UWS and NIE/NTU Jointly Mark the Year of the Turtle

Singapore, 31 July 2006 – The educational journey of marine conservation continues as Underwater World Singapore (UWS) and National Institute of Education (NIE), an institute of Nanyang Technological University (NTU), came together today in a joint effort to commemorate the Indian Ocean - South East Asia (IOSEA) "Year of the Turtle" (YoT). In what would be an unusual voyage, 11 turtles fitted with satellite-tracking devices will be released into international waters for the first time. The occasion was graced by the Minister for National Development, Mr Mah Bow Tan.

In contrast to previous turtle releases on-shore, the 11 turtles were today transported by a Pacific International Lines container vessel, the Kota Hadiah, for release, on 1 Aug 06, in the South China Sea by NIE's professor, Dr C H Diong, the Project's Principal Investigator. The scientific basis for the release at sea and the safety of the experimental turtles were important considerations in this NIE/NTU research study.

The momentous occasion was marked by the unveiling of the "Sea Turtle Conservation Gallery" by Mr Mah at UWS. The Gallery features a plethora of information and displays on the following:

- the significance of IOSEA and the Singapore YoT committee,
- the natural history and characteristics of each of the 7 species of sea turtles
- illustrations of sea turtle life-cycle and anatomy
- a 3D model of a turtle nest
- threats and conservation issues
- turtle conservation efforts in Singapore
- what Singaporeans could do to protect these marine creatures

As part of its ongoing initiative to educate the public on turtle conservation, UWS' Education and Curatorial departments will be conducting a series of educational and outreach programmes over the next few months. These include public seminars at the National Library Board, training workshops for YoT Ambassadors as well as Turtle Conservation Talks for school groups visiting UWS.







Mr Kwek Meng Tiam, General Manager of Underwater World Singapore commenting on this latest exhibit, "At Underwater World, we are constantly looking at creative ways to educate visitors, especially children, on the importance of conservation and marine protection. And this being the Year of the Turtle, we hope to bring to the attention of our visitors the distinct characteristics of these creatures, the dangers they are facing and the need to protect them."
