

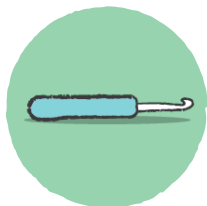

SETUP

MATERIALS



8mm crochet hook



Tapestry needle



Stuffing



Scissors
(not included)



Brown bulky-weight
yarn, with 3 stitch
markers in it (168 yds)

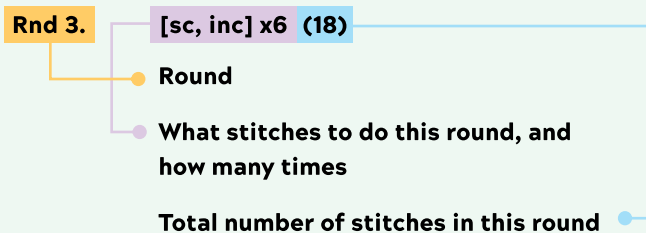


Dark Brown
bulky-weight
yarn (39 yds)



Black bulky-weight
yarn (3 yds)

HOW TO READ A WOOBLES PATTERN



For round 3, repeat the pattern in the brackets 6 times. The pattern is: single crochet in 1 stitch, then increase stitch in the next stitch. Because an increase is actually 2 single crochet stitches in the same stitch of the previous round, the total number of stitches in this round is 18.

ABBREVIATIONS

This pattern is written in US terminology, and crocheted in continuous rounds. Watch video tutorials at thewoobles.com/tutorials

ch	chain
sc	single crochet
hdc	half double crochet
dec	(invisible) decrease
inc	increase (2 sc in the same hole)
rnd	round
sl st	slip stitch

PATTERN

HEAD & BODY

With brown yarn.

TIP Keep track of where you are by placing a stitch marker in the first stitch of the current round.

- Rnd 1.** start 6 sc in a magic loop (6)
Rnd 2. 6 inc (12)
Rnd 3. [sc, inc] x 6 (18)
Rnd 4. [2 sc, inc] x 6 (24)
Rnd 5. 4 sc, [2 sc, 3 inc] x 2, 10 sc (30)

TIP Your piece might start curling - that's totally normal. For a neater final look, push the middle of your piece until it curves the other way. This makes the "right side" face out. Then keep crocheting to the left. If you're a lefty, keep crocheting to the right.

- Rnds 6-8.** 30 sc (30)
Rnd 9. inc, sc, [2 sc, 4 dec] x 2, 3 sc, 5 inc (28)
Rnd 10. 4 sc, [2 sc, 2 dec] x 2, 12 sc (24)
Rnd 11. [sc, inc] x 12 (36)
Rnds 12-13. 36 sc (36)
Rnd 14. [2 sc, dec] x 9 (27)
Rnd 15. 27 sc (27)
Rnd 16. [sc, dec] x 9 (18)

Stuff the piece, shaping it like a peanut. The side that sticks out more from the body is the front of the body.

- Rnd 17.** 9 dec (9)

Fasten off, leaving a long tail. Thread a needle with a tail; then use it to pull the yarn tail through the front loops of each stitch. Pull tight to close the remaining gap. Hide the tail in the body.

Start here if you're using the pre-made piece

EYES

With black yarn.

Embroider the eyes between rounds 5 and 6, with a 10-stitch space between them and two stitches wide:

Step 1.

Thread a needle with an arm's length of yarn. Insert the needle somewhere on the right side of the body, and pull it out the hole between rounds 5 and 6, where you want the left edge of the right eye. Leave a 6-inch tail.

Step 2.

Insert the needle two stitches to the right, and pull it out of the same hole it just came out of.

Step 3A.

Insert the needle two stitches to the right.

Step 3B.

Pull it out the hole between rounds 5 and 6, where you want the right edge of the left eye.

Step 4.

Insert the needle two stitches to the left, and pull it out of the same hole it just came out of.

Step 5A.

