• Pupil Handbook 2009

Your child/ward would have received a copy of the Pupil Handbook 2009. Please read through the Pupil Handbook with your child/ward so that you are familiar with its content. • Timetable and the Use of Lockers

The timetable of your child/ward has been made known since the first day of school. Please ensure that your child/ward prepares the necessary books and materials for his / her daily lessons. In addition, each pupil is allocated a locker so that his / her school bag can be kept at a manageable weight.

• Pupils who are unwell

We would like to advise all parents/guardians that pupils who are unwell should see a doctor and not come to school until certified fit by doctors. In addition, the medical certificate should be handed to your child's/ward's form teacher when he / she returns.

• Oral Digital Thermometers (ODTs)

As a preparatory measure, please note that all pupils are required to have a personal ODT by end January 2009. ODTs will be issued free of charge to Primary 1 pupils as they have not been given one before. As for pupils in other levels who have lost their ODTs, they are required to replace it. They may buy it at \$5.00 per piece from the school bookshop.

• Remedial & Supplementary Lessons

Please note that remedial and supplementary lessons for selected groups of P3, P4, P5 and all pupils of P6 will start in week 3 (for P6) and week 5 (For all other levels). These lessons are scheduled on Wednesdays (Mother Tongue) and Fridays (English, Mathematics and Science) unless specified. A consent form will be issued to your child through the form teachers if he / she is required to attend the lessons.

Term 1 Programme Highlights!

For Term 1 in 2009, we have lined up the following programmes:

• House Practices and Sports Carnival for P4 – P6

Fairfield Sports Carnival returns this year on 13 March 2009. In preparation for the event, House Practices will be conducted on 13 January and 11 March for Blackmore and Eveland Houses while Martin and Olson will have theirs on 14 January and 10 March from 1.30pm to 3.45pm. House practices are compulsory for all P4-P6 pupils. When necessary, additional sessions may be arranged by the House Mistress/Master and parents will be informed accordingly. The event aims to achieve 100% participation of all pupils in a variety of games and sports, and to build teamwork, cooperation and a sense of camaraderie among House members. We look forward to your support in making our Sports Carnival 2009 an enjoyable and successful event by encouraging your child/ward to participate fully in all House practices as well as joining us on 13 March 2009 itself.

• P1 Games Day

Primary 1 pupils will be having their Games Day on 6 March 2009 during the curriculum time. Their (Physical Education) PE teachers will train them in preparation for the event. The Games Day aims to provide a learning platform for these children to display the skills learnt during PE lessons.

• P2 Education Gymnastic Programme

The aim of this programme is to develop in children an enthusiasm for physical activities and to provide the fundamental skills for further skills development across all aspects of the PE programme. The gymnastic coaches are equipped with either local or overseas coaching certificates. There will be a total of 16 sessions to be conducted during the PE lessons in Term 1 and 2. The whole process will be closely monitored by the coaches and the PE teacher. Upon completion of the programme, each pupil will be awarded a certificate. The programme will end with a Gym Talent Day on 22 May 2009.

• Adventure Camp for P5

This annual camp (26-28 March 2009) is an anchor programme for Primary 5 which aims to build self-confidence and resilience. In addition, the camp seeks to build team spirit in and among the P5 classes.

• Revision of Science Syllabus

With the revised Science syllabus implemented for P3/P4 in 2008 and P5 in 2009, the contents of the curriculum are organized in THEMES (Diversity [for P3/P4 only], Interactions, Cycles, Systems and Energy) by 2 levels (P3/P4 and P5/P6). This gives flexibility to schools to pace their curriculum to enable teachers to use more engaging teaching and learning approaches.

As such, please keep all the books purchased till your child / ward graduates from Primary 6.

Please also note that the current P6 pupils will not be affected in this change.
