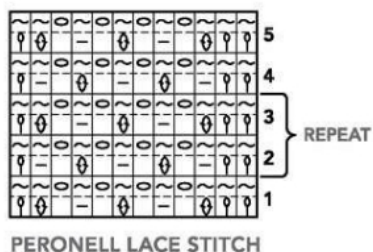
Row 10 *Insert hook into next 2 vertical bars, yarn over and draw loop through the bars and the loop on hook (sl st made), sl st in next horizontal bar; repeat from * across to last vertical bar, sl st in last vertical bar. Do not fasten off.

Block 5

Row 1 (Forward pass) Working across top of Block 2, *insert hook in next sl st and draw up a loop; repeat from * across, insert hook in first st on side of Block 3 and draw up a loop to join Block 5 to Block 3—13 loops on hook.

Row 1 (Return pass) *Yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook; repeat from * until one loop remains on hook.

Row 2 (Forward pass) *Insert hook into next 2 vertical bars, yarn over and draw up a loop, insert hook under top horizontal bar of previous st, yarn over and draw up a loop; repeat from * across to last vertical bar, Tss, insert hook



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in next st on side of Block 3 and draw up a loop—13 loops on hook.

Row 2 (Return pass) Work same as Row 1 return pass.

Row 3 (Forward pass) Tss, *Tps, Tss; repeat from * across, insert hook in next st on side of Block 3 and draw up a loop—13 loops on hook.

Row 3 (Return pass) Work same as Row 1 return pass.

Rows 4–9 Repeat last 2 rows 3 more times.

Row 10 *Insert hook into next 2 vertical bars, yarn over and draw loop through the bars and the loop on hook (sl st made), sl st in next horizontal bar; repeat from * across to last vertical bar, sl st in last vertical bar. Do not fasten off.

Block 6

Row 1 (Forward pass) Working across top of Block 3, *insert hook in next sl st and draw up a loop; repeat from * across—12 loops on hook.

Row 1 (Return pass) Work standard return pass.

Rows 2–6 Work same as Rows 2–6 of Block 1. Fasten off.

FOURTH STRIP

(Blocks 7–10 in Peronell Lace Stitch)

Block 7

Work same as Block 2, beginning at lower right corner of Block 4 and joining to edge of Block 4.

Block 8

Row 1 (Forward pass) Working across top edge of Block 4, ch 1, Tss in first sl st, ch 1, Tcl in next sl st, *sk next sl st, Tps in next sl st, sk next sl st, Tcl in next sl st; repeat from * across to last sl st, Tss in last sl st, ch 1, insert hook in first row of Block 5 and draw up a loop.

Row 1 (Return pass) Yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook, *yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook, ch 1; repeat from * until 4 loops remain on hook, [yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook] 3 times.

Row 2 (Forward pass) Ch 1 (counts as first st), Tss, ch 1, Tps, *Tcl, Tps; repeat from * across to last vertical bar, Tss, ch 1, insert hook in next row of Block 5 and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook, insert hook in next row of Block 5 and draw up a loop.

Row 2 (Return pass) Work same as Row 1 return pass.

Row 3 (Forward pass) Ch 1 (counts as first st), Tss, ch 1, Tcl, *Tps, Tcl; repeat from * across to last vertical bar, Tss, ch 1, insert hook in next row of Block 5 and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook, insert hook in next row of Block 5 and draw up a loop.

Row 3 (Return pass) Work same as Row 1 return pass.

Rows 4 and 5 Repeat Rows 2 and 3.

Row 6 Sl st in next vertical bar, *sl st in next vertical bar, sl st in next ch-sp; repeat from * across to last 2 vertical bars, sl st in each of last 2 vertical bars—1 loop remains on hook. Fasten off.

Block 9

Work same as Block 8, beginning by working across top of Block 5 and joining to Block 6.

Block 10

Work same as Block 3, beginning by working across top of Block 6.

FIFTH STRIP

(Blocks 11–14 in Knotted Twist Stitch)

Block 11

Join yarn with sl st in top corner of first block of previous strip, and work same as Block 5 beginning by working across first block of previous strip and joining to neighboring block.

Blocks 12 and 13

Work same as Block 5, beginning by working across top of next block of previous strip and joining to neighboring block.

Block 14

Work same as Block 6, beginning by working across top of next block of previous strip.

SIXTH STRIP

(Blocks 15–18 in Peronell Lace Stitch)

Block 15

Join yarn with sl st in top corner of first block of previous strip, and work same as Block 8, beginning by working across first block of previous strip and joining to neighboring block.

Blocks 16 and 17

Work same as Block 8, beginning by work-

ing across top of next block of previous strip and joining to neighboring block.

Block 18

Work same as Block 3, beginning by working across top of next block of previous strip.

7TH–15TH STRIPS

(Blocks 19–54)

Repeat Fifth and Sixth Strip 4 times, then repeat Fifth Strip once more.

16TH STRIP

(Blocks 55–57)

Work same as first three blocks of Sixth Strip. Fasten off.

17TH STRIP

(Blocks 58 and 59)

Work same as first two blocks of Fifth Strip. Fasten off.

BLOCK 60


Work same as Block 15. Fasten off.

FINISHING

Edging

Round 1 With RS facing and smaller hook, join yarn with sl st in corner of stole, ch 1, sc evenly spaced all the way around, working 3 sc in each corner; join with sl st in first sc.

Round 2 Ch 1, sc in each sc around, working 3 sc in center sc of each 3-sc corner; join with sl st in first sc. Fasten off.

Weave in ends. Sew buttons evenly spaced across one short edge of stole. Use chain spaces in Peronell Lace for button holes.

SPECIAL ABBREVIATIONS

FPhdc (Front Post half double crochet)

Yarn over, insert hook from front to back to front again around post of indicated stitch, yarn over and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through all 3 loops on hook.

NOTES

1 The Beaded Bracelet wraps around wrist twice. For a shorter bracelet, use 22 beads. To change the look even more, use only a few beads in the center of the bracelet.

2 The Flower Chain Bracelet is a chain of six Motifs joined together. Add extra length by increasing the number of Motifs.

3 To fasten all bracelets, slip one tie inside beginning ring and tie to second tie.

CHEVRON BRACELET

With A, ch 10; join with sl st in first ch to form ring.

Row 1 Ch 1, 9 sc in one side of ring,

leaving other side of ring unworked—9 sts.

Row 2 Ch 1, turn, sc2tog, sc in next 2 sc, 3 sc in next sc, sc in next 2 sc, sc2tog.

Fasten off A.

Rows 3–4 Join B with sl st in first st, repeat Row 2 twice.

Fasten off B.

Rows 5–6 Join C with sl st in first st, repeat Row 2 twice.

Fasten off C.

Rows 7–8 Join D with sl st in first st, repeat Row 2 twice.

Fasten off D.

Row 9 Join A with sl st in first st, repeat Row 2; do not fasten off at end of row.

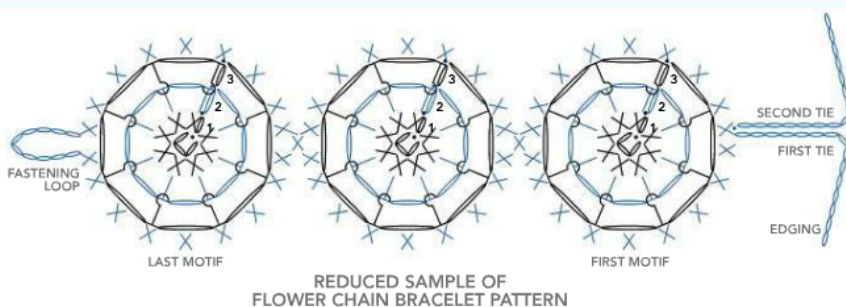
Rows 10–33 Repeat Rows 2–9, 3 times.

Row 34 Repeat Row 2. At end of row, ch 15 (first tie). Fasten off A.

Row 35 Join A with sl st in first st, repeat Row 2. At end of row, ch 15 (second tie). Fasten off A.

BEADED BRACELET

Thread beads onto C with beading needle.

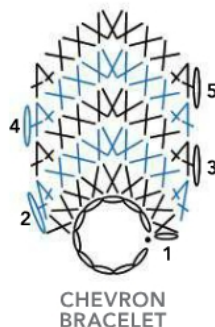


Remove needle.

Ch 10; join with sl st in first ch to form ring.

Row 1 Ch 1, *slide a bead down toward hook, work next ch, catching bead in center of ch to secure; repeat from * until bracelet is desired length, ch 15 at end of bracelet (first tie). Fasten off C.

Row 2 Join C with sl st in first ch of ch-15 tie, ch 15 (second tie). Fasten off C.



FLOWER CHAIN BRACELET

Motif (Make 6)

With B, ch 3; join with sl st in first ch to form ring.

