UNDERWATER 'WUSHU' EXTRAVAGANZA TO USHER IN THE LUNAR NEW YEAR

Underwater World Singapore is pleased to present an innovative underwater wushu (martial arts) performance to usher in the Lunar New Year of the Golden Rooster.

This power-packed underwater performance by wushu exponents from Kuen Culture, is the first-ever underwater martial arts performance in the world. Traditionally, wushu is a form of impactful gymnastic stunts performed on land. To overcome the challenges of the buoyancy of the water, the performers have undergone extensive dive training to maintain their stability and equilibrium. The entire sequence promises to enthrall visitors with perfectly executed punches and kicks in the water.

The whole routine is specially choreographed and performed by three martial arts exponents, all of whom have won numerous awards and accolades in local and overseas competitions. It is considered auspicious for three persons to perform in the water, as the number *three* signifies "to multiply" and water symbolises "wealth".

The first stunt consists of a "Li Yu Yue Long Men", "鲤鱼跃龙门", which means "the Carp leaping over the Dragon Gate". Legend has it that a carp was swimming against a strong upstream current to reach a lake in the hills. Near the summit, a huge rock barred its way. Mustering all its strength, the carp took a giant leap over the rock. While in the air, the carp was transformed into a celestial dragon. Ever since then, the rock became known as the Dragon Gate. The significance of the Carp leaping over the Dragon Gate signifies the shedding of the old to embrace fortune and prosperity. This action involves the exponents leaping and somersaulting into the water from the top of the reef tank in the tunnel. This is an extremely difficult stunt as they have to land steadily on their feet and compose their posture in the water. With this "Li Yu Yue Long Men", "鲤鱼跃龙门", we wish one and all a giant leap into the Lunar New Year ahead!

The grand finale will be a spectacular "Luo Han He Sui", "罗汉贺岁", in which one of the exponents will jump up and perform a split on top of the shoulders of the other two and unveil a scroll with auspicious characters. This is a symbolic presentation to wish all our visitors a happy and bountiful year. Being a difficult stunt, its success depends on the perfect timing, flexibility and suppleness of the person performing the jump. At the same time all three performers must maintain balance and coordination.

With this spectacular underwater wushu performance, Underwater World Singapore wishes all our stakeholders good fortune, good health and prosperity.

During the Lunar New Year, there will be performances at 4.00 pm from Feb 9 to 13, 19 and 20. The ever-popular "Underwater God of Fortune" will also be making daily appearances underwater to greet visitors with blessings of good fortune.
