"TALES ON SMRT TRAINS" BRINGS ENCHANTING STORIES TO CHILDREN ON THE GO

1 Jointly organised by SMRT, the National Library Board (NLB) and the Society for Reading and Literacy (SRL), the popular "Tales on SMRT Trains" is back for the June school holidays! This year, more than 400 children are expected to participate in four free* storytelling sessions on board SMRT's trains. For the first time, the storytelling sessions comprise read aloud sessions to encourage interactivity and participation from the young audience.

After a stint as a sitcom writer with the Television Corporation of Singapore, he embarked on a career in children's literature. He is the author of twenty-four well-received children's books, many of which feature his young niece and nephews as the main characters.

ROSEMARIE SOMAIAH of Asian Storytelling Network, has taught, led workshops and told stories for children and adults in schools, libraries, and museums in Singapore and overseas. She has performed at The Arts House, the Asian Civilisations Museum, the Substation, the Singapore Art Museum, and at festivals like Kidsfest, The Asian Children's Festival and The Storytellers Showcase in Singapore and the Scottish Storytelling Festival in Edinburgh. Rosemarie currently leads The Storytellers' Circle of the Society for Reading and Literacy (SRL) and is Secretary of the Singapore Drama Educators' Association (SDEA).