Round 1 Ch 1, 8 sc in ring; join with sl st in first sc—8 sts.

Round 2 Ch 3 (counts as hdc and ch 1), hdc in next sc, [ch 1, hdc in next sc] 6 times, ch 1, join with sl st in 2nd ch of beginning ch 3—16 sts. Fasten off B.

Round 3 Join D with sl st in first st, ch 1, FPhdc around beginning ch 2, [ch 1, FPhdc

around next hdc] 7 times, ch 1; join with sl st in first FPhdc. Fasten off D.

Edging

With A, ch 15 (first tie), sc in any ch-1 sp of first Motif, *[sc in next FPhdc, sc in next ch-1 sp] 4 times, sc in ch-1 sp of next Motif; repeat from * 4 times across tops of next 4 Motifs, [sc in next FPhdc, sc in next ch-1 sp] 4 times across last Motif, ch 10 (fastening loop made), turn piece to work

across bottom of Motifs the same way, sc in same ch-1 sp of last Motif, **[sc in next FPhdc, sc in next ch-1 sp] 4 times, sc in join between current Motif and next Motif, sc in ch-1 sp of next Motif; repeat from ** 4 times across bottom of Motif chain, [sc in next FPhdc, sc in next ch-1 sp] 4 times across last Motif; join with sl st in first sc, ch 15 (second tie).

FINISHING

Weave in ends. 🧵

Teach Kids About Yarn Fun!

Get a child interested in crochet with this traditional friendship bracelet. Soon they'll be ready for (and wanting) their hooks!



1 Start by tying at least three strands of yarn together (we used six).

2 Wrap the far left thread (Strand 1) around the thread immediately to its right (Strand 2). Loop it over the front of Strand 2, then around the back and up through the loop you created, as shown. Pull the end to tighten Strand 1 into a knot. Repeat across the strands.



3 Repeat using Strand 2, tying new knots below the existing ones.

4 Continue making rows of knots across until the bracelet is the right length. Tie the loose ends of your strands into a knot and trim them neatly.

sc3tog (single crochet 3 stitches together) [Insert hook in indicated st, yarn over and draw up a loop] 3 times, yarn over and draw through all 4 loops on hook.

hdc2tog (half double crochet 2 stitches together) [Yarn over, insert hook in indicated st, yarn over and draw up a loop] 2 times, yarn over and draw through all 5 loops on hook.

SMALL HEART

(Make 3)

Row 1 (RS) With first color, ch 2, 2 sc in 2nd ch from hook—2 sc.

Row 2 Ch 1, turn; 2 sc in each sc—4 sc.

Row 3 Ch 1, turn; sc in each sc across.

Row 4 Ch 1, turn; 2 sc in first sc, sc in each remaining sc—5 sc.

Row 5 Ch 1, turn; (sc, ch 1, dc) in first sc, (dc, ch 1, sc) in next sc, sl st in next sc, (sc, ch 1, dc) in next sc, (dc, ch 1, sc) in last sc—13 sts.

Fasten off.

Small Heart Edging

With RS facing, join second color with sc in free loop of foundation ch at bottom of Heart, sc in same loop, sc in edge of each of Rows 1-4; working across top of Row 5, sc in next sc, *sc in next ch-1 sp, sc in next 2 dc, sc in next ch-1 sp*, sc3tog across next sc, next st on Row 4 at base of sl st and next sc; repeat from * to * once, sc in next sc; working along opposite edge, sc in edge of each of Rows 4-1, sc in same loop at bottom; join with sl st in first sc—22 sc.

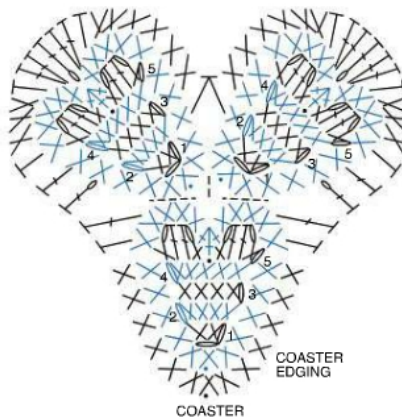
Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.

Coaster Edging

Using photo as a guide, arrange three Small Hearts with one Heart below the other two. With RS facing, join third color with sc in free loop of foundation ch at bottom of bottom Heart, sc in same loop, sc in next 5 sc, hdc in next sc, dc in next sc; working along outside edge of top right Heart, sk first 4 sc worked on Heart Edging, edc in next sc, dc in next sc, hdc in next sc, sc in next sc, *2 sc in next sc, hdc in next sc, 2 dc in next sc, edc in next sc3tog, 2 dc in next sc, hdc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc*, sc in next 4 sc; working to join top 2 Hearts, hdc2tog across next sc on current Heart and 4th sc on top left Heart, sc in next 4 sc; repeat from * to * once, sc in next sc, hdc in next sc, dc in next sc, edc in next sc; working along opposite outside edge of bottom Heart, sk next 7 sts across top of bottom Heart, dc in next sc, hdc in next sc, sc in last 5 sc, sc in same loop as joining; join with sl st in first sc—56 sts. Fasten off.



Use the hearts as appliques on pillows, afghans, hats, and scarves.



FINISHING

With long tails at bottom of top two Hearts, sew bottom point of Hearts together, and sew 2-3 sts along bottom edge of each top Heart to the curved edges of bottom Heart. Weave in ends.

1, 4 dc) in next ch-5 sp, dc in last sc—74 dc, 9 ch-1 sps, 16 sc, and 8 ch-5 sps.

Row 4 Ch 5, turn, sk first st, [dc4tog, 4 dc in next ch-1 sp, dc4tog, ch 5, (sc, ch 5, sc) in next ch-5 sp, ch 5] 8 times, dc4tog, 4 dc in next ch-1 sp, dc4tog, dtr in top of turning ch-3—25 ch-5 sps, 18 dc4tog, 36 dc, 16 sc and 1 dtr.

Row 5 Ch 1, turn, sc in dtr, [ch 5, sk next dc4tog, dc4tog, sk next dc4tog, ch 5, sc in next ch-5 sp, (4 dc, ch 1, 4 dc) in next ch-5 sp, sc in next ch-5 sp] 8 times, ch 5, sk next dc4tog, dc4tog, sk next dc4tog, ch 5, sc in top of turning ch-5—18 sc, 18 ch-5 sps, 9 dc4tog, 64 dc and 8 ch-1 sps.

Row 6 Ch 5 (counts as dc and ch-2), turn, sc in first ch-5 sp, [ch 5, sc in next ch-5 sp, ch 5, dc4tog, 4 dc in next ch-1 sp, dc4tog, ch 5, sc in next ch-5 sp] 8 times, ch 5, sc in next ch-5 sp, ch 2, dc in last sc—26 ch-5 sps, 18 sc, 16 dc4tog, 34 dc and 2 ch-2 sps.

Row 7 Ch 1, turn, sk first st, sc in next ch-2 sp, [(4 dc, ch 1, 4 dc) in next ch-5 sp, sc in next ch-5 sp, ch 5, sk next dc4tog, dc4tog, sk next dc4tog, ch 5, sc in next ch-5 sp] 8 times, (4 dc, ch 1, 4 dc) in next ch-5 sp, sc in 3rd ch of turning ch-5—18 sc, 72 dc, 9 ch-1 sps, 16 ch-5 sps and 8 dc4tog.

Row 8 Ch 5, turn, [dc4tog, 4 dc in next ch-1 sp, dc4tog, ch 5, (sc, ch 5, sc) in next ch-5 sp, ch 5] 8 times, dc4tog, 4 dc in next ch-1 sp, dc4tog, dtr in last sc—25 ch-5 sps, 18 dc4tog, 36 dc, 16 sc and 1 dtr.

Rows 9–72 Repeat Rows 5–8, sixteen times.

Row 73 Repeat 5.

Row 74 Turn; sl st in first 2 chs of first ch-5 sp, ch 1, sc in 3rd ch of same ch-5 sp, [ch 4, sc in next ch-5 sp, ch 4, sc in next ch-1 sp, ch 4, sc in next ch-5 sp] 8 times, ch 4, sc in 3rd ch of last ch-5 sp—26 sc and 25 ch-4 sps.

Row 75 (RS) Ch 1, turn; sc in first sc, *4 sc in next ch-4 sp, sc in next sc; repeat from * across; do not fasten off—126 sc.

Edging

Side 1

Ch 2, turn to work into row ends and turn-

ing chs along side of Blanket, sc in side of next sc, 3 sc in next sp, sc in side of next sc, [4 sc in next sp, sc in side of next sc, 3 sc in next sp, sc in side of next sc] 17 times, 4 sc in next sp, 2 sc around next dc, sc in side of next 2 sc, ch 2; join with sl st in first foundation ch—166 sc.

