

When "That's All Right" started playing on the local radio, it became a hit overnight. Many people had never heard a sound like it before. It wasn't blues, but it wasn't country either. It was... ROCK 'N' ROLL!






Elvis joined a band called The Blue Moon Boys, and together they played almost every night. The audience was very different from place to place. Still, once Elvis started singing and jiggling his legs, everyone went crazy... one way or the other!
























Two years later, Sergeant Presley was discharged from the army. Back home, he focused on his acting career. For the next eight years, he made dozens of musical movies, but he missed the excitement of performing live and the closeness of his audience.



His comeback to the stage was in a television special where he sounded better than ever. The show ended with "If I Can Dream," a moving tribute paid to Martin Luther King, Jr., the civil rights activist Elvis so much admired.



Elvis was only 36 when he received a Lifetime Achievement Award for his contributions to music. Yet he still had much more to offer! He kept giving his best, dressing in stunning jumpsuits and even adding karate moves to his show.







And all the great musicians that came after him still look up to little Elvis, King of Rock 'n' Roll,




the irreplaceable artist who changed the course of music history and made sure that no song would be black or white ever again.





Elvis Aaron Presley was born on January 8th 1935 in Tupelo, Mississippi. His twin brother, Jesse, died at birth, and Elvis grew up with his parents in a tiny two-bedroom house built by his father. He fell in love with music at age 11 when he was gifted his first guitar. Influenced by the music he heard in church and the country songs his mother would play, he began listening to Black R&B musicians on the famous Beale Street when the family moved to Memphis, Tennessee. At 18, Elvis recorded "My Happiness," which was picked up by an executive at Sun Studios, a local record label. From there his career took off, and he introduced Rock 'n' Roll to the world, opening doors for both white and Black artists. Although he was adored by many, he was criticized by others who thought his music and dancing were too

different and radical. Nonetheless, his music dominated the charts from 1956 to 1958, and he was followed by fans wherever he went. Elvis was forced to put his career on hold when he was drafted by the US army, and he spent time in Germany during his service. When he came home in 1960, he picked up where he left off, starring in many movies over the next eight years including *Blue Hawaii* and *Viva Las Vegas*. He kept performing for the rest of his life, returning to his home, Graceland, when he wasn't on the road. Elvis died prematurely at the age of 42, but to this day he is one of the biggest artists of all time, with over 1 billion records sold globally. The King of Rock 'n' Roll changed history forever, showing the world that music can be color blind.