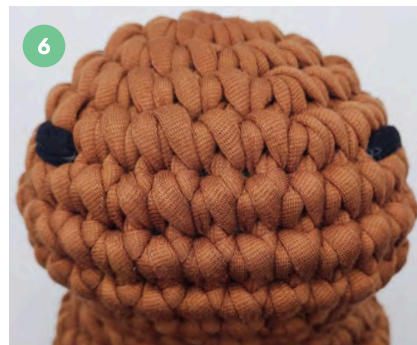
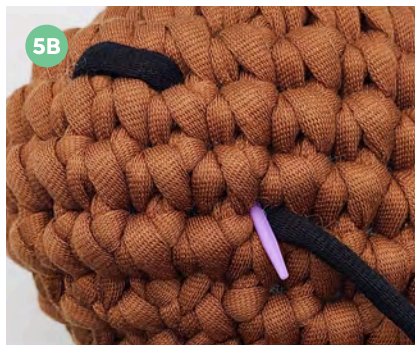
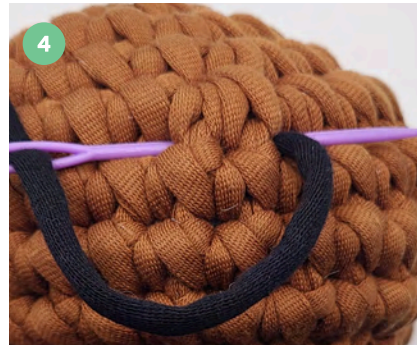
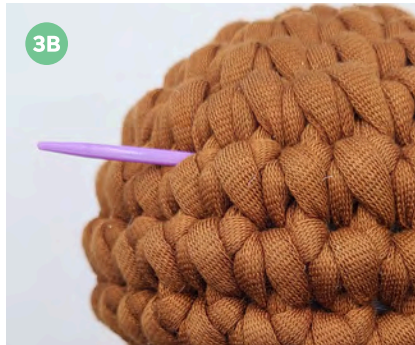
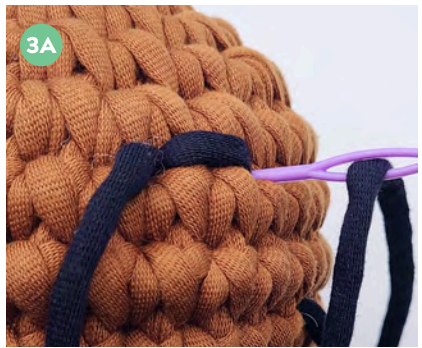
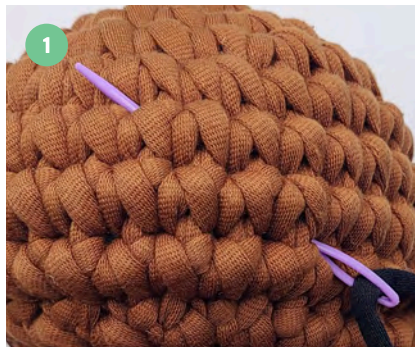
Insert the needle two stitches to the left.

Step 5B.

Pull the needle out of the same hole in the body that it originally went into, so that both tails are coming out of the same hole.

Step 6.

Tie a knot with both tails, as close to the surface of the body as possible. Hide the tails in the body.



SNOUT

With dark brown yarn.

- Rnd 1.** start 8 sc in a magic loop (8)
Rnd 2. hdc, hdc inc, [sc, inc] x 2, sc, hdc inc (12)

TIP *hdc* means half double crochet.
hdc inc means to crochet 2 hdc in the same stitch.

Invisible fasten off, leaving a long tail. Thread a needle with the tail, then use it to sew the snout on the front of the body, spanning rounds 6 to 8, centered between the eyes. Make sure the half double crochet stitches are at the bottom. Hide the tail in the body.

EARS

With dark brown yarn (make two).

- Rnd 1.** start 6 sc in a magic loop (6)
Rnd 2. 6 sc (6)

Invisible fasten off, leaving a long tail. Thread a needle with the tail, then use it to sew each ear to either side of the head, spanning rounds 3 and 4, aligned centered behind where the magic loop is. Hide the tails in the body.