Fasten off.

Side 2

With RS facing, join A with sl st in last foundation ch, ch 2, turn to work into row ends and turning chs along 2nd side of Blanket, sc in side of next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sp, 4 sc in next sp, [sc in side of next sc, 4 sc in next sp] 17 times, sc in side of next sc, 3 sc in next sp, sc in side of next sc, ch 2; join with sl st in first sc of Row 75—166 sc.

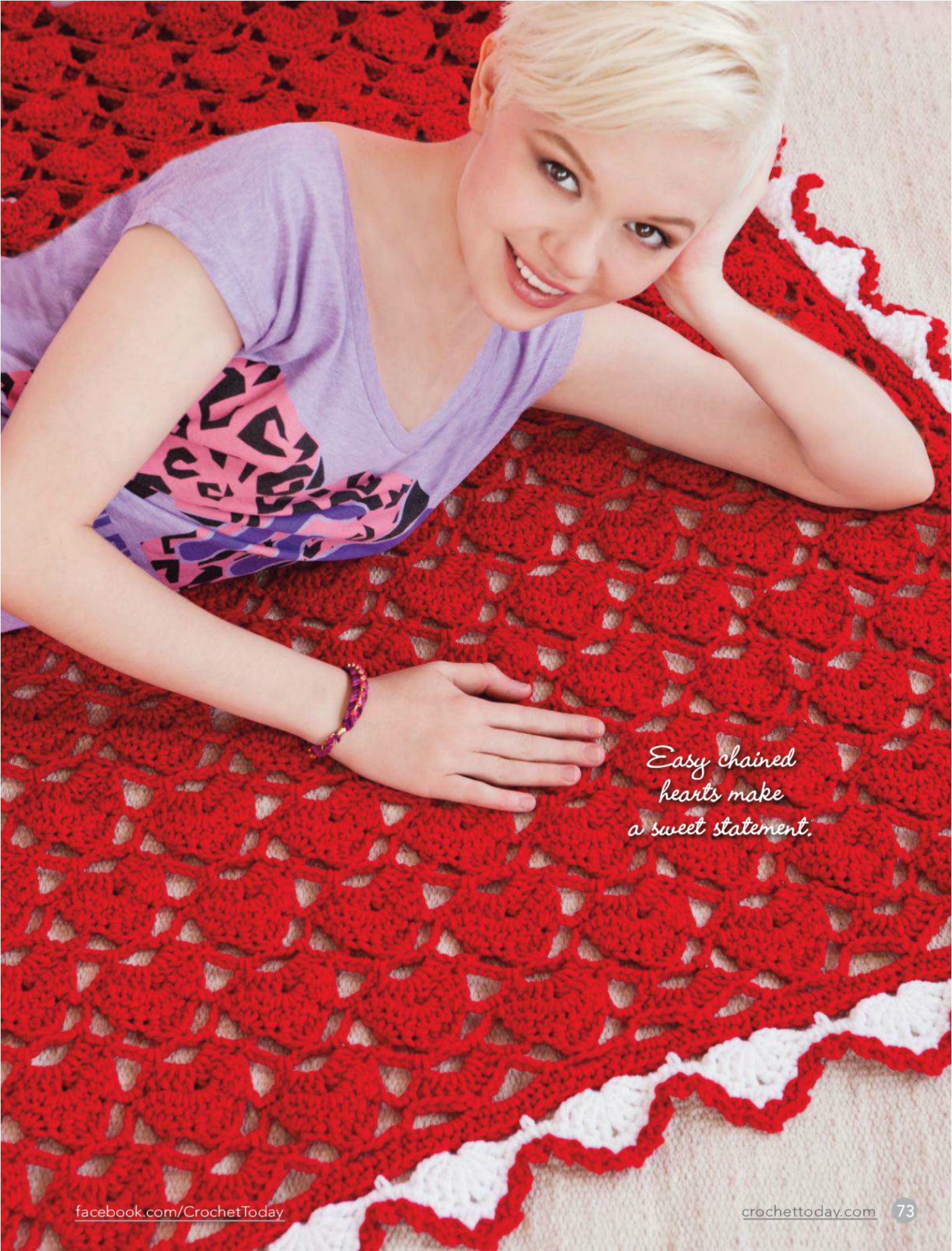

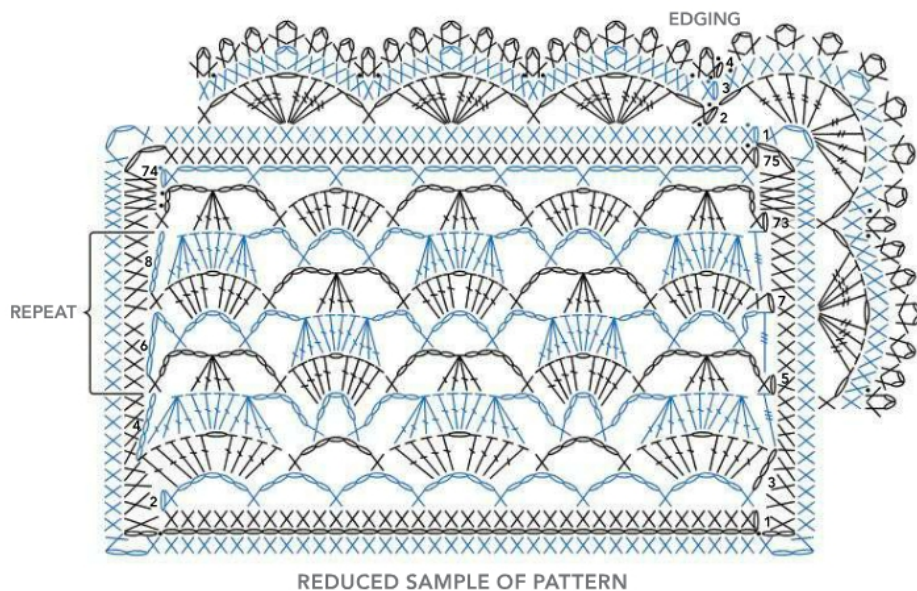

Round 3 Ch 1, sc in same st, *[sc in next ch-1 sp, sc in next 4 tr, (sc, ch 2, sc) in next ch-1 sp, sc in next 5 tr, (sc, ch 2, sc) in next ch-1 sp, sc in next 5 tr, sc in next ch-1 sp, sc in next sc, [sc in next ch-1 sp,

sc in next 4 tr, (sc, ch 2, sc) in next ch-1 sp, sc in next 4 tr, sc in next ch-1 sp, sc in next sc] 16 times, sc in next ch-1 sp, sc in next 5 tr, (sc, ch 2, sc) in next ch-1 sp, sc in next ch-1 sp*, sc in next sc; repeat from * to *; join with sl st in first sc—60 ch-2 sps and 788 sc (156 sc on top and bottom edges, 208 sc on each side edge between corner ch-2 sps).

Fasten off B.

Round 4 With RS facing, join A with sl st in center sc between two 4-tr shells near center of top of Blanket, ch 1, (sc, ch 2, sc) in same st, * [sl st in next sc, [sk next sc, (sc, ch 2, sc) in next sc] twice, sk next sc, (sc, ch 2, sc) in next ch-2 sp, [sk next sc, (sc, ch 2, sc) in next sc] twice, sk next sc, sl st in next sc, (sc, ch 2, sc) in next sc*; repeat from * to * across to last 7 sc, sl st in next sc, [sk next sc, (sc, ch 2, sc) in next sc] 3 times, (sc, ch 2, sc) in corner ch-2 sp, (sc, ch 2, sc) in next sc, [sk next sc, (sc, ch 2, sc) in next sc] twice, sk next sc, sl st in next sc, (sc, ch 2, sc) in next sc] 4 times; repeat from * to * across to first st; join with sl st in first st—368 ch-2 sps, 120 sl sts and 736 sc (158 sc on top and bottom edges, 210 sc on each side edge between corner ch-2 sps).
Fasten off A.

FINISHING

Weave in ends.

