








Beyoncé was only seven when she won a school talent show, beating children twice her age. She performed "Imagine," a beautiful song about peace and love.

Soon after, she hit the highest notes in the choirs at church and school.














Beyoncé Knowles grew up in Houston, Texas, with her parents and sister, Solange. As a child, she loved singing and dancing and won thirty-five local talent shows in a row. At age nine, she joined the girl group Girls Tyme, which eventually became the trio, Destiny's Child. With hits such as "Survivor" and "Say My Name," the group achieved international fame, won two Grammys, and had four US No.1s. In 2002, she was named Songwriter of the Year by the American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers—making her the first Black woman to win the award. Beyoncé launched her solo career in 2003 with the chart-topping album Dangerously in Love, which included the award-winning track, "Crazy in Love." The tune featured her future husband, Jay-Z, and became an R&B

classic. Her third album introduced fans to her alter ego—a type of stage character—called Sasha Fierce. Beyoncé sometimes felt nervous as a soloist, and performing as Sasha helped her to find her confidence. Alongside making music, she has starred in movies such as *Dreamgirls* and *The Lion King* and runs the popular fashion line lvy Park. Beyoncé is a committed civil-rights activist and speaks out against racism and sexism. In her 2016 album, *Lemonade*, she sang passionately about the experiences of Black women in the US. And through her charity, BeyGOOD, she helps support Black-owned businesses. In 2022, she released her seventh solo album, *Renaissance*, and a sell-out tour followed. Beyoncé's desire to bring joy, change, and healing to the world reminds us that she is truly irreplaceable.