FRONT LEGS

With dark brown yarn.

Left leg

Step 1.

Hold the piece upside down, with the front facing you. Identify the hole three stitches to the right of the center of the body, nine rounds up from the eyes towards the bottom of the body between rounds 14 and 15. Sl st join to the stitch you identified by inserting the hook into the body from the back to the front of the body.

TIP *sl st join* means slip stitch join.

Step 2.

Ch 3.

Step 3.

Sc into the second ch from the hook, sc.

Step 4.

Sl st in the next stitch towards the center of the body. Fasten off and hide the yarn tails.

TIP *sl st* means slip stitch.



Right leg

Step 1.

With the piece still upside down, with the front facing you. Identify the hole three stitches to the left of the center of the body, nine rounds up from the eyes towards the bottom of the body between rounds 14 and 15. Sl st join to the stitch you identified by inserting the hook into the body from the front to the back of the body.



Step 2.

Ch 3.

Step 3.

Sc into the second ch from the hook, sc.

Step 4.

Sl st in the next stitch towards the back of the body. Fasten off and hide the yarn tails.



HIND LEGS

With dark brown yarn (make two).

Repeat the following steps on the bottom of the body to create two legs:

Step 1.

Hold the piece upside down. Sl st join into a stitch on round 16, across from either front leg towards the back of the body. Insert the hook into the piece from the middle and outward of the bottom of the body.

Step 2.

Ch 3.

Step 3.

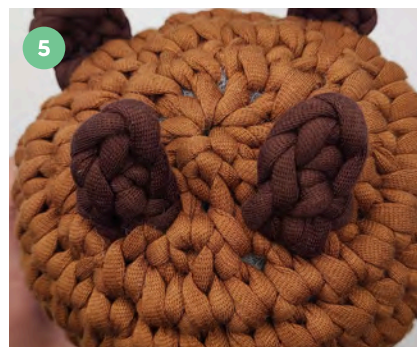
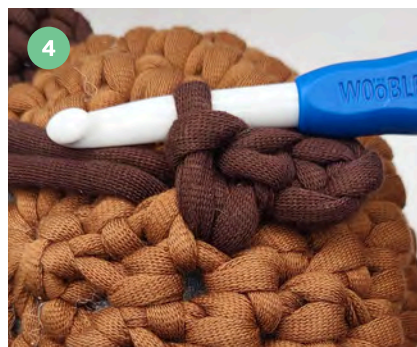
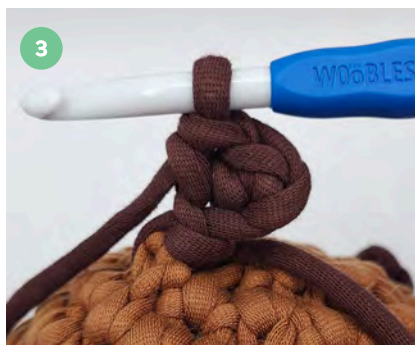
Sc into the second ch from the hook, sc.

Step 4.

Sl st in the stitch where you made the sl st join, from outward to the middle of the bottom of the body. Both yarn tails should be coming out of the same hole.

Step 5.

Fasten off. Make sure the feet are pointing toward the face. Tie the yarn tails together and hide them.



NOSE & MOUTH

With black yarn.

Step 1.

Thread a needle with an arm's length of yarn. Insert the needle somewhere on the right side of the body, and pull it out the magic loop on the center of the snout. Leave a 6-inch yarn tail.

Step 2.

Insert the needle one round up and one stitch to the right, and pull it two stitches to the left.

Step 3.

Insert the needle into the same hole it was pulled out in step 1, and pull it out one round below.

Step 4.

Insert the needle into the same hole it was pulled out in step 1. Pull the needle out of the same hole in the body that it originally went into, so that both yarn tails are coming out of the same hole.

Step 5.

Tie a knot with both yarn tails, as close to the surface of the body as possible. Hide the tails in the body.