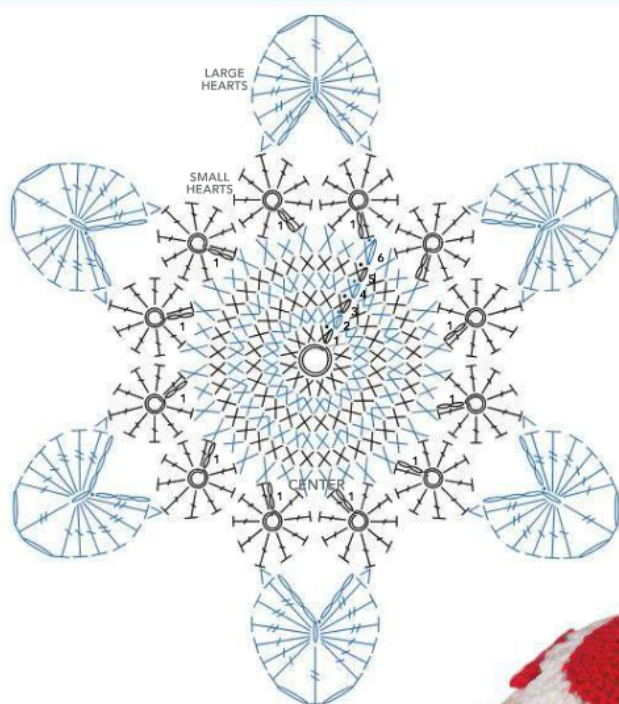

Round 6 Ch 2 starting in first hdc, [hdc in next 4 hdc, 2 hdc in next hdc] 10 times; join with sl st in first hdc—60 hdc.

Round 7 Ch 2, hdc in first hdc and in each hdc around; join with sl st in first hdc.

Child Size Only

Round 7 Ch 2, starting in first hdc, [hdc in next 9 hdc, 2 hdc in next hdc] 6 times; join with sl st in first hdc—66 hdc.

All Sizes

Round 8 Ch 2, hdc in first hdc and in each hdc around; join with sl st in first hdc.

Rounds 9–17 (19) Repeat Round 8, 9 (11) times.

Fasten off A.

Round 18 (20) Join B with sl st in previous join, ch 1, rev sc in each st around; join with sl st in beginning ch-1.

Fasten off B.

FLOWER APPLIQUÉ

Small Heart Petals (Make 12)

With A, make an adjustable ring.

Round 1 Ch 2, work 9 dc in ring, sl st in ring—10 dc.

Fasten off. Pull adjustable loop to close ring.

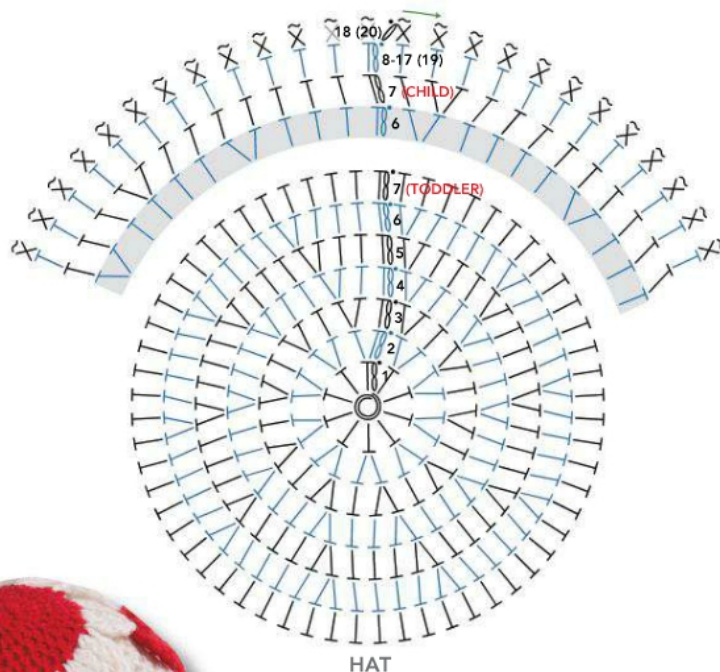

With B, ch 4.



Row 1 [3 tr, 3 dc, ch 1, tr, ch 1, 3 dc, 3 tr,] in 4th ch from hook, ch 3, sl st in last ch. Fasten off, leaving long tail for sewing. Turn piece inside out so WS of Center is facing. Referring to photo for placement, sew each Large Heart to Small Heart Petals with RS of each facing.

FINISHING

Sew completed Flower Appliqué to top of Hat. Weave in ends.

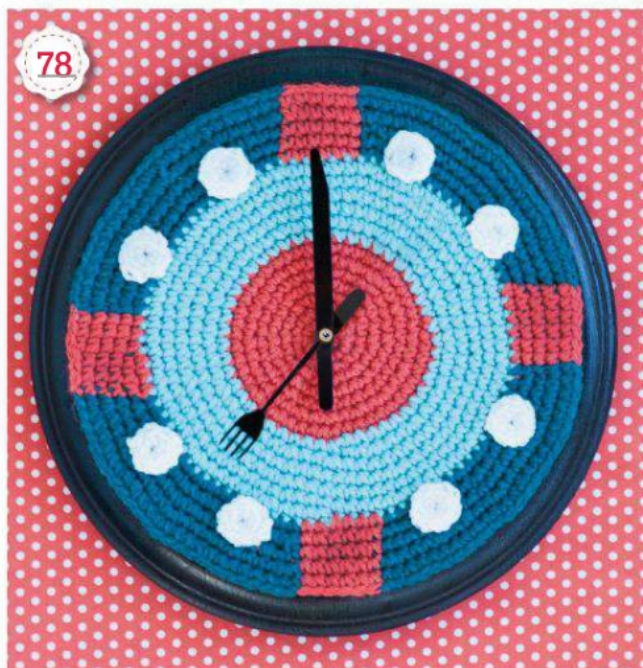

2 To change color, work last stitch of old color to last yarn over. Yarn over with new color and draw through all loops on hook to complete stitch.

Rounds 14–18 of Clock Face are worked with both A and C. Carry unused color along back of work until next color change.

CLOCK

Clock Face

With A, ch 6; join with sl st in beginning ch to form ring.

Round 1 Work 8 sc in ring—8 sts.

Round 2 Work 2 sc in each st around—16 sts.

Round 3 [Sc in next st, 2 sc in next st] 8 times—24 sts.

Round 4 [Sc in next 2 sts, 2 sc in next st] 8 times—32 sts.

Round 5 Sc in each st around.

Round 6 [Sc in next st, 2 sc in next st] 8 times—48 sts.

Round 7 Sc in next 47 sts, sl st in last st. Fasten off.

Round 8 Join B with sl st in any st on Round 7, ch 1, sc in same st and in each st around.

Round 9 [Sc in next 2 sts, 2 sc in next st] 16 times—64 sts.

Round 10 Repeat Round 5.

Round 11 Sc in next 4 sts, [2 sc in next st, sc in next 4 sts] 12 times—76 sts.

Round 12 Repeat Round 5.

Round 13 [Sc in next 5 sts, 2 sc in next st] 12 times, sc in next 3 sts, sl st in next st—88 sts. Fasten off B.

Round 14 Join A with sl st in any st on Round 13, ch 1, sc in same st, sc in next 2 sts, changing to C in last st; with C, sc in

next 16 sts, changing to A in last st; [with A, sc in next 6 sts, changing to C in last st; with C, sc in next 16 sts, changing to A in last st] 3 times; with A, sc in next 3 sts.

Round 15 Sc in next 3 sts, changing to C in last st; with C, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 6 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 7 sts, 2 sc in next st, changing to A in last st; [with A, sc in next 6 sts, changing to C in last st; with C, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 6 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 7 sts, 2 sc in next st, changing to A in last st] 3 times; with A, sc in next 3 sts—100 sts.

Round 16 Sc in each st around changing colors to continue pattern.

Round 17 Sc in next 3 sts, changing to C in last st; with C, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 3 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 4 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 4 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 3 sts, 2 sc in next st, changing to A in last st; [with A, sc in next 6 sts, changing to C in last st; with C, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 3 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 4 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 3 sts, 2 sc in next st, changing to A in last st] 3 times; with A, sc in next 3 sts—120 sts.

Round 18 Repeat Round 16.

Fasten off A and C.

Number Dots (Make 10)

With D, ch 2.

Round 1 Work 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook; join with sl st in first st—6 sts.

Round 2 Sl st in each st.

Fasten off, leaving long tail for sewing.

Using photo as a guide, sew Dots onto Clock Face between color bars.

FINISHING

Weave in ends.

Paint wooden clock base. Glue crocheted clock face to wooden base, making sure center hole on crochet clock face matches with hole on wooden base. Add clock kit and clock hands. It may be necessary to bend clock hands up slightly so hands rotate freely around clock and do not snag on crocheted stitches.

Resulting swatch should measure approx 4"/10cm square. If necessary, adjust hook size to obtain correct gauge.

SPECIAL TECHNIQUES

surface slip stitch Make a slip knot, but do not place it on hook. Hold slip knot on wrong side of fabric. Insert hook from right side of fabric through to wrong side. Place slip knot on hook, draw loop to right side. Insert hook from right side to wrong side through next desired stitch or space, yarn over, draw loop to right side and through loop on hook (surface slip stitch made). To end a line of surface slip stitches, draw up a loop on the right side of fabric. Remove hook from loop and take hook to wrong side of fabric. Insert hook from wrong side to right side, place loop on hook, draw loop through to wrong side of fabric. Fasten off leaving a long tail. Draw

tail through final loop and pull tight.

NOTES

Potholders are worked in joined rounds. Do not turn unless otherwise indicated.

To change color, work last stitch of old color to last yarn over. Yarn over with new color and draw through all loops on hook to complete stitch.

Rounds 5–9 of Potholder 1 are worked with both B and C. Carry unused color along back of work until next color change.

For a thicker potholder, make the pattern twice and sew the edges together with WS facing.

POTHOLDER 1

With A, ch 3.

Round 1 Work 5 hdc in 3rd ch from hook (ch-2 counts as first st here and throughout); join with sl st in ch-2—6 hdc.

Round 2 Ch 2, hdc in same st, 2 hdc in each hdc around; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—12 hdc.

Round 3 Ch 2, hdc in same st, [hdc in next

hdc, 2 hdc in next hdc] 5 times, hdc in last hdc; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—18 hdc.

Round 4 Ch 2, hdc in same st, [hdc in next 2 hdc, 2 hdc in next hdc] 5 times, hdc in last 2 hdc; join with sl st in top of beginning ch, changing to B in last st—24 hdc.

Fasten off A.

Round 5 With B, ch 2, [hdc in next 3 hdc, 2 hdc in next hdc] 3 times, changing to C in last st; with C, [hdc in next 3 hdc, 2 hdc in next hdc] 2 times, hdc in last 3 hdc, hdc in same st as beginning ch-2; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—30 hdc.

Round 6 Ch 2, turn; hdc in same st, [hdc in next 4 hdc, 2 hdc in next hdc] 2 times, hdc in next 4 hdc, changing to B in last st; with B, [2 hdc in next hdc, hdc in next 4 hdc] 3 times; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—36 hdc.

Round 7 Ch 2, turn, hdc in same st, [hdc in next 5 hdc, 2 hdc in next hdc] 2 times, hdc in next 5 hdc, changing to C in last st; with C, [2 hdc in next hdc, hdc in next 5 hdc] 3 times; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—42 hdc.

Round 8 Ch 2, turn; hdc in same st, [hdc in next 6 hdc, 2 hdc in next hdc] 2 times, hdc in next 6 hdc, changing to B in last st; with B, [2 hdc in next hdc, hdc in next 6 hdc] 3 times; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—48 hdc.

Round 9 Ch 2, turn; hdc in same st, [hdc in next 7 hdc, 2 hdc in next hdc] 2 times, hdc in next 7 hdc, changing to C in last st; with C, [2 hdc in next hdc, hdc in next 7 hdc] 3 times; join with sl st in top of beginning ch, changing to A in last st—54 hdc. Fasten off B and C.

Round 10 With A, ch 2, hdc in same st, [hdc in next 8 hdc, 2 hdc in next hdc] 5 times, hdc in last 8 hdc; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—60 hdc.

Round 11 Ch 2, hdc in same st, [hdc in next 9 hdc, 2 hdc in next hdc] 5 times, hdc in last 9 hdc; join with sl st in top of beginning ch, changing to D in last st—66 hdc. Fasten off A.

Round 12 With D, ch 2, hdc in same st, [hdc in next 10 hdc, 2 hdc in next hdc] 5 times, hdc in last 10 hdc; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—72 hdc.

Round 13 Ch 2, hdc in same st, [hdc in next 11 hdc, 2 hdc in next hdc] 5 times, hdc in last 11 hdc; join with sl st in top of

beginning ch—78 hdc.

Round 14 Ch 2, hdc in same st, [hdc in next 12 hdc, 2 hdc in next hdc] 5 times, hdc in last 12 hdc; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—84 hdc.

Round 15 Ch 2, hdc in same st, [hdc in next 13 hdc, 2 hdc in next hdc] 5 times, hdc in last 13 hdc; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—90 hdc.

Round 16 Ch 2, hdc in same st, [hdc in next 14 hdc, 2 hdc in next hdc] 5 times, hdc in last 14 hdc; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—96 hdc.

Round 17 Ch 2, hdc in same st, [hdc in next 15 hdc, 2 hdc in next hdc] 5 times, hdc in last 15 hdc; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—102 hdc.

Round 18 Ch 2, hdc in same st, [hdc in next 16 hdc, 2 hdc in next hdc] 5 times, hdc in last 16 hdc; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—108 hdc.

Round 19 Ch 2, hdc in same st, [hdc in next 17 hdc, 2 hdc in next hdc] 5 times, hdc in last 17 hdc; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—114 hdc.

Fasten off D.

POTHOLDER 2

With C, ch 3.

Rounds 1–4 Repeat Rounds 1-4 of Potholder 1, changing to B in last st of Round 4.

Fasten off C.

Round 5 With B, ch 2, hdc in same st, [hdc in next 3 hdc, 2 hdc in next hdc] 5 times, hdc in last 3 hdc; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—30 hdc.

Round 6 Ch 2, hdc in same st, [hdc in next 4 hdc, 2 hdc in next hdc] 5 times, hdc in last 4 hdc; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—36 hdc.

Round 7 Ch 2, hdc in same st, [hdc in next 5 hdc, 2 hdc in next hdc] 5 times, hdc in last 5 hdc; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—42 hdc.

Round 8 Ch 2, hdc in same st, [hdc in next 6 hdc, 2 hdc in next hdc] 5 times, hdc in last 6 hdc; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—48 hdc.

Round 9 Ch 2, hdc in same st, [hdc in next 7 hdc, 2 hdc in next hdc] 5 times, hdc in last 7 hdc; join with sl st in top of beginning ch, changing to C in last st—54 hdc.

Fasten off B.

Round 10 With C, ch 2, hdc in same st, [hdc in next 8 hdc, 2 hdc in next hdc] 5 times, hdc in last 8 hdc; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—60 hdc.

Round 11 Ch 2, hdc in same st, [hdc in next 9 hdc, 2 hdc in next hdc] 5 times, hdc in last 9 hdc; join with sl st in top of beginning ch, changing to A in last st—66 hdc.

Fasten off C.

Round 12 With A, ch 2, hdc in same st, [hdc in next 10 hdc, 2 hdc in next hdc] 5 times, hdc in last 10 hdc; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—72 hdc.

Round 13 Ch 2, hdc in same st, [hdc in next 11 hdc, 2 hdc in next hdc] 5 times, hdc in last 11 hdc; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—78 hdc.

Round 14 Ch 2, hdc in same st, [hdc in next 12 hdc, 2 hdc in next hdc] 5 times, hdc in last 12 hdc; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—84 hdc.

Round 15 Ch 2, hdc in same st, [hdc in next 13 hdc, 2 hdc in next hdc] 5 times, hdc in last 13 hdc; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—90 hdc.

Round 16 Ch 2, hdc in same st, [hdc in next 14 hdc, 2 hdc in next hdc] 5 times, hdc in last 14 hdc; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—96 hdc.


Round 17 Ch 2, hdc in same st, [hdc in next 15 hdc, 2 hdc in next hdc] 5 times, hdc in last 15 hdc; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—102 hdc.

Round 18 Ch 2, hdc in same st, [hdc in next 16 hdc, 2 hdc in next hdc] 5 times, hdc in last 16 hdc; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—108 hdc.

Round 19 Ch 2, hdc in same st, [hdc in next 17 hdc, 2 hdc in next hdc] 5 times, hdc in last 17 hdc; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—114 hdc.

Fasten off A.

FINISHING

Weave in ends. Steam block gently. With F hook, work surface sl st around edge of each color circle to smooth out transitions. With yarn needle and embroidery floss or yarn, embroider as desired. Cut black felt into circle shape, sew to back. 

Step out in a fun scarf that's sure to get music lovers noticed!

color and draw through all loops on hook to complete stitch. Carry color not in use loosely across WS of work, until instructed to fasten off.

3 Notes, a Treble Clef, and a Fine are worked separately and sewn to the Scarf.

SCARF

With larger hook and C. ch 184.

Row 1 (RS – Lower Border) Hdc in 2nd ch from hook (beginning ch does not count as a st) and in each remaining ch across—183 sts. Fasten off C.

Row 2 (RS) With RS facing, join A with sl st in first st, ch 2 (does not count as a st here and throughout), dc in same st as join, dc in each remaining st across.

Rows 3–5 Ch 2, turn, dc in each st across.

Row 6 (RS) With A, ch 2, turn, dc in first 9 sts; *[with B, FPdc around each of next 2 sts; with A, dc in next dc] twice; with B, FPdc around each of next 2 sts; with A, dc in next 3 sts with B, FPdc around each of next 2 sts; with A, dc in next st; with B, FPdc around each of next 2 sts; with A, dc in next 3 sts; [with B, FPdc around each of next 2 sts; with A, dc in next dc] twice; with B, FPdc around each of next 2 sts; with A, dc in next 9 sts; with B, FPdc around each of next 2 sts; with A, dc in next st; with B, FPdc around each of next 2 sts; with A, dc in next 3 sts; [with B, FPdc around each of next 2 sts; with A, dc in next dc] twice; with B, FPdc around each of next 2 sts; with A, dc in next 3 sts, with B, FPdc around each of next 2 sts; with A, dc in next st; with B, FPdc around each of next 2 sts; with A dc in next 9 sts; repeat from * once more, [with B, FPdc around each of next 2 sts; with A, dc in next dc] twice, with B, FPdc around each of next 2 sts; with A, dc in next 3 sts, with B, FPdc

Fasten off.

Rows 7–10 With RS facing, join A with sl st in first st, ch 2, beginning in same st as join, work same as Row 6. Fasten off.

Side and Top Borders

With RS facing, join C with sl st in corner at beginning of foundation chain to work up short side edge, ch 1, 3 hdc in same corner, hdc evenly spaced across side edge, 3 hdc in corner, hdc in each st across top edge, 3 hdc in corner, hdc evenly across side edge, 3 hdc in corner; join with sl st in foundation ch. Fasten off.

HALF NOTE

(Make 2)

With smaller hook and C, make an adjustable ring. Ch 1, work 6 sc in ring (for head), join with sl st in first sc, ch 8 (for stem). Fasten off and weave in ends.

QUARTER NOTE


(Make 2)

With smaller hook and C, make an adjustable ring. Ch 1, work 6 sc in ring (for head), join with sl st in first sc, ch 10 (for stem and flag). Fasten off and weave in ends.

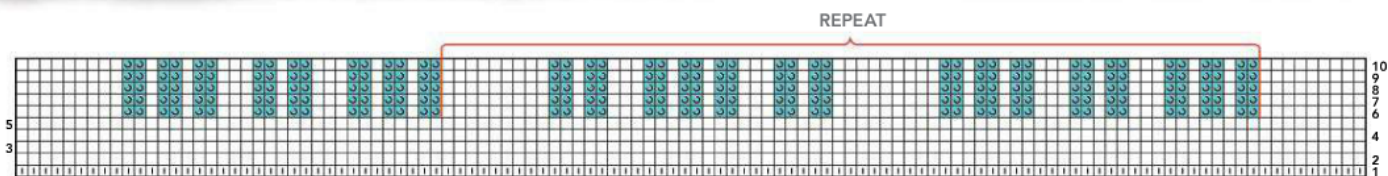
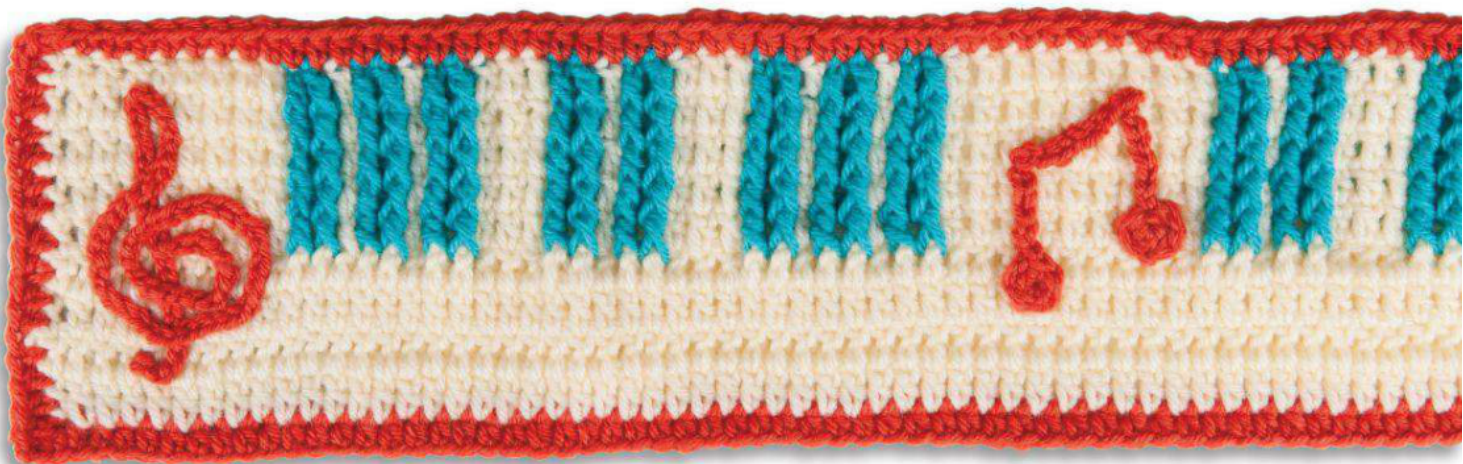
EIGHTH NOTE

(Make 2)

- Size L/11 (8mm) crochet hook

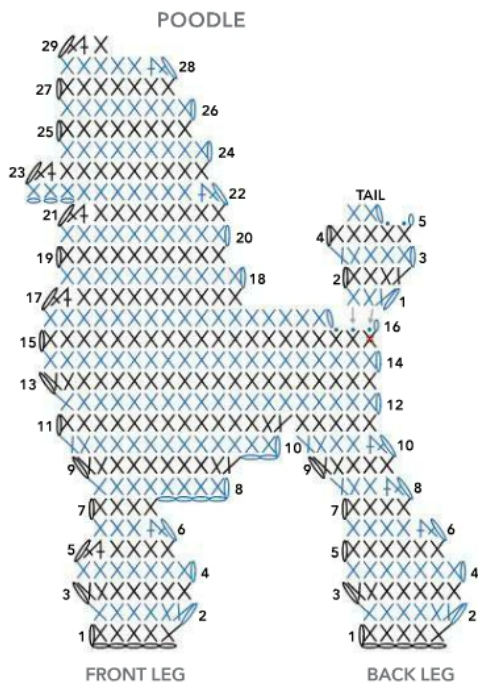

Round 3 Ch 3, dc in same st as previous join, dc in next dc, *2 dc in next dc, dc in next dc; repeat from * around; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—36 dc.

Round 4 Ch 3, skip first st, 2 dc in next dc, dc in next dc, *dc in next dc, 2 dc in next dc, dc in next dc; repeat from * around; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—48 dc.

Round 5 Ch 3, skip first st, dc in each of next 2 dc, 2 dc in next dc, *dc in each of next 3 dc, 2 dc in next dc; repeat from * around; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—60 dc.

Round 6 Ch 3, skip first st, dc in next dc, 2 dc in next dc, dc in each of next 2 dc, *dc in each of next 2 dc, 2 dc in next dc, dc in each of next 2 dc; repeat from * around; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—72 dc.

Round 7 Ch 3, dc in same st as joining, dc in each of next 5 dc, *2 dc in next dc, dc in each of next 5 dc; repeat from * around; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—84 dc.

Round 8 Ch 3, skip first st, dc in each of next 2 dc, 2 dc in next dc, dc in each of next 3 dc, *dc in each of next 3 dc, 2 dc in next dc, dc in each of next 3 dc; repeat from * around; join

with sl st in top of beginning ch—96 dc.

Round 9 Ch 3, skip first st, dc in each of next 6 dc, 2 dc in next dc, *dc in each of next 7 dc, 2 dc in next dc; repeat from * around; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—108 dc.

Round 10 Ch 3, skip first st, dc in each of next 3 dc, 2 dc in next dc, dc in each of next 4 dc, *dc in each of next 4 dc, 2 dc in next dc, dc in each of next 4 dc; repeat from * around; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—120 dc.

Round 11 Ch 3, dc in same st as joining, dc in each of next 9 dc, *2 dc in next dc, dc in each of next 9 dc; repeat from * around; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—132 dc.

Round 12 Ch 3, skip first st, dc in each of next 4 dc, 2 dc in next dc, dc in each of next 5 dc, *dc in each of next 5 dc, 2 dc in next dc, dc in each of next 5 dc; repeat from * around; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—144 dc.

Round 13 Ch 3, skip first st, dc in each of next 10 dc, 2 dc in next dc, *dc in each of next 11 dc, 2 dc in next dc; repeat from * around; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—156 dc.

Round 14 Ch 3, skip first st, dc in each of next 5 dc, 2 dc in next dc, dc in each of next 6 dc, *dc in each of next 6 dc, 2 dc in next dc, dc in each of next 6 dc; repeat from * around; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—168 dc.

Round 15 Ch 3, dc in same st as joining, dc in each of next 13 dc, *2 dc in next dc, dc in each

of next 13 dc; repeat from * around; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—180 dc.

Round 16 Ch 3, skip first st, dc in each of next 6 dc, 2 dc in next dc, dc in each of next 7 dc, *dc in each of next 7 dc, 2 dc in next dc, dc in each of next 7 dc; repeat from * around; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—192 dc.

Round 17 Ch 3, skip first st, dc in each of next 14 dc, 2 dc in next dc, *dc in each of next 15 dc, 2 dc in next dc; repeat from * around; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—204 dc.

Round 18 Ch 3, skip first st, dc in each of next 7 dc, 2 dc in next dc, dc in each of next 8 dc, *dc in each of next 8 dc, 2 dc in next dc, dc in each of next 8 dc; repeat from * around; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—216 dc.

Round 19 Ch 3, dc in same st as joining, dc in each of next 17 dc, *2 dc in next dc, dc in each of next 17 dc; repeat from * around; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—228 dc.

Round 20 Ch 3, skip first st, dc in each of next 8 dc, 2 dc in next dc, dc in each of next 9 dc, *dc in each of next 9 dc, 2 dc in next dc, dc in each of next 9 dc; repeat from * around; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—240 dc.

Round 21 Ch 3, skip first st, dc in each of next 18 dc, 2 dc in next dc, *dc in each of next 19 dc, 2 dc in next dc; repeat from * around; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—252 dc.

Round 22 Ch 3, skip first st, dc in each of

next 9 dc, 2 dc in next dc, dc in each of next 10 dc, *dc in each of next 10 dc, 2 dc in next dc, dc in each of next 10 dc; repeat from * around; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—264 dc.

Round 23 Ch 3, dc in same st as joining, dc in each of next 21 dc, *2 dc in next dc, dc in each of next 21 dc; repeat from * around; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—276 dc.

Round 24 Ch 3, skip first st, dc in each of next 10 dc, 2 dc in next dc, dc in each of next 11 dc, *dc in each of next 11 dc, 2 dc in next dc, dc in each of next 11 dc; repeat from * around; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—288 dc. Fasten off.

Border

With C and larger hook, join with sl st in first dc of Round 24, ch 4 (counts as dc, ch 1), (dc, ch 1) in each dc around; join with sl st to 3rd ch of beginning ch—576 sts. Finish off. Weave in ends.

POODLE

Note The Poodle is worked from the legs to the head. The Back Leg is worked separately and then joined to the Body after the Front Leg is worked.

Back Leg

With C and larger hook, ch 6.

Row 1 Sc in 2nd ch from hook and each ch across—5 sts.

Row 2 (RS) Ch 1, turn; 2 sc in first sc, sc in each sc across—6 sts.

Row 3 Repeat Row 2—7 sts.

Row 4 Ch 1, turn; sc in each sc across.

Row 5 Ch 1, turn; sc in next 6 sc, leaving the last st unworked—6 sts.

Row 6 Ch 1, turn; sc2tog, sc in next 4 sc—5 sc.

Row 7 Ch 1, turn; sc in first 4 sc, leaving the last st unworked—4 sts.

Row 8 Ch1, turn; sc2tog, sc in next sc, 2 sc in last sc—4 sts.

Row 9 Ch 1, turn; 2 sc in first sc, sc in next 3 sc—5 sts.

Row 10 Ch 1, turn; sc2tog, sc in next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc—5 sts. Fasten off.

Body

Front Leg

With C and larger hook, ch 6.

Row 1 Sc in 2nd ch from hook and each ch across—5 sts.

Row 2 (RS) Ch 1, turn; 2 sc in first sc, sc in each sc across—6 sts.

Row 3 Ch 1, turn; 2 sc in first sc, sc in next 5 sc—7 sts.

Row 4 Ch 1, turn; sc in each sc across.

Row 5 Ch 1, turn; sc2tog, sc in next 4 sc, leaving last st unworked—5 sts.

Row 6 Ch 1, turn; sc2tog, sc in next 3 sc—4 sts.

Row 7 Ch 1, turn; sc in each sc across.

Row 8 Ch 5, turn; skip first ch, sc in next 4 chs, sc in each sc across—8 sts.

Row 9 Ch 1, turn; 2 sc in first sc, sc in next 6 sc, 2 sc in last sc—10 sts.

Row 10 Ch 3, turn; skip first ch, sc in next 2 chs, sc in next 9 sc, 2 sc in last sc—13 sts.

Joining Back Leg

Row 11 Ch 1, turn; sc in first st, sc in next 11 sc, 2 sc in next sc, with WS of Back Leg facing, sc in next 5 sc on last row of Back Leg—19 sts.

Body (Continued)

Row 12 Ch 1, turn; sc in each sc across.

Row 13 Ch 1, turn; 2 sc in first sc, sc in each sc across—20 sts.

Rows 14–15 Ch 1, turn; sc in each sc across, place a stitch marker in last st of Row 15.

Row 16 Ch 1, turn; sl st in first 3 sc, ch 1, sc in next 17 sc—17 sts.

Row 17 Ch 1, turn; sc2tog, sc in next 10 sc, leaving the last 5 sts unworked—11 sts.

Row 18 Ch 1, turn; sc in each sc across.

Row 19 Ch 1, turn; sc in next 10 sc, leaving last st unworked—10 sts.

Row 20 Ch 1, turn; sc in each sc across.

Row 21 Ch 1, turn; sc2tog, sc in next 8 sc, leaving last st unworked—9 sts.

Row 22 Ch 1, turn; sc2tog, sc in next 7 sc; work 3 Ext-Fsc at end of row—11 sts.

Row 23 Ch 1, turn; sc2tog, sc in next 9 sc—10 sts.

Row 24 Ch 1, turn; sc in next 9 sc, leaving last st unworked—9 sts.

Row 25 Ch 1, turn; sc in next 8 sc, leaving last st unworked—8 sts.

Row 26 Ch 1, turn; sc in each sc across.

Row 27 Ch 1, turn; sc in next 7 sc, leaving last st unworked—7 sts.

Row 28 Ch 1, turn; sc2tog, sc in next 5 sc—6 sts.

Row 29 Ch 1, turn; sc2tog, sc in next sc, leaving last 3 sts unworked—2 sts. Fasten off.

Tail

With RS facing, join C with sl st in marked st on Row 15 of Body, ch 1.

Row 1 Work 2 sc in first sc, sc in next sc—3 sc.

Row 2 Ch 1, turn; sc in next 2 sc, 2 sc in last sc—4 sc.

Row 3 Ch 1, turn; sc in next 3 sc, 2 sc in last sc—5 sc.

Row 4 Ch 1, turn; sc in each sc across.

Row 5 Ch 1, turn; sl st in next 2 sc, ch 1, sc in next 2 sc, leaving last st unworked—2 sc. Fasten off.

Bow Tie

With B and smaller hook, ch 91.

Row 1 Sl st in 2nd ch from hook and each ch across—90 sts.

Fasten off.

Weave in ends. Tie Bow Tie loosely around Poodle's neck and sew to Poodle through knot to secure.

FINISHING

Weave in ends. Using photo as a guide, position Poodle on RS of blanket and pin in place. With A, sew Poodle onto blanket, working through strands on back of Poodle near edges and through front strands of blanket, so seaming is not visible. 🧵

Rows 6–7 Repeat Row 5, twice.

Row 8 Turn; sl st in first sc, sc in next 9 sc across—9 sc.

Row 9 Repeat Row 5.

Row 10 Turn; sl st in first 2 sc, sc in next 7 scs—7 sc.

Round 11 Ch 1, rotate piece to begin work along side of Lens; sc in each row-end st of Rows 10–1 to corner, working across opposite side of foundation ch, sc in each ch across, sc in each row-end st of Rows 1–7, sc in sl st at end of Row 8 (insert st marker), sc in next row-end st, sc in next 2 sl sts, sc in each st across top of Row 10; join with sl st in first st—34 sc. Fasten off.

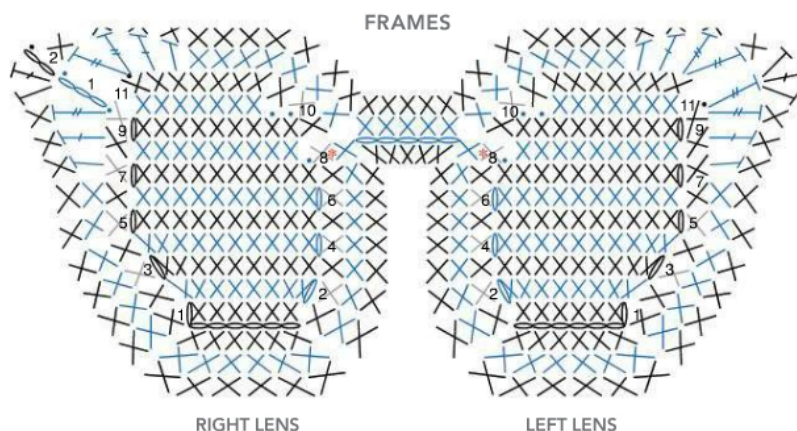
Left Lens

Rows 1–10 Repeat Rows 1–10 for Right Lens.

Round 11 Ch 1, turn; sc in each st across Row 10, sc in next 2 sl sts, sc in next row-end st, sc in sl st at end of Row 8 (insert st marker), sc in each row-end st of Rows 7–1, working across opposite side of foundation ch, sc in each ch across, sc in each row-end st of Rows 1–10; join with sl st in first st—34 sc. Fasten off.

Frames

Round 1 With RS facing, join B with sl st in last st in Row 11 of Right Lens, ch 3 (counts as tr), tr in same st, dc in next st, hdc in next st, sc in next 20 sc, sc in marked st, ch 5; with RS facing, sc in marked st on Left Lens, sc in next 20 sc (around bottom edge), hdc in next st, dc in next st, 2 tr in next st (Row 11 joining st), 2 tr in next st, dc in next st, hdc in next st, sc in next 7 sc (across top of Left Lens), sc in marked st, sc in next 5 ch, sc in marked st on Right Lens, sc in next 7 sc (across top of

Right Lens), hdc in next st, dc in next st, 2 tr in last st; join with sl st in top of beginning ch; do not turn—78 sts.

Round 2 Ch 2 (counts as hdc), dc and hdc in same st as ch-2, sc in next 24 sts (around bottom and up inside of Right Lens), sc in each of next 5 ch sts, sc in next 24 sts (down inside and around bottom of Left Lens) (hdc, dc, hdc) in next st (corner made), sc in next 12 sts (across top of Left Lens), sc in next 5 sc (across bridge), sc in next 12 sts (across top of Right Lens); join with sl st in top of beginning ch—88 sts. Fasten off.

Strap

Row 1 Join B with sl st in 4th sc down from top left corner of frames, sc in same st, sc in next 2 sc—3 sc.

Row 2 Ch 1, turn; sc in each sc across. Repeat Row 2 until strap measures 14"/35.5cm or fits head snugly; join to right side of frames with slip stitch seam. Alternately, fasten off and sew to right side.

FINISHING

Weave in ends, steam block lightly. Using photo as a guide, sew crystals or beads in top outside corners of eyeshade to embellish, if desired.

Entrelac Made Easy!

Entrelac always seems like a very complex technique when I contemplate using it in a project. Then when I pick up my hook, I'm surprised at how easy and fun it is.

Essentially, entrelac crochet consists of blocks of stitches that are interlocked together as you go. The key to this technique is that you're not joining granny squares, but actually making little swatches of stitches that are continuously crocheted together. So whether you're working entrelac in the round or in rows, the yarn is joined just once for the round or row, and fastened off only at the end of the project or for a color change.

Tunisian Entrelac in Rows/Stripes

Entrelac rows are worked from the lower right-hand corner to the upper left-hand corner. Usually, each row changes color only when a new yarn is joined. The stitches in all the blocks go in the same direction.

Here's How

Block 1

Swatch A uses 12 sts across and 10 rows to make a square shape. Make your block a square shape, even if the number of rows varies from this. Bind off and cut the ends.

Block 2

(Right-hand side of first block) Join new yarn

(in swatch A, it's magenta) to the first stitch of Block 1. Chain 12.

Forward Pass Pick up a loop in each chain across. Insert your hook into the first stitch in Block 1, yarn over and pull up a loop to join the row ends together.

Reverse Pass Yarn over and pull through 2 loops, repeat across (the first stitch joins the new block to the first). In the forward pass, be sure to pick up an extra loop in the first stitch of the row in Block 1. Then in the reverse pass, yarn over and pull through 2 loops and repeat across. After the last row, bind off, then slip stitch to the first bound-off stitch in Block 1.



Block 3

First Row, Forward pass Pick up stitches across the bound-off top edge of Block 1. To pick up a stitch, insert your hook into the slip stitch bind-off, yarn over and pull up a loop. In Swatch B, 12 stitches are picked up in the first forward pass.

Reverse pass Work the same as Block 2.

Finish off the rest of the rows and cut the yarn.

Block 4

Work the same as Block 2.

Block 5

First Row, Forward Pass Pick up stitches across as in Block 3, and pick up a stitch in the first stitch of Block 3.

Reverse Pass Yarn over and pull through 2 loops across (Swatch C).

Continue the same as Block 2 through the bind off.



Block 6

Work the same as Block 3.

Continue as established by adding blocks (Block 2) to each row until your project is the desired width. Once established, join yarn to the block above (Block 5) and continue the rows until the desired length is achieved. Last, fill in the right-hand corner with another Block 5.

Tunisian in the Round

Entrelac can also be worked in the round. Each block reverses direction to create a woven look. In Swatch D, Block 1 is crocheted as usual. Then Block 2 is created by picking up stitches along the left-hand side of Block 1 and crocheting as usual. Block 3 is a repeat of the previous block. The last block picks up stitches along the edge of Block 3,



plus one stitch in the chain of Block 1 to join them together. Repeat each round until they are joined at the end.

Traditional Crochet in the Round

Traditional crochet can easily get in the act, using either rows or rounds. The only difference is in the joining. In Swatch E, a basic half double crochet block is worked in the round, with the direction of the work constantly changing. In Swatch F, the join is a simple slip stitch to the previous block before the work is turned. For single crochet stitches, slip stitch once and turn. For half double stitches, slip stitch twice and turn. For double crochet, slip stitch three times, and so on. It's just like a turning chain directly into the adjoining block.



Beyond the Basic Block

This isn't the end! How about instead of switching colors in each round, you switch stitch patterns? An example of this is shown in the Material Girl Stole on page 63. You can also change the shape of the blocks—instead of squares, make parallelograms. In that case, the project resembles a quilt with shapes fitting neatly together. I hope you enjoy experimenting! 🧶

How to Do Foundation Single Crochet (Fsc)

- 1 Begin with ch 2. Then insert hook in 2nd ch from hook.
- 2 Yarn over, pull up a loop, yarn over, pull through 1st loop on hook (base-ch made).
- 3 Yarn over and pull through both loops on hook (Fsc made).
- 4 Insert hook in last Fsc base-ch. Yarn over and pull up a loop, yarn over, pull through 1st loop on hook (base-ch made).

- 5 Yarn over and pull through both loops on hook (Fsc made).

- 6 Repeat steps 4 and 5 for desired number of Fsc.



How to Make an Adjustable Ring

- 1 Holding the yarn a few inches from the end, wrap around your fingers.
- 2 Insert hook into wrap, pull up a loop, ch 1, remove loop from fingers.
- 3 Work stitches of first round into the ring, covering it.
- 4 To tighten ring, pull gently but firmly on yarn tail.

You can walk down the steps into North Beach (SF’s Little Italy) or catch a cable car joy ride on Hyde.

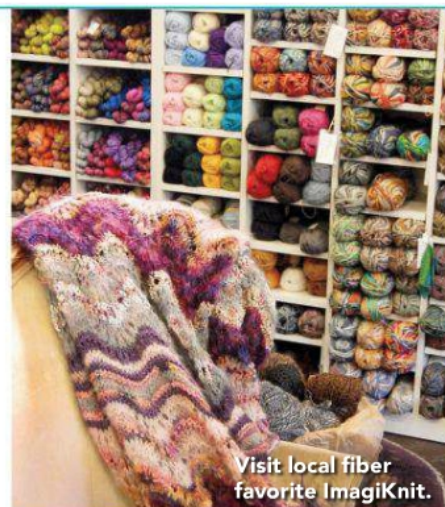

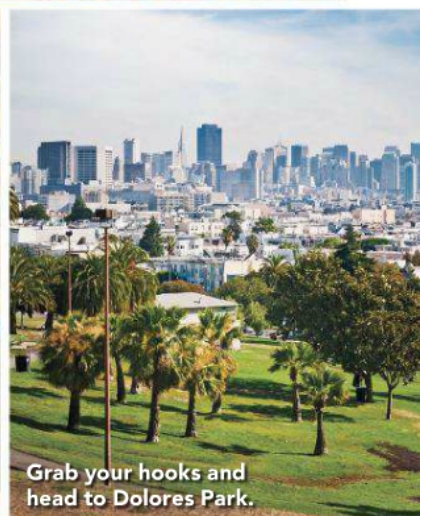

Two blocks away you’ll find a foodie’s paradise, including **Tartine Bakery and Café** (600 Guerrero St., 415-487-2600, tartinebakery.com) for a hot pressed sandwich and a slice of coconut cream tart, or try Bi-Rite Creamery for small-batch, artisanal ice cream (the salted caramel’s so good). Lick your scoops at **Dolores Park** across the street for fun people-watching and a breathtaking city view.
